Possibly Mislabeled THC Products


What's happening:

Many THC products sold at smoke shops, gas stations, and liquor stores may **appear legal** but are **not regulated or tested** by licensed cannabis programs. These products are often mislabeled, and **may contain higher THC levels, synthetic cannabinoids, or harmful contaminants.**

Why it matters:

Labels may claim “Delta-8,” “hemp-derived,” or “legal THC,” but testing often shows **inaccurate potency** or **undisclosed ingredients**. Using these products can lead to **unexpected poisoning, intoxication, or serious health effects.**

What You Can Do

Mislabeled or unregulated THC products can contain **unexpected** levels of THC, synthetic cannabinoids, pesticides, or solvents. These can cause **strong or unpredictable effects**, including anxiety, nausea, rapid heart rate, or even hospitalization.

If you suspect mislabeling:

- **Stop** using the product.
- **Save** the packaging and receipt. Take clear photos.
- To report suspicious products or retail establishments, go to: www.sdsheriff.gov/resources/thc
- **Seek medical help** and call **911** if you feel unwell and mention it may involve a THC product.

Tip: Illegal products are often cheaper and easier to find—but they can also be more dangerous and may skip required lab testing and safety checks.

Stay safe:

Buy only from licensed cannabis businesses.
