Cruise on Lake Titicaca, Puno

Peru - land of gold and the sun-worshipping Incas, the biggest empire in pre-Columbian America. From its biodiverse cloud forests and indigenous peoples to the towering Andes, to the coastline dotted with Inca ruins, Peru is an extraordinary destination.

This tour takes you on a journey from Lima, a modern city with a colonial past, through the Andes to the Sacred Valley and onto the lost city of Machu Picchu, the most magnificent legacy of the Incas. Visit Cusco and continue to vast Lake Titicaca, the largest navigable lake in the world, and explore the traditional communities, who live on the lake much as they have done for centuries.

This bespoke tour combines a rich cultural programme with CPD professional visits. In the company of like-minded people examine the landscape of dentistry in Peru against a wider health backdrop, where modern and traditional health care are both widely practiced.

Itinerary 18 – 30 October 2026

2 nights Lima – 4 nights Sacred Valley – 1 night Machu Picchu
– 2 nights Cusco – 2 nights Puno – 1 night Lima



Day 1: Lima (Sun, 18 Oct)

D

Am/Pm: Arrive in Lima and transfer to the hotel.

Eve: Dinner with the group.

Day 2: Lima (Mon, 19 Oct)

B D

Am: Visit to Universidad Peruana Cayetano Heredia – Faculty of Odontostomatology, one of Peru's most prestigious institutions for dental education. Learn of the work at the Stomatology campus and the hospital's emphasis on applied technology and community outreach.

Pm: Half-day guided tour of the 'City of Kings', exploring Lima's historic centre. Visit the Larco Museum for an introduction to Peru's ancient past, see the country's finest private collection of pre-Columbian art.

Eve: Alfresco welcome dinner of classic Peruvian cuisine.

Day 3: Lima / Sacred Valley

B L

(Tues, 20 Oct)

Am: Fly to Cusco. Visit Sacsayhuaman Fortress, a magnificent Inca compound with panoramic views of the city.

Pm: Local lunch, followed by a visit to Museo

Sulca Textiles, renowned for its exquisite pieces created using ancestral Peruvian techniques. Continue to the town of Pisac, and explore its Inca sites and artisanal market. Visit ancient remains at the Inti Watana site, including the Inti Watana itself – a volcanic ritual stone used as an astronomical clock or Inca calendar to mark the changing seasons.

Day 4: Sacred Valley (Wed, 21 Oct)

B L

Am: Visit Virgen de VIDAWASI Children's Health Citadel in Urubamba, a non-profit organisation dedicated to decentralising specialised paediatric healthcare across Peru and providing free paediatric care, including dentistry.

Pm: Lunch at UNU restaurant with stunning views before visiting the salt fields of Maras and the Moray terraces; believed to be a former agricultural laboratory, an astronomical observatory, a place of worship, or all three.

Day 5: Sacred Valley (Thurs, 22 Oct)

B L

Am: Visit the Patacancha community, stroll through a traditional Quechua village, learn about their weaving technique, and visit a local home. Meet with the team at Sonrisas Solidarias Cusco (Solidarity Smiles Cusco), a non-profit organisation which provides free dental care to communities in the Cusco region.

Pm: Continue to the Inca citadel of Ollantaytambo, known as a 'live Inca town' because inhabitants still live according to customs and traditions inherited from their ancestors.

Day 6: Sacred Valley (Fri, 23 Oct)

B L

Am: Visit Misminay, a community in Peru renowned for preserving its cultural and ancestral traditions. The inhabitants continue to wear traditional dress and practice ancient farming techniques.

Pm: Experience cooking lunch with the Misminay community using freshly grown local produce. Return to the hotel and at leisure in the Sacred Valley. Optional Andean trek, subject to numbers.

Day 7: Sacred Valley / Machu Picchu B L D
(Sat, 24 Oct)

Am: Board the train to the legendary citadel of Machu Picchu, the great mountain-top city abandoned by the Inca Empire, reclaimed by the jungle and lost to humanity until its rediscovery in 1911.

Pm: Following a buffet lunch at Suno restaurant, explore the 'Lost City'. The guided tour includes the main plaza, the circular tower, the sacred sun dial, the royal quarters, the Temple of the Three Windows and the burial grounds.

Eve: Overnight and dinner in Aguas Calientes.

Day 8: Machu Picchu / Cusco B D
(Sun, 25 Oct)

Am: Option to return to Machu Picchu (at an additional cost) or take the more adventurous option of climbing Huayna Picchu, or at leisure in Aguas Calientes.

Pm: Train back to Cusco for dinner.

Day 9: Cusco (Mon, 26 Oct) B D

Am: Visit bustling San Pedro Market, popular with locals. Meet a local herbalist who will explain Andean pharmacopoeia, including the properties of the herbs that grow on the edge of the Andes such as muña, anise, boldo, chamomile, lemon verbena, black mint and asmachilca.

Pm: At leisure in Cusco before dinner at Tunpupa Restaurant.

Day 10: Cusco / Puno (Tues, 27 Oct) B L

Am: Travel through Andean valleys to Puno and Lake Titicaca. Meet with local brujas (witches) at Huasao, who create potions for love and success and cure illness with plant and animal rituals.

Pm: Continue to the colonial town of Andahuaylillas and visit its magnificent church. Visit APAINE, a health care

project for poor communities in the Andes. Transfer to the hotel in Puno.

Day 11: Puno (Wed, 28 Oct) B L

Am: Cruise across Lake Titicaca to the unique floating islands of the Uros. Continue to the island of Amantani, whose population is renowned for its fine crafts including pottery, textiles and stone carvings.

Pm: Enjoy a local lunch in the community and return by boat to Puno.

Day 12: Puno / Lima (Thurs, 29 Oct) B D

Am: Drive to Sillustani, a pre-Incan burial site on the shores of Lake Umayo, for a guided excursion of the tombs. See the archaeological remains of the chullpas – ancient, impressive circular stone towers built around 3,000 years ago, long before the Inca period. Continue to Juliaca Airport to fly to Lima.

Pm: Check in to the hotel. Farewell dinner at Huaca Pucllana Restaurant.

Day 13: Lima (Fri, 30 Oct) B

Am: Depart for airport or connect with the Ecuador and Galapagos tour: see below.

All itineraries are subject to change according to local conditions.

Ecuador and the Galapagos Island

30 Oct – 18 November 2026

JBT's annual tour to Ecuador and the Galapagos tour immediately follows this tour. Start with a pre-tour extension into the Amazon before continuing to colonial Quito. Stay in a boutique lodge in the Cloud Forest, ascend to a thermal resort in the Andes and cruise the Galapagos Island in a private yacht. Second Entrance to Machu Picchu

On day eight there is the option to revisit Machu Picchu, tickets must be purchased in advance. If you would like to visit for a second time, please let us know as soon as possible so we can arrange your tickets. These will be added to your invoice and are non-refundable once purchased. There is also the option to climb Huayna Picchu or of walking to Machu Picchu Mountain which involves a longer but less steep hike.

The cost is AUD \$244 per person and includes transfer and entrance fees.
