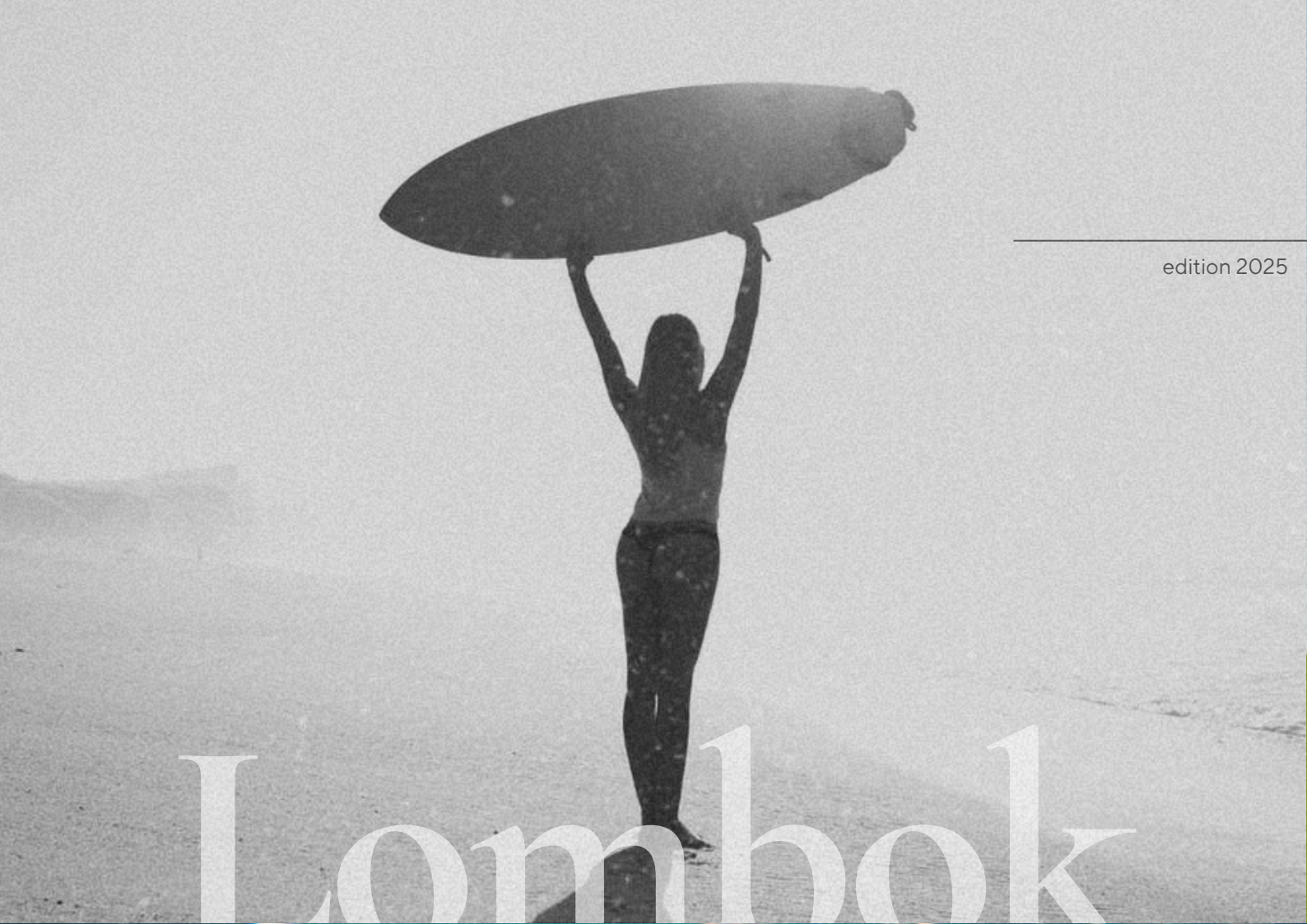
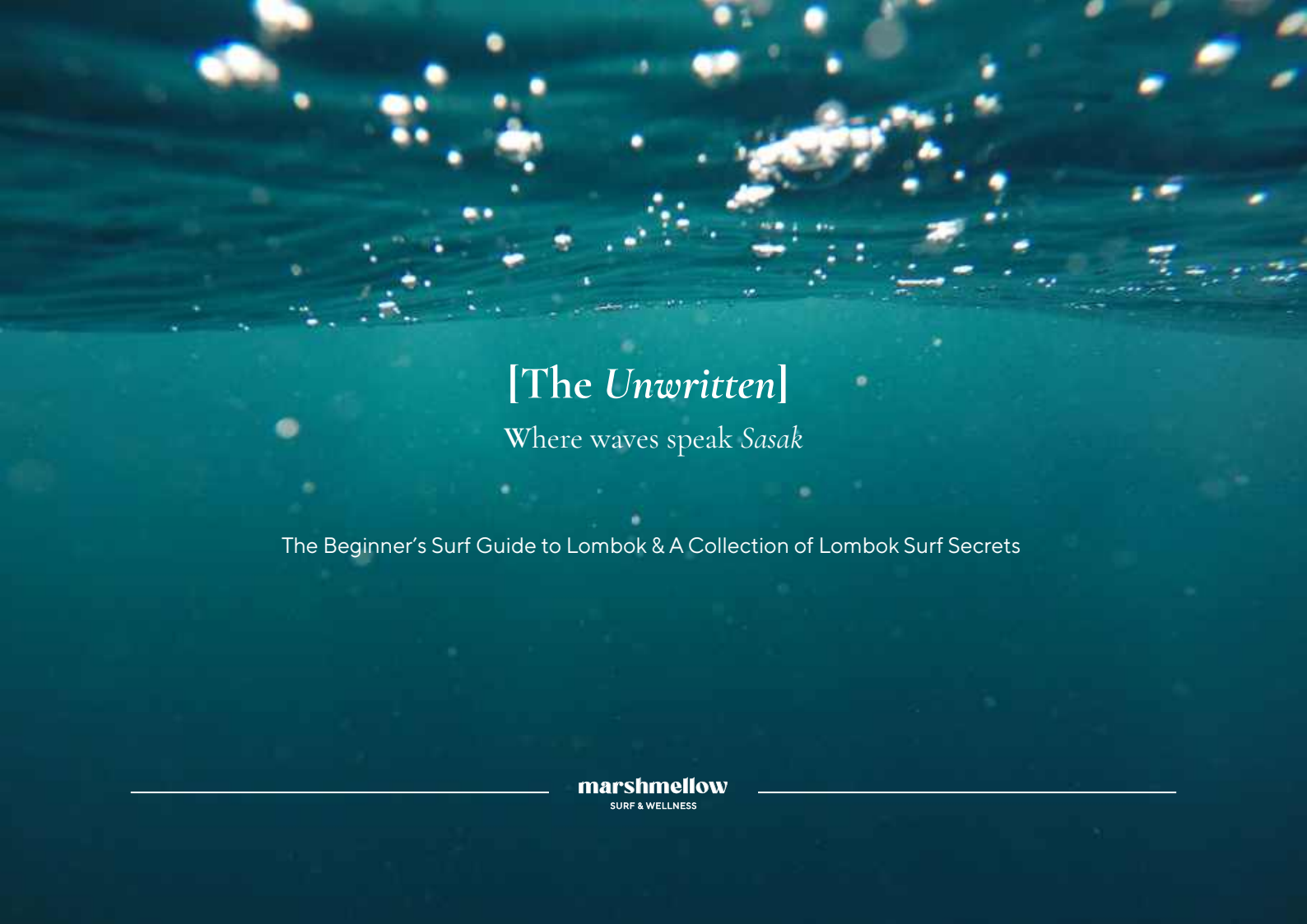

This might not be the introduction you expected in a surf guide — but it's one that matters. Before the surf, before the sunsets, before the rituals of the island settle into your rhythm, there's something we all need to acknowledge: Lombok, like much of the world, is struggling with plastic.

[Oceans Don't Want Plastic: A Quiet Warning From the Shore]

It's easy to admire the turquoise bays, empty beaches, and unspoiled reefs—but after the rain, plastic appears: tangled in driftwood, caught on rocks, floating beside waves. It's a global issue, threatening marine life, livelihoods, and the future of surfing. The causes are complex, but local, ground-up solutions are taking root.

In Merendeng, Kuta Lombok, our village is taking small but vital steps. Led by Kadus (village chief) **Mr. Supriadi**, the community now separates plastic from organic waste and supports respectful disposal through weekly collection—thanks to strong local leadership.

The challenge is massive, but people and organizations here are responding—with creativity, persistence, and growing impact.

Honest Made – Community-Driven Recycling

A pioneer in Kuta Beach, turning collected plastic into usable goods. Their all-in-one recycling hub works with the local community to shift mindsets and inspire sustainable habits.

Lombok Plastic Free – Grassroots Power

lombokplasticfree.com

Lombok Plastic Free tackles plastic waste through cleanups, school programs, and village waste systems—building grassroots change where government action falls short.

PT Geo Trash Management (GTM) – Recycling at Scale

greenrinjani.com

PT Geo Trash Management runs large-scale recycling plants across Lombok, turning up to 30 tons of plastic daily into reusable materials to reduce landfill use and add value to waste.

Conplas – Turning Waste into Building Materials

undp.org

Rooted in community and science, Conplas transforms non-recyclable plastic into eco-blocks and grease. Led by Mataram University's Sudirman, they also pay villagers for sorted waste, supporting over 15 freelance waste workers.

Plastik Kembali – Art with Purpose

Operating in Selong Belanak, Plastik Kembali turns plastic waste into art and homeware. Led by Elissa Gjertson, the team reuses thousands of plastic bags, supports cleanups, and builds local waste systems.

Gili Eco Trust – Island Inspiration

Gili Eco Trust, based in the Gilis, runs cleanups, recycling, and education across Lombok. They install compost systems, protect reefs, and clear trash from coasts and seafloors.

This isn't about perfection. It's about attention — and responsibility. Honor the island that's welcoming you. Because the reefs remember everything — and the waves don't want plastic.

Indonesia is a vast surf frontier of 17,000+ islands catching swell from all sides. Bali made it global—home to Uluwatu's legendary break, board-laden motorbikes, and sacred ceremonies that still bless each ride.

Did you know?

Uluwatu's iconic cave entrance wasn't even known to locals until surfers crawled through it in the '70s.

Surfing in Lombok

Lombok is Indonesia's quieter, wilder sibling—where waves come by boat, and locals read the swell from swaying palms. Beginners share bays with village kids, and the reefs here are shaped by years of quiet, uncrowded surfing. It's a rhythm that began long before you paddled out.

Did you know?

Desert Point was kept a secret for over a decade — just whispered coordinates and surf karma.

A Quick Guide for Beginner Surfers Looking for the Right Wave.

Planning a surf trip to Indonesia? Bali gets the spotlight — but for slower pace, smaller crowds, and beginner-friendly waves, Lombok is a perfect match.

Why is Lombok a surf gem ?

Lombok *Ease into the swell !*

- ✓ Fewer crowds.
- ✓ Affordable, laid-back living.
- ✓ No traffic.
- ✓ While Bali's beaches buzz with scooters, surf schools, and packed lineups, Lombok still offers quiet bays where you might share the waves with just a handful of others — or none at all.
- ✓ South Lombok has several protected spots that are ideal for learning, with soft takeoffs and sandy-bottom channels.
- ✓ No competitive crowds, no pressure.
- ✓ Gentle Beginner Waves.
- ✓ For those with more experience, Lombok delivers clean, powerful waves and uncrowded line-ups.
- ✓ Raw, untouched nature.
- ✓ Think rolling green hills, empty beaches, and wild cliffs — no beach clubs or techno sunsets, just you and the horizon.
- ✓ Authentic island culture.
- ✓ Lombok's Sasak traditions are alive in everyday life. You'll see fishermen launch their boats by hand, families offering rice to the sea, and local kids learning to surf barefoot after school.
- ✓ Everything moves slower here — except the waves. From food to accommodation, it's easier to stretch your budget and your breath.

KEY INFO: The scores provided are general references based on typical conditions.

Swell size, wind direction, and tides can all shift a wave's character — even at familiar spots. Some breaks feature multiple peaks, each with different shapes and levels of difficulty. Take time to observe, and when in doubt, ask someone experienced — local surfers, boat captains, or your surf coach.

Check the forecast, know your limits, and read the ocean before every session.

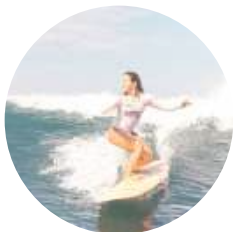

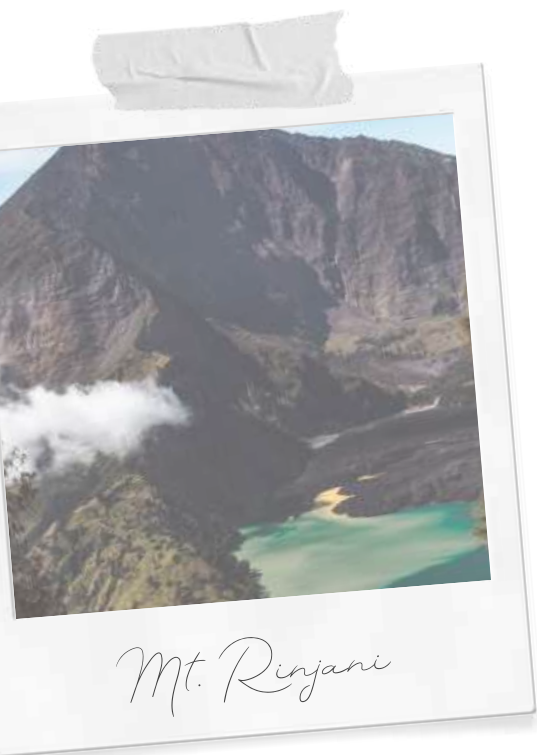

70 – 80

The First Footsteps

- First foreign surfers arrived, mostly from Bali
- Rumors of empty waves led to remote explorations
- Desert Point and Ekas were unknown

80–90

The Discovery of Desert Point

- Long, hollow barrels discovered by a handful of surfers. It gained mythical status
- Harsh access, zero crowds — total secrecy
- Other breaks like Mawi and Are Guling began to enter quiet conversations

Chronicles

90–2k

From Secret to Cult

- Surf films and blurry magazine photos leaked Desert's perfection
- Kuta was still a tiny village
- Locals began surfing with borrowed or broken boards

2k–2010

Infrastructure & Local Rise

- Bali's crowd pushed surfers east
- Surf schools, rentals, and boat access emerged
- Gerupuk became a hub for beginners and instructors

Surf Culture Solidifies

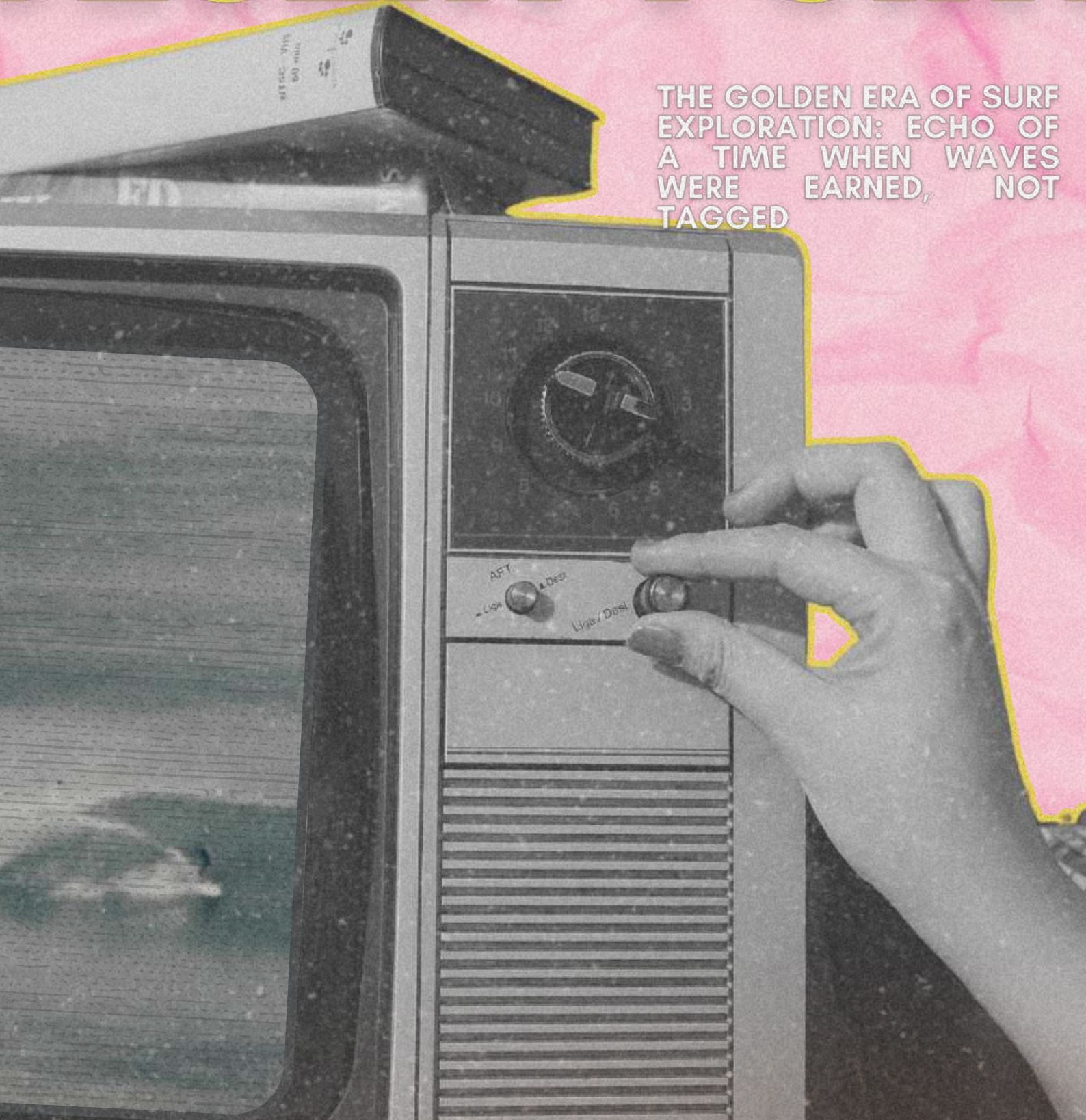
- Lombok became a retreat from Bali's rush

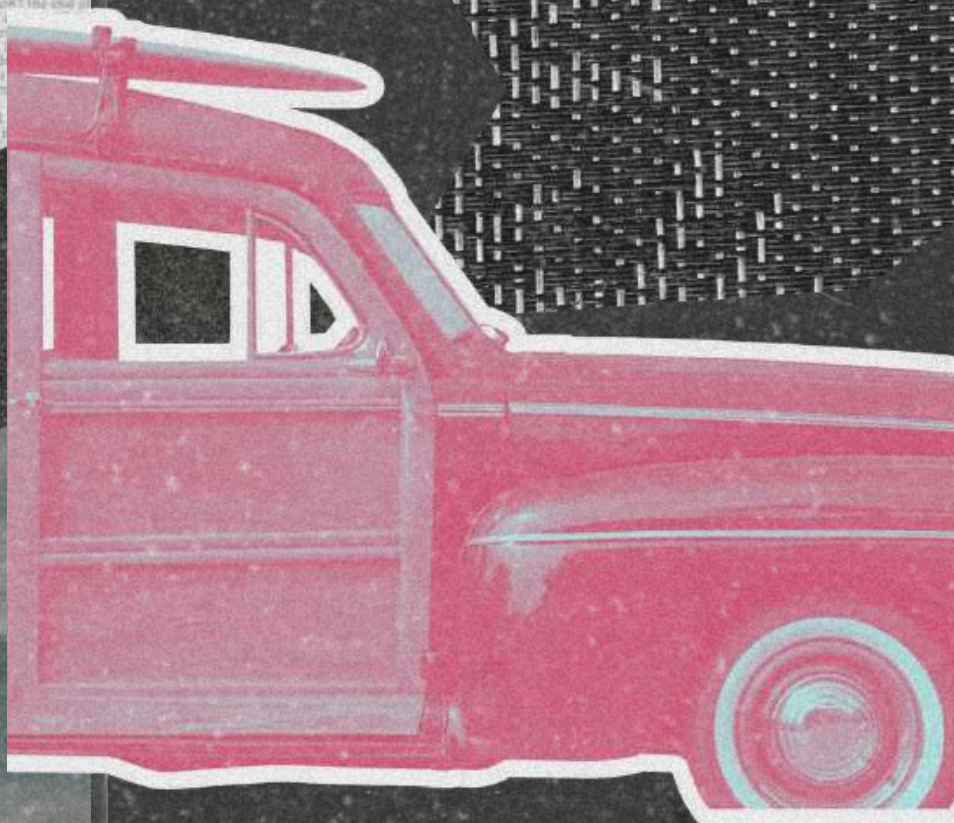


In his documentary *Secrets of Desert Point*, Bill Heick recounts surfing this legendary wave in the early 1980s:

"No talk, no maps, no photos... we became really good liars."

He and his crew "The Golden Beards" lived aboard leaky boats, camping rough and safeguarding Desert Point from the surf media for nearly a decade.

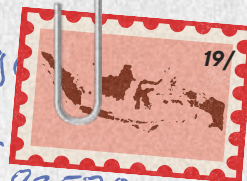

In The Surfer's Journal, humble surfer Pablo Miller reflects on his life in Lombok in 1981-1983 era saying: "You don't wanna interview me, man. I'm pretty boring..."

He spent quarters of the year living on remote Lombok reefs, balancing the serenity of perfect tubes with the real dangers of reef, pirates, and harsh conditions. A Legend around the Island.

Jimmy Banks,

Australian Jim Banks appeared in interviews with The Surfer's Journal and Surflife, sharing his early-'80s breakthrough:

"My **whole** concept of riding the barrel changed in Lombok... I was the only person in the water." He recalls sitting alone in heavy, perfect sets (**20-waves-to-a-set!**), describing it as the peak surfing experience.

1980 Gili Air,

First recorded surf on Gili Air (1980)

A surf blog cites the earliest documented waves on Gili Air in 1980:

"Mike & Tim McHugh ... did the channel crossing ... I caught the first wave and got ~~smashed~~ hammered on the reef."

These images capture the dawn of surf tourism on the Gilis — an untouched archipelago at the time.

FOLLOWING THE REAL LEGENDS

First Surfboard in Lombok: Myth or Memory?

Who rode the first wave in Lombok? No one really knows. Some say it was traveling Aussies in the '70s. Others whisper about local fishermen experimenting with wooden planks even earlier. What's clear is this: the surfboards came, and everything changed. From bamboo rafts to soft tops, the tools evolved — but the sea stayed the same. In a place without a fixed starting point, your first wave becomes part of the ongoing myth.

Desert Point was first ridden on single fins

Desert Point was surfed in the early 1980s by traveling surfers using single fins and early thrusters. The initial wave-riders, often Australian, brought whatever boards they had — and at that time, many were still riding single fins. The wave's structure also naturally favors a clean, down-the-line style suited to single fins.

"Signs You're Surfing in Indonesia"

The Warung auntie knows your board better than your friends. Tropical rain feels warmer than your shower. And you will start craving rice at 9am.

Waves Speak Sasak: Surfing Through Local Eyes. To the Sasak people, the sea isn't a playground — it's a provider, a presence. Surfing here, you're entering their space. Listen closely: waves don't just break, they communicate. They speak of patience, strength, unpredictability. A good surf session isn't just about standing up — it's about understanding what the water is trying to tell you. In Lombok, surfing is a form of listening.



There's an Unnamed Break That Locals Call "Training Ground" — But It's Not on Any Map

Just east of Gerupuk, there's a small reef with a clean shoulder and forgiving drop that surf instructors use to train future local surf guides — but they rarely take tourists there. It's protected, quiet, and breaks best when the tide is doing "nothing," which most people would write off. If you're ever invited, it's a silent compliment — you're being let in on the next generation's classroom.

LOMBOK WHERE SPEAK WAVES SASAK

Desert Point Was Kept Secret for Over a Decade. One of the best left-hand barrels in the world — Desert Point (Bangko-Bangko) — was surfed in near-total secrecy during the 1980s. Those who discovered it camped in the dust, shared no photos, and swore each other to silence, keeping it off the radar until the '90s. Even today, it's still considered a pilgrimage spot for advanced surfers.



LOMBOK SURF SLANG (DON'T) LEARN AT YOUR RISK

BAGUS SEKALI

Literal meaning: Very good!

Surf usage: When someone gets a good ride – “Bagus sekali, brother!”

GROM / GROMMET

Young local surfers – often seen ripping – cheer up one another. Used by both locals and foreigners.

SET DATANG

Meaning: The set is coming!

Local instructors or boat drivers shout this to warn or hype up students when a solid set approaches.

SANTAI AJA, BRO

Translation: Just relax, bro.

This is a Lombok surf philosophy – go slow, follow the rhythm, don't rush the wave. Often used when people get anxious or aggressive in the lineup.

BOAT DROP

Refers to the common practice in Lombok where surfers get dropped directly into the lineup by boat.

REEF CUT BADGE

Joking term for injuries caused by the reef – a rite of passage. If someone shows up with bandaged feet or legs, locals might say: “Ah, first reef cut badge, ya?”

NASI CAMPUR RECOVERY

Surf slang for the post-session meal – a cheap, delicious mixed rice plate (nasi campur). It's a daily ritual for many surfers in Kuta.

GERUPUK INSIDE EXPRESS

Teasing name for the fast boat ride to Gerupuk Inside. Known for beginners flying over chop, wide-eyed, holding onto foamies.

TUBE OR TOMB

Common phrase around Desert Point. Ride the barrel clean – or get destroyed. It's used jokingly, but everyone knows it's true.
