Here at IJM, we know how powerful prayer is. We've seen God act in the most extraordinary ways in response to prayer – enabling IJM to work with police and partners to **BRING OVER 98,600 PEOPLE TO SAFETY** from slavery and violence and seeing **SLAVERY REDUCE BY UP TO 86%** in places where we've worked.

Persisting in prayer isn't always easy, especially for issues as vast and brutal as slavery and violence. That's why '25 in 25' will help break down these issues and walk with you in prayer as together we seek to bring freedom, justice and hope into the world's darkest places.

Each day, you'll be briefly introduced to an area of IJM's work that urgently needs breakthrough, before turning to God, guided by prayers from a variety of church leaders and IJM partners. Please be aware that some of the content may be difficult to read. If God lays a particular area on your heart, there are opportunities to dig deeper throughout the resource.

As you begin, you may want to pause and consider how you can use this booklet in a way that works best for you. For some, it might be helpful to print it out and pop it in your Bible or journal. For others, choosing a set time each day could be a helpful rhythm – you could even set an alert for 25 minutes past the hour!

However you decide to take part, we hope that this journey serves and blesses your desire to pray for justice and brings you closer to God's heart.

THEME: Forced scamming

Forced scamming is a new, complex and fast-growing form of modern slavery.

Right now, thousands of victims are being tricked, trafficked, trapped in guarded compounds in South East Asia and forced to scam people like you and me, under the threat of extreme violence and electrocution.

Interpol announced that forced scamming is now a global crisis 'representing a serious and imminent threat to public safety.' Forced scamming affects us all, and it's urgent that it ends.

Today let's be bold in our prayers, asking for God to bring forced scamming to an end.

THEME: Online sexual abuse and exploitation of children

Online sexual abuse and exploitation is one of the darkest forms of human trafficking. Children in countries like the Philippines are being abused for sex offenders around the world, including the UK, to watch online.

Approximately 1 in every 100 children in the Philippines was trafficked to create new child sexual exploitation materials in 2022, according to a study by IJM and the University of Nottingham Rights Lab. Shockingly, according to the UK National Crime Agency, the UK is the third largest global consumer of livestreamed abuse.

RUBY* is living proof that God answers prayer today and brings his people out of the darkest situations.

After the death of her parents, Ruby was **tricked by traffickers** who offered her a job in a computer shop. But when she arrived, Ruby was trapped and locked in a house with a guard outside. She was sexually abused live over the internet for sex offenders around the world to watch online.

One night, in desperation, Ruby cried out, 'Lord, if you're real, get me out of here!' The very next day, IJM and local police brought Ruby and five other girls to safety. Thanks to Ruby's testimony, the traffickers were arrested and eventually sentenced to 15 years in prison.

Today, Ruby is a **powerful advocate** for ending this crime. She has experienced so much freedom that she chose to forgive the perpetrators – even praying for them at the back of the courtroom after their conviction.

"I am a living testimony of God's immeasurable love. Indeed, we have a great God who is able to turn each of our painful stories into powerful testimonies."



Pray today for freedom for every child who is being trafficked and abused. Please pray for God to convict the hearts of every perpetrator of online sexual abuse in the UK and around the globe.

THEME: Sex trafficking

Human trafficking generates more than £100 billion a year – two-thirds of which comes from sex trafficking. This form of modern slavery sees traffickers coerce or deceive another person, most often women and children, into sexual exploitation for their profit. Simply put, sex trafficking makes a business out of sexual violence.

IJM works to combat sex trafficking in the UK, Romania, Kenya, the Philippines and across South Asia. We pray today for sex trafficking to decrease so much that our work in these countries is no longer necessary.

THEME: PRAISE GOD for 98,600+ people brought to safety

Since IJM was established over 27 years ago, we've worked with police and partners to bring tens of thousands of children, women and men to safety from slavery and violence.

THEME: Trafficking in the UK and across Europe

Did you know that nearly two million people are trapped in slavery in Europe – including the UK?

IJM has been working to protect people from trafficking in Europe since 2019. Many of our cases involve women trafficked from Romania to the UK for sexual exploitation.

When **MARA*** fell in love with a young man online, it seemed her dreams of a better life were finally coming true.

The man invited Mara to move from Romania to live with him in the UK. But when she arrived, he trafficked her for sexual exploitation.

For months, night after night, Mara was taken from one city to another across the UK and sexually exploited. Mara lived in **constant fear, suffering extreme physical abuse,** while the traffickers spent the money she earned on parties, cars, houses, and designer clothes.

After almost a year, Mara managed to escape. The perpetrators tried to flee the country but were caught by UK police. At the beginning of 2023, thanks to Mara's testimony and IJM's support, the **traffickers were found guilty**.



Pray today for women trapped in slavery in the UK. Please pray that IJM would continue to work effectively with local police forces to locate and bring these women to safety.

THEME: Protecting refugees fleeing Ukraine

War in Ukraine has put millions more women and children in Europe at risk of trafficking. Forced to flee their homes, many refugees are now scattered across Europe and vulnerable to false offers of work or housing.

IJM was amongst the first organisations working on the border between Romania and Ukraine when the war erupted, helping to protect vulnerable women and children from being exploited. Thanks to the support and prayers of people like you, we've protected thousands of people from trafficking and we're continuing to provide essential support.

Pray today for refugees in Europe, that they might be kept safe from the trauma of trafficking.

THEME: Slavery in supply chains

Over 50 million people are trapped in slavery right now. Shockingly, it's likely that many of the everyday products we use here in the UK have slavery in their supply chains – everything from coffee and chocolate to mobile phones and clothing.

17-year-old **ADHIR** was exploited in order to make shoe soles in a factory in South Asia. Adhir was forced to work 16-hour days and frequently subjected to violence.

Adhir remembers, "We worked with rubber soles which had to be dipped in strong and pungent chemicals. All of us lived in a small room within the factory building and there was just nowhere to go."

IJM supported law enforcement, local government, and partners to bring Adhir to safety.

Today, after receiving **trauma-informed care** from IJM, Adhir is free from exploitation, has completed his education, and has a stable job in a hospital.



Pray for UK businesses to commit to making their supply chains free from exploitation, so that people like Adhir are not trafficked in the first place.

THEME: Survivor leaders


IJM is privileged to partner with the **Global Survivor Network (GSN)** – an international group of survivors shaping and leading the movement to stop slavery and violence. People with lived experiences have unique insights into how to stop violence and it's vital that we listen to them. As the GSN says: 'a survivor-led movement will change the world.'

"When survivors are at the table where decisions are made, change happens."

VICTORIA is a founding member of the GSN and Women in Action for Women, a Ugandan organisation that provides vocational and business skills training to women and young people. She also currently works as a consultant for IJM.

As a schoolgirl, Victoria was abducted by the Lord's Resistance Army and held captive for eight years. After she escaped with her children, Victoria began sharing her story and amplifying the stories of other survivors on local, national, and international platforms.

Among her many achievements, Victoria facilitated more than 500 women to successfully petition the Parliament of Uganda to address the plight of survivors of sexual violence and war in northern Uganda. To recognise her outstanding contribution in protecting women, Victoria received the 2019 Amnesty International's Ginetta Sagan Award for Women's and Children's Rights.



Praise God for the courage of survivor leaders like Victoria and pray that their advocacy would shift the hearts and attitudes of people around the world, including those in power.

THEME: Child trafficking

12 million children are trapped in slavery today. That's the equivalent of every child in England and Wales.

IJM works with local authorities and communities to protect children from trafficking around the world, including in Ghana where many children are trafficked to work in the fishing industry on Lake Volta. These children are forced to do dangerous work, like diving deep into the lake to untangle fishing nets, and often experience physical punishment and abuse.

In the words of Jerry, a survivor of child trafficking in Ghana and an advocate for an end to child trafficking, "We call on government and all leaders to support the police and Department of Social Welfare to rescue all our brothers and sisters who have been trafficked."

Will you join us in praying for the millions of children who are trafficked and trapped in exploitation in Ghana and around the world?

THEME: Perpetrators of slavery and violence

While we pursue God's justice here on earth and celebrate more than 7,200 court convictions, we also recognise the complexity that perpetrators of violence are also made in God's image.

It can be so difficult to know how or even want to pray for traffickers and people who cause so much pain. But as followers of Jesus, we look to his words to help us.

"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbour and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." - Matthew 5:43-44 (ESV)

We therefore choose to do as Jesus commands us – to pray even now for traffickers and perpetrators of violence and abuse, that they would be led to repentance through the Holy Spirit, that justice would be established, and they too would be able to experience the loving mercy of God.

PRAYER: By Rich Johnson, New Wine England Leader and Vicar of All Saints Worcester

Father, may you break our hearts for the plight of your children, trapped in slavery all around the world.

Jesus, remind us of your victory over sin and evil and your power to set people free.

Holy Spirit, stir in us deep faith to contend in prayer, until all are free from oppression.

May we as the people of God never become weary, cynical or apathetic. Keep us bold, courageous and committed to playing our part in seeing justice prevail.

THEME: Cross-border trafficking

Children, women and men are trafficked across international borders for sexual exploitation or forced labour. Climate change and conflicts around the world are driving an increase in cross-border trafficking.

12-year-old **NY*** and 16-year-old **LALIN*** were trafficked from Cambodia into domestic servitude in Malaysia. "*My employer's children hit me, pulled my hair and spat in my food. I felt hurt and worthless." Lalin told us.*

Imagine being trapped in a foreign country. Abused. Forced to work long hours with little food. Ny was also sexually assaulted: "I was very scared... I thought of ending my life."



Ny and Lalin were trapped in slavery in Malaysia for two years until, thanks to the support of people like you around the world, IJM worked with police to bring the girls to safety.

"When they helped me return to Cambodia, I felt reborn." - Lalin

After two years on the run, the police caught and arrested the trafficker. He was sentenced to 17 years in prison – meaning he can't harm any more children.

Trafficking knows no borders and can happen to anyone. In 2022, Sir Mo Farah shared that he was trafficked as a child from East Africa into domestic servitude here in the UK. Please pray for increased global collaboration so that trafficking can be ended for good.

PRAYER: By Gareth MacLean, Church leader, Orangefield Presbyterian Church, Belfast

Loving Heavenly Father, touch our imaginations and help us see those who are living in turmoil or trauma, those who are in the midst of darkness or danger, those who are feeling lost, lonely or longing for freedom.

Your word, Lord, reminds us that as we fix our hearts and hope on you, the Living God, you renew our strength and cause us to soar on eagles' wings.

Forgive us when we reduce these words to nothing more than a catchy melody, a trite statement or a prayer we fail to live out.

For those living with darkness, either around them or within, may they know your presence with them Holy Spirit, filling them with strength and hope.

For those living with darkness, either around them or within, may they know your promise Jesus, that one day you will return, wiping every tear and righting every wrong.

THEME: Bonded labour

Bonded labour is a form of labour trafficking where individuals or whole families are forced to work to repay a debt. Traffickers manipulate, lie about, and add to this debt to trap people in forced labour for years – or even generations.

Bonded labour goes beyond just bad working conditions for little to no pay. Victims may face physical, verbal and sexual abuse, and cannot leave to find other work or protect their families.

Please pray that bonded labour is eradicated across South Asia, and families are released from their false debt so that they can find fulfilling and empowering work.

PRAYER: By Wole Agbaje, Leader of Imprint Church, London

Heavenly Father, I thank you for your grace and mercy. I thank you that you see every person who is wounded and oppressed around the world.

Holy Spirit, I pray that you would come and be their light and guide. Would you be their comforter in times of need. And amid sorrow, would they find more and more of you.

THEME: Sexual violence against children

Tragically, children around the world are highly vulnerable to sexual violence. Worldwide, up to 50% of sexual assaults are committed against girls under 16 years old. (UN Women)

Girls like four-year-old **TATIANA** in Guatemala who was playing hide-and-seek when a teenage boy trapped her and violently assaulted her.

"He suggested his room would be the perfect place to hide, as no one would find us."

Now an adult with her own daughter (pictured together), Tatiana advocates for an end to sexual violence against children and women as part of an IJM-supported survivor group.

"I invite you to raise your voice and join it with mine. For a world free of violence and full of justice."

Today let's join our voices with Tatiana as we pray together for children who are affected by sexual violence and ask God to bring each one healing.

THEME: Aftercare

Helping police bring children, women and men to safety from slavery and violence is just the beginning of IJM's work. Providing specialist care to help survivors heal is just as vital.

People who've experienced slavery or violence are deeply traumatised, and they remain highly vulnerable. The journey to healing is long. It doesn't happen overnight.

But with long-term, professional support – from immediate crisis care, to counselling and support to obtain justice – IJM's aftercare teams have helped over 9,300 survivors reach a place of sustainable recovery.

Thousands more survivors are on the journey to healing. Please pray that, with IJM's support, each person is able to find fuller freedom and closure.

AFTERCARE IN ACTION:

"God sent you to me because the burden was getting heavy."

These powerful words were spoken to IJM by **HELSA***, a mother in Uganda, after her young daughter **PEACE*** was sexually abused.

Helsa struggled to get Peace the support she needed, until she met IJM. IJM provided Peace with professional counselling to help her heal, and supported Helsa to testify in court. Together, we saw the perpetrator sentenced to eight years in prison.

From the moment she reported the abuse to the police, Helsa says she didn't stop praying and fasting. She's seen her prayers answered: Peace, who was once withdrawn and afraid, has become a happy and playful child again with big dreams for the future.

"With God, I know she is going to make it," Helsa shares proudly.



THEME: Violence against women

1 in every 3 women experiences violence in her lifetime. IJM works with local authorities to combat violence against women and children, in Guatemala, Bolivia, El Salvador, Kenya, Colombia, Peru and Uganda. Together, we've helped bring over 21,800 women and children to safety from violence.


Pray for changes in attitudes towards women in communities where violence has become normalised. Pray that perceptions shift so that women are respected and valued, and abuse is condemned.

THEME: IJM's teams on the frontlines

Today IJM has more than 1,300 staff working across the world – from investigators in the Philippines helping police bring children to safety, and social workers in Guatemala supporting survivors to heal from sexual violence, to lawyers in Kenya speaking up for victims of police abuse in court.

These inspiring teams are confronting the darkness of injustice daily but are passionate about bringing justice and hope to those with whom they work.

Today let's pray for the Holy Spirit to fill each staff member afresh, protect them in their work, and sustain them with the joy of the Lord who is their strength.

WHERE WE WORK



THEME: PRAISE GOD for thousands of people brought to safety in 2024

When we read large numbers, we can easily lose sight of the fact that each individual number represents a person made in God's image.

Every time we hear the story of a person being brought to safety, we celebrate. And when we reflect over a year and know that we've helped authorities bring thousands of children, women and men to safety – each with a name and purpose – we celebrate.

In October 2024, **PHILIP*** and six other boys (not pictured), some as young as 11, were brought to safety from trafficking in Ghana.

The boys had been forced to work up to 17 hours a day in the fishing industry. They reported being pricked by hooks and severely beaten.



After several months, Philip decided he couldn't suffer any more and **escaped on a canoe.** An IJM-trained police investigator recognised the signs of trafficking and quickly called the Department of Social Welfare (DSW) and IJM for support.

IJM assisted the police to bring six more boys to safety from trafficking at the hands of the same fisherman.

Believing that God had directed him to speak to Philip, he shared, "God really wanted this boy and the others to be free."

Today, let's give thanks for freedom for Philip and every other person, and praise God for all the breakthrough we saw last year, in expectant hope of more to come in 2025.
