## Candidates:

1. **Actively participate in monthly virtual salon-style seminars**—lectures, shared readings, and discussions.
2. **Design and present one local-impact project** based on the Prohuman vision and mission. Host a speaker, organize a discussion group, lead an in-service, or another approved activity.
3. **Opportunities to publish**—write a thought piece, participate in a podcast, or appear in a video to practice messaging on Prohuman themes.

## Credentialing:

On completion, participants are awarded the Prohuman Ambassador credential via a digital badge. This will be a lifetime credential, with opportunities for continuing education and additional badging with the Prohuman Foundation.
