THE CLOSEST EVER: SULYI SCORES NARROW 4-POINT USAC EASTERN MIDGET CHAMPIONSHIP IN 2023

Logan Sulyi prevailed in the closest USAC Eastern Midget Association points battle ever during the 2023 season.

The Raleigh, N.C. racer defeated J.T Bierman by just four points and one on-track position with his narrow victory in the season finale in October at North Carolina's Carteret County Speedway.

The previous closest margin between first and second in the 20-year history of the series came in 2020 when Jessica Bean defeated Hunter Wise by 14 markers in the final tally.

To boot, Sulyi earned the championship in style by winning the final two events of the year at North Carolina's Tri-County and Carteret County Speedways, becoming just the fourth driver to close out with two victories and the championship along with Chase Scott in 2004, Jared Irvan in 2012 and Jessica Bean in 2019.

Beginning his career in quarter midgets and karts before moving on to midgets in 2022, the 17-year-old was a winner with the USAC Eastern Midget Association during his Rookie season a year ago while finishing third in points, setting the stage for a title run in his father Mike Sulyi's No. 19 in 2023.

Sulyi was solid throughout the '23 campaign, finishing inside the top-four in all but one of his 10 series starts, winning three times in all, including an early season triumph at his hometown track of Wake County Speedway in Raleigh, N.C.

However, throughout the year, Sulyi regularly had to contend with Bierman (Bath, Pa.). Sulyi led the points for a span of two events between May and June before Bierman took over and held the top rung of the standings from June until two races remaining in late September.

Bierman was spectacular in qualifying, garnering a fast time in each of the final seven races of the season and became a first-time series winner in July at North Carolina's New River All American Speedway.

Reigning series champion Hunter Wise (Allentown, Pa.) came home third in the final standings, his fourth consecutive season of finishing inside the top-four of the standings.

Chris Lamb (Colfax, N.C.) took fourth in the standings, leading a series-high 108 laps and winning a series-high four features while increasing his series victory total to a staggering 61 with scores at Orange County Speedway, Dillon Motor Speedway, Dominion Raceway and Shenandoah Speedway.

Between Dakoda Armstrong and Brady Allum, they took turns in winning the first four meetings of the season. Armstrong (New Castle, Ind.) and Allum (Gold Hill, N.C.) captured a pair of non-points special events with a wing affixed to their roll cages in February at Florida's Auburndale Speedway.

Without the wing, Armstrong proceeded to win the initial points race of the year at Dillon while Allum followed up in the second round with a trophy at Caraway Speedway. Allum wound up fifth in the series standings while Armstrong grabbed seventh in part-time duty.

In all, five non-points special events were held. Shortly after picking up a major win in the Little 500 Sprint Car race at Anderson (Ind.) Speedway, Jake Trainor (Medway, Mass.) raced to victory lane at Massachusetts' Seekonk Speedway during the 27th annual running of the Boston Louie Seymour Memorial while also sporting a wing in a co-sanctioned event with NEMA Lites.

The east met the west when the USAC Eastern Midget Association faced off with the USAC Rocky Mountain Radical Midgets for a pair of non-points special events in September at Idaho's Meridian Speedway. Chuck Groat (West Valley

City, Utah) took round one while Ashlyn Powell (West Valley City, Utah), a softball player for Southeast Arkansas College away from the track, won the following evening.

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STRONG START: ARMSTRONG WINS USAC EASTERN FOCUS SPECIAL AT AUBURNDALE

Winter Haven, Florida (February 10, 2023).....For Dakota Armstrong, a return to USAC Eastern Focus Midget victory lane was in order on Friday night at Florida's Auburndale Speedway.

The 2004 USAC Kenyon Midget titlist and former NASCAR Xfinity and Camping World Truck Series wheelman took over the lead on lap five from early race leader Chris Lamb, then led the remaining distance of the 50-lapper to earn the victory in a non-points special winged event for the series.

Prior to last July's victory, it had been 14 years since Armstrong (New Castle, Ind.) last experienced a USAC victory lane celebration. Now, just a mere six-and-a-half months later, he's back in the win column.

Armstrong was followed to the finish line by Northeastern Midget Association regulars Jake Trainor (Medway, Mass.) and P.J. Stergios (Candia, N.H.) with Chris Lamb (Colfax, N.C.) and Chase Locke (Chester, N.H.) rounding out the top-five.

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IT'S ALL ALLUM AT AUBURNDALE

Winter Haven, Florida (February 11, 2023).....Brady Allum lost the lead early on but reloaded and surged back to the front by the midway point to score Saturday night's USAC Eastern Focus Midget non-points special event feature at Florida's Auburndale Speedway.

Allum (Taylorsville, N.C.) led the opening 14 laps before being overtaken for the lead by Northeastern Midget Association regular P.J. Stergios. Stergios (Candia, N.H.) commanded the field for 10 circuits between laps 15-24 until Allum carved his way back to P1 on lap 25 of the 50-lap winged event.

Stergios ultimately dropped out of the race with nine laps remaining to finish 12th.

It was all Allum in the end as he collected the victory by leading the final 26 trips around the 1/4-mile paved oval. Todd Bertrand (Suffield, Conn.) finished second with Chase Locke (Chester, N.H.) third, Friday night Auburndale winner Dakota Armstrong (New Castle, Ind.) fourth and Jake Trainor (Medway, Mass.) fifth.

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ARMSTRONG FLEXES IN USAC EASTERN FOCUS MIDGET SHOWDOWN AT DILLON

Dillon, South Carolina (April 1, 2023).....Dakota Armstrong raced to victory during Saturday night's USAC Eastern Focus Midget event at South Carolina's Dillon Motor Speedway.

The New Castle, Ind. native took over the top spot from Brady Allum nine laps into the 35-lap main event in his Radical Racing owned machine, then proceeded to lead the remaining 27 laps to earn his second series victory of the season.

Armstrong picked up the win on February 10 at Florida's Auburndale Speedway in a non-points winged race. This time, sans the wing, he was just as dominant as he now assumes the early series point lead.

Reigning series champion Hunter Wise (Allentown, Pa.) finished second with Logan Sulyi (Raleigh, N.C.) third, J.T. Bierman (Bath, Pa.) fourth and Brady Allum (Gold Hill, N.C.) rounding out the top-five after leading the initial eight laps.

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RALEIGH'S SULYI RALLIES TO HOMETOWN VICTORY AT WAKE COUNTY

Raleigh, North Carolina (May 12, 2023).....Logan Sulyi raced his way into becoming the third different feature winner in the first three races to kick off the 2023 USAC Eastern Focus Midget season on Friday night at North Carolina's Wake County Speedway.

Sulyi (Raleigh, N.C.) moved to the front just prior to the halfway point of the 35-lap feature, passing Mack Leopard for the point on lap 17. Sulyi then led the remaining 18 circuits to earn his second career series victory. Sulyi also earned the night's fastest qualifying honors.

Brady Allum (Gold Hill, N.C.) took the runner-up spot behind Sulyi while Leopard (Fairborn, Ohio), who led the initial 16 laps, scored a career best third-place finish. J.T. Bierman (Bath, Pa.) came home fourth while defending series champ Hunter Wise (Allentown, Pa.) rounded out the top-five.

In the process of picking up the maximum of 76 points, Sulyi elevated to the series point lead.

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LAMB ON FIRE, WINS SECOND STRAIGHT AT DILLON

Dillon, South Carolina (June 24, 2023).....The USAC Eastern Focus Midget series once again became The Chris Lamb Show on Saturday night at South Carolina's Dillon Motor Speedway.

It was the Colfax, N.C. native's second straight victory this season and his 59th overall with the series, by far the most all-time.

Lamb chased race leader Keegan Walmer for the first five laps until slipping by en route to winning the 30-lap main event. Dakota Armstrong (New Castle, Ind.) finished as the runner-up, just a car length back and 0.229 sec. behind at the stripe.

J.T. Bierman (Bath, Pa.) was the fastest qualifier for the second straight series event, then went on to finish third in the feature. By doing so, he leapfrogged Logan Sulyi to take over the series point lead by a slim four-point margin.

Walmer (Concord, N.C.) brought it home fourth while reigning series champion Hunter Wise (Allentown, Pa.) rounded out the top-five.

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TRAINOR TAKES SEEKONK'S 27TH ANNUAL BOSTON LOUIE SEYMOUR MEMORIAL

Seekonk, Massachusetts (July 15, 2023).....For the past 27 years, the race held in honor of the Massachusetts based car owner, "Boston Louie" Seymour, who campaigned his winning midgets, sprints and Silver Crown cars across America, has brought together the very best in open wheel Midget racing.

This past Saturday, July 15, at Massachusetts' Seekonk Speedway was no different as Jake Trainor took down the NEMA Lite/USAC Eastern Focus Midget portion of the event.

In a strong field of 29 cars, P.J. Stergios in the Matt Seymour Racing #4 led the field to green flag racing for 50 fast laps. Stergios took the lead going into turn one as Chris Lamb in the #9L, Jacob Perry in the #47 and Joey Bailey in the Scrivani Racing #21 went three wide down the backstretch.

On lap two, Stergios maintained his lead over Perry while Randy Cabral in the #35 raced his way to 3rd from his 7th place starting position followed by Bailey and Chase Locke in the Seymour Racing #1.

Over the next few laps, the top-five began to spread out as a race between positions 6-9 began to occur between Lamb, J.T. Bierman in the Radical Racing #5, Jake Trainor in the Seymour Racing #4s and Avery Stoebr in the Parker Brothers' Racing #10.

On lap 10, Stergios continued his lead, followed by Cabral and Perry, but going down the backstretch, the leaders started to encounter lapped traffic and Cabral was able to capitalize and take over the first position. By lap 20, Cabral had extended his lead to a couple of car lengths over Stergios, Perry, Trainor, and Locke. A few laps later, on lap 23, Stergios closed the gap between him and Cabral. Trainor, who started in the 12th place starting position, took over the 3rd position from Perry.

On lap 26, the caution flag was flown, and the drivers realigned for a double file restart. Cabral led the field to the green as a side-by-side battle for first occurred between Cabral and Stergios for nearly four laps until Cabral was able to pull away from Stergios.

On lap 32, Cabral was able to extend his lead as a race for second occurred between Trainor and Stergios, but going into turn three, Trainor was able to take the low line from Stergios to take over the 2nd position. With 10 laps remaining, Cabral and Trainor skillfully navigated through lapped traffic as Trainor was now on the back bumper of Cabral. On lap 41, going down the front stretch, Trainor drove to the inside of Cabral to take over the first position.

A late race caution on lap 45 brought the cars back together for a double file line up. Trainor led the field back to the green and continued his lead as Locke got a good run going into turn one and battled for second with Cabral, but Cabral drove around the outside going into turn two to remain in the second position.

In the following laps, working his way up from his 10th place starting position, Kyle Valeri in the Valeri Motorsports #17 and Perry began to battle for the 4th position. On lap 48, going into turn one, Valeri took the low line from Perry to take over 4th.

As the checkered flags flew, Trainor went on to win the Boston Louie Seymour Memorial, followed by Cabral and Locke to round out the top-three.

In victory lane, Trainor commented on his win, "I had to work for that; that was 50 laps wide open, but this year has been awesome, and I can't thank everyone enough that makes this all possible, and it is that much more special to get the win on Boston's night."

Rounding out the top-10 were strong finishes by Trainor, Cabral, Locke, Valeri, Perry, Bailey, Todd Bertrand, Alby Ovitt, Ryan Macartney and Dan Cugini.

NEMA's announcer, Pete Falconi welcomed Alan Bestwick, Jack Arute and Kevin Boucher to the announcers' booth as well as many video shoutouts leading up to and on the day of the Boston Louie from drivers Rusty Wallace, Ryan Preece and Santino Ferrucci.

Ken Schrader, former NASCAR Cup Series regular and current SRX driver, climbed into Seymour Racing's The Spirit of Boston No. 29 and won the third and final heat race of the night.

The Legacy of Boston Louie lives on through the continued support and sponsorships of Mike Nocella from Nocella Paving, Bentley's Saloon, Hoosier Tire, Eddie from Shea Concrete and many others.
