Take your education to the global stage with the Medicine Immersion Program at the Spencer Fox Eccles School of Medicine at the University of Utah Mission Driven M.D. Program in Salt Lake City, Utah, U.S.A.

Aimed at senior medical students, this rich multi-modal education experience enables you to immerse yourself in Utah's beautiful Salt Lake Valley while gaining valuable experience and insights about medicine. University of Utah boasts the only MD program in the state, as well as a tertiary care academic medical center. With more than 14,000 faculty and staff, University of Utah Health is one of the state's largest employers and is the only university health care system in the state that provides patient care for the greater region (encompassing Utah, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, and Nevada). It is also the training ground for most of Utah's physicians, nurses, pharmacists, therapists, other health care professionals, as well as the next generation of researchers and scientists.

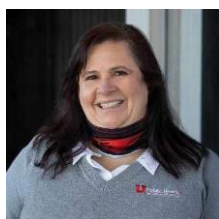


Dr. Jennifer
