Begin in the elegant capital Hanoi, then sail overnight through the towering limestone karsts of Halong Bay. Travel on to the ancient imperial city of Hue, follow the coast to the lantern-lit streets of Hoi An, and finish in the fast-paced energy of Ho Chi Minh City. For those wanting to extend the journey, join an optional extension to the temples of Angkor Wat in Cambodia after the tour.

profession and she is also an Honorary Life Member of OT Australia. Internationally, Marilyn has been made an Honorary Member of the Swedish Occupational Therapy Association and the Moroccan Association of Occupational Therapy, and an Honorary Fellow of WFOT, the highest international honour an occupational therapist can receive.

In 2023 Marilyn was awarded an Officer of the Order of Australia (AO) for her contribution to the profession.

Cruise through Halong Bay



3 nights Hanoi – 1 night cruise, Halong Bay - 2 nights Hue – 3 nights Hoi An
– 2 nights Ho Chi Minh City – **Extension** 3 nights Siem Reap



Day 1: Hanoi (Sun, 2 May) **D**

Am/Pm: Arrive and transfer to the **Silk Path Hotel**.

Eve: Local dinner.

Day 2: Hanoi (Mon, 3 May) **B D**

Am: Visit Hoan Kiem Lake, Ngoc Son Temple and the Temple of Literature, Vietnam's first university.

Pm: Walk through Hanoi's '36 Streets,' where each street is named after the produce sold there and visit a street of traditional medicine. Take a cyclo tour of the Old Quarter to catch a glimpse of ancient Hanoi.

Eve: Welcome dinner.

Day 3: Hanoi (Tues, 4 May) **B L**

Am: Visit Bach Mai Hospital's Rehabilitation Centre, Vietnam's top national referral centre for rehabilitation – and its largest – and meet its multidisciplinary OT team at work shaping the profession's growth.

Pm: Have lunch at KOTO, an Australian Vietnamese charity that trains disadvantaged youth in hospitality skills. Free time to wander Hanoi's atmospheric streets, linger in cafes, and browse its shops.

Day 4: Hanoi / Halong Bay **B L D**

(Wed, 5 May)

Am: Set off early for Halong Bay, where thousands of steep-sided islands tower above the emerald waters.

Pm: Board the elegant **Indochine Lan Ha** in time for lunch. Cruise through beautiful Halong Bay – relax on deck, visit islands, kayak or enjoy the scenery from your cabin balcony.

Day 5: Halong Bay / Hue **Brunch**

(Thurs, 6 May)

Am: Disembark and visit Legend Pearl, one of the most famous centres for cultivating and processing saltwater pearls in Halong Bay.

Pm: Professional visit to Quang Ninh Geriatric and Rehabilitation Hospital, a respected facility focusing on elderly care and rehabilitation. Transfer to the airport to fly to Hue.

Eve: Check in to the Silk Path Hotel.

Day 6: Hue (Fri, 7 May) **B L**

Am: Visit the dramatic Royal Tu Duc Tomb.

Pm: Explore mighty Hue Citadel, which was home to the nation's last royal family and still bears battle scars from defending the Imperial City. Continue to the innovative Quang Hop Integrative Medicine Clinic and learn of their work using acupuncture.

Day 7: Hue / Hoi An (Sat, 8 May) **B D**

Am: Take one of the world's great railway journeys along the South China Sea to Hoi An (bags transferred by coach).

Pm: Arrive and check in to **La Siesta Resort**.

Day 8: Hoi An (Sun, 9 May)

B L

Am: Hoi An was once a thriving port popular with European, Chinese and Japanese merchants. It is an excellent place to have a local tailor run up a bespoke outfit or shop in the silk market. Take a walking tour of its atmospheric old quarter.

Pm: Take a boat across Thu Bon River and visit a family-run vegetable and herb farm in Kim Bong. Enjoy lunch made with fresh home-grown ingredients and relax with a foot massage.

Day 9: Hoi An (Mon, 10 May)

B D

Am: Drive to visit Da Nang Psychiatric Hospital and learn about mental health rehabilitation in Vietnam.

Pm: At leisure before a local dinner.

Day 10: Hoi An / Ho Chi Minh City (Tues, 11 May)

B D

Am: Fly to cosmopolitan Ho Chi Minh City (HCMC) and check in to **Liberty Central Riverside**.

Pm: Visit the Children's Rehabilitation Centre and learn about paediatric rehabilitation.

Eve: Finish the day with drinks at the Rex Hotel's rooftop bar — site of the Vietnam War's famous "Five O'Clock Follies" press briefings. Enjoy dinner with local occupational therapists from the University of Medicine and Pharmacy at Ho Chi Minh City (UMP HCMC).

Day 11: Ho Chi Minh City (Wed, 12 May)

B D

Am: Guided tour of Ben Thanh food market. Visit UMP HCMC's Rehabilitation Department, a leading OT and speech therapy training centre, to meet faculty and clinical staff and see rehabilitation education in action.

Pm: Visit the French era Notre Dame Cathedral and Reunification Palace.

Eve: Farewell dinner.

Day 12: Ho Chi Minh City (Thurs, 13 May)

B

Am: Depart or take extension (next section).

Extension: 13 – 16 May 2026

Day 12: Ho Chi Minh City

/ **Siem Reap** (Thurs, 13 May)

Am: Fly to Siem Reap in Cambodia and check in to **Hotel Lotus Blanc**.

Pm: Dinner at the Foreign Correspondents Club.

Day 13: Siem Reap (Fri, 14 May)

B L

Am: Start early to visit atmospheric Bayon Temple and Ta Prohm, still entwined with centuries-old tree roots. Continue to Angkor Wat, part of the Khmer city of Angkor (802-1220 AD) — at its peak likely the largest city in the world, home to over a million people.

Pm: At leisure.

Day 14: Siem Reap (Sat, 15 May)

B D

Am: Visit the Land Mine Museum and learn about their important work.

Pm: At leisure.

Eve: Farewell dinner.

Day 15: Siem Reap (Sun, 16 May)

B

Am: Depart hotel after breakfast.
