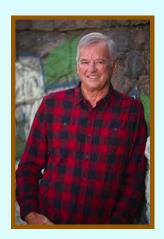

The wonderful lady at reception called and happened to reach the lovely and beautiful Eryn. She said send her right over. Eryn had a cancellation and was able to see me that day.

It was the beginning of a wonderful counsellor / client relationship. I continued to receive grief counselling with Eryn throughout 2022, 2023 and the beginning of 2024.



I owe myself a lot of credit for how far I have come but I also owe so much to Eryn especially and to Matthews House Hospice. I do not know where I would be if I had not met Eryn. She has helped me tremendously in understanding the future without my husband and what it brings. I looked forward to my time with Eryn every month and will always and forever be so grateful to her and Matthews House Hospice.

I have also been very fortunate to attend a few grief courses, volunteer at the golf tournament and attend the Gala last year. I see what an amazing place Matthews House is.

HOSPICE RESIDENCE UPDATE

This past year has been one of deep meaning and growth at Matthews House Hospice Residence. With an occupancy rate exceeding 70%, we've had the honour of supporting many patients and families through life's final chapter offering comfort, dignity, and compassionate care.

Thanks to the dedication of our staff, volunteers, and generous community supporters, we completed several impactful upgrades that enhanced our quality of care. Our shower room was upgraded for greater comfort, and a new ergonomic shower chair was added through the generosity of the Leroy Foundation. We also acquired a bladder scanner, giving nurses a vital tool to guide care decisions and ensure comfort in the final stages of life. These additions were made possible through the continued support of the Leroy Foundation. Team building flourished with two successful staff events focused on communication and collaboration. Over 14 staff members were recognized by their peers for exemplary care, and new twice-weekly palliative rounds with Stevenson Memorial Hospital improved transitions for patients and families.

Safety remained a top priority throughout the year. We installed security cameras across the residence and provided staff with personal panic buttons to ensure rapid emergency response. A new paging system was added to improve communication during urgent situations, and the nursing station furniture was updated to align with current infection control practices. Resident rooms were also equipped with additional electrical outlets, making access to devices and chargers safer and more convenient.

Our commitment to education and training continued to strengthen our care. A new Professional Development and Education Policy was introduced to support nurses and PSWs in pursuing continuing education. We welcomed several students from local secondary and post-secondary schools for placements, and two nursing students completed their placements at our residence, one of whom we were thrilled to welcome as a new full-time nurse.

Clear and compassionate communication is central to hospice care, and this year we made several enhancements. Resident room whiteboards were updated by a creative volunteer to provide clearer information for patients and families. A comprehensive staff communication plan was implemented to improve the timely sharing of information. We also achieved full compliance with the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA), and successfully navigated a province-wide medical supply disruption by sourcing alternatives without compromising care.

All of these improvements were made while remaining within our operating budget, which is a testament to the careful stewardship of our resources and the generosity of our donors, partners, and community supporters.

As we reflect on a year of meaningful achievements, we remain committed to providing a place of comfort, dignity, and sanctuary for all who come through our doors. With the continued support of our community, we look forward to building on these successes in the year ahead.



COMMUNITY PROGRAM MESSAGE

Our staff supporting the community hospice programs have had a busy and impactful year, continuing to provide compassionate care and meaningful services to those we serve.

In June 2024, our Memory Care and Dementia Day Program celebrated its first anniversary. We've grown to welcome 12 clients per day with over 2,400 visits per year from 53 clients, reflecting the increasing need for specialized support in our community. Thanks to the generous contributions from the Giving Hearts Gala, we were able to purchase new furniture that is both sturdy and easy to clean that has created a more comfortable and welcoming environment for our clients. The funds raised also helped subsidize program fees, reducing financial barriers and making our services more accessible to families in need. We are deeply grateful to everyone who supported this initiative.

Camp Chrysalis was another highlight of the year. In partnership with Mansfield Outdoor Centre, we supported 12 children between the ages of 6 and 10 who experienced the loss of a significant person in their lives. The camp provided a safe, nurturing space for healing, connection, and emotional growth, while providing a fun and adventurous environment.

Our Hospice@Home program continues to grow, offering personalized care to clients living with life-limiting illnesses who wish to remain in the comfort of their own homes. This program also provides much-needed respite and emotional support to caregivers, helping families navigate challenging times with dignity and compassion.

We were pleased to restart our Spousal Loss Support Group and launch a new Caregiver Support Group tailored specifically to families involved in our Day Program. These groups offer a space for connection, understanding, and shared experience, and have been well received by participants.

Our memorial events, An Evening to Remember in June and Light Up a Life in December, were deeply moving and provided comfort and reflection for all who attended. These gatherings continue to be an important part of our community's healing journey.

We also expanded our outreach efforts, delivering programs at Kingsmere Retirement Home and the Community Living Association of South Simcoe (CLASS). Presentations at St. Paul's United Church, Briar Hill Community Centre, Rosemount United Church, and the Alliston Probus Club helped raise awareness of our services and the importance of palliative care education.

As we look ahead to the 2025-26 fiscal year, we remain committed to growing and refining our community programs to meet evolving needs. With continued support, we will ensure that every individual and family facing serious illness or loss receives the care, comfort, and connection they deserve.

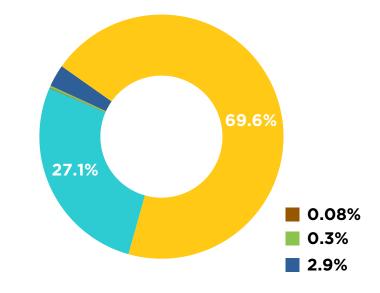

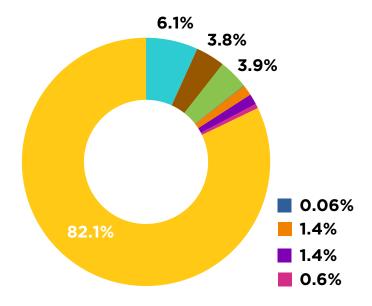

Thank you for all that you have done and all that you continue to do for our residents, clients, their families and our community.



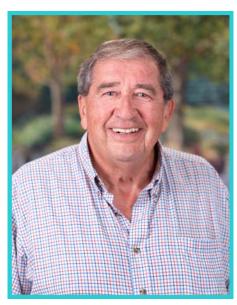
From the President

Where Our Food Comes From

As a charitable organization, we are committed to keeping costs low so that every dollar is used with intention and impact. We're proud to say that all of the food we serve is rescued and donated.

We're part of a food rescue hub that alerts us when items nearing their best-before date are available for pickup. Our Food Services Coordinator then designs menus around these rescued ingredients. We cook, freeze, and store what we can, and any surplus is shared with other local organizations or distributed to our clients in the community.



We've also built strong partnerships with local farms and grocery stores that generously support our Food Services. Meals To Go

Our Meals To Go are freshly made single-serve frozen meals. They are made fresh each week using rescued and donated ingredients.

Each 28oz meal is sold for \$10 and comes with a homemade soup or dessert. Our Meals To Go are available to everyone in our community, and are great for those cooking for one or living alone, recovering, or just because.

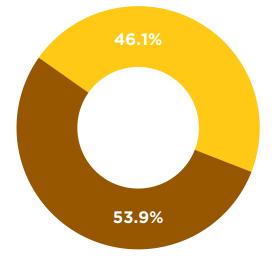

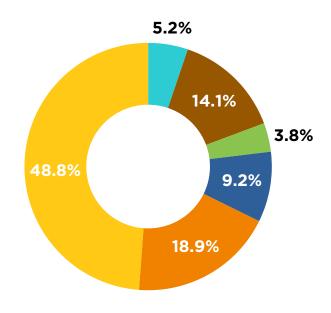
