The process of obtaining the Venezuelan national identification card, also known as the cédula de identidad, is free and managed by the Servicio Administrativo de Identificación, Migración y Extranjería (Saime) or its foreign consulates. Once issued, the identification card has a validity period of 10 years. This document is essential for various purposes, such as making payments, enrolling in universities, or registering to manage other national documents.



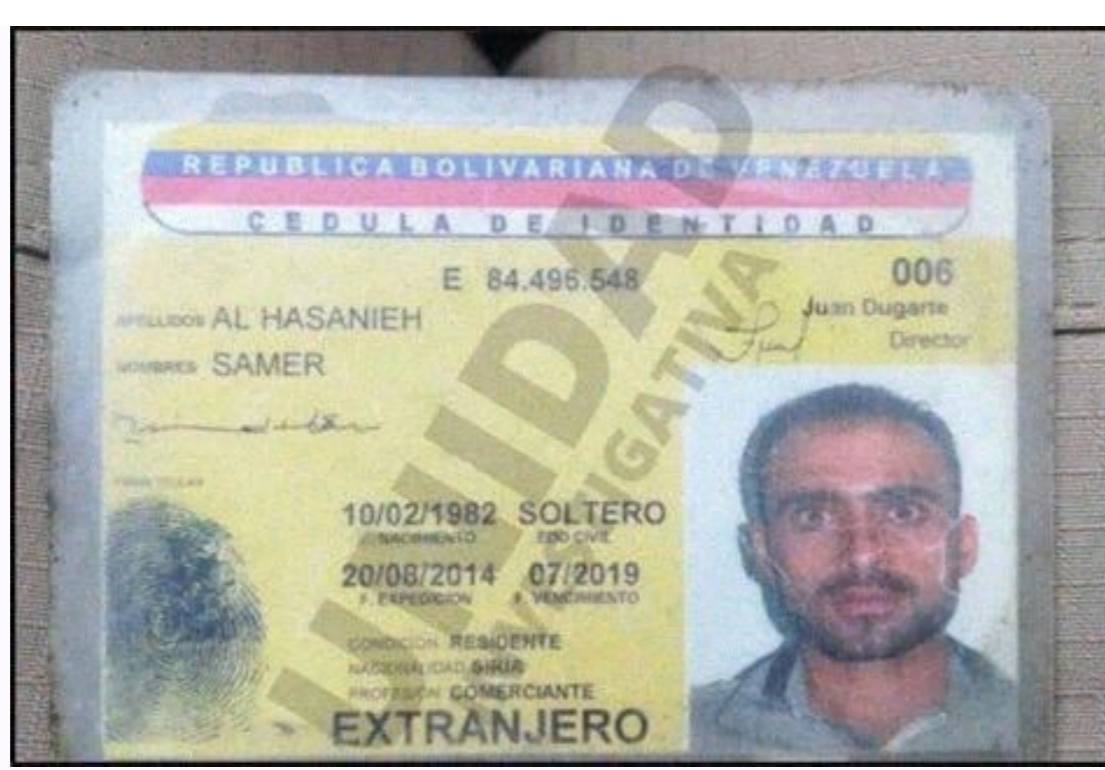
Required documents include: * Birth certificate inserted into the Registro Civil * Certified copy of birth certificate * Copy of identification card from one or both parents or representatives Original documents must be presented, along with certified copies. For minors, an additional step involves inserting the original birth certificate and a certified copy into the Registro Civil. The application process takes place at Saime offices across the country, where citizens must provide specific documentation to obtain the card. According to Venezuelan legislation, all citizens born in Venezuela must apply for their national identification card starting from age 9. In cases of minors, representatives are responsible for processing the application until they reach the age of majority. For children, this corresponds to the residency of their parents or representatives. If some of your parents have passed away, you'll need to provide an original death certificate. If it's from a foreign country, it must be apostilled or legalized. You may also be required to: * Declare your intention to acquire Venezuelan nationality before turning 25 years old. * Establish residency in the Venezuelan territory before turning 18 years old. As for what you can do at Saime's self-service machines: * Obtain certified copies of birth certificates that indicate the indigenous community or population to which you belong.

Despite this, citizens can also visit other offices where a public employee will take a photo, fingerprint, and signature, as well as gather necessary identification data and indicate the steps to follow. For individuals living abroad, regardless of age, they can manage their identification at the Venezuelan consulate in their country of origin. The Migration and Identification Organization's website (www.saime.gob.ve/identificacion/cedulacion) has all the requirements and recommendations. Once the processes are completed, Saime should assign an identity card to the Venezuelan citizen. Typically, it is issued within several weeks after submitting the documents at the same office where the process took place, with a variable timeframe of one, three, or six months.

However, when the organization conducts identification drives, individuals may obtain their identification without waiting. It's crucial to identify scams and people posing as Saime handlers. Twitter This isn't the first case of identity document fraud registered in 2023. In February, the National Electoral Council (Saime) reported an attempted scam through WhatsApp groups. The entity stated that scammers offered false document processing services. According to Saime, this modus operandi involved requesting personal data from victims to supposedly update or verify their identification and travel documents.

"Dear users, be aware of fake information circulating on WhatsApp groups," a post by Saime on Instagram reads. "Don't give out your data to third parties; avoid being scammed." To process an ID card through the Saime website, users must follow these steps: 1) Log in to the Saime platform and fill out a verification code 2) Enter their ID number and password 3) Click on the "cedulación" option at the top of the page 4) Select the "renew" option and click "accept" 5) Fill out a personal data form, including mandatory requirements such as physical characteristics, birthdate, and medical center information.
