The CAMTS winter board meeting took place on a virtual platform. Jan Eichel, CAMTS Executive Director, said, "Achieving CAMTS accreditation is a major milestone that showcases a strong dedication to excellence in medical transport." She explained that CAMTS standards, developed and regularly updated by a panel of safety and medical transportation experts, exceed regulatory requirements. Accredited programs undergo frequent, detailed audits to maintain compliance and ensure top-tier patient care and safety.

The Commission on Accreditation of Medical Transport Systems (CAMTS) is dedicated to improving the quality of patient care and safety of the transport environment for services providing rotorwing, fixed wing, and ground transport systems. To achieve accreditation by CAMTS, medical transport programs must adhere to CAMTS's standards, developed and continually improved by a board of highly skilled and experienced safety and medical transportation professionals. Adherence to these standards, which are above and beyond regulatory requirements, is audited every three years to ensure program compliance to remain accredited by CAMTS.
