<u>What the Judges are looking for</u> in the COUNTRY TIPPLE CLASS

An interview with longstanding judge Joe Moore.

How many judges are there?

For the Country Tipple section, always at least 2, sometimes 3.

How many entries are there usually?

At the most about 50 total. The majority of those are in the alcoholic classes. The most popular class is Sloe Gin; last year about 40% of the entries were in that category.



How much do you drink?

It depends on the category... if it is a spirit-based drink, normally a shot between the two of us... for beer or non-alcoholic entries, often half a glass.

Talk us through the judging process.

We do it class by class, trying to mix up the spirit-based classes with the others. Every entry is assessed on specific criteria, including presentation, colour, transparency, smell, viscosity, taste and aftertaste. In the larger sections we shortlist the exceptional ones and then revisit those to decide the prize order. From all the category winners, we then choose the overall Best in Class. It takes about 90-120 minutes in total.

Is there anything you would advise for those wanting to enter next year?

We like different! Recent winners include a raspberry gin and a vanilla vodka as well as some unique sloe recipes with unusual botanicals.

How do you feel afterwards?!

Well... some of us go home and fall asleep, others stumble around the rest of the show and others actually attempt to play sport (it's the cricket season), usually with pretty "average" results!

Farming Through the Ages

The journey from horses powering farm machinery through to the complex, nearlyautonomous machines we have today is a fascinating one, and Bishow Wilton Show attendees historically enjoyed looking at all the latest developments!

Main Ring @ 3.45pm

This year we focus on potato cultivation. The Yorkshire Wolds are "high health area" for seed potato production. Too much water is the



enemy of seed potatoes; the free draining soils, drier than average weather and the hill breezes help to prevent fungal infection and leads to disease free tubers. Many of us will feel our backs aching when we remember autumn days spent spud picking, but how things have changed. We've searched barns across the area to bring a together a showcase of how potato cultivation has changed through the years.



Mike Stringer is the $3^{\rm rd}$ generation to farm here at High Callis, where the show is held. He says,

"It is interesting to see that much of the progress over the past 70 years has involved a vast increase in size yet many of the basic design features are virtually unchanged.

Check out the Horticulture tent for Murton Park's display of even older farm equipment! With large fields, long days and often only short periods of suitable weather in which to get work done it is easy to see why modern machines have grown to the size they are, even if there are trade-offs with **issues such as soil compaction**.

Many of the new machines now come with driver aids which *almost* allow

them to drive themselves. Who knows, if we repeat this exercise at the show in another 70 years there is a good chance we may see smaller machines back again... but possibly working autonomously.

That may be the future but there is a little bit of me that thinks that something could be lost from the countryside if this happens."





<u>What the Judge is looking for</u>

in the SHEEP CLASSES

There are various sheep classes for our judge - Mr Charles Marwood from Whenby - to assess, including Pure Native Breed, Pure Continental Breed and Young Handler sections.

In Butchers' Lamb classes the **degree of muscling** (the thickness through the leg, width between rear legs, shape over the rack of the animal) and **degree of finish** (frame size and degree of maturity) will be the most important traits.

However, in Breeding Ewe classes the **balance** (wide and deep at the rear and tight and trim through the front end), **frame size** and **structural correctness** will have greater weight.

When looking at soundness and structural correctness, judges often work through the 5 "T's," which are:


- Toes pasterns, fetlock, knees, hocks and leg profile.
- 2. **Teeth** at lip / mouth profile, jawline.
- 3. Testicles
- 4. Teats
- Type unique breed standard features.

The judge will have an idea of what "correct" looks like in his mind's eye (as shown in the diagram



shown in the diagram above, for legs) and will place the class based on the volume of the important traits.




