EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In December 2025, Alkhidmat Europe delivered comprehensive humanitarian and development support to displaced and vulnerable Palestinian families across Egypt and the Gaza Strip, reaching more than 98,600 beneficiaries through coordinated, multi-sector interventions.

In Egypt, programs focused on strengthening family stability and resilience through financial assistance, housing support, education sponsorships, and access to health care. Targeted support to orphans, university students, and displaced families contributed to improved living conditions, continuity of education, and reduced financial stress for households facing prolonged displacement.

In Gaza, Alkhidmat Europe sustained life-saving emergency operations under extremely challenging conditions. Interventions included the provision of safe drinking water, hot meals, bread distribution, food parcels, winter clothing, rubble removal, and psychosocial activities for children, alongside education support and medical scholarships. All activities were implemented with direct field supervision to ensure safety, accountability, and dignified access for affected communities.

Throughout the month, strong partnerships played a critical role in expanding impact, including collaboration with international and local partners in education, winterization, and emergency relief. These collective efforts enabled Alkhidmat Europe to respond effectively to urgent needs while maintaining a commitment to transparency, coordination, and sustainable impact.

Programs Progress Updates

1- Family Support Program

This program helps vulnerable families achieve stability through financial assistance, housing support, and livelihood opportunities.

Project	Updates
Permanent Support – Financial Aid	Monthly cash assistance is provided to eligible families through Egypt Post. In December, a total of 365,000 EGP was delivered to 52 deserving families.
Vulnerable Families Hosting	The housing support program assisted 40 families (200 individuals) living in host apartments across Cairo. As part of ongoing field monitoring, a visit was conducted to 10th of Ramadan City to follow up on the financial needs of hosted families and review the apartments allocated to marginalized households.
Food Assistance	A total of 1,900 food parcels were distributed to vulnerable families in Egypt during the reporting period.

2- *Orphans Care Program*

The orphans program ensures financial, emotional, and educational stability for children who have lost one or both parents.

Project	Updates
Orphans Sponsorship	A total of 100 orphans received monthly support of \$50 each, amounting to 255,300 EGP disbursed via Egypt Post. Post-distribution calls were made to confirm receipt and gather family feedback.
Orphans Housing	Since January 2025, 33 orphans and their 11 families have been accommodated in fully furnished apartments for one year, ensuring stability, dignity, and improved living conditions. On December 13 th Prof. Dr. Hafeez AlRahman visited 10 orphan families in 10th of Ramadan City to ensure that their needs were being met.
Orphans Celebration Activity	A celebration was held for orphans, hosting 60 orphaned children along with their families. The event included the distribution of in-kind and cash gifts, recreational games, a lively and supportive atmosphere, and a shared dinner.

3- *Learning Support Program*

Education remains a top priority for Alkhidmat Europe's mission to restore normalcy and opportunity to displaced families.

Project	Updates
Financial Support for Students	A total of 21 university students continued receiving support amounting to 249,000 EGP in December.
Dentistry Students	A group of 28 dentistry students began their internships, supported with 343,000 EGP in training-related expenses. A dedicated meeting was held with the students at the office to follow up on their academic progress and professional challenges.
Alkhidmat School in Maadi	The school serves students from Grade 1 to Grade 11, providing a safe learning environment for displaced Palestinian children and employment opportunities for Palestinian teachers. A follow-up visit was conducted to the Pyramids of Hope Initiative, led by Ms. Maroua Abu Duqqa, to assess school operations. The school currently employs 40 teachers, with total monthly staff expenses reaching 395,900 EGP .
Alkhidmat School in Alexandria	The only operational school serving displaced Gaza students in Alexandria, staffed by 30 teachers, with total monthly expenses of 270,000 EGP including salaries and rent.

4- *Health Care Program*

The Health Care Program continued to support vulnerable families through medical referrals and treatment coordination. During December, five medical cases were admitted to Resala Hospital for specialized care. Ongoing coordination ensured access to medications, chronic illness follow-up, and emergency medical support for eligible patients.

5- Gaza Relief Program

Throughout December, Alkhidmat Europe sustained its humanitarian response across the central, southern, and northern Gaza Strip, focusing on life-saving assistance for displaced families. All activities were implemented under direct field supervision to ensure quality, safety, and dignified access.

- **Safe Drinking Water:** Water distributions ranged between 7,000 and 15,000 liters per site, totaling 302,700 liters delivered to shelters, reaching an estimated 153,600 service beneficiaries through repeated distributions.
- **Food Security Activities:**
 - **Bread Distribution Program:** In partnership with the Australian Association, Alkhidmat Europe operated its bakery in central Gaza, distributing 1,800 bread bundles to approximately 3,400 beneficiaries.
 - **Food Parcel:** A total of 730 food parcels were prepared and distributed across multiple governorates, benefiting 3,320 individuals.
 - **Hot Meals:** 4,600 hot meals were distributed across several shelters, reaching 4,600 individuals.
- **Winter Clothing Distribution:** A total of 240 winter clothing items were distributed to children in various locations, contributing to protection, warmth, and dignity during harsh winter conditions.
- **Rubble Removal Project – Northern Gaza:** In coordination with partners, a rubble removal initiative was implemented in Jabalia, improving mobility, access for emergency services, and overall safety in heavily damaged areas.
- **Psychosocial and Community Activities:** In partnership with Aghosh UK, recreational and psychosocial activities were implemented for 90 orphaned children, supporting emotional well-being and resilience.
- **Education Support:** A full medical scholarship was awarded to a student at The Islamic University, funded by Aghosh UK.

Regular team meetings are held to review project progress, plan upcoming activities, and assess new social cases for inclusion in the Family Support Program.

Weekly coordination meetings were conducted via Google Meet, focusing on staff safety, implementation progress, upcoming plans, media documentation, and timely reporting to ensure accountability and effectiveness.
