Professor Christine Hallett is a leading authority on nursing during the First World War. A practising nurse before attaining PhDs in Nursing and History, Christine was appointed Professor of Nursing History at the University of Manchester in 2010. Christine was Founding Chair of the United Kingdom Association for the History of Nursing, President of the European Association for the History of Nursing, and Associate Editor of the journal Nursing History Review. Widely published, she has spoken at conferences and symposia around the world; appeared on television and radio, and offered expert advice to the BBC, the Royal College of Nursing, the National Trust, and the Queen Alexandra's Royal Army Nursing Corps. Christine recently attained emeritus status.





Dr Simon Chaplin is an experienced historian, curator and public speaker. He is a past Monckton Copeman lecturer for the Society of Apothecaries, a Poynter lecturer for the British Society for the History of Medicine and a Hunterian Orator and has lectured on several JBT tours and cruises. His past roles include Director of the Hunterian Museum at the Royal College of Surgeons of England, where he is also a Fellow of the Faculty of Dental Surgery, and Head of the Wellcome Library and Director of Wellcome Collection. He is currently the Chief Executive of Arcadia, a charitable fund, and a trustee of Erasmus Darwin House in Lichfield and the Wende Museum in L.A.

Day 1: Istanbul, Turkey (Sat, 16 May)Pm: Arrive and transfer to the MS Monet.

Day 2: Canakkale, for Gallipoli and Troy (Sun, 17 May)

Am: Cruise into the Dardanelles and dock at Canakkale. Visit Gallipoli, Anzac Cove, The Gallipoli War Museum, Lone Pine and walk to the site of No 1 Casualty Clearing Station and the war memorials.

Pm: Reboard and cruise down the Dardanelles to visit the extensive UNESCO-listed remains of Troy, the site of the legendary Trojan horse. Continue cruising along the Gallipoli Peninsula.

Day 3: Dikili, for Pergamum (Mon, 18 May)

Am: Disembark in the pretty little port of Dikili and drive to the spectacular ruins of Pergamum. Visit the magnificent Acropolis and the Asclepieion, the first complete health spa the world had known.

Pm: Depart Dikili and cruise along the glittering Aegean coastline.

Day 4: Kusadasi, for Ephesus (Tues, 19 May)

Am: Explore Ephesus, the best-preserved classical city in the Eastern Mediterranean, and gain a glimpse into day-to-day life in the ancient world.

Pm: The afternoon is at leisure to further explore Ephesus or relax on the Monet or at Kusadasi.

Day 5: Bodrum (Wed, 20 May)

Am: Visit Bodrum Castle and Museum of Underwater Archaeology.

Pm: At leisure.

Eve: Cruise to Kos and overnight.

Day 6: Kos, Greece (Thurs, 21 May) B L D

Am: Explore Kos, the birthplace of Hippocrates. Visit the International Hippocratic Institute of Kos, the famous Hippocrates plane tree and the Asclepium.

Pm: Lunch at a local taverna. Visit the Museum of Medicine. At leisure to enjoy the local town before late departure.

Day 7: Rhodes (Fri, 22 May)

Am: Rhodes is one of the showpiece Greek islands, with an exquisitely preserved medieval city that was the legacy of the crusading Knights of St John, based here from 1309-1522. Take a half day tour of Rhodes, including the Street of the Knights, the Grand Master's Palace and the hospital of St John, now a museum.

Pm: At leisure with an option to visit the Valley of the Butterflies and the charming town of Lindos, dominated by the citadel.

Day 8: Naxos (Sat, 23 May)



Pm: Arrive Naxos at midday. At leisure to explore this beautiful Cycladean island, with its classic whitewashed buildings, blue doors and a fertile, mountainous interior flanked by stunning beaches. It also boasts impressive ancient sites, such as the Temple of Poseiden and Temple of Apollo in the atmospheric old town.

Day 9: Nafplio (Sun, 24 May)




Am: Drive through the Argos Plain to Mycenae, where you will enter by the Lion Gate. Explore the Royal Palace and the remains of the city walls.

Pm: Continue to the magnificent amphitheatre at Epidaurus, birthplace of the son of Apollo, Asclepius. Visit Asclepieion - the most celebrated healing centre of the classical world - as well as the theatre and museum. Explore Nafplion, one of the prettiest Greek towns, set on a lovely harbour surrounded by the Arcadian Mountains and crowned by a Venetian castle.

Day 10: Athens (Mon, 25 May)



Am: Disembark the MS Monet and depart or join the extension to Athens.

Day 1: Istanbul (Wed, 13 May)

Am: Arrive and transfer to the hotel.

Pm: Welcome dinner.

Day 2: Istanbul (Thurs, 14 May)

Am: Visit the Blue Mosque, the Hippodrome and the Hagia Sophia, one of Istanbul's most imposing sights.

Pm: Explore the Grand Bazaar and the Spice Bazaar.

Day 3: Istanbul (Fri, 15 May)

Am: Visit Scutari Barracks, where Florence Nightingale tended thousands of Turkish and allied soldiers during the Crimean War. Visit the museum dedicated to her in the northwest tower.



Ship - MS Monet

The charming and intimate MS Monet takes no more than 50 guests in 28 twin or double cabins with 29 crew, providing an excellent service experience. The ship can navigate small ports inaccessible to bigger cruise ships.

Onboard there is Wi-Fi internet (free of charge). She has ample seating space, a well-stocked mini library with modern A/V equipment and an onboard gym. The glass-enclosed dining room reflects the ports of call and accommodates all guests at one setting and allows for panoramic views of the stunning scenery.

The public areas include a main lounge and bar with comfortable sofas on the Lumiere Deck, a restaurant located on the Parisian Deck and the Lumiere Open Deck al fresco dining area, where meals can be enjoyed when weather permits. The Lumiere Sun Deck provides a delightful space with sun loungers and a Jacuzzi, ideal for relaxation and wonderful views.

All the cabins on board the MS Monet are designed for comfort and have a warm and inviting feel with light fabrics and wood trimmings. Cabins range in size from 9 to 22 square metres and Categories A, B & C are equipped with windows, while those in Category D have portholes. Cabins 104-107, 112, 119, 205 and 210-215 feature twin beds and all other cabins have fixed double beds.

Cabin facilities include en suite bathroom with shower, television, minifridge, safety deposit box, air conditioning and hairdryer.






Dining at night on the deck



Cabin Costs (per person)

Category D (Standard Single) €7,498

Camille or Parisian Deck cabins range in size from 9 to 12 square metres and feature two portholes and ensuite facilities.

Category D €6,180

Camille or Parisian Deck cabins range in size from 9 to 12 square metres and feature two portholes and ensuite facilities. Cabin numbers with twin beds are 104-107, 112, 119 & 205. All others have double beds.

Category C €6,800

Category C (Parisian & Lumiere) cabins range in size from 12 to 14 square metres and feature a window and ensuite facilities. Cabin numbers 210, 211, 212 and 215 have twin beds. All others have double beds.

Category B €7,326

Category B (Lumiere) cabins are 17 square metres and feature windows and double bed and ensuite facilities.

Category A €8,226

Category A (Lumiere) cabins range in size from 21 to 22 square metres and feature windows and a double bed and ensuite facilities.
