

IMPLANTS

When a tooth or several teeth are lost or removed, the **first choice for replacement** is often a **titanium dental implant**. This implant acts as an artificial tooth root, securely placed into the jawbone.

After the implant is surgically inserted, a **healing period of 3 to 4 months** is needed to allow the bone to heal and fuse with the implant — a process known as **osseointegration**. Once this phase is complete, a custom-made **porcelain crown** is either screwed or cemented onto the implant, restoring both function and appearance.

INDICATIONS FOR DENTAL IMPLANTS:

- **Single Missing Tooth**

- To replace one lost tooth without affecting adjacent teeth.

- **Multiple Missing Teeth**

- To replace several teeth with implant-supported bridges or crowns.

- **Full Arch Replacement**

- For patients missing all teeth in one or both jaws (e.g., All-on-4 or implant-supported dentures).

- **Unstable or Ill-Fitting Dentures**

- To provide support and retention for removable dentures, improving stability and comfort.

What to Expect After Treatment:

Just like natural teeth, **dental implants require consistent at-home care and regular dental check-ups**. Brushing and flossing remain essential to keep the implant area clean and free of plaque.

Following your treatment, **routine follow-up appointments** will be scheduled to monitor the health of your implant, surrounding bone, and gums — ensuring everything stays healthy and functioning well.
