

AGOA LEADERS BREAKFAST ROUNDTABLE

On December 10, CCA and the AGOA Coalition, cochaired by Rosa Whitaker, hosted an AGOA Leaders Breakfast Roundtable to kick off the 3-day "Continue AGOA" series. Leaders from the U.S. and across Africa gathered to discuss the future of U.S.-Africa trade following AGOA's lapse in September.

Conversation centered on Chairman Jason Smith's draft legislation to extend AGOA through 2028 — a proposal CCA strongly supports. Participants, including the Prime Minister of Mauritius, emphasized AGOA's proven impact on trade, jobs, value chains, and U.S. competitiveness.

CCA remains committed to convening partners, advocating for sustainable trade policies, and strengthening long-term U.S.-Africa commercial ties — including at the 2026 U.S.-Africa Business Summit in Mauritius. Event Photos
