THE HAGUE, NETHERLANDS

Senior Visiting Fellow

Campaigning, effective narratives and communications, digital campaigning, and social media strategy

We are looking for a Fellow who combines a deep commitment to tax justice and economic equality with hands-on experience in campaign communications, digital strategy, and social media. The ideal candidate is a strong collaborator, able to work fluidly across research, advocacy, and campaigning teams in a fast-paced international environment. A solid understanding of the Dutch economic, political, and cultural landscape is essential, as the Fellow will be designing narratives and driving digital campaigns in the Netherlands. At the international level, they will contribute to broader communications efforts to normalize proposals for fighting wealth concentration.

The right candidate brings both analytical sharpness and creative communication skills: able to translate complex tax policy into resonant, accessible content for diverse audiences. They are self-driven, organized, and comfortable producing concrete outputs under tight timelines. A genuine alignment with the values of diversity, inclusivity, and respect for different perspectives is essential, as is an enthusiasm for working within a coalition of high-profile international partners.

We are looking for a Fellow with a lawyer or legal expertise background with a strong interest in fiscal justice and tax policy, ready to take ownership of a strategic six-month project at the intersection of law and public policy.

This is not a support role: the Fellow will lead an initiative from design to delivery, with concrete outputs that will outlast the placement. The role centers on building and coordinating a structured network of legal experts at the international level, and translating complex policy proposals into legally sound and constitutionally viable legislative frameworks.

Beyond identifying legal constraints, the Fellow will be expected to help design creative and workable solutions to overcome them, actively contributing to shaping viable legislative pathways rather than simply assessing what is or isn't possible.

The ideal candidate brings solid legal expertise, particularly in constitutional law, tax law, or EU law, combined with the ability to think strategically, communicate clearly, and engage a diverse network of experts. They are comfortable operating in a policy-driven environment, able to translate complex legal analysis into accessible arguments for public and parliamentary debate, and confident producing high-quality written outputs. Equally important is the human dimension: we are a small, collaborative team, and we are looking for someone who is a genuine team player, professional, respectful, and considerate of shared working space and others' time. An openness to different perspectives and a commitment to inclusive, respectful collaboration are as important to us as technical expertise.

Prior expertise matters less to us than intellectual rigor, professionalism, and genuine enthusiasm for the mission.

The core of the placement is a substantial research and writing project requiring the ability to synthesize diverse sources into a clear, actionable policy framework with a concrete implementation plan. The Fellow should be comfortable producing both written reports and presentations for a sophisticated audience. Beyond the core research work, the Fellow will gain exposure to international policy engagement and U.S. federal legislative advocacy, collaborating with partner organizations in the progressive taxation space. This is a hands-on, multi-dimensional placement for someone who wants to understand how policy change actually happens.

The ideal candidate is self-motivated, intellectually flexible, and able to adapt quickly to a shifting political environment. They communicate openly, ask good questions, and thrive in a collaborative, intergenerational team. Our office culture is professional but relaxed — we value people who take the work seriously without taking themselves too seriously.

We are looking for a highly technical Fellow with solid international tax experience: an international tax lawyer or accountant with five years of experience who is genuinely at home in the complexity of tax treaties, transfer pricing, and corporate tax systems.

This is not an introductory role; the work is substantive, fast-paced, and requires hitting the ground running. The placement sits at the heart of multilateral tax negotiations, supporting country delegates and Members through a series of high-stakes international meetings across Geneva and New York. The Fellow's work will be primarily analytical and written (producing briefings, position papers, and policy inputs) but will also involve direct participation in sessions and coordination meetings alongside key institutional partners. The exposure to senior tax officials, negotiators, and international organizations is exceptional.

The ideal candidate is not only technically sharp but also a careful, clear writer able to distill complex material into actionable guidance for a sophisticated audience. They are self-directed, able to manage an intensive and deadline-driven workload, and comfortable operating within the rhythms of multilateral processes. An interest in development and global equity in international taxation is essential. This work is driven by a commitment to ensuring developing countries have a meaningful voice in shaping the global tax architecture. The team is small and close-knit, with a remote working dimension. The right candidate will be autonomous, communicative, and genuinely motivated by the mission.

The ability to translate complex fiscal and tax policy arguments into compelling content for diverse audiences is just as important as technical expertise in this role.

The ideal candidate has a background in economics, law, or research, with knowledge of international tax law, political economy, or Islamic finance being a strong advantage. They bring solid writing skills across registers, from academic papers to civil society-facing content, and are confident engaging with multilateral policy processes. Fundraising experience and familiarity with the UN system are a plus. Beyond technical skills, we are looking for someone with a genuine commitment to amplifying Global South perspectives in international tax debates — a moment that is particularly urgent given the active negotiations around the UN Framework Convention on International Tax Cooperation.

The Fellow will have access to a rich network of experts and institutional partners, and will be expected to make the most of it. The Fellow will work under the direct supervision of the Directors and will also support intern training and contribute to grant development. This is a high-output, multi-dimensional placement suited to someone who is self-driven, versatile, and energized by the idea of making complex research matter beyond academic circles.

This two-part placement is uniquely designed to take research all the way from question to impact, and we need a candidate who is genuinely excited by both ends of that journey. The ideal candidate brings strong expertise in economics and tax policy, with solid quantitative and qualitative research skills and the ability to produce high-quality written outputs for both expert and general audiences. Experience with data visualization is an asset. They are comfortable engaging with academics, government, and civil society, and know how to frame complex findings in ways that resonate beyond specialist circles.

Just as important as technical skills is the right disposition: we are a curious, collaborative, deadline-driven team that brainstorms openly and invests in each other's growth. The ideal Fellow is intellectually open, responsive to new ideas, and ready to roll up their sleeves — whether that means refining a research methodology or helping shape a public campaign. A genuine commitment to tax fairness and reducing wealth inequality in Canada is essential. This placement sits at a consequential moment, as public understanding and policy frameworks struggle to keep pace with rapidly growing wealth concentration. The Fellow's work will directly contribute to closing that gap.

The ideal candidate has a strong grounding in international tax policy, human rights law, or global economic governance — or ideally, a combination of these. They are a confident writer and analyst, able to produce high-quality policy outputs across different formats and for different audiences, from technical discussion papers to movement-facing briefings. Experience engaging with multilateral processes and civil society coalitions is a significant asset. Beyond technical expertise, we are looking for someone with sharp strategic judgment — able to read power dynamics, identify advocacy entry points, and connect dots across fiscal policy, debt justice, and human rights frameworks. They are collaborative and humble in coalition spaces, comfortable working across regions and perspectives, and grounded in social justice values without losing sight of political opportunity.

This is a high-output, mission-critical placement at a genuinely consequential moment in international tax politics. The Fellow will contribute to outputs that will feed directly into ongoing advocacy well beyond the placement period. The right candidate is not looking for a conventional research role: they want their work to matter.

We are looking for a Fellow who is technically rigorous enough to conduct sophisticated quantitative analysis, and politically attuned enough to translate that analysis into compelling, accessible policy arguments. This profile is precisely what this placement is designed to identify and invest in.

The ideal candidate has a strong grounding in economics, public policy, or a related field, with hands-on experience in quantitative research and familiarity with statistical tools and Canadian data sources. They are

comfortable working with federal budget frameworks, fiscal costing, and wealth and income data, and equally comfortable turning those findings into clear, engaging content for media, policymakers, and the general public. Just as important is the organizational dimension: this role involves coordinating a large, diverse network of contributors on a tight production schedule.

The right candidate is not only analytically sharp but also a natural coordinator: reliable, communicative, and able to keep complex collaborative processes on track without losing sight of quality. A genuine commitment to social, economic, and climate justice is essential, as is familiarity with the Canadian civil society and labor landscape. We are looking for someone who sees rigorous research and progressive advocacy as inseparable, and who is motivated by the idea of producing work that shapes national conversations on economic fairness.
