**Following many successful midwifery tours we have run to China and beyond, this itinerary is designed to give participants a fascinating insight into China and its approach to midwifery and maternity care.**

From 2,000-year-old Hangzhou, where China's Normal Birth Movement originated on the shores of vast West Lake, continue to imperial Beijing before travelling by high-speed train to the Silk Road city of Xi'an and Chengdu in Sichuan Province. Continue to Guilin in spectacular Guangxi Province, a favourite of artists for centuries for its incredible karst landscapes. Cruise on the Li River past jaw dropping scenery to finish in the cobblestone town of Yangshuo.

This tour examines the rapid development of midwifery, maternity care and childcare in China and how these incorporate Traditional

Chinese Medicine (TCM). It looks at the challenges posed due to its rapid economic development and the legacy of the One Child Policy, as well as how Western Medicine and TCM are integrated in practice in China.

A full cultural programme, looking at contemporary and traditional culture and society, will provide a context to the professional visits. Experience the great cities of China and enjoy the stunning landscapes, history and society of this extraordinary land.

# Itinerary 1 – 13 June 2027

**B** = Breakfast **L** = Lunch **D** = Dinner

2 nights Hangzhou – 3 nights Beijing – 2 nights Xi'an – 2 nights Chengdu  
– 1 night Guilin – 2 nights Yangshuo



## Day 1: Hangzhou (Tues, 1 June)

**D**

**Pm:** Arrive and transfer to the hotel in Hangzhou. This historical city dates back 2,000 years and is full of spectacular architecture and scenery.

**Eve:** Welcome dinner.

## Day 2: Hangzhou (Wed, 2 June)

**B D**

**Am:** Visit Hangzhou's First People's Hospital and learn of the development of China's first Midwifery Led Normal Birth Unit (MLNBU) in 2008 (with the support of academics at Edinburgh University). Visit the Normal Birth Unit and meet local midwives.

**Pm:** Cruise on the tranquil expanse of West Lake before visiting a silk factory.

## Day 3: Hangzhou / Beijing (Thurs, 3 June)

**B D**

**Am:** Fly to Beijing, China's great imperial city, where the ancient and the modern collide on the most magnificent scale.

**Pm:** Visit the high-tech Beijing Antai Hospital, which mainly uses endoscopic minimally invasive surgery, excelling in gynaecology and obstetrics.

## Day 4: Beijing (Fri, 4 June)

**B D**

**Am:** Visit the vast expanse of Tiananmen Square and the impressive Forbidden City, once barred to all but the inner royal circle.

**Pm:** Take a walking tour of one of the traditional hutong districts of Beijing, the oldest areas in the city, to explore the laneways of markets, bazaars and cafes of Old Beijing.

**Eve:** Option to see the gravity-defying Beijing Acrobats.

## Day 5: Beijing (Sat, 5 June)

**B D**

**Am:** Visit the beautiful Summer Palace.

**Pm:** Visit the iconic Great Wall and spend time exploring this great architectural wonder.

**Eve:** Enjoy a traditional Peking Roast Duck dinner.

## Day 6: Beijing / Xi'an (Sun, 6 June)

**B D**

**Am:** Fly from Beijing to Xi'an, the ancient Silk Road hub and probably the first truly multicultural city in the world.

**Pm:** Visit the medieval city walls, still perfectly intact today.

## Day 7: Xi'an (Mon, 7 June)

**B D**

**Am:** Visit the amazing necropolis of the Terracotta Warriors.

**Pm:** Visit a local maternity clinic and meet with staff.

**Eve:** Optional visit to see traditional, graceful Tang Dynasty Theatre.

## Day 8: Xi'an / Chengdu (Tues, 8 June)

**B D**

**Am:** Option to watch or join early morning t'ai chi in the local park. Take the high-speed train to Chengdu.

**Pm:** Walking tour of Chengdu old town and a street market known for its Tibetan arts & crafts.

**Day 9: Chengdu (Wed, 9 June)** B D

**Am:** Visit the Hospital of Chinese Medicine.  
**Pm:** Visit the Chengdu Panda Research Base – the lovable pandas make this a favourite visit for many!  
**Eve:** Hot pot dinner.

**Day 10: Chengdu / Guilin** B D  
(Thurs, 10 June)

**Am:** Scenic train journey through the mountains to Guilin.  
**Pm:** Check in to hotel and at leisure.

**Day 11: Guilin / Yangshuo (Fri, 11 June)** B L

**Am:** Cruise down the Li River to the attractive town of Yangshuo. At leisure.  
**Eve:** Option to see the spectacular local *son et lumière* show.

**Day 12: Yangshuo (Sat, 12 June)** B D

**Am:** Visit a rural maternity hospital and examine baby massage. Explore the beautiful countryside and local villages. Visit a village health worker (formerly known as 'barefoot doctors').  
**Pm:** Option of Sichuan cookery class at Cloud 9 or at leisure.  
**Eve:** Dinner at Cloud 9.

**Day 13: Yangshuo / Hong Kong** B  
(Sun, 13 June)

**Am:** Transfer to the station for high-speed train to Hong Kong (Kowloon West).
