Angkor Wat

Journey by land and water through the enchanting lands of the mighty Mekong River.

Begin the tour in the energetic metropolis of Ho Chi Minh City a confluence of colonial architecture, modern skyscrapers, grand boulevards, and hidden alleyways. From there, venture into the tropical lowlands of the Mekong Delta, where you'll spend three nights aboard the elegant Pandaw Indochina. Far removed from city life, cruise through primeval mangrove forests, floating markets and languid villages.

Disembark in Phnom Penh, Cambodia's charming capital, to wander the palm-fringed riverside promenade dotted with royal palaces and temples. Drive through lush, rolling countryside to Siem Reap, via Oudong, the 'City of Past Kings'. The tour culminates with visits to the great archaeological wonders of Bayon, Ta Prohm and Angkor Wat.

Throughout the journey, professional visits and talks provide historical and contemporary insight into medicine and dentistry in Indochina. A series of excursions and talks will delve into the region's complex past – from the golden age of the Khmer Empire to the dark days of the Cold War and Khmer Rouge – whilst showcasing the vibrancy of modern society with its thriving street food culture, rich traditions, and warm-hearted people.

There is an optional extension to beautiful Koh Andet Island at the base of the Cardamom Mountains at the end of the tour.

Day 4: Ho Chi Minh / My Tho **B D** (Sun, 8 Feb)

Am/Pm: Transfer to the river port and embark on the RV Indochina. After settling in, take a tour by sampan (a flat wooden boat) through mangroves and bamboo forests to the fruit orchards of Ben Tre. Explore this birdlife-rich area by local rowboat, making your leisurely way through canals before arriving at a village specialising in local crafts.

Day 5: Gao Giong (Mon, 9 Feb) **B L D**

Am/Pm: Cruise upriver and visit the green oasis of Gao Giong, a 1,000-acre eucalyptus forest and wildlife sanctuary where a diverse selection of water birds and egrets gather in their tens of thousands across the 'Plain of Reeds'. Take rowboats across the canals to view the principal nesting areas. Continue cruising up the Mekong towards the Cambodian border.

Day 6: Chau Doc Vietnam **B L D** / Cambodian Border (Tues, 10 Feb)

Am: Cruise to the picturesque border town of Chau Doc and visit the floating markets by sampan. Visit Cham village before traveling to Sam Mountain to climb the 400 steps to the Hang Pagoda. Return to ship and cruise through a web of canals before dropping anchor on the Vietnam/Cambodia border to undergo immigration formalities.

Day 7: Phnom Penh (Wed, 11 Feb) **B D**

Am: Arrive in Phnom Penh and disembark. Visit the Phnom Penh Dental School to learn about dental education and training in Cambodia.

Day 1: Ho Chi Minh City (Thurs, 5 Feb) **D**

Pm: Arrive in Ho Chi Minh City and check in to the Pullman Saigon.

Day 2: Ho Chi Minh City (Fri, 6 Feb) **B D**

Am: Visit the University of Medicine and Pharmacy, the group will split between the Faculty of Odontology or the Faculty of Medicine.

Pm: Take a guided tour of HCMC, wander networks of alleyways onto vast boulevards lined with skyscrapers. Visit colonial buildings including Notre Dame Cathedral of Saigon and the palatial Central Post Office, with its grand concourse of painted maps.

Day 3: Ho Chi Minh City (Sat, 7 Feb) **B D**

Am: Explore the colourful stalls of Tan Dinh Market in the company of a cooking instructor, source local ingredients and participate in a cookery class.

Pm: Visit Reunification Palace; the iconic photograph of the North Vietnamese tank crashing through its gates signified the end of the Vietnam war. Visit the former CIA building and the War Remnants Museum, which includes a poignant photography exhibition.

Eve: Drinks at the rooftop bar of Rex Hotel,

Pm: Check in to the hotel before a walk along Sisowath Quay, a lively riverfront promenade that is home to several iconic landmarks and leafy French-colonial gardens.

Day 8: Phnom Penh (Thurs, 12 Feb) **B D**

Am: Visit the Royal Palace compound, see the Throne Hall, the extravagant Silver Pagoda and the world's finest collection of Khmer sculptures at the National Museum of Cambodia.

Pm: At leisure with options to visit the Central Market, Cambodian Living Arts (an NGO that specialises in performing arts) or the Tuol Sleng Museum of Genocide and the Killing Fields.

Eve: Option for post-dinner drinks at the Sora Skybar, with great views of the city skyline.

Day 9: Phnom Penh/ Siem Reap (Fri, 13 Feb) **B D**

Am: Drive to Siem Reap via Oudong, the magnificent post-Angkorian capital of Cambodia, and learn about its trading history with China, Japan and Europe.

Pm: Continue to Siem Reap, arriving in the late afternoon, and check in to the hotel.

Day 10: Siem Reap (Sat, 14 Feb) **B D**

Am: Drive to visit the Cambodia Landmine Museum, founded by Aki Ra, a former child soldier who is dedicated to de-mining Cambodia following decades of conflict. On return see ancient Khmer artifacts at Angkor National Museum.

Pm: Visit Angkor Hospital for Children (AHC) in Siem Reap and meet with the locally led, highly skilled team who are working to improve health care for children in Cambodia. At leisure before dinner at the Foreign Correspondents Club.

Day 11: Siem Reap (Sun, 15 Feb) **B D**

Am: Start early to visit the atmospheric Bayon Temple and Ta Prohm, a temple intertwined with enormous tree roots. Continue to Angkor Wat, part of the city of Angkor built by the Khmer civilisation

between 802 and 1220 AD. At its peak Angkor is thought to have contained upwards of a million people, making it the largest city in the world at that time.

Pm: At leisure before your farewell dinner.

Day 12: Siem Reap (Mon, 16 Feb) **B**

Am: Depart for the airport, extend your stay in Siem Reap or take the beach extension.

All itineraries are subject to change according to local conditions.

Extension to Koh Andet Island

16 – 19 February 2026

On the 16 February, depart Siem Reap for the Canvas & Orchids Retreat on Koh Andet Island at the base of the Cardamom Mountains. You will experience Cambodia's nature at its finest, including the Tatai River whose pristine waters are filled with aquatic life and surrounded by lush rainforests.

Relax at your leisure for three nights with the option to partake in resort activities including jungle treks and sunset cruises. On the 19 February, depart Koh Andet Island and transfer to Phnom Penh airport for your return flight.
