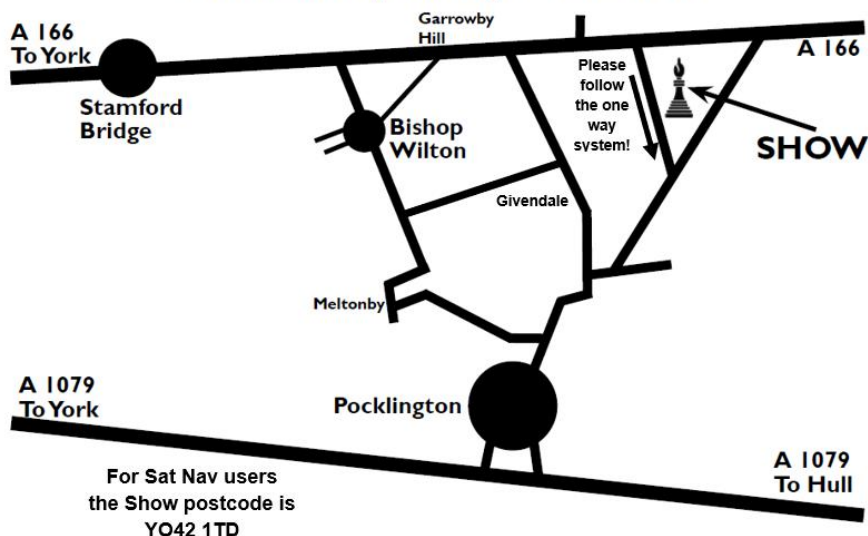

We would like to thank our President and all our Honorary Vice Presidents and Vice Presidents for their commitment and support for the Show.

RULES

- 1) The organisation of the Bishop Wilton Show is overseen by the Bishop Wilton Show Committee.
- 2) The Show is held under the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Bishop Wilton Show Committee, which accordingly bind all Exhibitors, members and all others attending the Show. Additional rules apply to some classes as set out in the Schedule.
- 3) Entries should be made on the relevant official Entry Forms, where provided.
- 4) Bishop Wilton Show Committee reserves the right to vary the order and composition of this Schedule, and to decline any entry without being required to give reasons.
- 5) All stock must be bona fide the property of the exhibitor.
- 6) All stock should be in the Show field one hour before the scheduled judging time. Judging to commence at 9am and the classes to be judged as catalogued, or as the stewards may direct.
- 7) Brood mares must have foal at foot. No foal to be less than three weeks of age.
- 8) All Exhibitors of livestock must be aware of and conform to current DEFRA rules on the transport of animals. In particular, attention is drawn to the rules governing the movement of mares and ewes in the last days of pregnancy.
- 9) All disputes to be settled by the Show Committee, whose decision is final.
- 10) The Show is open to all.
- 11) If any prize is awarded to any animal and it be discovered before the actual payment of the prize that such animal has been entered with a false pedigree or description or otherwise fraudulently, or in contravention of any rules of the Show, the committee shall have the power to refuse payment of such prize, notwithstanding that no notice of objection has been made to the Secretary under Rule 12, and in case of such payment being refused under this rule the entry fee shall be forfeited.
- 12) Any objection must be made in writing to the Secretary within half an hour of the prizes being awarded, and no animal that has won a prize shall be removed from the Show field until that time has elapsed, after which no objection will be considered; the person objecting will be required to deposit £100 which will be liable to be forfeited should the objection be overruled. Committee members do not in any case or under any circumstances hold themselves liable for any loss or injury to animals exhibited at this Show or to any person visiting the Show or for any loss of any articles belonging to exhibitors or other persons attending the Show. All ages to be taken on the Show Day, unless otherwise stated.
- 13) All persons who have entered stock and failed to exhibit shall forfeit the fee paid on entry.
- 14) Where a trophy is to be presented to the winner in a class, the steward will give a card to the winner, to be presented at the Secretary's Tent in exchange for the appropriate trophy. The winner's signature to take responsibility for the trophy, address and phone number, and a deposit of £10 are required, refundable on safe return of the trophy before the next Show.

- 15) It is a condition of entry that Exhibitors conform to the requirements of current Health and Safety legislation and to ensure that safe working practices are followed by themselves, their employees, agents and contractors. Exhibitors shall at all times comply with the instructions of Show Officials.
- 16) Smoking in any marquee toilet or other confined area on the showground is prohibited.
- 17) Any Exhibitor or Exhibitor's employee, or any member of the general public who conducts himself in an improper or offensive manner to any Judge, Steward or Official, shall be reported to Show Director. The offending person may be refused entry to the Showground, may not be allowed to compete in that Class or further Classes and may have no monies refunded. Further, the offending person may not be allowed to enter any future Shows until re-admitted by the Bishop Wilton Show Committee.
- 18) Exhibitors of Horses and Ponies must be dressed correctly and where grooms or attendants are permitted to enter the ring they must be dressed appropriately with regard to safety. Anyone riding a horse anywhere on the Showground is required to wear a hat of a standard approved by the governing body under whose rules they are exhibiting, (PAS 015, VG1- both must be kitemarked) with safety harness correctly fitted and secured at all times when mounted, or be disqualified
- 19) Under no circumstances will Entry Fees be refunded in the case of cancellation of entries by an Exhibitor except where BSJA Rules apply.
- 20) The onus is on every rider who suffers a fall, or anyone who suffers an injury whilst on the showground, to report the fall/injury to the Show Secretary.
- 21) The Show Committee has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of all participants. All persons on the showground are expected to do the same, and to comply with all instructions of the Organisers, Officials and Stewards.
- 22) The showground is designed so that competitors and members of the public are kept apart. All persons attending the Show are asked to keep within these designated areas.

LIABILITY

- 23) The Show Committee and its officers shall not be responsible for any person whatsoever while upon the Show fields, or while entering and leaving the same, for any damage or loss however caused to the property of any such person or for any injury, fatal or otherwise, to any such person.
- 24) The Show Committee and its officers shall not be responsible for any accident, damage or loss however caused that may occur to any exhibitor or his servant or to any animal, article, or property exhibited or brought onto the Showground by him/her. Each exhibitor shall indemnify the Show from and against all actions, suits expenses or claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury however caused.
- 25) The Show Committee will not under any circumstance accept liability for any loss or damage (whether direct or indirect) arising from or caused by the abandonment or cancellation, whether total or partial, or the postponement of any show, display, event, meeting or other happening on the Showground or elsewhere for whatever reason.
- 26) Exhibitors are required to arrange appropriate insurance cover.

HEALTH & SAFETY

- 27) It is the responsibility of all exhibitors to comply with any Health and Safety requirements placed on them whilst competing at the Show. Any exhibitor who fails to comply with health and safety or fire safety legislation may be liable to enforcement action by the East Riding of Yorkshire Council Environmental Health Officer and/or the Humberside Fire and Rescue Fire Safety Officer.
- 28) Horse walks have been laid out by the Show and it is imperative that ridden, driven and in-hand horses keep within these designated routes and take guidance from Officials or Stewards at crossing points, etc. For safety reasons - we do not allow the lunging of horses in the parking area or collecting ring.
- 29) Total separation between horses and the general public may in certain instances be impossible and it is suggested that if an exhibitor has a nervous/highly strung animal he/she should consider whether it is prudent for him/her to risk bringing this animal to a busy agricultural Show.
- 30) It is a condition precedent of entry to the Show that participants have read and accept these notices.
- 31) All dogs must be kept on a lead on the show field.

- Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification. *Those wishing to join or renew the Society will need to apply for this before 1st May each year or a late penalty fee of £15 will be charged.*
- **VHS Regional Final qualification.** All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each age category will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their cards in the ring and have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership, this MUST be done within 21 days of qualification. It is the competitors' responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.
- **Regional Finals are open to members only.**
- All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, at Arena UK, Lincs 4th - 6th September 2026. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule, which is available mid-season in 2026.

- CLASS 7 - VETERAN IN-HAND, COMBINED AGE CLASS (15 years and over). To be run as one class but judged as separate age categories: Diamond Veteran (25 years and over), Veteran (20-24 years) & Pre-Veteran (15-19 years). Open to horses and ponies of any breed and height.
- CLASS 13 - VETERAN RIDDEN, COMBINED AGE CLASS (15 years and over). To be run as one class but judged as separate age categories: Diamond Veteran (25 years and over), Veteran (20-24 years) & Pre-Veteran (15-19 years). Open to horses and ponies of any breed and height.

TGCA TOYS IN HAND AND RIDDEN CLASSES AFFILIATION 26/1807/STQ

NO KNOWN BREEDING REQUIRED TO ENTER THESE CLASSES.

NO MEMBERSHIP REQUIRED TO ENTER THESE CLASSES.

- TGCA Breed classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association's (TGCA) National Breed Championship Show "TOYS".
- Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs.
- Part Bred classes, are open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the part bred finals at "TOYS".
- The exhibit must have one parent that is pure bred traditional gypsy cob.
- Stallions - All stallions (pure or part bred, four years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class **MUST** be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA stallion evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two, **MUST** be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook.
- Current TGCA members must present their Membership card and Qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature.
- Non-members **MUST** receive a qualification card from the judge and have **21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification.**
- Please refer to www.tgca.co.uk for further details including membership, horse registration and showing rules (contained within the members handbook).

CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Quest for a Star Championship - TGC - 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship (separate Quest Championship for Mini Cobs) as per below rule.
- **ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship.**
- Membership card and Member's qualification card (specific to that exhibit) **must** be presented upon **entry into the ring.** The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS.
- *Tattersalls RoR OPEN In-Hand Show Series Qualifier 2026*
- *Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings. Handlers must be 15 years or over on the 1st of January 2026.*
- *Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a bitless/In-Hand Bridle. Blemishes caused by racing will be ignored.*
- *All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.*
- *Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.*
- *The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree, August 22nd, 2026*
- *Prizes - RoR rosettes 1st -4th plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5,*
- *Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10*
- *The Highest Placed Veteran also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Open In-Hand Veteran Show final at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd 2026*

TATTERSALLS ROR AMATEUR RIDDEN SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER 2027

- Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur.
- Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2026.
- Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.
- The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration.
- The Judge will not ride in the qualifiers but will ride in the Final. Competitors/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.
- **The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting, June 2027**
- **Prizes** – RoR rosettes 1st –4th + RoR Tattersalls official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.
- *The winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd, 2026. Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same date – August 22nd 2026.*

AMATEUR DEFINITION

- The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition a person classed as amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind.
- An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season: Engage(d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity.
- Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from 1st January 2025.
- Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season.
- Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season.
- A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show.
- Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes
