What is Tales Toolkit?

Helping children tell the stories that matter to them

Tales Toolkit is a package of practitioner training and interactive resources supporting children's early **language** and **social development** through oral storytelling.

One package includes everything a setting needs - no hidden costs!

How does it work?

Quality interactions that lead to independent storytelling

1: Online training course for the entire team

<u>Five</u> online training videos accessed through our portal, watched as a team, with collaborative activities. We recommend the videos are delivered over a term, leaving time to embed practice.


2: Group story sessions with the children

We encourage settings to run at least one group story session with all children per week. By implementing this regular foundational practice children...

- Become familiar with story structure
- Learn that using language and creating stories is fun you can't get it wrong!
- Gain confidence using their voice in a group dynamic
- Find ways to be creative with language and communication
- Gain important social skills such as turn-taking and collaborative problem-solving

3: Storytelling in independent play, preparation for writing

Once children are comfortable with the structure, practitioners encourage storytelling throughout the provision, with opportunities for independent play that provide the foundation for writing.



What's the impact?

Independent research shows impact across EYFS curriculum goals

Goldsmiths University of London

In 2018, Dr Alice Jones Bartoli published a study that showed Tales Toolkit's positive impact. We ran a trial, comparing control settings with those using Tales Toolkit. We used school data to track progress. The data showed significantly increased attainment across several key areas:

- Communication and Language
- PSED
- Literacy
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts & Design
- Boys' Writing*

Children in schools using Tales Toolkit make more progress.







Increased attainment in settings using Tales Toolkit


The steeper yellow lines show children using Tales Toolkit improving faster than their peers in control groups. This trend is replicated across several key areas of learning.











Closing the gap with Boys' Writing

Graph on the left shows literacy attainment with Tales Toolkit and on the right, without. **Boys using Tales Toolkit caught up to the girls, closing the gap by 62%.** Meanwhile the gap between boys and girls increased by 22% in the control group. <u>Read more.</u>

Education Endowment Foundation

In 2025, results from a pilot study with the EEF were released. The pilot took part in Schools, Nurseries and PVI settings. Here are some of the findings:

- Positive outcomes in CLL and PSED, including creativity, storytelling, writing, vocabulary, speech, problem-solving, turntaking, and sharing.
- Notable changes in practice in supporting children's language,
 quality interactions, collaborative play, storytelling, and child-led learning.
- Positive outcomes for children with SEND and EAL.

How we work with local authorities


