The templates cover dimensional lumber from 2x4 to 2x14, with additional measurements for thicker materials. The plans are divided into three sheets: * 8.5 x 11 sheet: Templates for 2x4 to 2x8 * 11 x 17 sheet: Templates for 2x4 to 2x10 * 17 x 22 sheet: Templates for 2x4 to 2x14 The designs were created by Glenn Frazee, who refined them after building a real-world pergola. You can also use other PDF readers installed on your computer. The Pergola End Rafter Tail Designs include: * 18 unique rafter tail designs * Templates for both 6" and 4" deep rafters * Instructions on how to cut the notches for each design Choose from three styles of rafter tails: * Flush-style: Notches are cut halfway, with the top rafter sitting flush with the supporting rafter. * Raised-style: Notches are cut partway (1"), allowing the top rafter to sit slightly higher than the supporting rafter. * Un-notched style: Rafters are unnotched, sitting fully on top of the supporting rafter. To use the templates: 1. Download and print the desired design 2. Place the template onto your rafter end 3. Draw the outline and cut with a saw Simple yet effective, these designs will help you achieve a unique look for your pergola. You can access Adobe Reader here by opening a new window. Alternatively, you can open the file in your browser window or download it for later viewing. If you want to print the file, open it and select the "Print" option from your file menu. To complete this project, you'll need a hand saw to cut the straight rafter tail ends and a jigsaw with a workbench to cut around curved template marks. If you don't have these tools or can borrow them, you can purchase them online by following the links below. To download the templates, simply fill out the form provided and your email address will be sent an email containing the download link and password. To create the design, start by drawing a circle on the corner of your 2 x 8 scrap. Leave a 4-inch spread, which will result in 3-1/2 inches at the top of the circle for an elegant proportion. Use a jigsaw with a sharp blade to cut out the semicircle along the line. Next, make the 1/2-inch clip cut on the miter saw or use a circular saw and Speed Square for a simple 45-degree clip off the bottom of each end. For the circle cut, place the rafter on sawhorses and use a pattern board to trace its edge onto each rafter's ends. Cut the circle using a jigsaw as before. To make the clip cuts, line up each rafter with the round line previously marked on the saw deck. Pass the blade through at a 45-degree angle, clipping about 1/2 inch off the two corners. Remember to use out-feed support to keep the work parallel to the saw deck height.
