### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This report aims to provide a concise overview of Alkhidmat Europe's humanitarian interventions for displaced Palestinian families in both Egypt and Gaza Strip during July 2025. It highlights the scope, scale, and outcomes of the organization's core programs, Family Support, Orphans Care, Learning Support, and Health Care, demonstrating how these efforts addressed urgent needs and contributed to the well-being and dignity of affected communities.

Additionally, the report outlines key partnerships, coordination efforts, and special events that supported program implementation and enhanced outreach. By documenting these activities, the report serves as both a record of impact and a foundation for strengthening future collaboration with stakeholders committed to supporting the Palestinian cause.

# **Programs Progress Updates**

# 1- Family Support Program

This project promotes lasting stability for vulnerable families by providing ongoing financial support and vital resources. It enables them to cover their essential needs, restore self-sufficiency, and work toward a safer, more stable future.

<b>Permanent Support</b>		
Financial Aid	Monthly cash assistance is provided to eligible families through Egypt Post. In July, a total of <b>489,000 EGP</b> was delivered to <b>69</b> deserving families.	
Vulnerable Families Hosting  Occasional Support	The project has supported <b>46</b> families, around 276 individuals, through housing assistance.  In early July, <b>eight</b> new families were added after careful field assessments. All families, both new and existing, were evaluated based on several factors: family size, income sources, number of students in school or university, and the health condition of the main provider.  To ensure proper follow-up, the team conducted 11 monitoring visits. Key Updates:  • July 17, 2025: Eng. Mosan & Mr. Awad handed over 3 apartments to Palestinian families in 10th of Ramadan City. The team conducted follow-up visits to 5 other families.  • July 24, 2025: Mr. Awad handed over apartments to 5 newly approved families in 10th of Ramadan City.	
Food parcels and Qurbani Project	In partnership with Resala Charity Association, around <b>2,500</b> food parcels were distributed. Additionally, <b>6,629 kg</b> of Qurbani meat reached <b>2,125</b> families, with each family receiving an average of 3 kg. The distribution took place on July 15, 16, and 17 at Resala's main building. All beneficiaries had registered through an online form shared via social media as part of the Eid Al-Adha campaign.	

# 2- Orphans Care Program

The primary goal of the project is to provide comprehensive care and financial support to orphaned children, ensuring their well-being, stability, and access to essential needs such as food, shelter, education, and healthcare.

Orphans	Monthly cash support is provided to 145 orphans, each receiving \$50,
Sponsorship	with the total disbursed amount reaching <b>371,900 EGP</b> . Payments are made through Egypt Post, allowing families to collect the funds from their nearest branch.
	The total amount covers sponsorship, internet costs, and medical support.
	Post-Distribution Follow-Up
	After each payment cycle, records are reviewed and follow-up calls
	are made to confirm receipt and gather feedback from beneficiaries.
Orphans Housing	Since January 2025, <b>31</b> orphaned children and their <b>11</b> families have been hosted in fully furnished apartments for a period of one year

# **3- Learning Support Program**

This program is dedicated to safeguarding the right to education for displaced Palestinian students by ensuring continued access to quality learning opportunities.

Project Higher Education	Updates		
Financial Support for Students	Monthly financial assistance is provided to <b>21</b> Palestinian students enrolled in Egyptian universities, with a total disbursement of <b>265,000 EGP</b> . Funds are transferred through Egypt Post, enabling students to collect support from the nearest branch.  As part of the project, comprehensive home assessments were conducted to evaluate students' living conditions, parents' employment status, housing situation, and whether they live alone or with family. A detailed report was submitted to management and donors to guide decision-making. <b>Key Updates</b> :		
	<ul> <li>July 7–8, 2025: Eng. Mousa and Mr. Awad conducted field assessments for 15 students as part of the Higher Education Support Project.</li> <li>Three new students were also assessed and approved for sponsorship after being registered through the Alkhidmat Foundation website. The students will be added from the August 2025 to the sponsorship project.</li> </ul>		

# 4- Health Care Program

This program tackles the urgent healthcare needs of displaced Palestinians in Egypt through a comprehensive, holistic approach.

Project	Updates	
Medical Care	<b>Five</b> cases were referred to the attending doctor and scheduled for treatment at Resala Hospital. <b>Two</b> were referred by Goodwill Caravan and three came from our sponsored families. <b>One</b> case involved eye surgery, while the others required checkups, scans, and essential medications.	
Psychological Recovery	During the follow-up visits, the children engaged in drawing and coloring activities as part of their emotional expression and psychological recovery. All material were provided by Alkhidmat office in Cairo.	

# 5- Gaza Relief Program

# **Ongoing Support Program:**

## Distribution of Clean Drinking Water

Approximately **465,000** liters of clean drinking water were distributed to families in northern Gaza, benefiting around **76,650** people and helping to address the urgent shortage of safe water.

### • Distribution of Hot Meals

A total of **5,000** hot meals were distributed in northern Gaza, directly benefiting **5,000** individuals in need of immediate food assistance.

## • Distribution of Vegetables Parcels

**250** vegetable parcels were delivered to families across various governorates, reaching around **1,750** individuals from severely affected households. This initiative helped combat food insecurity and malnutrition, with many beneficiaries expressing heartfelt gratitude for the support.

## **Education Program:**

#### Alkhidmat School

This project provides primary education to over **80** students (boys and girls) in northern Gaza. The school, established with limited resources, is staffed by four dedicated teachers who ensure a safe and supportive learning environment despite the challenges.

#### **Orphans Care Program:**

The team collected updated data for over **288** orphans through field visits and phone calls, covering each child's health, education, and social conditions. All information was documented through reports and photos, reviewed, and uploaded to the system—allowing sponsors to track the wellbeing of each orphan accurately. Additionally, the team conducted **34** visits to orphans suffering from malnutrition and provided them with fresh vegetable parcels to support their health and nutrition.



# **Internal and External Meetings**

# Internal Meetings, Cairo Office.

## • Periodic Coordination Meetings:

Regular team meetings are held to review project progress, plan upcoming activities, and assess new social cases for inclusion in the Family Support Program.

## • Vulnerable Families Hosting

Across three review meetings, families receiving support were re-evaluated through field visits. A detailed report on each case was presented to guide funding decisions. Starting August 1, 2025, financial support will be continued or discontinued based on these assessments.

# Obour School Updates

Following a top management decision, an MoU is being prepared to allocate \$100,000 in funding over one year, starting September 2025.

The school will offer education to displaced Palestinian students and also serve as a community hub for extracurricular programs, including camps, English courses, and women's vocational training in embroidery and handicrafts for income generation.

#### • Qurbani Project Updates

The project will process 80 tons of meat, with half to be cooked and canned in 800g cans, and the other half preserved as beef to be in 360g cans.

This initiative continues in coordination with Resala Charity Association.

#### New Project Lunching internally

On July 20, 2025, a planning meeting was held with Ahmad Baroud, who will volunteer for three months to support the launch of a new livelihood project.

# Internal Meetings, Gaza Field.

Six internal meetings were held to cover the following topics mainly:

#### Orphan Care Program

The Orphan Care Program is currently focused on reviewing weekly progress and challenges, planning field visits to malnourished orphans, and strengthening internal coordination. Given the difficult field conditions and rising inflation, the program has prioritized updating orphan records, aiming to update 250 out of 1,700 profiles within three days. Tasks have been distributed among team members to ensure both speed and accuracy, with a focus first on new sponsorship cases, followed by monthly or bimonthly updates of existing cases. Additionally, the program is enhancing its documentation process by requiring detailed reports, photos, and videos from field visits to improve transparency and data accuracy for donors. Strong coordination between administrative and field teams is emphasized to maintain a professional and efficient workflow.

## • Emergency Response for Malnourished Orphans

An emergency response initiative was launched to address severe malnutrition among orphans, beginning with a dedicated meeting to plan urgent field visits. Each field team was assigned at least one critical case to ensure immediate attention. As part of the rapid response, emergency food parcels were distributed to affected



children, and every case was thoroughly documented and reported to maintain donor visibility and accountability.

# • Vegetables Parcel Distribution

An emergency meeting was convened to coordinate urgent visits to children suffering from severe malnutrition. Each field team was tasked with visiting at least one critical case to ensure immediate intervention. As part of the quick response, emergency food parcels were distributed, and each case was documented and reported to enhance donor visibility and accountability.

# MoUs

Two MoUs were signed with:

- 1- AlAzhar University- Gaza: aimed to establish a framework of cooperation between Al-Azhar University – Gaza and Alkhidmat Europe for the provision of scholarship support to a group of final-year students in the Faculty of Dentistry at AUG who have completed their final year of clinical training in Pakistan and require support to complete their academic requirements and obtain their graduation certificates
- 2- **Atef Rayan Partners Co.**: aimed to provide and distribute fresh vegetables to the most vulnerable families in Gaza, particularly those caring for orphans and households affected by malnutrition.
