### New Team, Same Story for R.J.! 2025 USAC CRA Sprint Car Review

One year after becoming a first-time Avanti Windows & Doors USAC CRA Sprint Car champion, R.J. Johnson became a repeat series titlist in 2025.

A pair of feature victories coupled with a series leading 16 top-fives and 20 top-tens and six fast qualifying times throughout the 2025 season made the Laveen, Arizona native just the third back-to-back champ in USAC CRA's 22-year history. Mike Spencer captured five consecutive between 2008-2012. Damion Gardner, meanwhile, grabbed nine in a row between 2013-2022, a run which was interrupted by a worldwide pandemic in 2020.

Johnson's consecutive titles these past two seasons have come with two different teams. After racing to the point in the Ricky and Michele Johnson's No. 51 in 2024, Johnson switched over to the Petty Performance Racing No. 33p for 2025 and wound up hoisting the championship trophy once more.

For Petty, it was an unprecedented year as a car owner in USAC competition. Additionally, he won the 2025 USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National Championship entrant title with Kyle Cummins. Petty is the first entrant ever to score both the USAC National and CRA title in the same season.

Johnson and his Petty Performance Racing/Avanti Windows & Doors – NexGen/Sherman/Stanton Chevy trailed in the point standings throughout much of the year but never strayed too far from striking distance. For the bulk of the season, it was a two-horse race between Johnson and Ricky Lewis. While Lewis bolted out to a series best eight wins, Johnson was the mark of consistency, bagging nine straight top-fives, including 14 top-fives in a 15-race span between April and October.

By the end of August, Johnson's unshakable performances had led him to the top of the standings following a fourth place finish on the final night of the Louie Vermeil Classic at Calistoga Speedway, while Lewis was scored 25th. Once Johnson took the point lead, he ruled with an iron fist. He nailed down his first and only two wins of the season in the next two ensuing September races at Perris, cementing his pursuit of the crown.

Johnson was the lone driver in the series to qualify for the feature in all 23 events during the season, and the 38-year-old promptly locked up the title down the stretch, winning by a final margin of 130 points over Lewis.

Overall, it's Johnson's seventh career USAC championship, following five successive crowns with the Southwest Sprint Cars between 2013-2017 and USAC CRA in 2024.

Lewis finished as the runner-up in the standings with eight wins, including two separate three race winning streaks. In March, he strung together a trio of triumphs, first at Perris, then swept a two-race weekend at Imperial Valley Raceway. Less than a month later, he was the victor again at Central Arizona Raceway.

In May, June and July, Lewis went on a tear again, winning three-in-a-row, beginning with Perris' Salute to Indy followed by a last lap, last turn pass of Johnson for the win at Perris and then picked up another "W" at Santa Maria. Lewis' final win of the year came at Perris in mid-August. Along the way, Lewis led a staggering 212 laps led. Johnson ranked second in laps led at 75!

Logan Seavey dropped in for four USAC CRA starts, finishing 3rd, 1st, 1st and 1st. He passed Ryan Bernal with five to go to win the \$10,000 Louie Vermeil Classic finale at Calistoga in August. In the first joint USAC National/USAC CRA event in three

years, Seavey dominated the 58th Western World Championships in October at Central Arizona. Seavey collected feature victories on both nights, leading 63 out of the 65 laps to earn \$52,000 across two nights of work.

David Gasper lost the lead, then gained it back from Johnson with five to go to win in April at Perris. One week later, he was back in victory lane with a wire-to-wire score at Central Arizona.

Jake Swanson led the points for the first four USAC CRA races, but USAC national obligations took him back to the Midwest. He notched a win in February's USAC CRA season opener at Mohave Valley Raceway. Tommy Malcolm overcame a rough patch of misfortune to reign at Perris in July. Ryan Bernal checked off his first USAC CRA win in more than three years in October at Mohave Valley. Brody Roa and his Dash-12 engine were the winning combination in October at Perris.

Eleven drivers won a USAC CRA main event in 2025, and three of them were first-timers. Kaleb Montgomery was the first of the batch as he surged to the front past Malcolm with three to go to win in May at Santa Maria. In August's Louie Vermeil Classic opener at Calistoga, J.J. Yeley clicked off his first career USAC CRA win after Johnson and Bernal tangled and crashed in turn three on the final lap. Curfew ended the race one lap shy of the scheduled 25-lap distance with Yeley finishing off a complete sweep of the event by setting fast qualifying time, winning his heat, and then notching the feature.

During the final month of the season, Mitchel Moles stayed out west and won the last two events of the year, both at Perris in November. Moles was also the fast qualifier on both occasions, and each night proved to be the first two USAC CRA wins of his career.

For the seventh consecutive season, Austin Williams (Yorba Linda, California) finished inside the top-three of the standings and took third once again this year. He's now finished inside the top-five of the standings in 11-straight years. A.J. Bender (San Diego, California) took fourth in the standings for the second year in a row, equaling his best career tally. Tommy Malcolm rounded out the top-five in the 2025 USAC CRA standings, his fourth successive year within the first five.

Rounding out the top-10 of the USAC CRA standings were Blake Bower (Brentwood, California), Charles Davis Jr. (Buckeye, Arizona), David Gasper (Goleta, California), Connor Lundy (Phoenix, Arizona) and Brody Roa (Garden Grove, California).

With seven top-10 results in 20 feature starts, including a best of eighth at Central Arizona and Santa Maria, Lundy earned Rookie of the Year honors after finishing ninth in points. Lundy is just the second Arizona driver to capture USAC CRA Rookie of the Year honors, and the first in 20 years. This year's champion, R.J. Johnson, was the top Rookie back in 2005.

Eddie Tafoya Jr. and Logan Seavey made two of the biggest feature charges of the USAC CRA season. Tafoya (Chino Hills, California) advanced 24th to 8th in mid-August at Perris while Seavey, likewise, moved up 16 spots from 19th to 3rd on the opening night of the Louie Vermeil Classic in late August at Calistoga. Of substantial note, Ricky Lewis raced up 21 positions from 26th to 5th in the Western World Championships opener at Central Arizona in October after taking a provisional to make his way into the starting lineup.

Mohave Valley, Arizona (February 22, 2025).....After problems forced early leader Kevin Thomas Jr. to the work area during a lap six caution, Jake Swanson (Anaheim, California) led the rest of the way to claim victory in Saturday night's Avanti Windows & Doors USAC CRA Sprint Car season opener at Mohave Valley Raceway.

Piloting Tom and Christy Dunkel's No. 17x Inland Rigging / Maxima Racing Oils DRC, Swanson fought off several challenges to earn his seventh career series triumph. Tommy "Thunder" Malcolm, R.J. Johnson, Brody Fuson and Eddie Tafoya Jr. followed the former Western World Champion to the checkered flag.

Fuson began the night by scoring the second Woodland Auto Display / WC Friend Company Fast Time Award of his career. The pilot of the Bob & Toni Van Meter No. 51 Spike recorded a time of 13.997 seconds over the 31-car roster.

Blake Bower, Malcolm, Brody Wake and "The Rattlesnake" Andrew Sweeney took the checkered flags in their 10-lap heat races.

Fuson topped the 12-lap Factory Wraps Semi-Feature as Logan Calderwood, Tafoya, Grant Sexton, "The Big Game Hunter" Austin Williams and Lonnie Oliver earned the final transfer spots.

In his first USAC CRA start, Lonnie Oliver earned the In Memory of Jim and Chet Gardner Hard Charger Award with a 15th place run from 22nd.

Next Saturday, March 1st, the USAC CRA Sprint Cars will battle at Perris Auto Speedway. Track promoter Don Kazarian has recently announced the addition of November 1st as a make-up date for the February 15th rainout.

Perris, California (March 1, 2025).....Regaining the lead from “Chargin” Charles Davis Jr. on lap 18, Ricky Lewis (Oxnard, California) led the rest of the way to earn Saturday night’s Avanti Windows & Doors USAC CRA Sprint Car victory at California’s Perris Auto Speedway.

Racing his No. 41 Coyote Candle Company / Mesilla Valley Transportation DRC, Lewis shook free from late race challenges by Jake Swanson and “KTJ” Kevin Thomas Jr. to earn the fifth win of his USAC CRA career. Swanson, Thomas, “The Cadillac” Cory Williams, and Davis rounded out the top-five.

In addition to his \$3,000 prize, Lewis also earned an extra \$500 cash bonus from Avanti Windows & Doors.

Imperial, California (March 14, 2025).....Regaining the lead from Braden Chiaramonte on lap 26, Ricky Lewis (Oxnard, California) earned his second Avanti Windows & Doors USAC CRA Sprint Car win of the season.

Piloting his #41 Coyote Candle Company / Mesilla Valley Transportation DRC, Lewis was running away from the field and Chiaramonte chased down the leader. The pair sliced their way through heavy slower traffic and Braden grabbed the top spot on the 23rd circuit.

With Chiaramonte out front, heavy traffic became a factor once again and Lewis took the Friday night non-stop feature at Imperial Valley Raceway.

Chiaramonte, point leader Jake Swanson, Logan Calderwood, and “The Cadillac” Cody Williams rounded out the top-five.

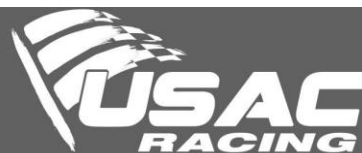
Williams opened the program by posting the 21st Woodland Auto Display / WC Friend Company fast time award of his career. Driving his #44 WC Friend Company / Trench Shoring DRC, Williams earned the top spot on the charts with a time of 12.257 seconds over the 28-car roster.

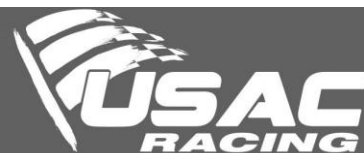

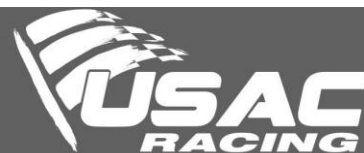

## Bernal Romps at Mohave Valley

Mohave Valley, Arizona (October 4, 2025).....Ryan Bernal raced to victory in Saturday night's Avanti Windows & Doors USAC CRA Sprint Car feature at Arizona's Mohave Valley Raceway.

Bernal (Hollister, California) set the tone quickly by establishing a new one-lap USAC CRA track record of 13.894 seconds during Woodland Auto Display / WC Friend Company Access Systems Qualifying.

Starting sixth in the 30-lap feature, he roared past Austin Williams with 12 circuits remaining to earn his 11th career USAC CRA Sprint Car victory, and his first in more than three years, in his Tom & Christy Dunkel owned No. 17x.

Braden Chiaramonte bolted from seventh to finish second, while Austin Williams led a race-high 15 laps (laps 4-18) in the feature to finish third. Series point leader R.J. Johnson bounced back from heavy contact in qualifying to finish fourth while Charles Davis Jr. rounded out the top-five.

Ricky Lewis, who led the initial three laps, fell out of the race with a 19th place result.

Rachel Clark, Kim Stolfus, and Addison awarded the "The Pride of Garden Grove" Brody Roa and his father, Brett, the \$100 hard charger bonus from Steve Lafond. The veteran driver raced from 14th to 6th in the main event.

Johnson, Roa, Ricky Lewis and Davis won each of the four heat races while Chiaramonte scored the win in the semi-feature.

### **Seavey Sings at Casa Grande, Wins Western World Opener**

Casa Grande, Arizona (October 24, 2025).....Four years following his initial taste of Western World success, Logan Seavey feasted on the field during Friday night's USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National Championship debut at Casa Grande's Central Arizona Raceway.

Seavey (Sutter, California) rushed into the lead from his outside second row starting position by lap three and paced the remaining 28 circuits to capture the opening night of the 58th annual Western World Championships at the 3/8-mile dirt oval, an event co-sanctioned by the Avanti Windows & Doors USAC CRA Sprint Car Series.

For Seavey, it was his eighth victory of the USAC National Sprint Car season and the 32nd of his career, tying him with the great Rollie Beale for 16th place on the series' all-time feature win list.

After qualifying fourth and finishing second by a single car length in his heat race, Seavey had sensed that he let down his team and their Abacus Racing/Mountain Mechanical – Droplight – Elbrecht Concrete/DRC/Stanton Chevy.

"I knew my car was going to be super, super good early," Seavey foreshadowed. "(Crew chief) Kirk (Simpson) had this thing lights out all night. I feel like I narrowly missed quick time, but that was probably my doing. Then, I narrowly missed winning my heat race. I felt like I owed one to these guys for giving me such a good racecar."

Just moments into the 30-lap feature, Seavey more than made up for it. By the end of lap one, he had ridden the high line around the outside of C.J. Leary and Justin Grant to slot into second. Then, Seavey immediately found the low line to his

liking. On the third go around, Seavey pulled even with Bacon, then slipped out in front as he carved a path under Bacon and slid past in turn one to take over the race lead, a place he knew he had to get to in a hurry if he wanted it to be his night.

"With Brady and Justin on the front row, if you don't go early, they're going to get rolling and figure out where they need to be," Seavey explained. "These races are so much easier once you get to the lead. You can see the cushion really well and you get to observe the whole racetrack."

Ten laps into it, Seavey had opened up a 1.5 second advantage over series champion Kyle Cummins, but lapped traffic was poised to play a role. In a matter of five laps, at the halfway point, Cummins had shaved a full second off Seavey's lead to put the interval between the two at about a half second.

At the precise moment when Seavey was about to reach the two-wide blockade of the traffic, the red flag was displayed for fifth running Kevin Thomas Jr. after a collision with fourth place Justin Grant at the entry to turn three on lap 16. Thomas barrel rolled three times before being nailed by the trailing Daison Pursley (7th), which also sent Pursley spinning to a stop, knocking both Thomas and Pursley out of the race in a moment's notice.

As a result of the incident, Thomas' series record streak of 29 consecutive top-10 finishes screeched to a halt. Thomas, who finished 25th on the night, hadn't finished outside the top-10 since the USAC Eastern Storm round at Pennsylvania's Port Royal Speedway four months earlier on June 21.

With traffic cleared for the leaders, Seavey's biggest nemesis down the stretch was the gnarly cushion and the ever changing track conditions.

"We're already really close to the wall, and (the cushion) was pretty big there early," Seavey said. "It just kept getting thicker and thicker as the race went on. I knew there at the very end, it was going to start taking rubber. I could see the shine kind of going away and I was struggling to gain on the cars in front of me. I just felt so good on the cushion; I didn't want to give up on it and have somebody make a big run on me. I stayed up there as long as I could until the last three or four laps, then I finally had to peel off."

By then, Seavey's lead held steady, but Cummins was able to climb to within a couple car lengths of Seavey's rear bumper. Yet, at that point, Seavey had firmly entrenched himself in the catbird seat and wasn't going to do anything to put that in jeopardy.

"This place is so fast and so tricky, it can be easy to get uncomfortable," Seavey revealed. "(The crew) has done such a good job today to make me feel good in this racecar so that I can run as hard as I need to in order to win these races."

At the stripe, Seavey was .788 seconds ahead of the field, ahead of Cummins while Leary was strong late to finish third ahead of the surgent Ricky Thornton Jr. in fourth and an impressive Ricky Lewis who finished fifth, advancing 21 positions after using a provisional and starting 26th on the grid.

With his runner-up finish, Cummins set a new USAC National Sprint Car record by posting his 37th top-five finish of the 2025 series season in 48 starts so far. That broke the mark of 36 top-fives set by Brady Bacon during the 2021 season.

C.J. Leary continued his masterful run of Western World finishes with a third place result. Dating back to the 2022 installment of the event, Leary has finished 2nd-5th-3rd-4th-3rd-3rd in his six most recent starts at Western World.

The top-four of Seavey, Cummins, Leary and Ricky Thornton Jr. are all locked into Saturday's \$35,000-to-win feature event at Central Arizona.

Late Model superstar Ricky Thornton Jr. made a spectacular USAC National Sprint Car debut by winning his heat race, then advancing from 10th to fourth in the feature. It's the best USAC Sprint Car debut by any driver since Mitchel Moles took second at the Terre Haute Track in 2022. Thornton's performance earned him the Inferno Armor Fire Move of the Night.

It was a lucrative hard charging night for Ryan Bernal. He raced from 18th to 10th in the feature, and with it, he earned \$1021.26 from the Lafond Jar of Change, plus another \$150 from Rod End Supply for a grand total of \$1,171.26.

Chase Stockon picked up an extra \$100 courtesy of Bud & Cathy Goodwin for his 13th place feature finish. James Turnbull II, meanwhile, was the Hard Luck Award recipient after a violent crash in his heat race. The Indio, California native walked away from the crash and also walked away with \$200 from an anonymous donor.

In Honest Abe Roofing Qualifying, Mitchel Moles equaled an all-time USAC National Sprint Car record with his 15th fast time of the year. That tied Kevin Thomas Jr. for the most quick times in a single season with the series, a mark set by KTJ during the 2018 campaign.

**Seavey Sweeps Western World, Pockets \$43,750 in Casa Grande**

## 2025 USAC CRA SPRINT CAR SEASON REVIEW



Casa Grande, Arizona (October 25, 2025).....As if one Western World Championships win wasn't good enough, Logan Seavey went ahead and swept the entire weekend on Saturday night at Casa Grande's Central Arizona Raceway.

One night after the Sutter, California racer pocketed an opening night victory at the 3/8-mile dirt oval, he repeated the feat on Saturday to the tune of \$43,750 in total winnings between his \$35,000 winner's share, plus another \$8,750 in lap leader money after leading all 35 circuits in the 58th running of the event.

With his latest triumph, Seavey became a two-time Western World champion after getting his first win in the event during the 2021 season. Furthermore, he's the first driver to win the final two races of the USAC AMSOIL Sprint Car National Championship season since Tyler Courtney in 2019.

"This is so cool," Seavey said following his second Western World win. "What an unbelievable job all year to give us exactly what we needed to get some speed back. Like I said at Lawrenceburg, I was hoping we were back and we sure as heck proved it tonight and throughout this whole weekend."

Seavey's ninth win of the 2025 season aboard his Abacus Racing/Mountain Mechanical – Droplight – Elbrecht Concrete/DRC/Stanton Chevy was the 33rd of his USAC National Sprint Car career, moving him past 1973 series champion Rollie Beale for sole possession of 16th place on the all-time list.

Throughout the early portion of the night, Seavey's arch nemesis was 2025 USAC National Sprint Car champion Kyle Cummins, who snookered him on the final restart of The Underwood Dash with three laps remaining to earn a \$5,000 reward and a prime starting position on the pole.

However, at the start of the feature, Seavey felt he was right where he needed to be to get a proper jump on Cummins, which he did for roughly three-quarters of the first lap. Meanwhile, over in turn three on the opening lap, Logan Calderwood (19th) flipped upside down to necessitate a red flag. Despite it all, Calderwood was actually able to restart and complete the first nine laps before pulling off with a 26th place result.

On the second attempt at the start, Seavey was apprehensive that the slight bit of green flag activity might've shuffled the deck back into Cummins' favor.

"I was really glad to see what they did to the track because I knew the outside would be a little better," Seavey offered. "Then, that second start made me nervous that the bottom was going to get cleaned up. But I was able to hold him off. I couldn't give up the lead to Kyle. He's too good out front and I'm sure he was thinking the same thing. Right now, he's the best in the country and it was nice to keep him behind us."

Seavey got the upper hand on Cummins around the outside to lead the opening lap and every bit thereafter, although Cummins stayed close in check. Meanwhile, Chase Stockon had hustled up from his sixth starting spot to third after sliding under Ricky Thonton Jr. for the spot in turns three and four on the 13th lap.

By midway, Cummins was right on Seavey's tail as the pair worked through lapped traffic, but the coast was made clear for the leaders on the 22nd lap when 17th running Kevin Thomas Jr. came to a halt in turns three and four with a flat right rear tire, which caused additional damage to the right side of his ride and promptly ended his night.

On the ensuing restart, Cummins found his stride along the inside line and came within a car length of nipping Seavey at the stripe at the completion of lap 23. But the high side proved to be Seavey's jam and he utilized it to launch off turn two and leave Cummins in the not-so-distant past as he blazed a trail out in front of Cummins to the tune of 1.1 second.

That said, just when Seavey might've felt a slight sense of peacefulness, eighth running Jake Swanson's shredded right rear tire on the 30th lap squashed any semblance of that. As Swanson was forced to the Indy Metal Finishing Work Area, Seavey was sent into a worrisome state of mind.

"Usually, when they work the track like that, it's really fast early," Seavey explained. "That's really hard on tires because we are running so hard and we've got a full fuel load. Once I saw Jake pop a tire, I was nervous because I hadn't really saved anything early. I was worried about tires all race because you're so hard on them here. You're running around here full throttle basically. Speaking of full throttle, it's also hard on fuel."

That became the next nail-biting situation Seavey had to endure while cruising toward victory with the white flag in sight. That's when Ryan Bernal (9th) slowed with an apparent fuel issue, and under the caution period, C.J. Leary (4th) and Briggs Danner (8th) both slipped into the work area with dry fuel tanks but weren't able to make it back on track in time for the restart.

Call it a premonition, but Seavey admitted he had an inkling that the book wasn't about to be closed on this sucker just yet.

"I don't know why, but once we took that first white, I just had a feeling that it wasn't over," Seavey stated. "Then, we got that caution and we had to go again. I was liking what I was doing on the restarts. I was a little bit vulnerable, but I felt better about protecting than I did about moving up and maybe giving him an opportunity to slide us. I thought I did as good as I could on those starts, but the guy behind you has the catbird seat to try and make a move, and he tried, but my Abacus 57 was a little too fast tonight."

Cummins did take a run at Seavey in turns one and two on the first lap of the green-white-checkered finish. But it was to no avail and nearly cost him the second position as Stockon's momentum carried him right to within an arm's length of Cummins on the back straightaway.

At this particular moment, Seavey was up front singing a merry tune as he put the finishing touches on a grand victory. Yet, all the while, he maintained a pit in his stomach as he pondered if he could even make it successfully to the line.

"I was out (of fuel) those last two laps and watching that 35 grand go out the window," Seavey revealed. "Luckily, I had just enough to hold on and this Stanton engine was running just good enough to get me to the line."

Seavey's fears did not come to fruition, and instead, he closed out the victory with a 0.412 second winning margin as past Western World victors occupied the top-four finishing positions with Kyle Cummins second, Chase Stockon third and Brady Bacon fourth while Ricky Thornton Jr. rounded out the top-five.

How did Thornton's first two nights in a USAC National Sprint Car go? Well, the late model star followed up his impressive fourth place finish on Friday with a fifth on Saturday night. With it, he earned 2025 Western World Rookie of the Year honors, plus an extra \$1,500 as the Team AZ-Petty-Rossi "Whiz Kid" award winner.

R.J. Johnson collected a \$3,131.98 bonus for his run from 23rd to ninth in the feature. That's \$2,461.98 from the Lafond Jar of Change, another \$520 as the #WesternWorld Passing Master and \$150 more courtesy of Rod End Supply.

In what was the closest Rookie battle in USAC National Sprint Car racing history, Gunnar Setser prevailed over Hayden Reinbold by a four point margin (2166 to 2162) to earn the Max Papis Innovations Rookie of the Year award.

Brentwood, California's Blake Bower earned his way into the feature in spectacular fashion. After getting passed on the final lap of the semi, he raced back into the final transfer spot off the last corner to land an A-Main spot in his first ever Western World appearance. That proved to be the Inferno Armor Fire Move of the Night.

## **Moles Posts First USAC CRA Win at Perris, Johnson Clinches Title**

Perris, California (November 1, 2025).....Mitchel Moles took command from “The Big Game Hunter” Austin Williams on the third lap, then led the rest of the way to score the first Avanti Windows & Doors USAC CRA Sprint Car win of his career on Saturday night at California’s Perris Auto Speedway.

Driving the Reinbold-Underwood Motorsports #19AZ Spike, the Raisin City, California driver finished ahead of Williams, hard charger R.J. Johnson, Hayden Reinbold (from tenth), and “The Pride of Garden Grove” Brody Roa.

For his efforts, Mitchel also scored an extra \$500 bonus from series title sponsor, Avanti Windows & Doors.

Meanwhile, 12th starting R.J. Johnson earned his second In Memory of Jim and Chet Gardner Hard Charger Award / “Best Passing Job” honors of the season with a third place run. With his third place result, Johnson clinched his second consecutive USAC CRA Sprint Car driving championship.

Furthermore, Johnson’s Petty Performance Racing team earned its first USAC CRA entrant title. In doing so, PPR became the first team to achieve both the USAC National and USAC CRA Sprint Car championship in the same season.

For the majority of the 30-lap main event, Moles, who primarily races with the USAC national series, had to fend off Williams as both drivers raced multiple laps side-by-side on a two groove surface and around slower traffic. When the checkered flag waved, the night belonged to Moles, who became the 88th winning driver with USAC CRA dating back to 2004.

Moles began the evening by posting his fourth career Woodland Auto Display / WC Friend Company Access Systems Fast Time Award with a time of 16.328 seconds over David Gasper, “KTJ” Kevin Thomas Jr., “The Bull” Tye Mihocko, Roa, and the rest of the 20-car roster.

Buckeye, Arizona’s “Chargin” Charles Davis Jr. roared to the 10-lap WC Friend Company Access Systems / In Honor of Wiley Miller Sr. & Wiley Miller II / Silbermann Solar First Heat Race triumph aboard his #47 DRC. Newly crowned two-time USAC CRA Champion, R.J. Johnson of Laveen, Arizona piloted the Petty Performance Racing #33P Sherman to the In Memory of Jim & Chet Gardner / Sexton Fire Protection / Factory Wraps Second Heat Race victory. For Davis, it was his sixth heat race win and the series leading ninth heat triumph for Johnson.

Next Saturday, November 8th, the Avanti Windows & Doors USAC CRA Sprint Car Series will return to Perris Auto Speedway for their last race of the season. 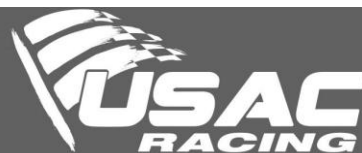
