





Greetings from The Keystone Project and all our disciples in the nation!

As 2025 comes to a close, we celebrate God's incredible work through The Keystone Project. Because of your faithful prayers, generosity, and partnership, hundreds of leaders were trained across India, Southeast Asia, Africa, and the United Kingdom—equipped to make disciples, plant redemptive communities, and advance the Gospel among the unreached.

This year, five new disciple-making movements were launched in South Asia, 41 new disciples were made, and three new communities were formed in previously unreached villages and urban neighborhoods. Entire families and communities are now gathering for worship and discipleship—often under trees or in simple homes. In December alone, over 500 leaders in Asia were trained, greatly strengthening local churches and movements.

In East Africa, prison ministry efforts led to 49 men and women coming to Christ, and community outreach resulted in additional salvations. In the UK, pastors and church leaders were inspired to launch disciple-making movements, while in Southeast Asia, over 600 leaders were trained, and new mission teams were mobilized—including a 60-year-old woman preparing to serve in Indonesia in 2026.

Looking ahead to 2026, we plan to train mission teams in the US, strengthen alumni coaching and regional hubs, distribute the updated Keystone Project Manual globally, and equip even more leaders to reach the unreached.

Thank you for standing with us. Every life touched, every disciple made, and every community formed is the fruit of your generosity. Together, we are fulfilling the Great Commission in this generation.

What is The Keystone Project?

We are a global network of churches and leaders who are committed to the fulfillment of the Great Commission. We train leaders and other students to launch movements of disciples making disciples by the power of the Holy Spirit, especially among unreached people groups. Our training focuses outside the confines of church buildings and programs and, instead, seeks to reach the lost through Spirit-led, missional discipleship.

Vision

We exist to glorify God by multiplying Spirit-transformed followers of Jesus Christ in every tribe, tongue, people, and nation.

Mission

We identify, train, and coach leaders to launch movements of disciples making disciples in every nation on earth.

Global Leadership Development

Through workshops, seminars, and ongoing mentorship, we invest in leaders across Africa, Asia, Europe, and North America. We walk alongside pastors and movement leaders, helping them cultivate healthy disciple-making movements that are Spirit-led, locally owned, and sustainable.

Coaching & Mentorship

The Keystone Project coaches provide long-term relational support to leaders and teams in the field. This coaching strengthens vision, accountability, and resilience, ensuring that disciple-making efforts continue to grow beyond initial trainings.

Resource Creation & Distribution

We develop practical tools—including a field-tested training manual, curricula, and digital content—designed to be easily translated, reproduced, and shared. These resources equip believers to make disciples in the field, at home, in workplaces, in churches, and in unreached communities.

Digital & Media-Based Discipleship

To reach the next generation and those with limited access to traditional ministry, we leverage digital platforms, podcasts, video teaching, and online training. Through these tools, we are forming disciples and equipping leaders across borders, cultures, and closed contexts.

Why the Mission Must Continue

The mission is not finished. Billions still lack access to the Gospel, and thousands of unreached people groups may never hear unless disciples are intentionally sent—while an entire generation is being shaped outside biblical discipleship. The Keystone Project exists to multiply disciples who make disciples by equipping leaders, forming redemptive communities, and leveraging digital tools. Through this work, the Great Commission advances in nations, neighborhoods, and digital spaces for generations to come.

GLOBAL IMPACT REPORT



Across the globe, 2025 was a year of extraordinary growth and transformation through The Keystone Project. Hundreds of pastors, missionaries, and church leaders participated in our trainings, workshops, and online programs, from India to Malaysia, Indonesia, the United Kingdom, and Africa. Each leader was challenged and equipped to launch disciple-making movements and form redemptive communities in places where the Gospel had never been heard.

This year alone, five new disciple-making movements took root in South Asia, with 41 new disciples and three redemptive communities forming in previously unreached villages and neighborhoods. Entire families are now gathering for worship, prayer, and discipleship—often under trees or in simple homes. In December, our Asia Team trained over 500 leaders in Evangelism and Disciple Making, strengthening the capacity of local churches and movements for lasting impact.

The Gospel reached new areas in 2025—from remote villages and mountain communities in Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu to prisons and urban neighborhoods across Central Africa. Prison ministry efforts led to 49 men and women coming to Christ, with many more salvations through community outreach.

Keystone Project leaders and coaches also invested in long-term mentoring and missions. In the UK, pastors and church leaders were inspired to launch new movements through vision-casting seminars. In Southeast Asia, over 600 leaders were trained, and mission teams were sent to neighboring nations—including a 60-year-old woman who has committed to serve as a missionary in Indonesia in 2026.

Every leader trained, every disciple made, and every new community formed is a testament to God's faithfulness—and to the generosity of our supporters, whose prayers and gifts are multiplying the impact of the Gospel across the nations.





STORIES FROM THE FIELD

AFRICA

A Seminary Stirred by Vision – Ghana

At the Assemblies of God Theological Seminary, over 200 pastors and seminary students gathered for two vision-casting workshops on disciple-making movements—many encountering multiplication-first thinking for the first time.

Through practical teaching and dialogue, participants came to see disciple-making and redemptive communities as central to the Great Commission. Led by Bernard Joe Appiah, shaped through The Keystone Project, alongside his mentor William Wilkinson Marfo, the workshops reflected generational fruit, leaders training leaders who will train others.

Faith in Action: From Children to the Multitudes

One of the most moving moments of the year came through children. After being trained to share the Gospel, a group of children boldly entered a nearby community. With simple words and sincere faith, they shared the message of Jesus.

That day, 14 people—including adults—gave their lives to Christ. These children are learning early that they are not just future leaders—they are disciples today.

Beyond preaching, ministry leaders embraced holistic shepherding—walking alongside families through practical care, consistent

presence, and faithful Gospel witness. As trust was built, hearts opened to the message of Christ. In partnership with Global Outreach, believers were sent out two by two across Africa.

Through these efforts:

- 10,000 people heard the Gospel
- 5,641 people surrendered their lives to Jesus

Outreach took place through crusades and open-air meetings, as well as in schools, prisons, children's remand homes, trading centers, and local communities across the region.

EUROPE

Four Cities, One Calling – United Kingdom

In August and September, Keystone Project leaders spent four weeks traveling across the United Kingdom, visiting London, Leeds, Manchester, and Liverpool. The purpose was simple but profound: to encourage disciples already walking faithfully and to cast vision for new disciple-making movements in a post-Christian context.

A one-day training and vision-casting seminar in North London brought together pastors and key church leaders hungry for renewal. Many left with a renewed sense of mission—realizing that disciple-making movements are not only for the Global South but urgently needed in Europe as well.



ASIA

Raising Leaders in an Unreached Mountain Region

Raja is from Kurnoolpuram, an unreached mountain region in Andhra Pradesh. When his discipler had to leave due to family circumstances, Raja sought the Lord and stepped into leadership. He prayerfully selected and trained 11 leaders from his redemptive community, which includes more than 60 disciples. Together, they reached a neighboring unreached village preaching the Gospel door to door, forming relationships with 21 households, discipling 15 new believers, and establishing a new redemptive community that now gathers under trees and in homes. They are praying for provision for a shared space for fellowship and training.



Raising Leaders in an Unreached Mountain Region

Darwin is a 15-year-old disciple from the village of Kaarai near Kanchipuram, Tamil Nadu. Despite living in extreme poverty, with an alcoholic father and a younger brother with autism, Darwin's faith continues to grow. He considers the church his true family. During a recent communion service, Darwin was moved by the Spirit to contribute to the shared meal—persuading his mother to prepare a simple soup for the church. His act deeply moved the congregation. Though his father initially opposed his involvement, Darwin courageously expressed his love for the church, and God continues to work in his heart. Through faithful discipleship by local leaders, the Kingdom of God is growing—even among the youngest.



REACHING THE NEXT GENERATION

A rising generation is growing up in a digital world, forming beliefs, identities, and community online long before they ever enter a church building. To reach them—and to reach the unreached who may never encounter a missionary in person—we must engage where people already gather. Through social media, online training, and digital discipleship tools, the Gospel is crossing borders, overcoming barriers, and entering homes and hearts in ways never before possible.

Digital disciple-making allows us to equip leaders, coach movements, and multiply disciples even in restricted or remote regions. By stewarding technology for the Kingdom, we can train the next generation to follow Jesus, form redemptive communities, and carry the Gospel forward—both online and on the ground—until every nation, tribe, and tongue has heard.



The U.S. has become an important mission field with many unreached populations, such as immigrants and younger generations with post-Christian views. Training domestic mission teams within local churches enables believers to engage in cross-cultural missions locally, equipping them for gospel-centered outreach in their communities.

STRENGTHEN ALUMNI COACHING AND REGIONAL DISCIPLE-MAKING HUBS

The long-term fruit of disciple-making is not determined at the end of a training—but in the years that follow. Strengthening alumni coaching and regional disciple-making hubs ensures that what God begins in training environments continues to mature, multiply, and endure.

This strategy focuses on ongoing shepherding, accountability, and multiplication, transforming alumni from trained participants into seasoned leaders who train others.

CREATE MORE DIGITAL DISCIPLESHIP RESOURCES AND MISSIONAL TEACHING
