Other sea creatures seen in SpongeBob SquarePants include brine shrimp, also called sea monkeys, krill, and prawns. Prawns appear in "Captain Pipsqueak," while barnacles are crustaceans that have various roles throughout the show. The TV show SpongeBob SquarePants features various sea creatures, some of which have significant roles in the series while others make brief appearances. For example, sea cucumbers are seen as a species that is more accurately depicted as food rather than their actual underwater form. This is different from other shows like SpongeGuard on Duty, where sharks are shown as family members and background characters. Additionally, leeches play a role in an episode when SpongeBob hides from Sandy, leading to a mass search by her. In another instance, nematodes are portrayed similarly to termites or pets, with groups destroying buildings in one of the episodes titled "Home Sweet Pineapple." Shark is a species that has been spotted in Bikini Bottom, but no further information is available about whale sharks. Frogfish are featured in "The SpongeBob SquarePants Movie" as food-chasing characters using their tongues to catch meals. Sawfish are background characters seen in the series with one being named and the other not. Angler Fish live in deep oceans, having lights on their heads to illuminate their surroundings. Dogfish have appeared a couple of times, including when SpongeBob dresses up like one for Pearl Krabs' birthday. Lionfish can be seen in "Spongicus" with its fish tail and lion head. Seahorses serve as transportation for other characters, coming in various colors like green, orange, and pink. Bass are distinct from the musical instrument, while Bubble Bass is a rude customer of the Krusty Krab. Flounders have made occasional appearances along with their species Flats. Tuna has been spotted once as an incidental character, while swordfish appear in episodes like "Neptune's Spatula." Catfish get medical attention when SpongeBob works at the local hospital, coughing up its keys to feel better. Blobfish named Barry and others of the same species have been introduced in "The Night Patty" and "Kamp Koral: SpongeBob's Under Years." Barracudas are seen as incidental characters with some appearing in Kamp Koral. Sea anemones can be found in SpongeBob SquarePants, dancing or being a character like Jennifer. Comb jellies are minor species featured in the series. Coral provides sea animals with habitats and is commonly seen in the background of many scenes. Dolphins have been featured in episodes like "Jellyfish Jam!" along with anthropomorphic dolphins. Orca characters Billy and Don (also known as Don the Whale) have appeared in the show. A blue whale named Frank also appears multiple times. An earless seal known as Craig is featured in "Sun Bleached" and another episode called "The Whole Tooth." Manatees have been seen in various episodes, with Sandy even riding one like a sea cow at some point. Elephants appear both in the movie "Sponge Out of Water" and in a bubble-making scene when SpongeBob sets up his stand. Horses have been featured in an episode called "I Had an Accident," where two characters are wearing a horse costume together, and there's also an elephant bubble incident where Patrick thinks it might be a giraffe instead. A cat named Kenny can breathe underwater without any special equipment. Dogs make brief appearances, with Plankton owning a labrador in one episode, but no one in town knows what a dog is. Rats have been seen in live-action segments like "The Poop Deck," where Patchy works and gets into a fight with Potty. Chimpanzees appear as characters named Lord Reginald, Dr. Marmalade, and Professor Percy in the episode "Chimps Ahoy." Gorillas are mostly just costumes on the show, but SpongeBob does dress up as a monkey at one point. Humans like Mermaid Man, Barnacle Boy, Patch the Pirate, and even Squidward, when narrating in some episodes, make significant appearances.
