EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In February 2026, Alkhidmat Europe continued its mission to support vulnerable families and displaced students in Egypt. The Family Support Program provided financial assistance to 37 families (257,000 EGP) and housing support to 30 families in Cairo host apartments. The Orphans Care Program sponsored 100 orphans (\$50 each) and accommodated 10 orphan families in furnished apartments, ensuring stability and dignity. Education initiatives supported over 500 students across university, medical, and dentistry programs, and in Alkhidmat Schools in Maadi and Alexandria, offering structured learning environments and professional teacher support. Visits, follow-ups, and recruitment of a new media handler strengthened program management and communications, while internal and external coordination with the Head Office, Cairo team, and partners such as Hak Turkish Association, and Al-Azhar University reinforced operational efficiency and partnerships.

While in Gaza, Alkhidmat Europe sustained multi-sectoral humanitarian interventions across the northern, central, and southern Gaza Strip, reaching over 45,300 beneficiaries. Safe drinking water deliveries totaled 126,000 liters, while 14,000 hot meals and 500 suhoor parcels supported displaced families and the most vulnerable households. Psychosocial initiatives included the first post-war football competition engaging eight youth teams and a recreational event for 115 orphaned children, combining activities with suhoor parcels, iftar meals, and sponsorship support. The initiatives strengthened emotional well-being, fostered community cohesion, and restored a sense of normalcy for children and youth. These coordinated efforts reflected a holistic, impact-driven approach to humanitarian assistance, education, and psychosocial support in a challenging operational environment.

Programs Progress Updates

1- Family Support Program

This program helps vulnerable families achieve stability through financial assistance, housing support, and livelihood opportunities.

Project	Updates
Permanent Support – Financial Aid	Monthly cash assistance is provided to eligible families through Egypt Post. In February, a total of 257,000 EGP was delivered to 37 deserving families.
Vulnerable Families Hosting	The housing support program assisted 30 families (150 individuals) living in host apartments across Cairo.

2- Orphans Care Program

The orphans program ensures financial, emotional, and educational stability for children who have lost one or both parents.

Project	Updates
Orphans Sponsorship	A total of 100 orphans received monthly support of \$50 each, amounting to 255,300 EGP disbursed via Egypt Post. Post-distribution calls were made to confirm receipt and gather family feedback.
Orphans Housing	Ten orphan families have been accommodated in fully furnished apartments for one year, ensuring stability, dignity, and improved living conditions.

3- Learning Support Program

Education remains a top priority for Alkhidmat Europe's mission to restore normalcy and opportunity to displaced families.

Project	Updates
Financial Support for Students	A total of 20 university students continued receiving support amounting to 241,000 EGP in February.
Hosting for Medical Students	A total of 15 medical students are residing in two rented apartments at a cost of 36,000 EGP enabling them to continue their internship requirements for graduation.
Dentistry Students	A group of 35 dentistry students began their internships, supported with 410,000 EGP in training-related expenses. A dedicated meeting was held with the students at the office to follow up on their academic progress and professional challenges.
Alkhidmat School in Maadi	The school serves students from grade 1 to grade 11, offering a safe and supportive learning environment to 250 displaced Palestinian children and employing Palestinian teachers. A follow-up visit was conducted to the Pyramids of Hope Initiative, led by Ms. Maroua Abu Duqqa, to assess operations at School in Maadi. The school currently employs 40 teachers, with total staff expenses reaching 403,400 EGP .
Alkhidmat School in Alexandria	The only operational school serving displaced Gaza students in Alexandria, staffed by 30 teachers, with total monthly expenses of 270,000 EGP including salaries and rent.

4- Health Care Program

The Health Care Program continued to support vulnerable families through medical referrals and treatment coordination. During February, **three** medical cases were admitted to Resala Hospital for specialized care. Ongoing coordination ensured access to medications, chronic illness follow-up, and emergency medical support for eligible patients.

5- Gaza Relief Program

Throughout February, Alkhidmat Europe sustained its humanitarian response across the central, southern, and northern Gaza Strip, focusing on life-saving assistance for displaced families. All activities were implemented under direct field supervision to ensure quality, safety, and dignified access.

➤ Education:

Three schools across Gaza were supported: Ru'ya School (south), Emaar School (central), and Bright School (north), each serving ~100 primary-level students. Nearly 300 children were able to continue their basic education, easing financial burdens for families and improving access to learning.

➤ **Psychosocial Activities:**

A series of initiatives promoted emotional well-being and community cohesion, including:

- The first post-war football competition for eight youth teams, fostering positive competition, unity, and a safe outlet for psychological and physical expression.
- An annual event for 115 orphaned children, combining recreational activities with suhoor parcels, iftar meals, and sponsorship support. These activities restored a sense of normalcy and strengthened community bonds.

- **Safe Drinking Water:** A total of 126,000 liters of safe drinking water were supplied to displacement shelters, benefiting 45,300 individuals, improving health conditions and supporting rapid humanitarian response.

➤ **Food Security Activities:**

- **Hot Meals:** 14,000 hot meals were distributed across northern, central, and southern Gaza shelters, including Kashko (1,500), Al-Almani, Al-Thuraya, Al-Dahyan, Al-Kayali, Nour Al-Huda, Bilal, Al-Ahliyya, Ard Sharab, Al-Sabereen, Badr, Asmaa (1,500), Al-Taqwa, Al-Falah, Nawa Al-Khair, Al-Maghazi, Qandila, Taiba (1,000), Ayadi Misr (1,000), and Ahl Al-Shamal (1,000).
- **Suhoor Food Parcels:** 500 suhoor parcels were delivered to the most vulnerable camps, including Bilal Shelter, supporting approximately 3,000 individuals during Ramadan and easing financial and living hardships.

Internal and External Activities

Internal Meetings

- Regular team meetings were held to review project progress, plan upcoming activities, and assess new cases for the Orphan Sponsorship Program.
- Mr. Irfan conducted two meetings with the Head Office in Pakistan and two Zoom meetings with the Cairo team to coordinate projects and ensure alignment.
- A job announcement for a Social Media Photographer & Content Designer was published, interviews were conducted with candidates, and one was selected and hired on a probationary period.
- In Gaza, weekly coordination meetings via Google Meet reviewed staff safety, project progress, upcoming plans, and reporting requirements. Discussions included ongoing projects, hot meal and water distribution, and Ramadan preparedness, with an emphasis on timely media documentation and reporting.

External Activities, Cairo Office

- Hak Turkish Association: Explored partnership opportunities, database exchange for orphan sponsorship, and potential collaboration.

- Alkhidmat School – Maadi (Meraj): Attended the excellence ceremony, introduced a projector as an educational tool, and toured school facilities.
- Al-Azhar University: Met with Eng. Mohammad Awazier (Board of Trustees) to follow up on dentistry students and review requirements for smooth academic progress.
