

Day 1: Santiago (Mon, 19 Jan)

D

Arrive Santiago and check in to Four Am Points by Sheraton.

Pm Mid-afternoon city walking tour.

Local dinner. Eve

Day 2: Santiago Tues (Tues, 20 Jan)



Professional visit to a dental hospital. Am Drive to the colourful World Heritage Site of Valparaíso. Enjoy the city's rich history, faded grandeur, bohemian charm and street art, followed by a visit to chic Viña del Mar, with its subtropical boulevards lined with palm trees and beautiful expansive parks. Return to Santiago.

Eve Welcome dinner.

Day 3: Santiago / San Pedro de Atacama (Wed, 21 Jan)



Am Fly to Calama.

Pm Transfer to the 5-star Cumbres Hotel in San Pedro de Atacama, an adobe town rich in ancient culture in the world's driest desert. Visit the Mountains of Salt (Cordillera de la Sal) and the Valley of the Moon (Valle de la Luna), famous for its natural mineral sculptures eroded by the wind.

Eve Watch the sun set from atop the cordillera. Return to the hotel.

Day 4: San Pedro de Atacama (Thurs, 22 Jan)



Visit a local dental health clinic and the Padre Le Paige Archaeological Museum. Head to Toconao village, which dates back 12,000 years, with its interesting handicrafts made of cactus or volcanic stone. Explore the beautiful oasis valley and see ancient petroglyphs.

Pm Continue to Atacama Salt Flat, the world's largest salt flat, and continue to Chaxa Lagoon, inhabited by three endemic species of flamingos. Watch the sunset.

Option to observe the stars through Eve a modern telescope while learning of ancient Andean astronomy.

Day 5: San Pedro de Atacama (Fri, 23 Jan)



Am Drive high into the Altiplano to visit the dramatic Tatio Geysers; one of the most important geothermal fields in the world. Take a dip in a natural hot pool. Drive into the richly colourful wetlands of Putana to see vicunas, flamingos and birds against the backdrop of the Colorado Volcano. Return to hotel via the tiny, historic adobe village of Machuca.

Day 6: San Pedro de Atacama / Puerto Varas (Sat, 24 Jan)



Am Talk: 'The bohemian George Cunningham, a founder of modern preventative dentistry' - Kevin Esplin. Transfer to Calama and fly to Puerto Montt.

Transfer to the rose-filled charm of Puerto Eve Varas. Check in to the lakeside 5-star Hotel Dreams de los Volcanes.

Day 7: Puerto Varas (Sun, 25 Jan)

Am The Chilean Lake District is a spectacular region of clear lakes overlooked by snow-capped volcanoes. Explore the towns of Puerto Varas and Frutillar, which hug the blue expanse of Lake Llanquihue. Return to the hotel.

Day 8: Puerto Varas (Mon, 26 Jan)

Am Board a boat to Chiloé Island, known for its myths and legends and one of the few truly Indigenous places left in Chile.

Discover the richness of its living culture amidst its famous colourful stilt buildings and beautiful landscapes. Return to the mainland and your hotel.

Day 9: Puerto Varas / Torres del Paine (Tues. 27 Jan)

Am Visit a local dental health centre.

Pm Fly to Punta Arenas. Drive to Torres del Paine National Park.

Eve Check in to the waterfront Hotel Costa Australis in Puerto Natales.

Day 10: Torres del Paine (Wed, 28 Jan)

Am Full day visit to Torres del Paine National Park, one of the most spectacular national parks on the continent with its snow-capped mountain peaks, cascading rivers and waterfalls, glaciers and mirrored lakes. Visit ancient Milodon's Caye.

Pm Walk to the Salto Grande on the Paine River. Continue to Lake Grey and enjoy the view across the lake to see the 'Horns.' Return to Puerto Natales.

Day 11: Torres del Paine (Thurs, 29 Jan)

Am Walk along the lake through an old lenga forest and along Grey Beach to board a catamaran for a three-hour voyage past floating icebergs. Approach different sides of the Grey Glacier to observe the beauty of the ice giant.

Day 12: Torres del Paine / Santiago (Fri, 30 Jan)

Am Drive to Punta Arenas. Visit the Penguin Sanctuary.

Pm Fly to Santiago.

Eve Farewell dinner.

Day 13: Santiago (Sat, 31 Jan)

Am Depart or take Easter Island extension.



Extension: 31 Jan – 5 Feb 2026

Deep in the Pacific Ocean, well over a thousand miles from the nearest inhabited land, Easter Island - or Rapa Nui - is shrouded in myth and legend, made more intriguing by the colossal moai statues that are scattered across the island. Explore the most fascinating locations on the island, with time to relax.

Day 13: Santiago / Easter Island (Sat, 31 Jan)

Am Fly to Easter Island and transfer to Hotel Taha Tai.

Pm Learn of the history of Rapa Nui on a tour into the interior of the island to the Puna Pau quarry, where the heads of the most famous moai were carved. Continue the Ahu Akivi platform. Visit the Tahai ceremonial centre and see three restored platforms.

Day 14: Easter Island (Sun, 1 Feb)

Am Take a leisurely hike to the highest point on Rapa Nui, the summit of Terevaka Volcano, for panoramic views. Descend the volcano to the Akivi sector. Return to hotel and at leisure.

Day 15: Easter Island (Mon, 2 Feb)

Am Visit the VINAPU archaeological site, whose stone constructions reflect the techniques used by the indigenous people. Continue to the ceremonial village of Orongo. End at the Rano Kau Volcano viewpoint, which hides a natural sanctuary in its hidden crater.

Am This full day archaeological tour visits some of the most outstanding sites related to the island's mysterious moai, finishing with a visit to Anakena Beach, with the best-preserved moai on the entire island, as well as palm trees, white sand and turquoise water.

Day 17: Easter Island / Santiago (Wed, 4 Feb)



Am At leisure.

Pm Fly to Santiago and overnight at the Holiday Inn Santiago Airport.


Day 18: Santiago (Thurs, 5 Feb)
