SEASON REVIEW: GARDNER PLANTS 8TH CONSECUTIVE USAC CRA SPRINT TITLE IN 2021

Rich Vogler, A.J. Foyt, Sleepy Tripp, Mel Kenyon, Dave Darland, Bryan Clauson and now Damion Gardner.

In 2021, Gardner (Concord, Calif.) added his name to this exclusive cast of seven drivers to reach 100 career USAC feature victories, adding six more scores during the season.

Moreover, his 8th consecutive series championship, and 9th overall with the AMSOIL USAC CRA Sprint Car Series, made Gardner one of just six individuals to collect at least nine career USAC driving titles, a company he keeps with Foyt, Clauson, Vogler, Tripp and Tony Hunt.

The Concord, Calif. native won three of his six at California's Perris Auto Speedway in April and June with number 100 arriving in October. A win at Santa Maria (Calif.) Raceway in July was followed by a memorable victory lane speech that put an exclamation mark on his Louie Vermeil Classic victory at Silver Dollar Speedway in Chico, Calif. The sixth and final came in October at Arizona Speedway.

The 38-point margin of victory provided the ninth title for the driver affectionately known as "The Demon" over chief rival Brody Roa. Gardner previously gathered USAC CRA Sprint Car championships in 2005-2013-2014-2015-2016-2017-2018-2019.

Brody Roa (Garden Grove, Calif.) scored twice at Perris in May's Salute to Indy and in August during California Racers Hall of Fame Night. Roa's second place standing in the points was his sixth consecutive top-three finish in the final rundown, and his third time as the series runner-up.

For Austin Williams (Yorba Linda, Calif.), it was his third-straight top-three result in the CRA standings, finishing third in 2021 on the strength of a pair of victories, the first coming at Perris in July for the 2009 series Rookie of the Year with the second coming at California's Petaluma Speedway in September.

Max Adams (Loomis, Calif.), the 2016 USAC CRA Rookie of the Year, became the first driver to reach multiple victories with the series in 2021, winning for the first time with CRA in nearly three years with two early season scores in March at The Dirt Track at Kern County Raceway Park in Bakersfield, Calif. and again on March 26 at Thunderbowl Raceway in Tulare, Calif.

Brady Bacon (Broken Arrow, Okla.), the four-time USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National Champion, migrated west during the month of November to capture two National/CRA co-sanctioned events – prelim nights for both the Oval Nationals at Perris and the Western World Championships at Arizona Speedway.

Similar stories unfolded during the National tour's venture to the west in November by Jake Swanson (Anaheim, Calif.) who captured a daring victory on the final corner of the final lap at Perris in an Oval Nationals prelim. Kevin Thomas Jr. (Cullman, Ala.), meanwhile, took the Oval Nationals finale, the third of his career. Logan Seavey (Sutter, Calif.) was the master in the closer at Arizona Speedway's Western World.

Charles Davis Jr. (Buckeye, Ariz.) returned to USAC CRA victory lane for the first time in 14 seasons with a triumph at Perris in September. Chase Johnson (Penngrove, Calif.) made it to the checkered flag first in a wildly entertaining and controversial finish at California's Bakersfield Speedway in May.

Two first-time USAC CRA feature winners dialed up victories in 2021, first by Ryan Timmons in the season opener in March at Kern County, doing so with a 360 c.i. engine versus a field full of 410s. Carson Short (Marion, Ill.) got the job done in the Louie Vermeil Classic opener in September at Silver Dollar.

Chris Gansen (Verdemont Heights, Calif.) finished a career-best 4th in the series standings. Best career points finishes were also earned by 8th place Eddie Tafoya Jr. (Chino Hills, Calif.) and 9th place Verne Sweeney (Lomita, Calif.). Corona, California's Cody Williams returned to the top-five with a 5th place finish in the points while Corona, California's Tommy Malcolm took 7th and Yorba Linda, California's Logan Williams was 10th.

Austin Grabowski (Riverside, Calif.) finished 15th in the standings, tops among all first-year competitors, which earned him 2021 USAC CRA Sprint Car Rookie of the Year honors.

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RYAN TIMMONS SCORES FIRST USAC/CRA WIN AT KERN COUNTY DEBUT

BAKERSFIELD, CA – MARCH 12, 2021... Holding off veteran Davey Ray, Ryan Timmons (Pleasant Hill, CA) earned his first career \$3,000 AMSOIL USAC/CRA Sprint Car victory at The Dirt Track at Kern County Raceway Park (KCRP).

Piloting the family owned #29 Timmons Auto & Truck Repair / Evergood Fine Foods CS9 with 360 power, the 2016 USAC West Coast Sprint Car Rookie of the Year won the Kern County debut over hard charger Ray, Chris Gansen (first podium), "The Big Game Hunter" Austin Williams, and "Chargin" Charles Davis Jr.

Ray earned the night's In Memory of Jim & Chet Gardner Hard Charger Award with a fifteenth to second place run.

"The Demon" Damion Gardner scored his 92nd career Woodland Auto Display Fast Time Award by posting a new track record with a time of 14.104 over the 30-car roster. The 8-time champion scored twentieth in the main event after an early flip ended his night.

The 10-lap heat race victories went to Gardner (FlowDynamics / Factory Wraps First Heat), Troy Rutherford (Huntington Beach Glass & Mirror / Factory Wraps Second Heat), Austin Liggett (All Coast Construction / Factory Wraps Third Heat), and Max Adams (Component Repair Company / Factory Wraps Fourth Heat). Former Ascot veteran driver Verne Sweeney topped the 12-lap semi-main.

The traditional 410 sprints are back in action tomorrow night (March 13) at The Dirt Track at Kern County Raceway Park.

BAKERSFIELD, CA – MARCH 13, 2021... Racing past Brody Roa on the twenty-third circuit, Max Adams (Loomis, CA) led the rest of the way to claim Saturday's \$3,000 feature at The Dirt Track at Kern County Raceway Park.

Racing Keith Ford's #73 Cam 2 Blue Blood Racing Oil / Sun Valley AG Transport Triple X, Adams scored the third AMSOIL USAC/CRA Sprint Car victory of his career. Roa, "The Demon" Damion Gardner, new point leader "The Big Game Hunter" Austin Williams, and Matt Mitchell followed the defending Gas City I-69 Speedway champion to the finish line.

Chris Gansen earned the night's In Memory of Jim & Chet Gardner Hard Charger Award with nineteenth to sixth place run.

For the second night in a row, Gardner claimed the Woodland Auto Display Fast Time Award by posting a time of 14.571 over the 32-car roster. The 8-time champion now has 93 quick times to his credit.

TULARE, CA – MARCH 26, 2021... After a torrid four-car battle and six changes for the top spot, Max Adams (Loomis, CA) emerged victorious at Tulare's Thunderbowl Raceway.

Piloting Keith Ford's #73 Cam 2 Blue Blood Racing Oil / Sun Valley AG Transport Triple X, Adams earned his fourth career \$3,000 AMSOIL USAC/CRA Sprint Car win (second in a row) over fast qualifier "The Demon" Damion Gardner, Austin Liggett, Matt Mitchell, and "The Cadillac" Cody Williams.

Rookie driver Austin Grabowski claimed the night's In Memory of Jim & Chet Gardner Hard Charger Award with nineteenth to eighth place run. Brody Roa, who crossed the finish line in second, was penalized for not going to the scales after the feature.

For the third consecutive race, Gardner claimed the Woodland Auto Display Fast Time Award by posting a time of 15.453 over the 21-car roster. At press time, the eight-time champion has 94 quick times to his credit. Before the main event, Gardner's crew had to change an ignition box and "The Demon" had to start last on the racetrack.

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DAMION GARDNER SHINES AT PERRIS' SOKOLA SHOOTOUT

PERRIS, CA – APRIL 24, 2021... Using slower traffic to his advantage, “The Demon” Damion Gardner (Concord, CA) slipped by “The Big Game Hunter” Austin Williams on the nineteenth lap and sailed to victory at Perris Auto Speedway.

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HAIL MARY! SWANSON'S LAST LAP NETS FIRST USAC NATIONAL SPRINT WIN AT OVAL NATIONALS OPENER

Perris, California (November 4, 2021).....With four runner-up finishes throughout his first full USAC AMSOIL National Sprint Car season, Jake Swanson wasn't about to settle for yet another in his ongoing pursuit of a first career series victory during Thursday night's opener for the 25th Heimark Anheuser Busch Budweiser Oval Nationals Presented by All Coast Construction at southern California's Perris Auto Speedway.

In fact, running second entering the final set of turns on the last lap wasn't sufficient enough to satisfy the Anaheim, Calif. native who was making his first trip back to his home track since becoming a permanent resident of Indiana about a year ago.

Swanson threw a "Hail Mary" through the marbles on the final circuit, removing himself from the bottom to take one last shot at the top of turn four. Swanson ignited the sky with a shower of sparks as his right-side wheels glanced off the outside front straightaway wall, then promptly brushed Thomas' left side wheels in a drag race to the finish line with Swanson ahead at the stripe by a mere 0.010 of a second for the closest finish of the year, and one of the closest in series history.

Not only was it dramatic, but it was also downright historic for Swanson who earned his first victory in what was his 84th career USAC National Sprint Car feature start. A long time coming and a long time to wait patiently, but his turn arrived Thursday night. A dream fully realized. A dream come true.

"I'm speechless. I'm absolutely speechless. I could cry I'm so happy," Swanson exclaimed after bringing his Team AZ Racing/Beaver Stripes – USW Cat Construction – RSS Industries – CSI/DRC/1-Way Chevy to USAC victory lane for the first time ever.

"I cannot say enough about this race team," Swanson continued. "This racecar was so dynamite. My race team is absolutely incredible, and I know it sounds cliché, but these guys are the best and I'm so glad to finally get this done for them. I can't thank everybody on the side of this racecar enough who has helped us and helped me get to the level I want to be at, and we finally accomplished that tonight."

Equipped with a new powerplant under the hood, Swanson started third on the grid, but for the majority of the distance, was resigned to chasing Thomas around the bottom of the 1/2-mile dirt oval all while simultaneously negotiating copious amounts of lapped traffic.

With six laps remaining, the cards fell in Swanson's favor after spying an opportunity on the back straightaway when Thomas split high to maneuver around the lapped car of Chris Gansen. With a big drive, Swanson cut under Gansen, making it three-wide as the trio hit turn three.

Thomas swung across both Gansen and Swanson, and back to the bottom with his left front tire teetering over the edge of the infield berm, but couldn't quite stick to the bottom, opening up the low line for Swanson to eke by for the lead exiting the fourth corner.

The moment was fleeting, as it turned out, when he became entrapped behind Logan Williams at the tail end of the lead lap entering low in turn one just a straightaway later. Thomas took to the top in one and two and gleefully reestablished his position at the head of the field on lap 26.

At that precise moment, now back in second and chasing Thomas once again, Swanson readily admitted to nearly feeling resigned to the fact that a first win just might be out of reach.

"I was worried; I didn't really think I could do it," Swanson said. "He's so good on the bottom and it was just a chess match dealing with lapped traffic. I tried to split the lapped car there off turn two and it almost worked, then I tried to do it again, but the next few lappers were running too tight down there."

Swanson shadowed Thomas for four-straight laps until reaching the white flag, sitting just a single car length back, and even saw Bacon briefly edge ahead of him by a bumper for the second spot off turn two on the last lap. Swanson got back into the groove and carried his momentum back by Bacon and deeper into turn three than he had all evening, at any cost, and the ultimate result wound up as the proudest achievement of his racing career.

"I wasn't lifting," Swanson flatly stated. "It didn't matter if we hit the fence. It didn't matter if I flipped the length of the front straightaway. I was not going to lift. I was buried in it. I bounced off the fence, I bounced off him, and he gave me just enough room. I really appreciate that, so I didn't go for a ride. I didn't think I was going to get it, but all of a sudden, I found some grip either on the wall or right next to the wall and I think I got him by an inch or two. It was unreal."

Swanson dedicated the victory to his grandfather, who passed away recently while Kevin Thomas Jr. finished second and series point leader Brady Bacon took third, just a single car length behind the front two. Defending Oval Nationals winner C.J. Leary grabbed fourth while Justin Grant rounded out the top-five.

Pole sitter Kevin Thomas Jr. (Cullman, Ala.) came out on the short end of the photo finish in his KT Motorsports/Dr. Pepper Presents the Ronald McDonald House Charities/DRC/Speedway Chevy, finishing second by the smallest of margins.

"It was wild," Thomas said. "It was a good race, though, and congrats to Jake. They've been working so hard and have been very, very close. We did all that and ran that close and that hard and we never touched each other. I've got a lot of respect for Jake and what he's done. Everybody on our crew did a great job and our car was good. I just got passed. It's not what we wanted, obviously, but we had a good solid run, and we'll try to duplicate it tomorrow and try to win a race."

Brady Bacon (Broken Arrow, Okla.) collected yet another top-five – his 32nd in 39 series starts this year – while finishing third, 0.129 sec. behind the winner, aboard his Dynamics, Inc./Fatheadz Eyewear – Elliott's Custom Trailers & Carts – TelStar/Triple X/Rider Chevy. Bacon started on the outside of the front row but lost the spot to Swanson on lap two yet still had a shot to win despite engine issues hampering the team throughout their night.

Tanner Thorson (Minden, Nev.) became the second driver this season (Logan Seavey) to record Fatheadz Eyewear Fast Qualifier awards after previously doing so in early October at the Terre Haute (Ind.) Action Track and Lawrenceburg (Ind.) Speedway.

Three drivers got upside down throughout the night: Dan Taylor and Chris Gansen did so during qualifying, while Chris Muraoka flipped during the fourth heat. All drivers walked away without injury and, in fact, Gansen returned to action with the same car, transferring through his heat race finish 18th in the feature.

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BACON FINDS LAST LAP OVALS FORTUNE AMID GRANT'S MISFORTUNE

Perris, California (November 5, 2021).....In a season that has been earmarked by a consistency matched by no other individual, feature wins have been, rather surprisingly, relatively few and far between for USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National Championship point leader, Brady Bacon.

As it turned out, all the Broken Arrow, Okla. native needed for that to occur was a little bit of good fortune to fall his way, somehow, someway.

Bacon became the leader for the third and final occasion while Justin Grant's car faltered with a broken nozzle line in Friday's night two of the Heimark Anheuser Busch Budweiser Oval Nationals Presented by All Coast Construction at southern California's Perris Auto Speedway.

Bacon cruised past the rapidly slowing Grant on the last of the 30th circuits to prevail with his fourth win of the year and marked his first time standing in victory lane since July's Indiana Sprint Week round at Bloomington Speedway.

The three-time series champion's 39th career USAC National Sprint Car feature win moved him to within one of Gary Bettenhausen for 8th on the all-time win list. Bacon's third career Perris win also went toward cementing his bid for a fourth career title as he incrementally elevated his lead from 63 to 64 with just three races left on the championship trail.

"We've had a good enough car to win a bunch of races this year, and it just never went our way," Bacon explained. "Tonight, we probably didn't deserve to win but we did, so we'll take it after all the races we've lost throughout the year."

After experiencing a rare downward descent when starting from the front row during Thursday night's opener at The PAS, Bacon was bound and determined not to let history repeat itself on consecutive nights. Bacon led the opening three circuits before being overtaken by Thorson, then regained the top spot from him just past halfway, then saw his lead slip into the abyss with Grant getting by just three laps from the end.

"I made a mistake there by letting him by," Bacon recalled of Grant's late-race pass. "We just had a little luck on our side tonight and I was able to capitalize on that and get the win. I thought we had a pretty good car, but we just got a little tight there after those couple cautions, probably because of low air pressure, which caused it to push really bad off four. After he got me, I just tried to not make any mistakes and, if he did, I was going to be able to capitalize. Unfortunately for him, something happened, but we'll definitely take it after the year we've had."

Bacon initially lost the lead to Thorson on the fourth lap when Thorson went third to first within a half lap, first charging by Grant for second midway down the back straightaway, then dove to the bottom of turns three and four to swipe the lead from Bacon.

Following a front straightaway flip performed by Sterling Cling (24th), which also ensnared Danny Faria Jr. (25th) on lap five, Grant relegated Bacon back to third on the sixth lap as Grant muscled his way under at the exit of turn four to put himself in the runner-up spot. Bacon ultimately regained the second position from Grant a mere three laps later.

Out front, Thorson continued to pull away on top, with everyone else following suit on the high line in their pursuit of the 2015 Turkey Night Grand Prix Midget winner when it was held at Perris.

Thorson, meanwhile, had lost his brakes about halfway through, and the issue came into focus as he attempted to put Tommy Malcolm a lap down in the running order with a turn one slider on the 17th lap that initially worked in his favor. However, as Thorson drifted past and glided up the racetrack, all momentum was lost, and opportunity was gained by both Malcolm to get his lap back momentarily as well as Bacon to race past and become the new leader.

As Bacon caressed a 2.089 second advantage with 10 laps remaining, Carson Short and Logan Williams were waging their own battle for the 17th position, which resulted in Williams enduring a rapid tumble after contact with both Short and the wall sent him on a wild ride of which he walked away from.

While Thorson went on the attack in turn two for second with Grant on lap 22, Grant had his sights set on ripping away Bacon's lead entering turn three. Grant ably pulled even with Bacon through the corners but was unable to make a successful go of it as of yet.

Grant tailed Bacon around the entire circumference of the half-mile dirt oval from his view a half-car length back as the two crossed underneath the flag stand with three laps to go. That's precisely where Grant made a swift maneuver to the bottom of turn one and stole the lead away with the race's distance waning in the balance.

Taken by utter and complete surprise just two laps later, Bacon pounced as Grant slowed to a crawl on the top side of the racetrack, clearing him between turns one and two as he cut underneath Grant with Thorson in tow to second. Thorson nearly climbed Grant's left rear tire coming off turn two, which stifled him momentarily, and allowed Bacon free reign to put the clamp and his stamp on the victory over Thorson, Kevin Thomas Jr., C.J. Leary, and Thursday's winner Jake Swanson.

Tanner Thorson (Minden, Nev.) finished a fine second after leading 13 laps in his Reinbold-Underwood Motorsports/AME Electrical – Mesilla Valley Transportation/Spike/Stanton Chevy.

Kevin Thomas Jr. (Cullman, Ala.) followed up Thursday's runner-up finish with a solid third on Friday in his KT Motorsports/Dr. Pepper Presents the Ronald McDonald House Charities/DRC/Speedway Chevy. The 2017-18 Oval Nationals winner feels like he's got a good game plan if the track conditions are similar to Thursday's and acknowledges having to find a little bit something more for conditions akin to those he faced on Friday night.

Six drivers – Jake Swanson, Kevin Thomas Jr., Brady Bacon, Tanner Thorson, C.J. Leary, and Justin Grant ranked as the top-six overall points-getters throughout the first two evenings of the Oval Nationals. All six are locked into the first three rows of Saturday night's 40-lap main event. The starting order of those first three rows will be determined via a Super 6 Dash which pits six cars against each other for a six-lap race with high stakes.

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OVALMEISTER: KTJ EQUALS RECORD WITH 3RD OVAL NATIONALS WIN AT PERRIS

Perris, California (November 6, 2021).....Like any young person raised on the sport of auto racing, having racing heroes of your own is a natural consequence.

Kevin Thomas Jr. is among those individuals.

One of the Cullman, Alabama native's racing heroes just so happens to be among the select gifted who, themselves, have won the Oval Nationals on three occasions.

Following his performance on Saturday night at southern California's Perris Auto Speedway, a new name, a new face was added to the books as one of four drivers to capture glory in the traditional November event three different times.

Kevin Thomas Jr. is now among those individuals.

Thomas joined Bud Kaeding (2001-02-07), Damion Gardner (2009-11-16) and Dave Darland (2005-06-13) to become the latest driver to earn three eagle trophies, accomplishing the feat in Saturday's finale for the 25th running of the Heimark Anheuser Busch Budweiser Oval Nationals Presented by All Coast Construction.

Thomas Jr. tracked down Justin Grant just four laps from the finish, then blazed a trail straight to racing immortality, straight to the land of legends, and straight to the realm of where several of the biggest sprint car racing names have cemented themselves as a hero of the Oval Nationals.

"This is a race I love to win," a choked-up Thomas stated. "I love taking home those eagles. It's emotional. It's our third one. Not many people have done that. I know Dave Darland has and he's one of my heroes. It's pretty cool to tie him."

Thomas' USAC AMSOIL National Sprint Car leading ninth win of the season in his KT Motorsports/Dr. Pepper Presents the Ronald McDonald House Charities/DRC/Speedway Chevy was especially pertinent based on how his weekend in Perris began – on the wrong side of a historic photo finish in Thursday's opener with winner Jake Swanson.

Following his runner up result, Swanson finished third on Friday and seemed to be on the cusp of breaking through. However, 40 laps annually present a test of wills, fortune (good and bad), and fortitude of positioning oneself in the right place at exactly the right time.

Starting fifth in the 25-car field, Thomas remained in constant pursuit of the leaders throughout the first three-quarters of the race. Meanwhile, at the head of the field, Grant had established a foothold in the lead from the outset as he powered around pole sitter and Super Six Dash winner C.J. Leary on lap one while all others continuously strategized how to reel him back in to their grasp.

A melee put a stoppage to the event just two laps in when 13th running Logan Williams spun sideways in turn four. He was then T-boned by the oncoming 20th place car of Matt Mitchell. Both came to a rest near the outside wall with damage. At the same time, 18th running Eddie Tafoya Jr. was collected in the incident and walloped the inside front straightaway wall. All drivers were uninjured but the same could not be said for their cars as all had their races come to a premature conclusion.

During the yellow, 7th running and fast qualifier Damion Gardner bowed out with brake issues that ended his bid for a record fourth Oval Nationals score, relegating him to a 22nd place result.

Coming up on the halfway mark, Grant found a close encounter of the traffic kind in turn four when he and 19th place Dennis Gile met wheel-to-wheel, but Grant continued on safely, no harm-no foul, while the encroaching machines of Leary in 2nd, Tanner Thorson in 3rd and Thomas in 4th became stifled in the quagmire of lapped cars, which allowed Grant to build up his lead to 2.5 seconds.

However, the gridlock did help Thomas a bit further back as he picked and grinned his way around the outside of Thorson for 3rd at the stripe on lap 19, then struck once more in much cleaner air on lap 23 as he bolted past Leary around the outside on the front straightaway to move to 2nd.

In short order, Thomas downsized Grant's lead a full two seconds in the ensuing laps, turning the quickest lap amongst anybody in the entire race on the 25th circuit, ultimately charging around the outside of Grant to nip him by a wheel at the line on lap 31. Grant surged back ahead of Thomas on the bottom of turn one mere moments later but now inherited a Noah's Ark of traffic within his view, two by two, marching high and low.

Grant and Thomas played the game with Grant drifting high and Thomas sticking low as they split Gile midway down the back straightaway with eight laps remaining. Grant staved off Thomas' charge for the time being with the topside cleared away and the bottom clamped down by the lappers.

"I knew that the 4 car was going to give it everything he had," Thomas recalled. "Whenever we got to lapped traffic, it was just about who was going to make the right move at the right time. We had a couple different opportunities to take advantage, and I didn't do that at the right time, but everything happens for a reason."

That reason soon became clear when Thomas' shining moment rose with four laps remaining as he stuck the bottom in turns three and four while Grant negotiated the long road home up top on the cushion. A major run by Thomas shot him past Grant to a car length advantage at the line on the 37th lap and, from there on, Thomas took the stage front and center, all for his own as he began his countdown to victory.

A quick dismissal of the now-lapped car of Charles Davis Jr. by Thomas in turn one with two to go put a mountainous, insurmountable half-straightaway separation between Thomas and Grant that completed the final chapter of the silver edition of the event which began 25 years earlier in 1996.

Thomas ran away to a final winning margin of 3.129 seconds at the finish line with Grant second, Leary third, Thorson fourth and point leader Brady Bacon rounding out the top-five.

"We got the win and I'm just so proud of these guys and everybody that's behind us," Thomas said in praise after corralling the \$10,000 winning prize. "A lot of those people believed in me when a lot of people didn't. I'm fortunate to have all those people behind me and doing good things for us. They gave me one heck of a racecar, and they read that track perfectly. They did their job 100 percent. That was a good one to drive."

Thomas' 36th career USAC National Sprint Car feature win moved him past Jon Stanbrough and Rich Vogler for sole possession of 11th on the all-time list. He now stands just one victory behind Sheldon Kinser for 10th all-time.

Justin Grant (Ione, Calif.) led a race-high 35 laps of the 40-lap distance in his TOPP Motorsports/NOS Energy Drink – MPV Express – TOPP Industries/Maxim/Kistler Chevy, equaling his best career Oval Nationals final night result of 2nd place, which he also earned back in 2017.

"The bottom started getting narrow and the top stayed so dirty," Grant explained. "I had to slow down so much to try and get stuck on the bottom. I don't do a whole lot other than go pound the fence, so we usually leave that thing set on 'cushion kill.' When the bottom gets that narrow, it's hard on us. We figured if we were going to win this race, it was going to be on the boards, but when the bottom got that thin, I had to get so slow. KTJ was just better than we were at the end, and we really started fading with about 10 to go and got real bad with about five to go."

C.J. Leary (Greenfield, Ind.) had a successful 2021 Oval Nationals, following up 4th place finishes in both prelims with a 3rd place result in Saturday night's finale aboard the Michael Motorsports/Kodiak Products – Gray Auto – Valvoline/DRC/Cressman Ford.

“This car was really consistent all weekend, which is something we haven’t had a lot of the year,” Leary admitted. “We’ve struggled and we’ve been really good, then we’ve been not so good. This weekend was not bad at all.”

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CLINCHED: BACON CEMENTS USAC SPRINT TITLE WITH WESTERN WORLD NIGHT #1 WIN

San Tan Valley, Arizona (November 12, 2021).....There's just something magical in the symbiosis between Brady Bacon and Western World.

The Broken Arrow, Okla. driver collected his 10th career victory in the event Friday night at Arizona Speedway as he tracked down racelong leader Logan Seavey with five laps remaining, then thwarted Seavey's comeback slider in the final corner on the final lap, driving back by to capture the victory in the 54th annual Western World Championships Presented by San Tan Ford opener for the USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National Championship.

With his winning performance and Kevin Thomas Jr.'s subsequent misfortune, Bacon clinched the 2021 USAC National Sprint Car driving championship with one race remaining Saturday night.

Bacon's fourth career series title makes him just the third driver to capture at least four championships in his career, joining five-timer Levi Jones (2005-07-09-10-11) and fellow four-time titlist Steve Butler (1986-87-88-90) while also garnering Dynamics, Inc. a record-extending 13th series entrant championship.

The milestones were racked up in droves throughout the night with Bacon also becoming just the ninth driver to win at least 40 career USAC National Sprint Car feature events. His 40th ties him with Gary Bettenhausen for eighth on the all-time series win list.

Bacon's Western World record continues to be remarkable and impeccable ever since winning his first race in the esteemed event in 2009. He won two 360 c.i. non-wing sprint car races at Tucson, Arizona's USA Raceway in 2009 and repeated in the same division there once more in 2010 with the ASCS Canyon Region series.

Furthermore, at Peoria, Arizona's Canyon Speedway Park in 2012, Bacon was an ASCS Winged 360 Sprint Car feature winner. He returned to USA Raceway in 2015 to add a USAC National Sprint Car triumph.

When Western World migrated to Arizona Speedway in San Tan Valley, Ariz., Bacon's winning ways continued with USAC Southwest 360 Sprint Car scores in 2016-17-18, followed by a USAC NOS Energy Drink National Midget win in 2019 and, finally, his USAC National Sprint Car tally Friday night, displaying a knack for success in the event unlike any other.

"This race has been great to me over the years, and I've got another win tonight," Bacon exclaimed. "I've won at three different tracks that the Western World has been at. I don't know what it is about the race; we just seem to find our way to victory lane. It doesn't matter if it's wing, non-wing, 360, 410 or midget, there's just something about this race. There's great fans in Arizona and a lot of history here, and I'm glad to be a part of it."

Bacon started third in the 30-lap feature event aboard his Dynamics, Inc./Fatheadz Eyewear – Elliott's Custom Trailers & Carts – TelStar/Triple X/Rider Chevy while Arizona native and USAC National Sprint Car Rookie Sterling Cling led the charge to the green flag. However, it was outside front row starter Logan Seavey who established the pace up front from the get-go.

Drifting from third back to sixth on the opening lap, Bacon was forced to steadily work his way back into contention, to fifth on lap five, to fourth on lap seven and to third just past the midway point as he slid past his nearest championship foe, Kevin Thomas Jr., with a turn three slide job on lap 17.

Two laps later, Bacon surged past Jake Swanson for the second position, utilizing the bottom of turns one and two, then set his sights on tracking down the leader, Seavey, who, at that point in time, was mired knee deep in a tussle with a myriad of cars on the tail end of the lead lap, thus shrinking the 1.5 second interval in half between himself and Seavey.

That margin was scrunched up even more on the 22nd lap when the lapped cars of Jake Helsel and Caleb Stelzig tangled in turn two, sending Helsel spinning backwards to a stop. Second running Thomas Jr. was already committed and affixed to the bottom groove, and with nowhere to roam, connected right rear to right rear with Hessel, ending Hessel's evening and also putting a wrap on Thomas Jr.'s slim title chances for good when he came to a stop. Thomas Jr. did, however, restart and finish 13th.

With Bacon now right on the back bumper of Seavey with eight laps remaining, both drivers stayed attached to their comfort zones, Seavey striding on the cushion and Bacon rolling the bottom, which proved to be equal with both drivers side-by-side lap-after-lap, with nary a car length separating the two on laps 22-23-24-25.

It was the 26th lap that turned the tide in Bacon's favor after Seavey got tight on the cushion in turns one and two, sending him skating up the 3/8-mile dirt oval which allowed Bacon to break free with six car lengths of daylight between the two on the back straightaway.

Seavey regained his footing and began rapidly reeling in Bacon, who had occupied the low line in turns one and two and the top in three and four during the late stages. Seavey took the high road in turns one and two to close within a car length of Bacon midway down the back straight.

“Three and four was kind of the question, I didn’t know where I should be and whether I should stay on the bottom or go back to the top,” Bacon quizzed. “I felt like it was going to have to be harder for someone else to pass me on the bottom that it would be for them to rip around me on the top if I made a mistake.”

It was right there, at that moment, Seavey fired a deep shot at Bacon on the bottom of three, sliding three lengths ahead of Bacon before plowing his right rear into and over the edge of the turn four cushion. Bacon was prepared and had his front wheels pointed straight to the bottom of four to charge back by and cross the stripe 0.495 of a second ahead of Seavey with Tanner Thorson third, C.J. Leary fourth and Charles Davis Jr. fifth.

“It was easier to make a mistake on the top, I felt like, and the bottom is kind of my bread and butter, and the top is probably his,” Bacon noted. “It was just going to be whoever messed up. On the last lap, I messed up on the bottom of one and two and gave him a shot at me. Luckily, I had enough drive off the bottom of four to get back by him.”

Despite coming up just short after leading a race-high 25 laps, Logan Seavey (Sutter, Calif.) displayed his reemergence after a rough go last weekend during three nights of racing in Perris, Calif. which saw all three finishes outside the top-ten. Seavey’s second place performance was his best result with the series since a runner-up finish during the 4-Crown Nationals at Ohio’s Eldora Speedway in his Baldwin-Fox Racing/Fox Paving – Claxton Engines/DRC/Claxton Chevy.

Tanner Thorson (Minden, Nev.) obliterated the one-lap USAC National Sprint Car track record at Arizona Speedway in Fatheadz Qualifying with a lap of 14.390 seconds, erasing the five-year-old record of 13.625, set by Chad Boespflug in 2016. Thorson was briefly in contention for the win with seven laps remaining before ultimately finishing third in his Reinbold-Underwood Motorsports/AME Electrical – Mesilla Valley Transportation/Spike/Stanton Chevy, his 14th finish of sixth or better in his last 15 starts.

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THE CLOSER: SEAVEY FINISHES USAC SPRINT SEASON AS WESTERN WORLD VICTOR

San Tan Valley, Arizona (November 13, 2021).....If at first you don't succeed, then dust yourself off and try again.

Logan Seavey lived and breathed this particular proverb through and through during both nights of the 54th annual Western World Championships presented by San Tan Ford at Arizona Speedway.

On Friday night, the Sutter, Calif. native led 25 of 30 laps before one tiny mistake cost him the victory. The following evening, Seavey vowed not to repeat his misfortune nor his ultimate fate, and instead, fully intending to capitalize on the opportunity at hand with an outside front row starting spot and a winning race car in his grasp.

Seavey led all 30 circuits of Saturday's feature, only briefly relenting the top spot to C.J. Leary just past the halfway mark. Without a rattle, without a hesitation, Seavey calmly raced back by to capture the season finale for the USAC AMSOIL National and USAC CRA Sprint Cars.

It was Seavey's first USAC National Sprint Car victory since running off three-straight in succession during Indiana Sprint Week in July, a Western World triumph worth \$7,500 after piloting the Baldwin-Fox Racing/Fox Paving – Claxton Engines/DRC/Claxton Chevy to victory lane in the last ever USAC event to be held at the 3/8-mile dirt oval before its permanent closure later this month.

"It's awesome," Seavey exclaimed following his sixth career USAC National Sprint Car win, which equaled him for 75th place all-time alongside Chad Boespflug, Kevin Briscoe, Jac Haudenschield, Jason McCord, Jan Opperman, Tom Sneva, George Snider, and Dick Tobias. "We led so many laps last night. I really, really love this place and I hate that it's our last time coming here."

The main crux of finding redemption is slaying those small landmines that are constantly thrown in the direction of team and driver and are bound to trip up individuals on occasion. Seavey attempted to thwart those aspects but ultimately resigned to be patient and wait for the track to come to him, as opposed to the reverse, as the surface changed throughout the duration.

"Last night, I got myself too tight with the shocks under yellow, trying to over-adjust, and I almost did the same thing tonight going the wrong way, getting myself freer," Seavey explained. "The rubber just wasn't quite as much as I thought it was there with a few to go. Then, it finally latched up and my car got really good."

It was maybe just a little overthinking on my end, but you've got to do everything you can to win these races," Seavey continued. "Everybody's so good and you've got to be perfect. It showed last night. We had a good car, good enough to win, and I messed up and gave it away. I knew I had a good car, and I could win tonight. I just had to do everything I could not to give this one away."

From the drop of the green, it was all Seavey as he sprinted to the lead from the outside of the front row, then surpassed pole sitter Austin Williams around the outside at the exit of turn four and promptly led the charge throughout the first half with C.J. Leary in tow on the high line, likewise, shooting around Williams on the top for the second position in turn four on lap two.

Seavey's 1.1 second lead over Leary began to dwindle in traffic and was carved in half by lap 18 when fifth running Kevin Thomas Jr.'s end-of-year misfortune continued with a flat right rear tire, which brought out the caution. Thomas returned to action but wound up a disappointing 22nd.

The stoppage put the traffic situation on the shelf and delivered Leary a golden opportunity that he nearly made work. With the top line paved in rubber, making a clean pass became a challenging proposition, but Leary was game.

On the first lap of the lap 18 restart, Leary stuck right to Seavey's rear bumper through turns one and two, and midway down the back straightaway, before diving to the bottom of turn three. However, Leary's momentum took him up the racetrack, to the very top off turn four, freeing the lane for Seavey to cross over back underneath and reclaim the lead.

"I knew my car was good up top," Seavey claimed. "Racing here in the past and knowing how clean the top got, I knew the rubber was coming. I got to lapped traffic and felt it coming, then a yellow came out and I freed myself way up for the rubber and I did it too early and about gave it away. C.J. got a huge run and about went by us. Luckily, I was able to hold on just long enough for the rubber to come."

With Leary's shot fired, Seavey was safe and sound for the final 13 laps as he contested the high line unchallenged the rest of the way, raising the interval to a whopping 3.127 seconds as he raced under the checkered flag with C.J. Leary second, Jake Swanson third, Thomas Meseraull fourth and newly crowned 2021 USAC National Sprint Car champion Brady Bacon rounding out the top-five.

Leary (Greenfield, Ind.) completed his season with a flurry of successful outings, finishing inside the top-five in each of his last five starts aboard his Michael Motorsports/Kodiak Products – Gray Auto – Valvoline/DRC/Cressman Ford.

Swanson's daring turn one pass of Meseraull for the third position with 10 laps remaining put the Anaheim, California driver on the podium for the seventh time with the USAC National Sprint Cars this year in his Team AZ Racing/Beaver Stripes – USW Cat Construction – RSS Industries – CSI/DRC/1-Way Chevy.

Bacon (Broken Arrow, Okla.) clinched his fourth career USAC National Sprint Car driving championship on Friday night at Western World, but was officially crowned following Saturday night's finale, placing him as the third member of an exclusive club of drivers who've won at least four titles with the series: Levi Jones (2005-07-09-10-11) and Steve Butler (1986-87-88-90).

Furthermore, Bacon became the first back-to-back USAC National Sprint Car driving champion since Bryan Clauson in 2012-13. Meanwhile, the Dynamics, Inc. No. 69 for Bacon earned its unprecedented 13th series entrant title after previously being crowned in 1989, 1992, 1993, 1996, 1997, 1999, 2002, 2004, 2008, 2014, 2016 and 2020.

Damion Gardner (Concord, Calif.) racked up an awe-inspiring eighth consecutive AMSOIL USAC CRA Sprint Car driving championship, and ninth overall, this year while also providing entrant Mark Alexander and car No. 1 its eighth-straight series entrant title, and ninth overall. The Gardner and Alexander partnership has garnered previous series titles in 2013-14-15-16-17-18-19. No 2020 champion was crowned. Gardner first earned a USAC CRA driving championship in 2005 while Alexander first did so in the entrant category during the 2007 campaign.
