



Pastor's Message

Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times for refreshing may come from the Lord, and that he may send the Christ, who has been appointed for you, even Jesus. Acts 3: 19-20

In the last days of January there was a message on the national and local news saying basically the same message: Winter and ice storms are on the way and dangerous and/or hazardous events may occur as a result of it.

They repeated that message over and over again, and the people in the different states, counties and communities responded properly to the message preparing themselves to be ready to receive the inclement weather in the best ways possible. Many people took extreme measures, yet some others left their preparations to the very last minute, and yet some others simply trusted that nothing will come to their communities so they didn't prepare at all.

Fortunately, the consequences of those events were not as expected, and the damage to the power lines and water systems and traffic accidents were not as bad as anticipated. Yet, most of the people responded to the message staying at home, not driving unless was necessary, and having the supplies that could be needed at home in case of an emergency.

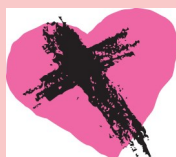
When an important message such as the possibility of natural disasters and other important events may occur, then the people take note responding in the appropriate ways to overcome those difficult moments. They follow the instructions of the message, and the proper response is vital for the wellbeing of themselves, and the community at large.

In our spiritual lives there is a permanent warning message as well. A message that has been proclaimed throughout many centuries by important leaders concerned for the spiritual wellbeing of the people in the world. A message that has been proclaimed by people such as Moses, David, Jonah, Ezekiel, Joel, John the Baptist, Peter or Paul, and the message has been basically the same, and that is: Repent and turn to God, so that your sins might be wiped out, the times for refreshing may come from the Lord, and that he may send the Christ.

Maybe because this message has been proclaimed for so long, many people today are not considering responding to it in the proper way following the invitation, yet the message is as relevant today as it was from the beginning.

We believers have responded to the message. I have heard many believers saying: I am ready! And that is great! Yet, the number of those ignoring or rejecting the message keeps growing in our times. The Lord invites us, as believers, to keep sharing this message, which is a message made in love and it is full of grace from God. Paul said: Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap the harvest if we don't give up. Is this hard? Yes, it may seem our message falls into deaf ears, yet, this is our task as Christians, to share the gospel in all the ways we can, to all the people we can, in all places we can as long as ever we can. God bless you for sharing the gospel where you are.

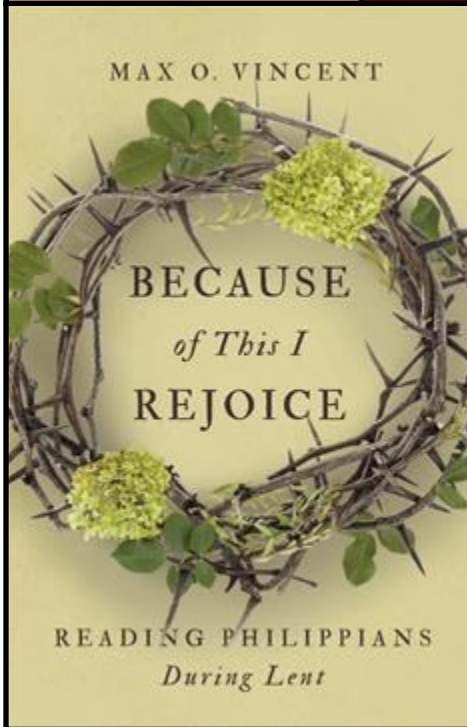
