The Nile is a repository of stories that stretch back millennia. As the world's longest river, it has always been an essential source of life, sustaining one of the great cradles of civilisation and influencing the dawn of modern medicine.


Professor Rosalie David, OBE, BA, PhD, FRSA is Director of the KNH Centre for Biomedical Egyptology at the University of Manchester. The focus of her career has been the establishment of a new university specialisation – biomedical research within the field of Egyptology – to provide a different approach to understanding the civilisation of ancient Egypt. Graduating with a BA degree in Ancient History from University College London, she subsequently pursued a PhD study of ancient Egyptian temple ritual at the University of Liverpool. Rosalie has lectured at universities in many countries and, since 1974, on Nile cruises. She is the author of over 30 books, many articles, and has been a consultant and contributor to several television documentaries. In 2003, she was awarded an OBE for services to Egyptology and has received Fellowships of The Royal Society of Medicine and The Royal Society of Arts.

3 nights Giza – 7 nights Nile cruise – 2 nights Luxor



Day 1: Giza (Fri, 29 Jan) **D**

Am/Pm: Arrive in Cairo and check in to the hotel.

Eve: Welcome dinner at the hotel, with views of the Great Pyramid.

Day 2: Giza (Sat, 30 Jan) **B L D**

Am: Known as 'The City of a Thousand Minarets', Cairo has long been the centre of the region's political and cultural life. Visit the Pyramids of Giza and the Sphinx.

Pm: Tour the new Grand Egyptian Museum, the world's largest museum dedicated to a single civilization. See the spectacular King Tutankhamun Exhibition Hall and many artifacts on display for the first time.

Day 3: Giza (Sun, 31 Jan) **B L**

Am: View the original Sakkara Step Pyramid before entering the Tomb of Ankhmahor to visit Imhotep Museum.

Pm: Tour the superb Royal Mummies Hall at the National Museum of Egyptian Civilization and discover ancient life through exhibits on medicine, agriculture, engineering, art, and music.

Day 4: Giza / Luxor (Mon, 1 Feb) **B L D**

Am: Fly from Cairo to Luxor. Explore Luxor Temple and the massive Karnak complex, visit the Sacred Lake and King Tuthmosis III's Botanical Hall, and see plant reliefs from his Syrian campaigns.

Pm: Board the Jaz Regent cruise ship and commence your journey along the Nile.
Talk: Ancient Egyptian civilisation, the historical background and significance of the Nile, and the beginnings of civilisation.

Day 5: Luxor / Esna / Edfu (Tues, 2 Feb) **B L D**

Am: *Talk: An introduction to ancient Egyptian medicine including medical papyri, art, mummies and inscriptions.*

Pm: Sail to Edfu and pass through Esna Lock. There is time at leisure to relax with lovely views.

Day 6: Edfu / Aswan (Wed, 3 Feb) **B L D**

Am: Guided tour of Edfu Temple – dedicated to the falcon god, Horus, it is one of the best-preserved temples in Egypt.

Pm: Sail to the city of Aswan with its distinctly African atmosphere and relaxed pace. Here the Nile is at its most beautiful, flowing through amber desert and granite rocks, around emerald islands covered in palm groves and tropical plants.

Talk: Mummies – A resource for studying disease, treatment and lifestyle.

Day 7: Aswan (Thurs, 4 Feb) **B L D**

Am: Visit Philae Temple, a dedication to Isis, goddess of birth, magic, and healing. Continue to the Aswan High Dam.

Pm: Take a felucca trip to Kitchener Island Botanical Garden and Nubia Island to learn about traditional Nubian medicine.

Day 8: Aswan (Fri, 5 Feb) **B L D**

Am: Optional flight to visit the UNESCO World Heritage site of Abu Simbel or take a bird watching tour to a Nubian village.

Pm: At leisure.

Day 9: Aswan / Kom Ombo / Edfu **B L D**
(Sat, 6 Feb)

Am: *Talk: 'The temples as centres of healing.'*

Pm: Cruise back along the Nile towards Kom Ombo Temple, where you'll see a rare, engraved image believed to show early surgical instruments – scalpels, curettes, forceps, a dilator, scissors, and medicine bottles from Roman Egypt. Sail on to Edfu.

Day 10: Edfu / Luxor (Sun, 7 Feb) **B L D**

Am: Sail back towards Luxor. *Talk: The Ancient Egyptian contribution to Graeco-Roman and later medicine.*

Pm: At leisure while sailing.

Day 11: Luxor (Mon, 8 Feb) **B L D**

Am: Visit the Temple of Hathor at Denderah, with its sanatorium where patients were treated with 'Dream Therapy'.

Pm: Lunch at the House of Life, Abydos Hotel. Continue to the Temple of Sethos I at Abydos, which boasts the finest painted hieroglyphs in Egypt. Check in to hotel.

Day 12: Luxor (Tues, 9 Feb) **B L D**

Am: Visit the Valley of the Kings, famed for the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb and the 'curse of the pharaohs.' Access three tombs and Queen Hatshepsut's uniquely designed temple, which features a former sanatorium terrace. Continue to The Ramesseum, the location of a priest's tomb (likely a physician). Conclude in the village of Deir el Medina.

Eve: Farewell dinner in a local restaurant.

Day 13: Luxor / Cairo (Wed, 10 Feb) **B**

Am: Depart for flight back to Cairo or take the extension to Alexandria.

Extension to Alexandria: 10 – 13 February 2027

Day 13: Luxor / Alexandria **B D**
(Wed, 10 Feb)

Am: Fly to Cairo. Drive to Alexandria via the Wadi Natrun Coptic desert monasteries; one of Christianity's most sacred areas between the 4th and 7th century. Arrive in Alexandria and check in to the hotel.

Day 14: Alexandria (Thurs, 11 Feb) **B D**

Am: Tour of Alexandria, including a visit to the catacombs and the Roman Theatre.

Pm: Explore the National Museum, which traces the city's history from antiquity, and the Roman and Manuscript Museums. Visit the Citadel of Quait Bay, Abu El Abbass Mosque and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

Eve: Dinner at the Fish Market Restaurant.

Day 15: Alexandria / Cairo **B L**
(Fri, 12 Feb)

Am: Drive to El Alamein, a crucial turning point for the Allies during the war. Visit the Commonwealth, German and Italian cemeteries, and the military museum.

Pm: Return to Cairo after lunch.

Day 16: Cairo (Sat, 13 Feb) **B**

Am: Depart hotel after breakfast.

The Jaz Regent is a five-star deluxe cruise ship with excellent facilities and cuisine. Optional visit to Abu Simbel

Fly from Aswan to Abu Simbel to visit the relocated temples, then fly back to Aswan. The temples were originally carved from the mountainside during the reign of Pharaoh Ramesses II in the 13th century BC, as a monument to himself and his Queen Nefertari. The complex was relocated to higher ground to make way for the Aswan High Dam. This is a seven-hour round trip excursion. **The cost per person is USD \$576.**

The cost of the tour is USD \$6,778 per person sharing
