

No Maybes for Davies, He's the Champ

In one of the closest contests in history, Jimmy Davies, a veteran driver from Gardena, Calif., made history in 1960 by becoming the first ever USAC National Midget driver/entrant champion. Pressed all season, Davies ultimately eked out a 9.75 point victory over Bob Wente of St. Louis, Mo. after Wente's tremendous stretch drive in the indoor races fell short.

Davies elected to pass up the indoor events because of the great distance to travel during the holidays from his home in California and because he believed his 58 point lead was a comfortable enough margin. His decision almost backfired as Wente came within a whisker of catching him.

The 1960 battle for the title was reminiscent of the 1958 struggle when Shorty Templeman edged Rex Easton for the title by just 8.25 points. There was another similarity as Wente was the leader in points for races held in the Midwest even though Davies won the national crown. In 1958, Easton was the Midwest champion and Templeman the national leader.

Davies, who began his racing career in 1945, turned in an impressive performance during the season as he finished in the top-six in 34 of the 55 races he started. He really won the championship with his remarkable qualifying record. He was the fastest qualifier in 19 races, or over one-third of the total events, and won nine features, was second four times, had five thirds, five fourths, six fifths and five sixths.

Wente nearly matched this record with seven wins, nine seconds, nine thirds, two fourths, six fifths and six sixths. Wente was also the fastest qualifier on eight occasions.

Among Davies' other racing accomplishments are three AAA National Championship victories, at Springfield in 1954 and at Phoenix and Del Mar in 1950. In 1951, he led the Indianapolis 500 for a short time. He finished a career-best third in his fifth and final "500" appearance in 1955.

Wente proved himself as one of the most promising drivers on the circuit. He had been racing only six years but had already developed into a fierce competitor in that time.

Gene Hartley of Roanoke, Ind., the defending series champion, finished a solid third in both the National and Midwest standings. Other familiar names in the top-ten included Leroy Warriner, Shorty Templeman, Len Sutton and A.J. Foyt.

First-time top-ten finishers in USAC's National Midget standings were Bob Tattersall, Tommy Copp and Parnelli Jones, all of whom eventually became National Midget Auto Racing Hall of Fame inductees.

Tragedy marred the October event at the Fairfield (Ill.) Fairgrounds. Jim Packard, 28, of Indianapolis, Ind. was killed in a crash on the second lap of his qualification run when his steering broke, sending his car over the fence and into a tree. Packard had won his first career USAC Sprint Car race just one week prior at the Allentown (Pa.) Fairgrounds, and his first USAC National Championship race a mere two-and-a-half months earlier at the Illinois State Fairgrounds.

Bob Stroud of Indianapolis, Ind., who had served from 1956-59 as the Midwest Midget representative for USAC, was appointed as USAC's National Midget supervisor in 1960. Operating from USAC National Headquarters in Speedway, Ind., Stroud's duties included the coordination and scheduling of midget events as well as the registration of cars and drivers.

In December, USAC headquarters were relocated from Speedway to midtown Indianapolis at 1927 North Meridian Street.

During the month of April, the name of the series was changed to supposedly give the public a better understanding of what type of race they can expect when they see it advertised. Effective immediately, as of April 28, 1960, the official title for the series became the 110 Offenhauser Division of the United States Auto Club.

To rectify the confusion, the release at the time stated, "since more than 95% of the midgets registered with USAC are powered by 110 cubic-inch Offenhauser engines. (The exact limit is 109.999). This does not mean that other engines are not welcome. The contrary is true." Are we clear?

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Weyant Wins Midget Race at Fort Wayne

Fort Wayne, Indiana.....Chuck Weyant of Springfield, Illinois won a 60-lap midget race at the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum in Fort Wayne, Indiana on Sunday, January 3.

The win gave Weyant enough points to take the lead in the indoor midget championship point standings.

The race was composed of two 30-lap segments. Leroy Warriner was the leader at the end of the first segment and led the second until the 26th lap. Don Branson was the fastest qualifier with a time of 8.65 seconds.

The heat winners were Lee Drollinger, Bob McLean, Bob Wente, and Willie Wildhaber.

The consolation winner was Wildhaber. Johnny White won the semi-feature.

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White Wins Fort Wayne Midget Race, Weyant is Indoor Champion

Fort Wayne, Indiana.....Johnny White of Warren, Michigan won the final race of the indoor season at the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum in Fort Wayne, Indiana on Sunday, January 10.

The feature distance was 90 laps on the one-tenth mile track, run off in three 30-lap segments.

Chuck Weyant of Springfield, Illinois, the winner the week before, finished third and earned enough points to clinch the 1960 indoor midget championship. He succeeds Leroy Warriner of Indianapolis, Indiana who was the champion the previous year in 1959.

White was followed across the finish line by Johnny Roberts of Lansing, Illinois, who won the first 30-lap segment. White won the last two and had an overall time of 13:27.03. Roberts was second in the final point standings.

For the third consecutive week, Don Branson of Urbana, Illinois was the fastest qualifier in the Rao Offy. His time was 8.590 seconds, which was the fastest effort of the three.

The biggest crowd of the season saw White drive the Forberg Offy to first place. The purse went over the guarantee to \$1,600.

The heat winners were Gene Force, Chuck Rodee, Bob McLean, and Ted Hartley. The semi-feature was won by Gene Hartley. Gene Force won the consolation race.

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Foyt Wins Ascot Race By a Foot

Gardena, California.....A.J. Foyt of Houston, Texas put on a sensational burst on the last lap to beat Davey Moses of Mountain View, California by one foot in a 100-lap midget race on the half-mile dirt track of Ascot Stadium in Gardena, California on Sunday, February 7.

Johnny Moorhouse of Santa Ana, California led the race for the first 18 laps before Foyt took the lead. Moses passed Foyt on the 66th lap and remained in first place until the last lap. Foyt and Moses were both driving cars owned by Jack London of Oakland, California.

The time of the feature was 41:40.36. It was the first western race of the season and gave Foyt the lead in the national midget standings.

Moorhouse and Jimmy Davies tangled on the 57th lap of the feature event, but neither driver was injured.

Carl Williams of Kansas City, Missouri posted the fastest qualifying time of 22.380 seconds. Tony Bettenhausen won the trophy dash. The heat winners were Billy Cantrell, Ray Crawford, and Bettenhausen. Cantrell won two heats. Len Sutton was the winner of the semi-feature.

The purse was \$3,000 and the attendance was 2,521.

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Moses Takes Midget Lead with Ascot Win

Gardena, California.....Davey Moses of Mountain View, California is the new leader in the national midget championship point standings after winning a 50-lap race on the half-mile dirt track at Ascot Stadium in Gardena, California on Saturday night, April 2.

Moses led every lap, although Rodger Ward passed him briefly on the fifth lap. However, Ward encountered engine trouble the instant he took the lead.

Porky Rachwitz of Los Angeles was the fastest qualifier with a time of 22.380 seconds. Moses' time for the feature event was 19:36.66. Since it was the first 50-lap race ever sanctioned on the Ascot track, his time stands as a track record for that distance.

Joe Garson won the trophy dash. Rodger Ward, Johnny Boyd, and Jimmy Davies were heat winners. Mike McGreevy won a 15-lap consolation race. The purse was \$3,000.
