## FROM THE SUPERVISOR

In perusing my former articles, I would not fault any reader for believing that I am obsessed with sewer issues. I am not; but sewer is right up there with, and related to, public safety, as the most important issue facing the Township. As you probably know, we are in the process of upgrading our very tired sewer system. The project will commence next year at the northern part of

Silver Lake. In order to save money, it will coincide with scheduled work being performed by the Kent County Road Commission.

The Township is responsible for upgrading the public portions of the system, using funds obtained from very low interest bonds and cash built up in our sewer fund balance. It will be the homeowner's responsibility to verify that their

"laterals" (the pipe running from their home and connecting to the system) are in good condition. This is done by televising the pipe, which will identify the material the pipe is made of and any defects in the line.

A letter was sent out to homeowners asking them to verify the condition of their lateral.

Many people

responded. Most of those were able to verify that their lateral needed no repairs or upgrading. Some laterals will require repairs and relining or replacement due to failure.

Some people received a failure letter due to the

material involved, but no known defects. For example, these laterals were composed of non-PVC material, which will eventually fail, but at present show no signs of doing so. It is preferable that PVC be utilized in laterals.

For those residents falling in this category, the Township decided to leave it to the resident whether to upgrade their lateral now, at lower cost, or do so later, at the time of the inevitable failure. If the decision is made to wait, the lateral will have to be replaced in its

current location, which could create an issue if future landscaping or a driveway is installed over the current location. If the homeowner chooses to replace the lateral now before the new trunk (main sewer line) is installed, they will be able to reroute their lateral in a different location on the trunk.

So, to be clear, any of you that received a letter informing you that your lateral failed the inspection because of non-PVC material, but your lateral is in good condition, it is not required that

you replace your lateral at this time. However, it is highly recommended to replace it now especially if you foresee your cottage someday becoming a main residence.

## Pre-dated Checks

We are asking our residents and business owners to avoid dating their property tax and sewer checks ahead of the date that the checks are written. For example, if property taxes are due September 14th some of our residents date it for that date or a day or two before, but turn it into

the Township office days or even weeks ahead of the date on the check. When this happens we have been holding the checks until the date on the check. Banks will not cash the checks before the date written on the check. With over 6,000 property tax checks and 2,000 sewer checks arriving during the due dates, it is difficult to set these aside until the date shown on the check.

## M-44 Construction Update

Major improvements are scheduled by MDOT this summer on Belding Road. Resurfacing and drainage improvements from Myers Lake Ave east to the Kent/Ionia County line will begin on June 15th and be completed by October 8, 2015 (weather permitting).

Included in this project is the intersection improvement at Ramsdell and Belding Road, increasing the visibility by 5 feet. Work will begin at this intersection on July 6th and is scheduled to be completed by August 7th.

Two way traffic on M-44 will be

maintained at all times when a detour is not in place. One lane of traffic will be maintained for eastbound traffic during the detours. Westbound traffic will be detoured via two separate detour routes.

A public information meeting was held on June 11th at the Township Center to explain the project to local residents and businesses. Also, flyers are available at the Township Center for anyone needing more information.

**Total estimated cost of this project is \$4.51 million.**

## Cannon Township Ramsdell/Belding Road Intersection Study - Spring 2015

### Quick Glance:

- 934 responded to the survey
- Roughly 2,052 school children pass through this intersection daily.
- 83% believe a light at this intersection is important

*"Everytime I cross here in my car I feel nervous, scared, and unsafe without a traffic light."*

### Background

The Cannon Township Board approached MDOT, which has jurisdiction over the Ramsdell/Belding Road intersection, and requested they install a traffic light.

The Township was told the light did not meet the signal warrants, which means it is not dangerous enough to warrant putting a light at that intersection. After meeting with MDOT they agreed to consider the matter if the Township provides information regarding how traffic patterns will change if the intersection receives a traffic light. The Township then commissioned a study to gather residents' opinions on installing a traffic signal at the Ramsdell/Belding Road intersection.


### Methodology

A self-administered questionnaire was designed by the Township and offered to the residents via the Township website. Neighborhood associations and Rockford Public Schools encouraged resi-

dents to fill out the survey. The survey was made available for the month of April. In that time 934 residents responded.

### Findings—Respondents

The majority of those-

Thirty-three percent live to the southeast/northeast. The review of the open-ended comments suggest many of those residents turn west onto Belding Road; affirming their uneasiness in turning or crossing at that intersection

who responded to the survey live Northwest of the Ramsdell/Belding Road intersection. The majority of these residents live in the lakes residential areas. As one resident stated, *"We live on Bostwick Lake and pulling out onto M-44 is quite challenging at times."*

This comment is consistent with the feedback the



### Findings—Utilization

Forty percent of those surveyed utilize the intersection daily, with 27% passing through more than once a day. According to Rockford Public Schools, 25 of their buses utilize this intersection, with 13 passing through twice daily during the school year. Keep in mind the average school bus holds 54 children.

## Findings— Alternative Routes

Of the 523 residents who use an alternative route to avoid the Ramsdell/Belding Road intersection, the majority use Myers Lake and Young, 39% and 29% respectively.

## Why are residents using an alternative route?

*"I used to take a route to school that included that intersection, but it's way too chaotic in the mornings and I had*


*almost been hit way too many times."*

*"Please do something with this intersection before someone else loses their life. I made my teenage kids use Myers Lake all of the time because of the danger of this intersection."*

*"This would be a great addition. I have personally witnessed 4-6 accidents in the last year at this intersection alone. Something needs to be done to slow traffic."*


## Findings— Importance of a Light

Eighty-three percent of the residents who completed the survey feel it is important to install a light at the Ramsdell/Belding Road intersection. The vast majority of those rate it as extremely and very important.

Which road do you use?



## Conclusion

The safety of the Ramsdell/Belding Road intersection has been a concern of the Township Board for quite a while. Since MDOT is going to commence work on reconstructing the road in this area, it would seem prudent to install a working traffic signal at that time. Installing a light at that intersection will alleviate some of the traffic on Myers Lake and Young Avenues, increasing the safety on those roads as well.

The priorities of the Board are the health, safety, and welfare of our residents. The Board views Ramsdell and Belding Road in the same light as the Belding Road and Blakely intersection, in which the addition of the traffic signal has been an asset to the community.

The Township Board respectfully asks MDOT to review this report and take the voice of our residents into consideration.

### Stream Study Volunteers

Also this spring Trout Unlimited, in partnership with Ground-swell, took 50 eighth grade students from

East Rockford Middle School to Richardson Sowerby Park in Downtown Rockford to plant a bioswale near the park parking lot.

The City of Rockford provided the site, removed the sod, provided the mulch, and contributed \$1,000 to the project! A bioswale is essentially a rain gar-

This spring the Bear Creek Stream Study volunteers teamed up with the Rogue River stream study volunteers for one HUGE insect monitoring event. Over 80 participants attended, and we had great weather!

This study consists of going to different

sites in the river/creek to collect macroinvertebrates (bugs), identify, and count them. Based on their diversity and numbers, we are able to assign each section of the stream a water quality score. Poor scores may warrant further investigation.

den that will detain, filter, and cool water before it enters the river. That is so important for the Rogue because it is a designated Natural River by the State of Michigan and a cold water trout stream. Bear Creek in Cannon Township is a cold water trout stream as well! Students also spent part of their time with Cannon Township Watershed Coordinator Julie Lovelace learning how to conduct insect monitoring. We hope these are future stream study volunteers!



Vigilant radio and television monitoring should always be maintained during inclement weather. Please take time to fully read and understand any costs related to subscribing to this service.

### 2014 Year in review:

By the end of last year, the Cannon Township Fire Department responded to 522 calls.

✓ Our average emergency response time for 2014 was 5 min-

utes, 10 seconds. (This statistic includes calls outside of Cannon Township and non-emergency calls.)

✓ Fire (building fires, chimney fires, grass fire, etc.) 44

✓ Rescue & EMT Incidents 307

✓ Hazardous Condition (natural gas leak, carbon monoxide) 35

✓ Service Calls (unauthorized burning, lock-out, etc.) 40

✓ Good Intent Calls (dispatched and cancelled or nothing found) 60

#### ✓ False Alarms 36

Our average response time is calculated based on when Kent County dispatches the department to when the department arrives on scene. Sometimes our delayed arrival is the direct result of not being able to find a street address.

Please take time to make sure that your address is clearly marked at your mailbox and/or the house numbers are visible from the street. If necessary, clear away any brush or tree limbs that may obscure your house numbers or prevent us

ation or ceremonial purposes, shall not be prohibited if the following conditions are satisfied:  
(i) any fire in excess

material described in Section 4(f) of this Ordinance.

Additionally, the campfire should never be left unattended, or should be thoroughly extinguished before leaving. And, a protective steel rim or rock formation should be used to help control the size and fire exposure to its surroundings.

## Watch Out

As you are outside doing lawn work, take a minute and inspect your driveway for branch obstructions. This simple problem continues to plague our department when responding to calls and is addressed in the current Township Ordinance which states in general:

Driveways longer than 75 feet, to have a minimum of 20 feet wide and 14

feet high, cleared of all obstructions.
