Update on Haiti

Last fall we launched an ambitious campaign to send medication to Haiti, and you stepped up!

In Haiti, access to basic medicine has become a matter of life and death.

Years of political unrest, gang violence, and economic collapse have pushed the country's healthcare system to the brink. Hospitals have been looted. Clinics have shut their doors. Doctors have fled for safety. For many families, even the most common treatments for infections, fevers, or malaria are nearly impossible to find.

Local leaders like Pastor Enel Angervil see the consequences of this crisis every day.

Through his work with FOKA-DAI, a Haitian-led community organization, Enel has watched families arrive seeking help that simply is not available. Children are suffering from illnesses that should be treatable. Parents are left with nowhere to turn.

To help change this story, last fall, we launched an urgent campaign to help send life-saving medicine to Haiti. The goal was clear: raise the funds needed to ship essential medicine into Haiti and equip local partners to distribute it where the need is greatest. Donors responded with incredible generosity, allowing the project to move forward and launch an international effort involving partners in Haiti and Canada.

Together with Health Partners International of Canada (HPIC), we coordinated the procurement and shipment of medical supplies. The original plan was to send one pallet of medical kits valued at approximately \$60,000. But something remarkable happened.

Through additional donated pharmaceuticals and strong collaboration between partners, the shipment expanded far beyond the initial plan. **Instead of one pallet, four pallets of medical supplies were secured with an estimated value of \$270,000.**



What began as an ambitious goal became an even greater opportunity to bring care to people who urgently need it.

After months of coordination, the shipment departed Canada at the end of February 2026 and has now arrived in Port-au-Prince!

The supplies have now cleared customs, and FOKA-DAI and their trusted partners have prepared to distribute the medicines to clinics, hospitals, and mobile medical teams serving vulnerable and displaced communities across Haiti.

For communities facing immense hardship, these supplies represent something powerful: the knowledge that they have not been forgotten.

Thank you for your incredible generosity. Together, we were able to go far beyond what we first imagined and send critical medicine to people who need it most. Medicines were secured. Partnerships were strengthened.

Building Hope, One Brick at a Time

Equipping students with practical skills and sustainable solutions that strengthen communities.

For many young people in Burkina Faso, opportunity can feel out of reach.

Economic hardship, limited job prospects, and barriers to education make it difficult for students to find a clear path forward. Many want to learn practical skills that can support their families and strengthen their communities, but access to training is often limited.

At CFPC (Centre de Formation Professionnelle en Construction), that reality is beginning to change. This year marked an exciting milestone for the training center. With new equipment funded through the grant, CFPC launched new vocational programs in aluminum work, upholstery, and ecological construction. These hands-on trades provide students with practical skills they can use to generate income and build a more stable future.

One of the most exciting parts of this training is the production of eco compressed bricks.

Using locally sourced materials and specialized equipment, students learn how to create strong and durable bricks that can be used to construct homes and community buildings. This innovative approach to construction not only provides valuable job skills, but also promotes environmentally responsible building practices that benefit the entire community.

For students, the experience is transformative. Each brick they produce represents more than a building material. It represents new skills, growing confidence, and the possibility of a better future.

The program is also opening doors for young women. Four young women recently stepped into leadership roles as interns, gaining hands-on experience while helping deliver training to other students. Their participation inspires more young women to pursue opportunities in the trades despite cultural and economic barriers.

Brick by brick, students gain the tools they need to shape their own futures and contribute to the growth of their communities.

Because of your generosity, students gain practical skills, sustainable building solutions are taking root, and new opportunities are created for the next generation.

This is the impact of your care! It is not just a metaphor, you are truly building hope and community brick by brick.

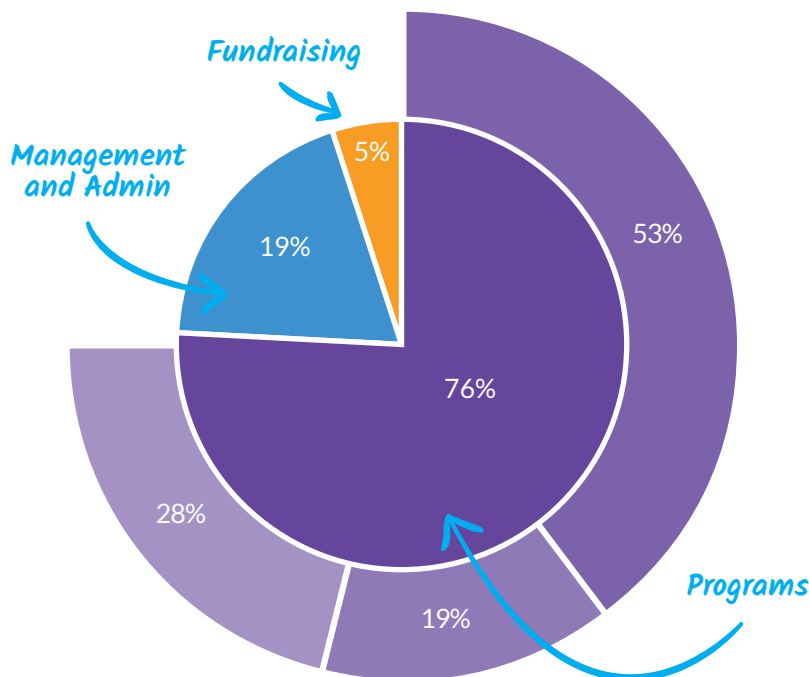
