EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In November 2025, Alkhidmat Europe continued its mission to support displaced and vulnerable Palestinian families across Egypt and Gaza. Through coordinated interventions in financial assistance, education, health, and emergency relief, our teams reached more than 98,600 beneficiaries through direct programming and humanitarian response.

In Egypt, our work focused on stabilizing families through financial aid, housing support, education assistance, and medical referrals. In Gaza, our field team maintained daily emergency operations despite extremely challenging conditions, including food distribution, water trucking, winterization support, and education activities.

Partnerships continued to strengthen this month, including coordination with the Leonard Foundation on education support, and the receipt of 2,500 winter blankets from Alkhidmat Pakistan for Gaza.

Programs Progress Updates

1- Family Support Program

This program helps vulnerable families achieve stability through financial assistance, housing support, and livelihood opportunities.

Project	Updates
Permanent Support – Financial Aid	Monthly cash assistance is provided to eligible families through Egypt Post. In November, a total of 365,000 EGP was delivered to 51 deserving families.
Vulnerable Families Hosting	The housing support program assisted 40 families (200 individuals) living in host apartments across Cairo. As part of ongoing field monitoring, a visit was conducted to 10th of Ramadan City on 16 November to follow up on the financial needs of hosted families and review the apartments allocated to marginalized households.
Direct Family Support Interventions	Additional support activities included the donation of household furniture to an eligible family living in the Al-Khayala housing units, where Palestinian patients in Cairo are accommodated. A field visit was completed on 13 November to ensure proper installation and assess remaining needs.
Winter Support for Families	In support of at-risk households, 16 blankets were delivered to six orphan families in 10th of Ramadan City.
Food Assistance	A total of 160 meat parcels were distributed to 160 families, with each family receiving 3.5 kilograms of meat to supplement their food needs.
Logistics and In- Kind Support	As part of winter and humanitarian preparedness, 2,500 blankets were received from Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan to be shipped and distributed inside the Gaza Strip.



2- Orphans Care Program

The orphans program ensures financial, emotional, and educational stability for children who have lost one or both parents.

Orphans	A total of 87 orphans received monthly support of \$50 each,
Sponsorship	amounting to 222,800 EGP disbursed via Egypt Post. Post-distribution calls were made to confirm receipt and gather family
	feedback.
Orphans Housing	Since January 2025, 33 orphans and their 11 families have been
	accommodated in fully furnished apartments for one year, ensuring
	stability, dignity, and improved living conditions.
	A field visit to 10th of Ramadan City also included monitoring the
	housing conditions of orphan families and verifying proper
	maintenance of the units provided.

3- Learning Support Program

Education remains a top priority for Alkhidmat Europe's mission to restore normalcy and opportunity to displaced families.

Project	Updates
Financial Support for Students	A total of 21 university students continued receiving support amounting to 249,000 EGP in November.
Dentistry Students	A group of 15 dentistry students began their internships, supported with 175,000 EGP in training-related expenses. A dedicated meeting was held with the students at the office to follow up on their academic progress and professional challenges.
Alkhidmat School in Maadi	The school serves students from grade 1 to grade 11, offering a safe and supportive learning environment for displaced Palestinian children and employing Palestinian teachers. A follow-up visit was conducted to the Pyramids of Hope Initiative, led by Ms. Maroua Abu Duqqa, to assess operations at School in Maadi. The school currently employs 39 teachers, with total staff expenses reaching 385,400 EGP.
Alkhidmat School in Alexandria	The only operational school serving displaced Gaza students in Alexandria, staffed by 30 teachers, with total monthly expenses of 270,000 EGP including salaries and rent.
Education Sector Partnerships	A meeting was held with the Leonard Foundation to explore expanded support and collaboration in the education sector.

4- Health Care Program

The health program continued to assist vulnerable families through direct medical referrals, with three cases admitted to Resala Hospital for specialized care. In parallel, ongoing coordination ensures access to medications, chronic illness follow-up, and emergency support for eligible patients.



5- Gaza Relief Program

Despite ongoing challenges, Alkhidmat Europe's Gaza field team-maintained operations to provide food, water, and education to thousands of displaced families.

• Distribution of Clean Drinking Water

To alleviate the severe water crisis, daily deliveries of clean and safe drinking water were carried out in the most affected communities. The distribution prioritized shelters, informal camps, and households with vulnerable residents such as children, the elderly, and individuals with chronic illnesses. Over the course of the month, a total of **249,000** liters of potable water were distributed, reaching **84,700** beneficiaries.

• Distribution of Hot Meals

Hot meals were distributed throughout the month to displaced families who lack access to cooking facilities. This intervention ensured that thousands of individuals received at least one warm, nutritious meal each day. By the end of the reporting period, a total of **2,700** hot meals had been delivered, benefiting approximately **2,700** people.

Bread Distribution

Daily bread distribution continued across targeted areas, providing families with one of their most essential food staples. The activity ensured access to bread for households that are unable to reach bakeries due to destruction, fuel shortages, or unsafe conditions. By the end of the month, the initiative had reached **8,000** beneficiaries through the distribution of **4,000** bundles of bread.

Winter Clothes

As temperatures dropped, the winter clothing distribution program was launched to support vulnerable groups. Children, women, and elderly individuals received essential winter items—including jackets, blankets, and thermal wear—to help them cope with the cold. This intervention served **55** beneficiaries and marked the beginning of broader winterization efforts.

• Medical Point

Alkhidmat Europe also established a medical point in southern Gaza to provide comprehensive healthcare services. The facility offers treatment for chronic diseases, pediatric and women's health issues, prenatal care, urology cases, and mental health conditions. It also dispenses free medications under the direct supervision of trained medical staff, ensuring the continuity and quality of care for patients in need.

• Rubble Removal Project:

The rubble removal project achieved significant impact in Jabalia, where several main streets were cleared and reopened after extensive debris removal. This intervention improved traffic flow, enhanced access to essential services, and enabled residents to move more safely within their neighborhoods, alleviating some of the daily hardships caused by destruction.

Education Support Activities:

Honoring Medical Students:

A ceremony was held to honor **113** medical students, sponsored by Khidmat Europe, which provided hospitality for attendees and financial rewards for all the students. The event



celebrated their academic achievements and encouraged their continued educational and professional growth.

• Honoring Qur'an Memorizers:

The activity also recognized **120** individuals who completed memorizing the Qur'an during the war. Each honoree received 20 kilograms of flour, in addition to event hospitality. This provided both moral and material support, reflecting appreciation for their perseverance and dedication.

Orphans Care Program:

In Gaza, **850** orphans continued receiving monthly cash assistance of \$50, distributed securely through the field team.

A recreational and support-oriented carnival was also organized for orphaned children across the Gaza Strip. A total of **85** children participated, receiving winter clothing and enjoying various entertainment activities. The event brought moments of joy to the children and contributed to fulfilling some of their basic winter needs.

Internal and External Meetings

Internal Meetings, Cairo Office.

Regular team meetings are held to review project progress, plan upcoming activities, and assess new social cases for inclusion in the Family Support Program.

Internal Meetings, Gaza Field.

Two coordination meetings were held during the month to follow up on the progress of key humanitarian interventions, including the distribution of hot meals, clean drinking water, and bread. The meetings also stressed the importance of strengthening media documentation for all activities and submitting the material promptly to ensure proper visibility and transparency.


CONCLUSION

As winter intensifies and needs continue to rise, our priority remains ensuring uninterrupted support, expanding donor engagement, and scaling interventions in both countries.


