THE DEMON HANGS 10 WITH USAC CRA SPRINT CARS IN 2022

Damion Gardner, the undisputed king of AMSOIL USAC CRA Sprint Car racing, retained his throne once again in 2022.

This year, Gardner (Concord, California) collected his 10th overall career series title and his ninth-in-a-row dating back to 2013.

“The Demon,” as he’s affectionately known, now possesses more career USAC championships than all but one driver, and that driver happens to be A.J. Foyt with 13.

Gardner led every statistical category with the division in 2022 on his way to a 236-point margin of victory in the final championship rundown over Austin Williams.

Meanwhile, Gardner also provided team owner Mark Alexander with his ninth consecutive entrant title and 10th overall with USAC CRA.

This year’s performance for Gardner featured six main event wins, which pushed his overall series win total to 95. His total USAC feature win count in all series pushed up to 106, which ranks seventh all-time.

Four of Gardner’s six feature wins on the 2022 season came in the first four events. He started the year off with a three-race sweep in January at Arizona’s Cocopah Speedway, then swung by victory lane in March’s return to California’s Perris Auto Speedway to capture the first four events of the campaign.

The Perris victory was his 50th in USAC CRA competition at the southern California half-mile dirt oval and tied his personal-best four-race USAC CRA win streak, which he also achieved in 2005 and 2014. Throughout the course, he added to more in the win column in April at Arizona’s Mohave Valley Raceway and once more for good measure in September at Perris.

Austin Williams (Yorba Linda, California) posted his fourth-straight top-three result in the final CRA standings. It was his second time finishing as the runner-up, equaling his previous best of second in 2019. The 2009 series Rookie of the Year was unable to grab a feature victory but did score three second place results at Cocopah, California’s Thunderbowl Raceway and Mohave Valley.

Eddie Tafoya Jr. (Chino Hills, California), likewise, was shut out of victory lane, but put in a career-best performance in multiple categories in 2022. His third place finish in the points topped his previous best mark and his second place result in the January finale at Cocopah was the best run yet of his CRA career. He was also one of only two drivers to start all 21 feature events in 2022 along with Damion Gardner.

Matt Mitchell (Yorba Linda, California) earned his best points finish with CRA since 2014, taking fourth in the final rundown after garnering his first series feature victory in six seasons in April at Perris.

Tommy Malcolm (Corona, California) slotted into the fifth spot in the point standings for the best points finish of his career, racking up five top-fives in 19 starts with a best showing of second at both Cocopah and Santa Maria as he gets ever closer to his first career series win.

In all, 12 drivers reached victory lane with USAC CRA this past season. Brody Roa (Garden Grove, California) scored three times overall, including in back-to-back starts during a midsummer stretch at Perris and Santa Maria. He accomplished those two wins for two different teams – his own BR Motorsports No. 91R at Perris and the May Motorsports No. 8m at Santa Maria. He then traveled to Arizona in October to notch another win at Mohave Valley.

After an eight-year absence from USAC CRA victory lane, Cody Williams (Corona, California) returned with a bang when he knocked down two-straight wins in May at Bakersfield (California) Speedway, then again two weeks later in the 71st running of the Salute to Indy at Perris.

Austin Liggett (Tracy, California) put up a “w” at California’s Keller Auto Speedway at Kings Fairgrounds in April. Ryan Bernal (Hollister, California) notched his first USAC CRA win in four seasons during an April meet at Thunderbowl.

Tanner Boul (Auberry, California) pulled a major upset in June at Ventura (California) Raceway when he took his 360 c.i. engine to the win against the 410 c.i. dominated field. Charles Davis Jr. (Buckeye, Arizona) showed who was in charge with a last lap pass to victory in August at Perris to post a win in back-to-back USAC CRA seasons for the first time since 2006-07.

Cocopah and Perris hosted a total of five matchups between USAC CRA and the USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National Championship during October and November. Emerson Axsom (Franklin, Indiana) and Jake Swanson (Anaheim, California) dominated each end of the 55th annual Western World Championships at Cocopah.

Days later at Perris, Brady Bacon (Broken Arrow, Okla.) collected an emotional victory on the opening night of the Oval Nationals just two days after his grandfather’s death. The following evening, Robert Ballou (Rocklin, California) made his return to California for the first time in five years pay when was the victor on night two of the ovals. The final night and the \$20,000 check belonged to Bacon as he became a first-time Oval Nationals champion.

Nate Schank (Santa Rosa, California) earned 2022 USAC CRA Sprint Car Rookie of the Year honors after tallying an 11th place finish in the standings as well as three top-10 results, bested by a sixth in April at Keller Auto Speedway.

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DAMION GARDNER GOES 4-FOR-4 AT PERRIS SO-CAL SHOWDOWN

PERRIS, CA – MARCH 30, 2022... Continuing his assault on the record books, “The Demon” Damion Gardner (Concord, CA) is having the best start of his career with the AMSOIL USAC/CRA Sprint Car Series.

Racing Mark Alexander's #1 PerformanceOnline.com / Carman Trucking Spike, Gardner scored his fourth win of the campaign in as many races last Saturday night at Perris Auto Speedway. The nine-time champion topped the "So-Cal Showdown," posted his 50th "home track" win under the USAC/CRA banner and tied his 2005 and 2014 record of four consecutive victories. Fast qualifier Matt Mitchell, "The Cadillac" Cody Williams, "The Big Game Hunter" Austin Williams, and "Chargin" Charles Davis Jr. rounded out the top-five drivers.

Starting fourth, Gardner had a torrid battle with Cody Williams and Davis before taking command of the main event on the twelfth circuit. With changing track conditions and a treacherous cushion, Davis led the opening laps as drivers fought for position. "The Demon" was not to be denied at the Lake Perris Fairgrounds and claimed the 93rd series win of his career.

Earlier in the program, Gardner qualified third overall and won the night's 10-lap Laser X Manufacturing Heat Race #3. The point leader heads to Hanford's Keller Auto Speedway with a stout 54-point advantage over the competition.

Driving his #37 Roy Miller Freight Lines / Campbell Brothers Storage Maxim, Matt Mitchell (Yorba Linda, CA) posted his ninth career Woodland Auto Display Fast Time Award over the 23-car roster. The former USAC West Coast 360 Sprint Car Champion ran second in his heat race to Verne Sweeney and charged to second in the feature after starting sixth. Matt left Perris ranked fifth in championship points.

Verne Sweeney (Lomita, CA) raced to victory in the night's 10-lap FlowDynamics Incorporated Heat Race #1. Piloting Ken Tracy's #98 Bill's Jerky / Faas Cores DRC, Sweeney was sixteenth quick in time trials and placed twelfth in the main event after starting sixteenth. The veteran Ascot driver has climbed to tenth in the point chase.

"The Big Game Hunter" Austin Williams (Yorba Linda, CA) won the night's Bill's Jerky Heat Race #2. Driving Rip Williams' #2 DigAlert / Full Throttle Scissor Lift Rental DRC, Williams qualified eleventh overall and charged to fourth in the feature after starting eleventh. The former co-rookie of the year has climbed to third in the USAC/CRA point standings.

"Shugah" Shane Sexton (Warner Springs, CA) earned the night's In Memory of Jim & Chet Gardner Hard Charger Award with a fourteenth place run from twenty-second. Racing the Sexton/Gatlin Racing #74 GAS Chassis / Mike Pridgeon Racing Engines GAS, Sexton was twenty-second fast in time trials and ran seventh in his heat race. The second year driver left Perris ranked seventeenth in the chase for the championship.

By qualifying sixth, Chris Gansen (Verdemont Heights, CA) was the Shawn McDonald Memorial Qualifying Award Winner. Driving the family owned #4G Trench Shoring / Cam 2 Blue Blood Oil Maxim, Gansen ran fourth in his heat race and placed eighth in the 30-lap feature. The veteran driver is currently seventh in the point standings.

"Showtime" Danny Sheridan (Santa Maria, CA) returned to USAC/CRA action and claimed the night's Shawn McDonald Memorial Feature Award with a sixth place finish. Piloting Robbie and Gaye Allen's #12 ABC Ventures / Beaver Stripes Maxim, Sheridan was tenth quick in qualifying and placed third in his heat race. After the checkered flags, the former Bandit 360 Sprint Car Champion is twenty-fourth in the point chase.

Making his first start of the year, Jeff Dyer (Yucca Valley, CA) placed thirteenth in the feature and earned the Wilwood Disc Brakes Lucky 13 Award. Driving the Cal-Sun Racing owned #39 Specialty Fasteners / Justice Brothers ITI, Dyer qualified eighteenth overall and ran sixth in his heat race. The California Lightning Sprint standout heads to the Kings County Fairgrounds ranked twenty-eighth in USAC/CRA points.

This Friday, April 1st, the USAC/CRA Sprint Cars will invade the Keller Auto Speedway in Hanford, California. The following night, the non-winged 410s will battle at the Thunderbowl Raceway in nearby Tulare for the "Chris and Brian Faria Memorial." The USAC Western States and BCRA Midgets will join the action at Tulare.

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CODY WILLIAMS SPRINTS TO BAKERSFIELD VICTORY

BAKERSFIELD, CALIFORNIA – MAY 17, 2022... In one of the wildest main events of the season, “The Cadillac” Cody Williams (Corona, California) raced to Saturday’s victory at Bakersfield Speedway.

After a flat tire knocked leader Tommy “Thunder” Malcolm out of contention, Williams led the final fourteen laps to earn the second AMSOIL USAC/CRA Sprint Car triumph of his career. 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TANNER BOUL SCORES UPSET USAC/CRA WIN AT VENTURA

VENTURA, CALIFORNIA – JUNE 14, 2022... In perhaps the biggest upset in series history, Tanner Boul (Auberry, California) raced to his first AMSOIL USAC/CRA Sprint Car win last Saturday at Ventura Raceway.

Starting on the pole position, the young driver hit his marks and led all 30-laps to become the 77th winner with the non-winged 410 series. Brody Roa, Troy Rutherford, Max Adams, and fast qualifier Eddie Tafoya Jr. followed Boul to the checkered flags.

Racing the family owned #99T King Racing Products / BR Motorsports Triple X with an iron block 360 engine, Boul qualified tenth overall and placed third in his heat race. In limited appearances, Tanner left the Ventura County Fairgrounds ranked twenty-second in the point standings. Boul's \$3,000 victory marked the sixth USAC/CRA triumph for a 360 sprint car since 2004.

Eddie Tafoya Jr. (Chino Hills, California) earned the first Woodland Auto Display Fast Time Award of his career at Ventura. Driving the family owned #51T Specialty Fasteners / DRC Chassis entry, the 2019 Rookie of the Year posted at a time of 12.735 seconds over the 24-car roster. The second generation driver scored fifth in his heat race, finished fifth in the main event after starting seventh, and sits fourth in the point standings.

Austin Grabowski (Riverside, California) won his third consecutive heat race with the AMSOIL USAC/CRA Sprint Cars. 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BRODY ROA TOPS USAC/CRA RETURN TO SANTA MARIA

SANTA MARIA, CALIFORNIA – AUGUST 8, 2022...History was made last Saturday night as “The Pride of Garden Grove” Brody Roa (Garden Grove, California) won the AMSOIL USAC/CRA Sprint Car return to Santa Maria Raceway.

Retaking the lead for good from Tommy “Thunder” Malcolm on lap 21, Roa went on to earn the seventh victory for an iron-block 360 powered car with the series. Malcolm, hard charger Daniel Whitley, Logan Williams, and Chase Johnson rounded out the top-five drivers.

Starting on the pole position, Roa’s May Motorsports’ #8M RDM Mechanics / Fastenal Eagle fell behind winged driver Kaleb Montgomery at the green flag. Montgomery, who won a USAC 360 show at Santa Maria in 2019, was looking to claim his first non-winged 410 main event. Those hopes were dashed as a multi-car tangle brought out the caution. On the restart, Roa got the jump and held the top spot on the technical surface.

Brody increased his advantage and was well in control of the main event. By the halfway point, Roa, the former USAC Southwest Sprint Car champion, was being challenged by fifth starting Malcolm. Malcolm made a bold move and took

command on lap sixteen with his sights on his first career victory. After a couple of laps, Roa hit his marks and reeled in the leader. From there, Brody powered to the lead and sailed to his second win in a row.

With his twelfth career USAC/CRA triumph, Brody Roa moves into a tie for fifth overall on the win list with Bryan Clauson. The 2016 USAC West Coast 360 Champion began his night by qualifying seventh out of a season high 31 race cars and scored third in his heat race.

Matt Mitchell (Yorba Linda, California) began the sold out event by claiming his second Woodland Auto Display Fast Time Award of the season. Piloting his #37 Roy Miller Freight Lines / Campbell Brothers Storage Maxim, Mitchell posted a time of 14.160 on the 1/3-mile clay oval. From there, the former USAC West Coast 360 Sprint Car Champion placed fourth in his heat race and scored twenty-first in the feature after an early exit.

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CHARLES DAVIS JR. WINS THRILLER AT PERRIS!

PERRIS, CALIFORNIA – AUGUST 22, 2022... When the checkered flag waved last Saturday night at Perris Auto Speedway, the race fans in attendance and those watching online had witnessed something special.

“Chargin” Charles Davis Jr. (Buckeye, Arizona) had surprised “The Demon” Damion Gardner to lead the final lap and win the \$2,500 “California Racers Hall of Fame Night.” The seven-time Arizona Sprint Car Champion had earned his first AMSOIL USAC/CRA Sprint Car victory of the season, but there is much more to the story.

On paper, there were seven changes for lap leaders, but the top spot changed hands at least a dozen times more. Polesitter and 2019 Rookie of the Year, Eddie Tafoya Jr. led the opening circuit with “The Big Game Hunter” Austin Williams and Gardner in close quarters. Williams had his sights on his first win of the campaign and took command from Tafoya on the next lap. USAC/CRA point leader Gardner had other ideas and powered by Williams to make it three leaders in the first three laps.

Gardner looked to drive away from the field, but the fifth starting Matt Mitchell gave chase and challenged the nine-time champion. From there, the top two drivers in USAC/CRA points put on a clinic in clean and hard racing. For several laps, the duo exchanged the lead on each end on the speedway. Both drivers used “slide jobs” and countered with crossover moves to regain the top spot. With a few laps remaining, Gardner had control of the feature and powered to the white flag. Up from ninth, Davis had reeled in “The Demon” and grabbed the lead heading down the back straightaway. Damion gave one last challenge, but the night belonged to Davis, who finished ahead of Gardner, Mitchell, Williams, and Tafoya.

Racing his #47 MP Environmental Services / Black Magic Bead Breaker RSS, Charles Davis Jr. qualified eighth overall and finished fifth in his heat race. The 1993 CRA Rookie of the Year earned the night’s In Memory of Jim and Chet Gardner Hard Charger / Best Passing Job honors with a ninth place run to claim the 30-lap victory. “Chargin” Charles left the Lake Perris Fairgrounds ranked ninth in points and five career USAC/CRA wins to his credit.

Matt McCarthy (Riverside, California) opened the night by earning the first Woodland Auto Display Fast Time Award of his career. Driving the family owned #28M FlowDynamics Incorporated / DrinkPAK DRC, McCarthy posted a time of 16.845 seconds to become the 85th driver since 2004 to earn USAC/CRA top qualifying honors. Next, the 2017 Rookie of the Year claimed \$2,000 by winning the Junior Kurtz / Bill Simpson Trophy Dash over Mitchell, R.J. Johnson, and Austin Williams. The special event featured four three-lap dashes for cash with roots going back to the 1980s at the legendary Ascot Park. Matt scored sixth in his heat race, ran thirteenth in the main event, and claimed the night’s Wilwood Disc Brakes “Lucky 13 Award.” Heading to Bakersfield on September 3rd, Matt sits tenth in the point chase.

“The Demon” Damion Gardner (Concord, California) raced to victory in the night’s 10-lap FlowDynamics Incorporated / Laserworx Manufacturing / Factory Wraps First Heat Race. Piloting Mark Alexander’s #1 PerformanceOnline.com / Carman Trucking Spike, Gardner was seventh fastest in time trials and led 16 laps of the main event before scoring second at the checkered flag. “The Demon” leads the point chase by 106 markers heading to Bakersfield Speedway.

“The Cadillac” Cody Williams (Corona, California) won his first heat race of the campaign in the 10-lap Billsjerky.net / Laserworx Manufacturing / Factory Wraps sponsored event. Racing his #44 WC Friend Company / Trench Shoring DRC, Williams qualified second overall but was unable to compete in the Kurtz / Simpson Dash due to mechanical problems. The crew made repairs and “The Cadillac” responded by winning the night’s second heat race. Cody scored seventeenth in the main event and left Perris Auto Speedway ranked seventh in points.

Matt Mitchell (Yorba Linda, California) scored the victory in the 10-lap In Memory of Jim and Chet Gardner Third Heat Race. Driving his #37 J.W. Mitchell Motorsports / Roy Miller Freight Lines Maxim, Mitchell was third quick in time trials, tied R.J. Johnson for second in the Kurtz / Simpson Dash, led twelve laps of the feature, and finished third in the “California Racers Hall of Fame Night.” The former USAC West Coast Sprint Car Champion heads to Bakersfield ranked second in the point standings.

“The Pride of Garden Grove” Brody Roa (Garden Grove, California) took home the Shawn McDonald Memorial Qualifying Award by timing in sixth quick overall. Driving the BR Performance #91R HD Industries / Burris Racing Eagle, Roa placed

fifth in his heat race and scored nineteenth in the main event after an early exit. The 2019 USAC Southwest Sprint Car Champion has run a limited schedule and ranks eighth in the point chase.

A.J. Bender (San Diego, California) claimed the night's Shawn McDonald Memorial Feature Award with a sixth place finish in the "California Racers Hall of Fame Night." Racing the family owned #21 Bender Pool & Spa / K&R Motorsports DRC, Bender qualified tenth overall, placed fourth in his heat race, and scored sixth in the main event after starting tenth. The USAC Western States Midget rookie contender left Perris ranked thirteenth in points.

A special thank you goes to Perris and Ascot infield announcer Chris Holt and everyone that contributed to the "California Racers Hall of Fame Night." Holt collected over \$12,000 in additional prize money for the night's event.

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BRODY ROA CHARGES TO VICTORY AT MOHAVE VALLEY

MOHAVE VALLEY, ARIZONA – OCTOBER 12, 2022... Starting eleventh, “The Pride of Garden Grove” Brody Roa (Garden Grove, California) powered by “The Demon” Damion Gardner on lap 27 to take Saturday’s \$3,000 victory at Mohave Valley Raceway.

For Roa, the win marked his third AMSOIL USAC/CRA triumph of the season and the 2019 USAC Southwest Sprint Car Champion moves to fifth on the series win list with thirteen victories. Gardner, Tommy “Thunder” Malcolm, hard charger Shon Deskins, and “Chargin” Charles Davis Jr. followed Roa to the checkered flags.

Outside front row starter “Chargin” Charles Davis Jr., led the opening six laps in his #50 MP Environmental J&J. As track conditions were changing, polesitter Jake Helsel slipped by the multi-time Arizona champion for the top spot. Making his first start in the Ream Industries owned #8 GF1 with a 360 cubic inch engine, Helsel maintained the lead for the next twelve circuits. Taking advantage on a restart, point leader Damion Gardner took over from Helsel as the race leader. Looking for his seventh win of the year, Gardner set a torrid pace around the 1/3-mile oval. As the laps counted down, Roa had sliced his way to the front and challenged Gardner for the top spot. Roa snatched the lead and “The Demon” briefly regained command. Brody countered, secured the lead for good, and was not to be denied at Mohave Valley.

Racing the BR Performance #91R HD Industries / Burris Racing Eagle, Roa began his night by qualifying eleventh out of a season high of 32 cars. From there, the 2016 USAC West Coast Sprint Car Champion won the 10-lap In Memory of Jim and Chet Gardner Third Heat Race. Brody left Mohave Valley ranked eighth in the point chase.

Chris Gansen (Verdemont Heights, California) earned the second Woodland Auto Display Fast Time Award of his career with a time of 14.660 seconds at Mohave Valley. Driving the family owned #4G Trench Shoring / Cam 2 Blue Blood Oil Maxim, Gansen placed fifth in his heat race, scored third in the semi-main, and finished twentieth in the main event.

Making his first start in the Yeley Racing #2J Avanti Windows and Doors Twister, R.J. Johnson (Laveen, Arizona) raced to victory in the 10-lap FlowDynamics Incorporated First Heat Race. The multi-time USAC Southwest Sprint Car Champion was seventeenth quick in time trials and raced to seventh in the main event after starting fifteenth.

Tommy "Thunder" Malcolm (Corona, California) raced to victory in the night's 10-lap BillsJerky.net Second Heat Race. Piloting Dino Napier's #5X Indiana Truck Salvage / B&B Powder Coating DRC, Malcolm qualified tenth overall and raced to third in the feature from tenth. Tommy left Mohave Valley ranked fifth in the USAC/CRA point chase.

Racing Mark Alexander's #1 PerformanceOnline.com / Carman Trucking Spike, "The Demon" Demon Gardner (Concord, California) took the checkered flags in the 10-lap Laserworx Manufacturing Heat Race. Gardner was fourth fastest in time trials and led eight main event laps before finishing second to Roa. Looking for his tenth championship, the USAC/CRA point leader heads to Cocopah Speedway with a 188-point advantage.

A.J. Bender (San Diego, California) won the 12-lap Factory Wraps Semi-Main Event. Driving the family owned #21 Bender Pools & Spa / Schweitzer Racing DRC, Bender qualified eighteenth overall, ran sixth in his heat race, and finished twenty-third in the feature after an early flip ended his night.

Shon Deskins (Phoenix, Arizona) claimed Mohave Valley's hard charger / best passing job honors with a fourth place run from twentieth. Racing his #20 Mesilla Valley Transportation / Premium Coach Group DRC, Deskins was twenty-third quick in time trials and placed third in his heat race.

By virtue of his thirteenth place finish from seventeenth, Verne Sweeney (Lomita, California) earned the night's Wilwood Disc Brakes "Lucky 13 Award." Piloting Ken Tracy's #98 BillsJerky.net / Faas Cores DRC, Sweeney qualified nineteenth overall, placed fifth in his heat race, and ran fifth in the semi-main.

The AMSOIL USAC/CRA Sprint Cars will return to action on October 28 and 29th at Cocopah Speedway in Yuma, Arizona for the "Chapman Chevrolet of Yuma 55th Annual Western World Championships Presented by Yuma Insurance and Avanti." 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THE WAIT IS LIFTED: AXSOM WINS FIRST USAC SPRINT RACE IN 8 MONTHS AT WESTERN WORLD NIGHT #1

Somerton, Arizona (October 28, 2022).....More often than not, the most preferred method of ending a drought isn't one that involves heading straight into the desert.

However, Emerson Axsom found the arid surroundings of southwestern Arizona quite replenishing on Friday night during the 55th Annual Chapman Chevrolet of Yuma Western World Championships Presented by Yuma Insurance & Avanti at Somerton's Cocopah Speedway.

For Axsom (Franklin, Indiana), it had been more than eight months since he last visited victory lane with the USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National Championship, scoring wins in two of the first three rounds during February's Winter Dirt Games at Ocala, Florida's Bubba Raceway Park.

Eight months later, the leading Rookie of the Year contender found himself in an envious position within the USAC National Sprint Car ranks during the series' first ever visit to Cocopah Speedway, starting on the outside of the front row and proceeding to lead all 30 laps of the main event co-sanctioned by USAC CRA aboard his Clauson Marshall Newman Racing/Driven2SaveLives – ZMax Race Products/Spike/Kistler Chevy.

Including the two early season wins, Axsom has been consistent, reeling off 14 top-fives and 27 top-tens in 35 feature starts while routinely residing inside the top-five in series points. Axsom knew that it was only a matter of time before they could experience that winning feeling once again.

Entering Western World, the pondering of Axsom's mind as to exactly when "the wait" would be lifted off his shoulders was punctuated by the question, "Why not me?"

"I feel like we've had so much speed this season and not a lot of luck, just Rookie mistakes," Axsom explained. "We've had a shot to win a lot of these races, but I feel like I needed a little bit of luck. I felt like if anyone deserves it, maybe it's me."

Western World has treated Clauson Marshall Newman Racing beautifully in recent years. With Tyler Courtney in the driver's seat, the team captured final night victories in three consecutive seasons between 2018-2020. With Axsom stepping into the role this year, he's picked up the baton successfully to carry on the team's Western World prosperity, doing so in the driver and team's first year working together.

"We haven't had the wins, but it's not like the speed hasn't been there," Axsom noted. "We've been up front basically all year and been really consistent especially for a first year group. This is our first year working together so I feel like it's been a pretty solid year for my first full sprint car season and for all of us working together."

Axsom bolted out of the gate and into the lead as he blazed a trail around the outside of pole sitter Matt Westfall on the opening lap, firmly finding a line up top in turns one and two and on the bottom of three and four.

Brady Bacon initially closed up the gap on Axsom and found himself within a car length of the race lead on lap five when he drifted into the outside wall on exit, which promptly allowed Jake Swanson to charge underneath to rip the second spot away a single circuit later.

The feature's initial yellow flag came with seven laps completed as Logan Seavey came to a halt on the back straightaway while running 12th. After a touch up in the Indy Metal Finishing Work Area, the reigning Western World champion restarted 24th and came all the way through to finish an impressive ninth, all things considered.

Under caution, Bacon's right rear tire looked visibly wonky, to use a technical term. When racing resumed, it was only a matter of time before his rubber gave way, which it finally did on lap 12 while running third. With the tire completely flat and his ride slowing dramatically, Bacon detoured to the Work Area where he was fitted with fresh rubber.

Bacon's subsequent 10th place result severely hampered his chances at a fifth career USAC National Sprint Car title, losing 15 points in the process to eventual fifth place finisher Justin Grant who extended his lead to 93 markers with four events remaining.

Swanson was now the nearest challenger to Axsom's hold of the lead and made a run on the top side of turn two on the lap 12 restart to show his might. However, he got tight on the cushion and nearly tagged the wall, causing him to lose several car lengths in his pursuit of Axsom.

Simultaneously, Westfall slotted back into third as he slipped under Grant for the third spot entering turn three. But, up front, Axsom built his lead to a full two seconds over Swanson as he moved up a lane off the low line to put the cars of Verne Sweeney, Logan Williams, and Matt Mitchell a lap down.

From there, Axsom went untouched for the remaining handful of dwindling laps to post a 1.936 second margin of victory with Jake Swanson second and Matt Westfall third. Robert Ballou picked off Justin Grant with a move underneath off turn four with four laps remaining to take over fourth at the line. Grant rounded out the top-five.

Seemingly inching closer to a first win of the 2022 USAC season is Jake Swanson (Anaheim, California) who took the home state ride from fifth to second in the feature. The run marked his third runner-up result of the USAC National Sprint Car season and the second in his last three feature starts in the seat of the Team AZ Racing/Beaver Stripes – RSS Industries – USW Cat Construction/DRC/1-Way Chevy.

"I felt like I was making it work up there and I might have a shot, but it got to a point where it was so thin up there, I started smashing the wall," Swanson recalled. "I didn't want to end up like Brady with a flat right rear, but I tried as hard as I could. I don't know, maybe if I would've backed the corner up and made up a little more ground the first couple laps, I might've been able to get around him. At that point, it was track position. (Emerson) was really good in the black, but I think we know exactly what to do to be just a little bit better tomorrow."

For Matt Westfall, it was his best performance in 10 years. The Pleasant Hill, Ohio native earned his best USAC National Sprint Car finish since April of 2012 at Ohio's Eldora Speedway. That night a decade ago, he finished third. On this night, in his first trip to Cocopah, he grabbed another third at the wheel of his Ray Marshall Motorsports/Buckeye Machine – Hempy Water/DRC/Gressman Chevy.

"On the start, the tires didn't fire all that well and I got behind and fell to fifth," Westfall replayed. "When Brady had that flat tire, it helped us out as we got back to third, and we ended up having a good run."

While establishing the USAC National Sprint Car track record at Cocopah, C.J. Leary (Greenfield, Indiana) officially entered the upper crust alongside the best qualifiers in the history of the sport. His Fatheadz Fast Qualifying time was the 39th of his USAC National Sprint Car career, tying him with Levi Jones for fifth on the all-time list.

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HOME SWEEP HOME: SWANSON DELIVERS WESTERN WORLD PERFECTION FOR TEAM AZ AT COCOPAH

Somerton, Arizona (October 29, 2022).....Perhaps it was an omen. Perhaps he had a statement to make. Perhaps it was simply his moment. Perhaps it was all of the above.

But one night following a second-place qualifying run and a runner-up finish in the feature, Jake Swanson made certain that he was “the one” in all aspects during Saturday night’s 55th Annual Chapman Chevrolet of Yuma Western World Championships Presented by Yuma Insurance & Avanti.

One couldn’t help but wonder if it was a harbinger of things to come when the Anaheim, California native kicked open the door at the forefront of Saturday’s program at Arizona’s Cocopah Speedway by setting a new track record during Fatheadz Eyewear Qualifying.

As it soon became abundantly clear, Swanson’s evening was just getting started.

Swanson turned up the wick with a last turn, last lap pass to win his heat race after starting sixth, then followed through by once again charging from sixth to first in the feature, overtaking Robert Ballou for the lead with 13 laps remaining in the 30-lapper to score a complete sweep of the night in his Team AZ Racing/Beaver Stripes – RSS Industries – USW Cat Construction/DRC/1-Way Chevy.

The complete dominance displayed by Swanson in all phases – from qualifying to his heat race and to the feature – was the first such sweep in USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National Championship competition since Tyler Courtney did so during the 4-Crown Nationals at Ohio’s Eldora Speedway in September of 2019.

To boot, the second USAC National Sprint Car victory of Swanson’s career was his most lucrative thus far with a \$10,000 payday and, by doing so, he came through by delivering a dream come true for the Arizona-based Team AZ operation, which finally achieved one of its prized aspirations – winning in their home state at the Western World.

It’s a long way from the sort of season that Swanson described as “chaos” at certain points this summer due to injury, bad luck and misfortune running roughshod over the team in USAC competition during 2022.

"It's just been non-stop work and there's been no time for any sort of relaxation. I've got a little cold, and it turned into a weeklong thing because I couldn't ever just rest," Swanson explained. "I'm just thankful for the opportunity to be able to do this. It's been such a blessing moving to the Midwest (to race more often and for a living) and I didn't really think I'd ever get the chance. I felt like I was too old. I didn't really think it was going to happen but then COVID came, and it was one of those decisions where we jumped on it, went all-in and just hoped it would pan out."

Not only was it a winning performance for Swanson, but it was also a riveting dissection of the 24-car field which witnessed him make all the right moves at all the right times throughout the non-stop, caution-free affair which presented Swanson with his second new track record of the night, this one for the distance of 30 laps.

"My job is so easy when I have such a fast racecar; holy cow," Swanson exclaimed. "This thing has just been on rails. I was rolling out there starting six and I'm like, man, I've got some good guys up here in front of us. I still felt like, as long as I do my job, this car can win the race. I've just got to make it happen."

While Swanson had an eagle eye view of the front of the pack proceedings from his outside row three starting position of the USAC National and USAC CRA co-sanctioned event, pole sitter Ballou stepped away to the early race lead while, in between Ballou and Swanson, a bit of high speed, close-quarters jockeying was at full intensity right from the get-go.

As C.J. Leary darted down the back straightaway right up against the outside wall, the squeeze play was on as Damion Gardner refused Leary access to have free reign to the fourth spot. The ensuing moment put Leary in the pinch position as he bounced his right rear tire off the concrete and lost quite a bit of ground. Leary caught up to Gardner in turn four and the resulting bumper-to-bumper contact sent Gardner slashing sideways across traffic all while retaining his position as Leary slid back to eighth.

Ballou maintained his steady presence on the bottom line for the first third of the race while Friday night winner Emerson Axsom stepped up to the top with a resurgent Leary and Swanson right in tow. However, Swanson was quickly gaining a full head of steam and slid under Leary in turn three to grab the third spot on lap 10.

Swanson soon made a bid for second as he peeked under Axsom for second in turn three on the very next lap before falling back into line and reloading. Swanson utilized his ammo to ultimately breeze past Axsom for second, then completed the pass exiting turn four on lap 13.

Riding the rim like the hero of a paperback novel, Swanson challenged Ballou to an all-out duel just after the midway point with the pair of native Californians riding two-wide down the back straight on the 18th circuit. Digging in, Swanson put the hammer to the nail and rode the wave around the outside of Ballou to complete the pass, and his quest for the lead, off turn four.

"I was worried about the racetrack kind of getting single file and I wanted to get to the lead as soon as I could and make sure I had track position when I needed it," Swanson noted. "I don't think it would've mattered, though. We still would've been able to drive to the front."

Meanwhile, moments later, Ballou became the one who got burned in a three-way script. Enter number two, which was Leary, who flew around the outside to gain second from Ballou on lap 21, then reeled in Swanson in a hurry and was now within a handful of car lengths outside the lead as the front runners work heavy traffic.

Just when Leary seemed poised to strike on lap 24, he tagged the turn two wall in his pursuit of Swanson to reach the head of the class. That caused Leary to lose a substantial enough amount of ground to prevent him from formulating another attack, although he reloaded and was poised to return.

Leary lured his way back into the race for the lead on the final lap and was a mere single car length behind Swanson in turn two when Leary drifted over the top of the cushion, unceremoniously ending his one last chance to take a shot at Swanson.

Though two-wide traffic loomed ahead for Swanson in turns three and four on the final go-around, he was able to navigate swiftly and decisively to clean sail his way into the books as a Western World champion with Leary .816 of a second behind

in the runner-up spot. Axsom nipped Ballou at the line for third by a nose with Ballou fourth in the order and Brady Bacon fifth.

Leary (Greenfield, Indiana) overcame an adventurous first lap in which he free-fell from fourth to eighth. He then gathered it up to advance all the way back to a second place result in his Michael Motorsports/Kodiak Products – Gray Auto – Highsmith Guns – DMI/DRC/1-Way Chevy.

“On the start there, I gave up some ground and I had a run-in with the 1 car,” Leary recalled. “We were so good at the end there and I was going to race Jake really hard. I was hoping to get a run at him in lapped traffic but, overall, it was a good weekend.”

A successful first Western World is in the books for Axsom (Franklin, Indiana). A night after winning the Western World opener, he raced by Ballou on the final lap to take third by inches at the finish line. It's Axsom's first run of back-to-back podium finishes since February of this season aboard his Clauson Marshall Newman Racing/Driven2SaveLives – ZMax Race Products/Spike/Kistler Chevy.

“Once you find a good package for something, you just stick to it and fine-tune,” Axsom said of the blueprint for CMNR's success throughout the weekend. “I felt like, at the end, we were really coming alive to get Robert at the line. I think it was getting a little abrasive in turn one and, if there was a little bit more time, maybe we would've had a shot.”

Logan Seavey (Sutter, California), meanwhile, pocketed up more than \$1,100 in bonus bucks for his hard-charging performances during Western World weekend. Seavey passed 26 total cars across both nights to earn the Western World ProSource Passing Master Award. Furthermore, Seavey's run from 21st to 6th in Saturday's feature race earned him the coveted Lafond Jar of Change, which made up more than \$900 of Seavey's bonuses courtesy of fan donations.

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THIS ONE'S FOR TED: BACON'S TRIUMPH A SPECIAL ONE AT OVALS OPENER

Perris, California (November 3, 2022)..... When Brady Bacon stands on the throttle, everybody soon takes notice.

In a similar manner, the same could be said for Brady's grandfather, Ted Bacon. When Ted spoke, everyone listened.

Sadly, the words of the Bacon family's racing patriarch fell silent on Tuesday morning when Ted passed away.

Two days later, Brady strapped into a sprint car and ultimately pulled into victory lane on the opening night of the 26th Heimark Anheuser Busch Budweiser Oval Nationals at California's Perris Auto Speedway.

It's the same drill Brady had performed 44 previous times in his USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National Championship career, but this one carried extra significance. This one was for Grandpa Ted.

"It's bittersweet," Brady admitted. "You never want to lose anybody, but he wasn't doing well with not being able to do everything he wanted to do. He was on the go all the time and not being able to do that wasn't ideal for him."

When posed the question of what his grandfather would've said to him had he witnessed his victorious performance on Thursday night, Brady theorized that Ted would've remarked something short and sweet along the lines of, "Ahh, pretty good."

Succinct and straight to the point. Just like Ted's words of praise, Brady approached the start of the Oval Nationals in a highly familiar fashion.

Brady reached the front of the field just six laps in, then raced away to his first USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National Championship feature victory since June 19 – a span of 24 races and roughly four-and-a-half months – in his Dynamics, Inc./Fatheadz Eyewear – Cressman Sanitation – DriveWFX – Tel-Star/Triple X/Rider Chevy.

Brady's fourth career Perris feature victory was his 45th overall in USAC National Sprint Car competition, tying him for fifth all-time with 1968-70-75 series champion, Larry Dickson.

Grandpa Ted was a supermodified standout in his heyday during the 1970s-80 who competed against contemporaries like Emmett Hahn, Harold Leep and Mike Peters at dirt tracks from Dewey, Oklahoma to Hutchinson, Kansas. Yet, his grandson Brady's feat sure would've been something he'd have been proud of, and something he'd have had no reservations telling Brady what was on his mind.

“He was hardnosed, and he’d tell you what he thought regardless of whether you had a dollar or 10 million or if you were five-foot tall or seven-foot tall. He didn’t care. He always liked to have a good time, did things his way and that was the only way. That’s what we always used to say. There’s Ted’s way and the wrong way.”

Brady and the Dynamics, Inc. team unloaded with a fast piece right from the get-go, first by recording the best lap during Wednesday night’s open practice. Starting sixth in the 30-lap feature, Brady wasted little time in showing that they were up to the task.

Methodically marching up through the field one-by-one, Brady picked off one spot per lap throughout the first five circuits. On the fifth lap, Bacon used a drive to wedge a path into the lead entering turn three in front of Robert Ballou. However, Ballou defied the change of position for a moment as he turned down underneath Bacon to regain the position.

Bacon’s second try became the second verse, different from the first, as he roared past on the back straightaway on lap six to take over, retain and maintain the lead from there on out.

With the lap count dwindling to six laps remaining, Bacon controlled the remote, dialing up a 3.609 second lead over second-running Max Adams, who was in the midst of his best career USAC National Sprint Car run.

But things can change in a hurry as evidenced by fourth place Jake Swanson who tagged the outside wall with his right rear tire in turn four, which sent him into a spin-cycle, airborne 360. Swanson’s car was straightened out only due to the fifth-running car of Justin Grant who hit the front left of Swanson’s car squarely. Back on the gas, Swanson found himself as a passenger with the front end knocked out, thus sending him on a beeline to the left that stopped him in his tracks about a foot from the inside front straightaway wall. Nonetheless, the 2021 “Ovals” opening night winner’s victory defense was finished while Grant continued on.

Once more, Bacon scooted away on the lap 26 restart over Adams. Meanwhile, Ballou and Grant exchanged a bevy of sliders in a duel for third with Ballou escaping back into the spot just prior to the yellow flag for Kyle Edwards (21st) who climbed the turn four wall, knocking him out of the contest.

Adams subsequently slipped above the cushion in turn two on the lap 28 restart, handing over two pieces of real estate to Ballou and Grant who promptly zoomed past. Grant surpassed Ballou for second at the entry to turn three with the white flag being waved just ahead on the horizon. Meanwhile, Leary streamed a path past Adams along the inside berm in turns three and four to gain fifth.

Just then, Brody Roa (6th) whipped against the turn four wall and was subjected to a similar fate as Swanson just a handful of laps earlier with Roa pirouetting along the outside wall before beaching his front wheels atop the turn four concrete, forcing yet another in a barrage of restarts that Brady was forced to endure down the stretch.

“I was getting nervous with all those restarts at the end,” Brady relayed. “I just felt like something was going to happen – a tire going down or me messing up on the start and opening the door for somebody to slide me. But luckily, that didn’t happen.”

Foreshadowing, Bacon hit the “Esc” key to distance himself from the fray without another obstruction in his path during the green-white-checkered finish which sent the four-time USAC National Sprint Car driving champion to another Perris victory while closing the gap on his deficit in the championship race from 83 points to 76 behind Grant who grabbed runner-up honors 0.959 sec. behind Bacon at the line.

“Anything’s still possible with the points as well, but that would require some misfortune from some other people,” Bacon stated, regarding the final two races of the year this weekend. “I’d never wish that on anybody, but we’ll just try to do the best we can, and if something like that were to happen, we would be in a position to capitalize.”

In fact, the top-four in USAC National Sprint Car points ran first, second, third and fourth. Leary rounded out the podium in third while Ballou landed fourth. Reigning Oval Nationals champion Kevin Thomas Jr. mounted an excellent charge from 13th to fifth to round out the top-five.

Justin Grant (Ione, California) made a superb late-race bolt to the forefront of the field, advancing from fifth to second over the final seven laps to finish in the runner-up spot in his TOPP Motorsports/NOS Energy Drink – MPV Express – TOPP Industries/Maxim/Kistler Chevy, and now stands on the cusp of what we hopes is a first career series championship with just two races remaining.

C.J. Leary (Greenfield, Indiana) set quick time and turned in a solid result to score a third place feature finish in his Michael Motorsports/Kodiak Products – Gray Auto – Highsmith Guns – DMI/DRC/1-Way Chevy. It's the 2019 USAC National Sprint Car champion's fifth consecutive top-five feature result at Perris dating back to 2019.

During Fatheadz Eyewear qualifying, Leary moved into sole possession of fifth all-time in terms of career fast qualifying times with the USAC National Sprint Cars. The 40th of Leary's career moved him into sole possession of fifth all-time ahead of five-time series titlist Levi Jones. Furthermore, his 11 quick times in 2022 are the third most in a single season, equaling his own mark in 2019 and trailing only Kevin Thomas Jr.'s 15 in 2018 and Tom Bigelow's 14 in 1978.

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THE MADMAN COMETH: BALLOU SWIPES LATE-RACE VICTORY AT OVALS NIGHT TWO

Perris, California (November 4, 2022).....During a red flag period 10 laps into Friday night's feature event at California's Perris Auto Speedway, Robert Ballou was feeling confident.

Sitting third at the time, the Rocklin, California native felt that he had a good enough car to, at least, run second.

With that said, he wasn't quite sold on whether another Oval Nationals prelim victory was within the realm of possibility on this night.

In that particular moment, Ballou felt that then-race leader Kevin Thomas Jr. was the class of the field after checking out to a considerable lead in the early stages.

However, that's why they run the races, and the balance of the 30-lap distance from that point forward ultimately painted a completely different picture in Ballou's favor.

In fact, it was pure artistry from one of the best to ever do it on the USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National Championship tour and, despite the earlier estimation, Ballou wasn't going to go down without a fight.

"(C.J.) Leary got under me one lap (with 10 laps to go), but I was too tight to run down there then," Ballou explained. "I tried to get my shocks a little bit better to where I could hold it down around the bottom and not get tight. It was really tough, but then Brady (Bacon) shot right by me, and I'm like, the 69 isn't getting by me tonight and I sat up in the seat."

Running as deep as fourth with just 10 laps remaining, Ballou found a sudden burst that put him right back into the thick of the hunt. It came just as he foretold during the earlier stoppage, that he would be a player for the win once the fuel load began to burn off.

"I feel like we're better than (second-running Emerson) Axsom," Ballou stated during the early-race red flag. "But as the fuel load burns off, and with me being a fat guy, my car should be a little bit faster where a guy like him might slow down a little bit. I feel that we've got the car to at least run second, but (Thomas) has pretty much checked out by the looks of it."

As it turned out, Ballou was just checking in on lap 20. Ballou charged under Brady Bacon for third on the back straight with nine to go. One lap later, Ballou glided his way into second with a turn one slide past Emerson Axsom to put him within a full two seconds of Thomas who seemingly held a commanding lead with the sands in the hourglass collecting piling up.

Finding his way into his front-running position by utilizing the bottom side of the racetrack, Thomas cut a swath of land for his own use by entering turns one and three on the bottom, then letting his car sweep to the top at the exit of turns two and four.

But with two laps until the bell tolled for thee, Thomas faced a bout of traffic. Charging into turn one hot on the heels of the 24th place car of Chris Gansen, Thomas was forced to alter his line on the bottom, skating his ride up the track a tad earlier in the corner than he had all race long.

The loss of momentum for Thomas was all Ballou needed to dig his talons in on the low line and drive his way past on the back straight to rise to the top of the leaderboard once and for all and for good.

Ballou negotiated turns three and four splendidly, scraping the infield berm with his left front wheel along the way as he dipped under Gansen who cleared a courteous path for the frontrunners by swinging wide on the front straightaway just as the white flag was being presented.

Ballou, Thomas and now Leary entered the final lap separated by a single car length between each driver. Ballou gained some much obliged separation from Thomas on the backside of the half-mile dirt oval, carrying onward to a 0.632 second victory in his Ballou Motorsports/Suburban Subaru - Dragonfly Aviation - Berks Western Telecom/Triple X/Ott Chevy.

Thomas collected a second place result after leading a race-high 27 laps while Jake Swanson made a last lap, last corner surge to beat Leary to the line by a single car length for the third position. Thursday night's Oval Nationals opening night winner Brady Bacon rounded out the top-five with a fifth-place result.

Emerson Axsom, who led the opening lap, was the sixth place finisher and scored the best finish among Oval Nationals Rookies in the field.

But Ballou was the main man on this evening as he punched his ticket for series victory number 37, which tied him with Sheldon Kinser for 11th on the all-time USAC National Sprint Car feature win list.

Ballou's sixth series victory of the year equals him with Justin Grant as the season's winningest driver, making it his most successful and winningest campaign since his 2015 championship year, which just so happened to be the last time in which he was victorious at Perris.

That is, until Friday night. That's when Ballou found something even more than he knew he had, which resulted in his fifth career USAC triumph at Perris after taking advantage of the situation at hand.

"When you're out front, you don't know where to go, especially on a long green. I just saw him sliding out," Ballou recalled of Thomas' lap 29 misfortune.

Three-time and defending Oval Nationals champion Kevin Thomas Jr. (Cullman, Ala.) nearly provided Michael Dutcher Motorsports with its first USAC National Sprint Car feature win since February of 2015 at Florida's East Bay Raceway Park, which came with Thomas behind the wheel of his Lifestyle Homes – Griffin's Propane – ProSource/Maxim/Chevy.

"We just got a little bit free at the end," Thomas acknowledged. "I lost brakes with about eight or 10 laps to go. I'm kind of bummed, but we've been making a lot of gains on this thing. I've never won a prelim night feature here, but as long as we're locked in, tomorrow's what we care about. We've made some great strides on what we need to do and some different little things we need to change. It's about getting acclimated with these guys again and just getting comfortable. Once we do that, the car has speed and we've just got to work a few little bugs out. Dutch and the guys work really hard on it; he takes very good care of his equipment and takes a lot of pride in it."

Jake Swanson (Anaheim, California) put together a redeeming third-place performance on Friday night at Perris. After a crash into the turn four wall the night before, Swanson zipped by Leary on the last lap to grab the final spot on the podium in his Team AZ Racing/Beaver Stripes – RSS Industries – USW Cat Construction/DRC/1-Way Chevy. It was Swanson's third stop in the top-three during his last four USAC National Sprint Car feature starts.

"I think we needed a 40-lapper there," Swanson admitted. "It was just getting faster and faster the more the track opened up and we were able to pass. I felt like we were really fast, but it was just a matter of getting the room to get by. We were on C.J.'s tail tank there at the end and we're able to make something happen. C.J. did a good job, but he just got a little bit crossed up there racing with (Thomas). I was working the middle and trying to make it work early, but it wasn't really working for me. Brady was able to do it then I think I finally figured it out by the end."

Leary set Fatheadz Eyewear Fast Qualifying time for the 41st time of his USAC National Sprint Car career Friday night at Perris. For the Greenfield, Indiana driver, it was his second fast time in as many nights and his 12th of the series season. Oddly enough, it also marked the fifth time Leary and Swanson have qualified first and second during a USAC event this year (4 Sprint & 1 Silver Crown).

Two drivers got upside down during the evening, first being Mitchel Moles who tipped over and caught a brief flame during the semi-feature.

Daniel Whitley, making his first career USAC National Sprint Car feature start, flipped into the catchfence on lap 10 and never came back down, at least for a little while. His Ted Finkenbinder-owned ride became lodged in the fence between three and four, prompting a nearly 25-minute red flag to corral the car and make fence repairs. Both Moles and Whitley walked away from their respective incidents.

Six drivers are locked into Saturday night's 40-lap Oval Nationals feature event by virtue of their accumulated point totals throughout Thursday and Friday's programs: Brady Bacon (275), C.J. Leary (274), Robert Ballou (271), Kevin Thomas Jr. (268), Justin Grant (258), and Emerson Axsom (244). The group of six will also participate in the Super Six Dash to determine the first three rows of starting spots for the main event.

Meanwhile, Justin Grant's eighth place feature finish garnered him a 66-point lead over Bacon entering the final race of the USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National Championship season. An appearance in Saturday's racing program will clinch a first career USAC National Sprint Car title for Grant and TOPP Motorsports.

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BACON BANKS 20-GRAND AT OVALS, GRANT GRABS USAC SPRINT TITLE

Perris, California (November 5, 2022).....For Brady Bacon, winning four of the six Oval Nationals preliminary night features that have been held at California's Perris Auto Speedway since 2019 was a nice feather to have in his cap.

However, the biggest prize of them all had eluded the 32-year-old driver for, quite literally, half his life.

Thirteen starts and sixteen years since his "Ovals" debut in 2006, Bacon had waited patiently for his time to finally arrive on championship night of the Heimark Anheuser Busch Budweiser Oval Nationals.

There was no more time spent in the waiting room for the Broken Arrow, Okla. native on Saturday night's 26th running of the marquee event as Bacon had no room to wait any longer.

Starting fourth, Bacon tore around the outside of Friday night prelim winner Robert Ballou to take over third on lap four. When pole sitter Justin Grant drifted off the bottom in turn four on lap eight, again, Bacon was there to capitalize.

On the 11th circuit, Bacon took his ride to the front of the field, launching down the back straight and blowing past Axsom for the race lead, then carrying onward to score one of his largest paydays with a \$20,000 score aboard his Dynamics, Inc./Fatheadz Eyewear – Cressman Sanitation – DriveWFX – Tel-Star/Triple X/Rider Chevy.

For the four-time USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National champion, it was a long time to wait for a coveted “Ovals” win, and it was a long time coming. But, when all was said and done, this one was finally his, ending years and years of oh-so-closes and almosts.

“It feels good to finally get this one,” Bacon exhaled. “It seems like we always miss it a little bit for the Saturday night feature here.”

There was no such consternation this time around for Bacon, who had previously logged five top-five finishes on the final night of the “Ovals” throughout his career, bested with a third in 2017. Bacon led the final 30 laps to record his second feature victory in a three-night span.

Bacon’s latest triumph was the 46th of his USAC National Sprint Car career, moving him past three-time champion Larry Dickson and into a tie for fourth on the all-time list alongside USAC and National Sprint Car Hall of Famer Jack Hewitt.

The evening was a lucrative one for Bacon as he not only pocketed \$20,000 for his Oval Nationals main event win but also added a \$10,000 bonus as the champion of the 10-race Bubby Jones Master of Going Faster series Presented by Spire Sports + Entertainment.

“This race is pretty important for our season financially,” Bacon explained. “If things faltered, or if I had a problem, it could’ve been a \$20,000 loss. I was kind of nervous about that all day. Obviously, the goal was to win this race and now I’ve got a \$40,000 swing the other way.”

Bacon didn’t exactly get away scot-free once he initially established himself as the race leader. Nearing the middle stages of the 40-lap feature, Axsom didn’t go away quietly as he kept pace with Bacon and, at times, was able to pull even in the fight for the lead.

On lap 17, calamity ensued in turn three when car of newly crowned 10-time AMSOIL USAC CRA Sprint Car champion Damion Gardner (10th) slowed suddenly. In a desperate attempt to avert the scene of the wreckage, Max Adams (13th), Tommy Malcolm (14th), and Daniel Whitley (17th) all tangled and stopped.

Meanwhile, Gardner made an excursion to the Indy Metal Finishing Work Area, wounded with a flat right rear tire, which was promptly swapped out for new rubber that returned him to the race. Gardner eventually dropped out soon after and finished 22nd. Oval Nationals Rookie Daniel Whitley was pushed away as well until his right front wheel decided to go solo and rolled aimlessly on the track through turns three and four.

Thereafter, the biggest mover and shaker instantly became Jake Swanson. The seventh starting driver grazed the bottom, and when Ballou drifted up a full lane at the exit of turn four on lap 20, that left the door open for Swanson to scoot under Ballou for third at the halfway mark. Swanson then took on Axsom and shot underneath in turn three with three laps remaining to slot into second.

At that point, Bacon had race officials with Sharpies in hand preparing to endorse his name on the mega-sized victory lane check. His lead stood at four-plus seconds with little obstruction along the way, sans a singular pack of lapped cars that caused little to no hiccups on Bacon’s warpath of dominance on both ends of the half-mile dirt oval.

“We kind of had a little mixture,” Bacon noted on the team’s car setup. “We had turns three and four from Thursday night and one and two from Friday night, so we did a combination on the car. It was something that worked pretty well, and even though I was making mistakes on top, I didn’t think anyone else could do it a whole lot better than me.”

He was right. Nobody did it better than Bacon in any facet down the stretch as he went on to collect a monumental win for his team and himself after a trying week that took its emotional toll. Brady’s grandfather, Ted, passed away on Tuesday morning and the team has been competing with heavy hearts ever since. Brady soldiered on to win not once, but twice in three nights at the Oval Nationals.

“It was a sweet win we had, especially after the hard week we’ve had,” Bacon acknowledged. “We definitely had a smoother week than we normally have here so, hopefully, he was helping us out and we’ll take it. It sure is a good way to top off the season.”

Jake Swanson (Anaheim, California) and his late-race effort earned him his best career Oval Nationals result. He swept by Axsom with three laps to go on his way to scoring a second place finish, besting his previous top Oval Nationals Saturday night performance of sixth one year earlier in 2021. Swanson finished the 2022 USAC National Sprint Car season on a high note with four podium finishes in his last five starts, including a 2nd, 1st, 3rd, and 2nd in his Team AZ Racing/Beaver Stripes – RSS Industries – USW Cat Construction/DRC/1-Way Chevy.

“I’m glad we started seventh even though I wish we would’ve been in the Super Six and be able to start up there with those guys,” Swanson stated. “But starting seventh was the best case scenario for us tonight and we were able to methodically work the bottom and work our way up through those guys. By the time I got to second, Brady was already checked out. I didn’t even know how hard he was running it or where he was running it. I felt like I was all by myself out there. At some point, I’m going to win one of these eagle (trophies). I love this place too much and I plan on doing it. Hopefully, it will be in the near future.”

It was a highly impressive debut for Emerson Axsom (Franklin, Indiana) who led the first 10 laps of his first career Oval Nationals start en route to a third place result in his Clauson Marshall Newman Racing/Driven2SaveLives – ZMax Race Products/Spike/Kistler Chevy. Axsom ended the season as the top-Rookie finisher in the USAC National Sprint Car standings, which was part of the learning curve, among other things, that played a role in his result which rounded out the podium.

“I think a lot of it was experience and we also had a tire delaminate,” Axsom revealed. “It was a tough deal, but obviously, Brady and Jake are really good here. My guys gave me a really great car. That’s probably about the best I’ve felt all year, but it’s a little disappointing with the tire. This is the biggest race for us, and I wanted to win.”

C.J. Leary came home fourth while Robert Ballou took home fifth. Landing just outside the top-five was sixth place finisher Justin Grant (Lone, California). By firing off for wheel pack/engine heat at the beginning of the evening, Grant clinched his first career USAC National Sprint Car driving championship after more than a decade-plus of close calls and heartbreaks. Grant earned a \$50,000 reward as the series' newest king. It's his second overall USAC National title after capturing the Silver Crown championship in 2020. Meanwhile, he drove Rochester, Indiana-based TOPP Motorsports to its first series entrant crown.

Jadon Rogers (Worthington, Indiana) was the man of the move throughout his debut weekend at Perris. He advanced more positions across the past three nights of feature racing than any other driver with 21 cars passed. On Saturday, he traveled 21st to 8th, which clinched him a \$1,000 bonus as the All Coast Construction Tony Jones Oval Nationals Hard Charger.

No driver passed more cars throughout the entirety of Oval Nationals than Tommy Malcolm (Corona, California) who advanced 26 positions during the weekend, which encompassed heat races, C-Mains, the Super Six Dash, semi-feature, and feature events. The effort worked in his favor as he came out on top of the ProSource Oval Nationals Passing Master award.

During Fatheadz Eyewear Qualifying, Mitchel Moles (Raisin City, California) became the most successful Rookie qualifier in USAC National Sprint Car history. Moles' eighth quick time in his first year of series competition surpassed Tanner Thorson's former record of seven from 2021. Wildly enough, both drivers achieved the feat while driving for the same team – the Reinbold-Underwood Motorsports #19AZ.
