“He who believes in Allah and the Last Day, let him speak good or remain silent”.

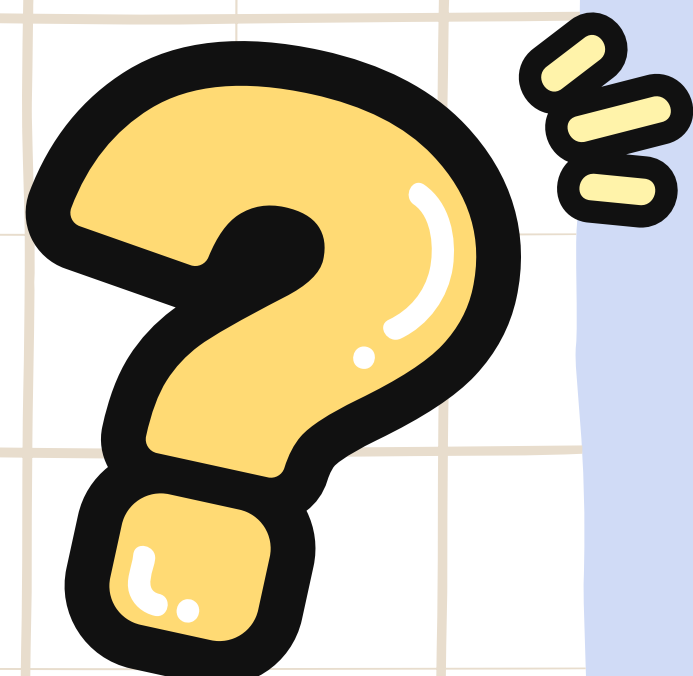
(Bukhari and Muslim)

“I said: ‘O Messenger of Allah! What is the means to salvation?’ He said: ‘That you control your tongue, suffice yourself your house, and cry over your sins.’”

When he received the first revelation, he returned home worried

- He mentioned to his wife, Hazrat Khadija (ra), the incident that had shaken him to the core that day.
- He said that he did not know what God was going to do with him. This incident greatly worried him.
- In a state of shock he requested that he be wrapped in something warm. So after doing what she had been told, Hazrat Khadija (ra) asked him what had happened, and he related to her the whole incident.
- He told her how an angel had squeezed him in a tight grip and asked him to read the following words:

Recite thou in the name of thy Lord Who created man... (Ch.96:V.2)

- Hazrat Khadija (rah) replied: 'God has not sent you that He should then give you up. Be not afraid because *you are kind and considerate to your relations, help the poor and the forlorn and bear their burdens.* You are restoring the virtues that had disappeared from our country. *You treat guests with honour and help those who are in trouble.*'

Hazrat Anas (ra) had the good fortune of serving the Holy Prophet (saw) for 10 years. The Holy Prophet (saw) treated him so nicely that Anas (ra) said,

"I served the Prophet (saw) for 10 years. By Allah, he never even said to me,

'Uff!'

'Why did you do that?' or 'Why did you not do that?'

If I did anything improperly, he would never say anything harsh to me, rather he would console me and instruct me affectionately and was never harsh to me.

He would frequently join me in doing many tasks."

The Promised Messiah (as) will stand up as one obeys the call of an honourable master, and will speak to them and advise them with a *cheerful* face.”

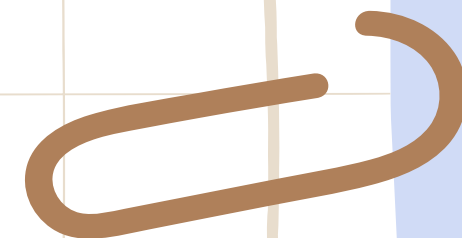
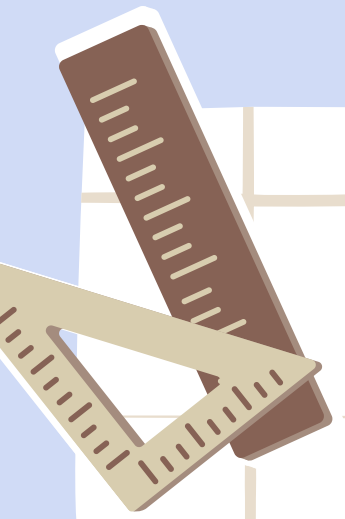

Never say jokes in a harsh manner

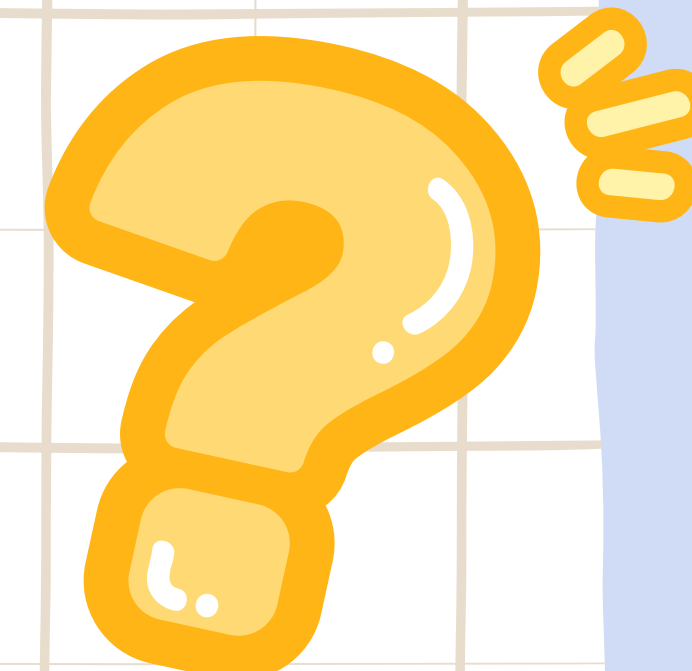
Hazrat Dr Mir Muhammad Ismail (ra) narrates

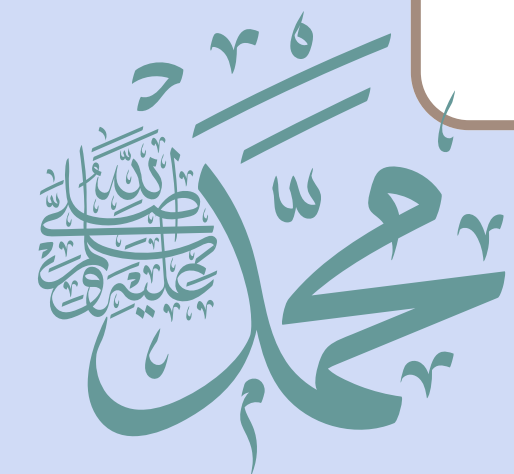

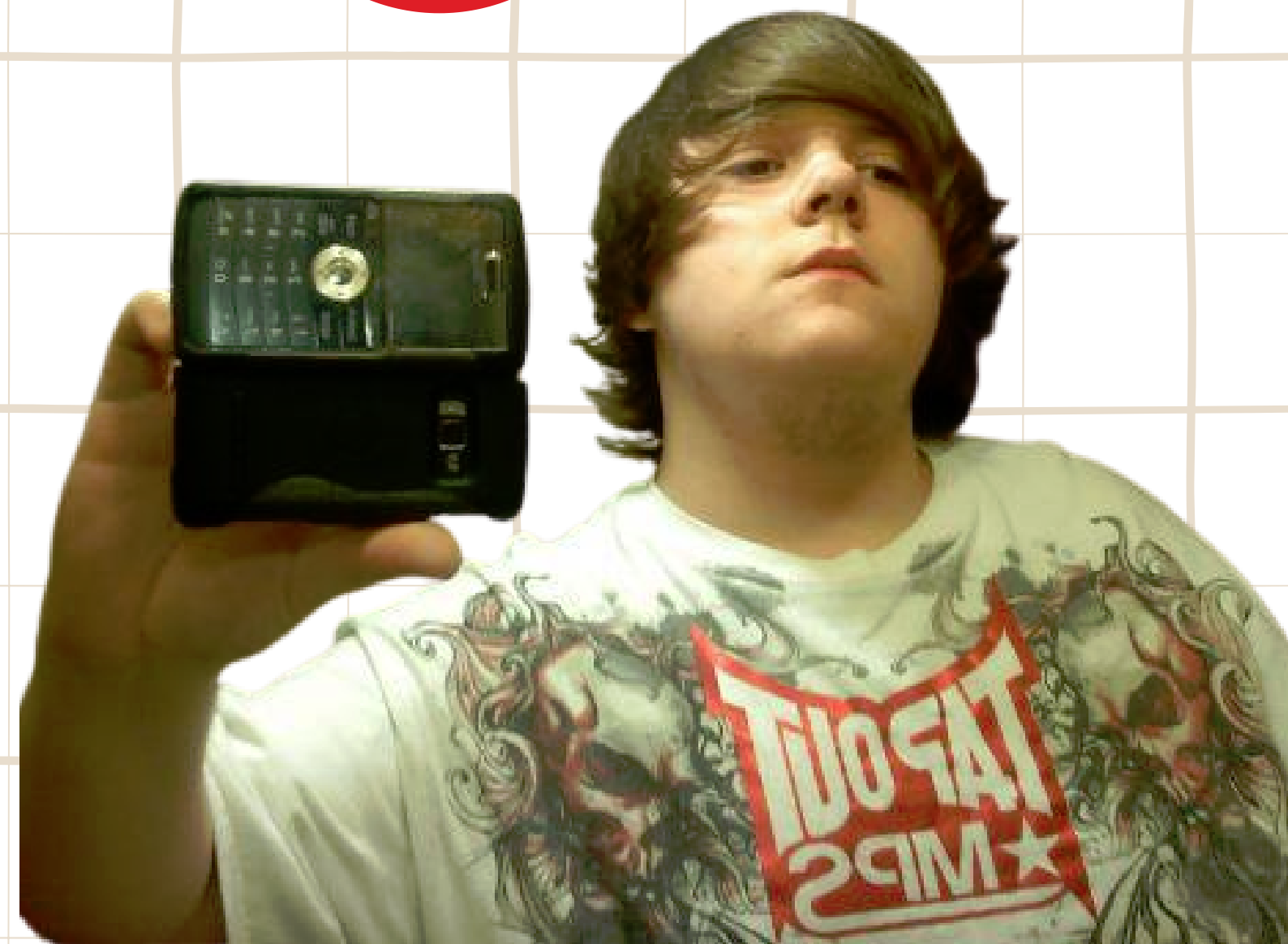

Huzur (aba) said:

- "One should wear simple clothes to the mosque. The clothes should not feature company logos, pictures, cartoons, or animal designs.
- Since we cover pictures in front of us during prayer, our clothes should also be plain.
- If someone is wearing a shirt or vest with such designs, they should wear a plain jacket over it."

Getting ready for Jumah

The Holy Prophet (saw) instruction before coming to Jumah

- Take a bath
- Clean your teeth
- Wear your best clean clothes
- Put on a nice smell
- He said Friday is a day of Eid for the Muslims – so bathe, use perfume if you have it, and use the miswak (brush your teeth)
