My daughter is a proud Brownie in Girl Scouts, and our favorite time of year is cookie season! We love Thin Mints, but more importantly, we appreciate each customer who buys cookies from her. To show our gratitude, I've created a Free Girl Scout Cookie Thank You Card Printable that can be used for all 6 levels: Daisies, Brownies, Juniors, Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors. To access the printable, simply scroll to the bottom of this page and click on the download button. Save it to your desktop and print as needed. I recommend printing on cardstock for a more professional look. You can customize these thank you cards by attaching them to the Girl Scout boxes, handing them out personally, or even gluing them to a small bag with the cookies inside (as shown in the picture below). This printable is designed to be used for all levels of Girl Scouts, from Daisies to Ambassadors. It's a great way to teach girls about good manners and the importance of showing appreciation. As a teacher, I emphasize the value of good manners in my students' daily lives. Whether it's using proper language, eating skills, or simply saying thank you, these skills are essential for success. In fact, I often use the example of a job interview to illustrate the power of good manners. Candidate One might order the most expensive item and eat sloppily, while Candidate Two orders a lower-priced item, uses a napkin, and says thank you. Which one do you think would get hired? As a leader of a Girl Scout troop, I like to make sure my girls understand the importance of good manners and appreciation for those who help us achieve our goals. One way we do this is by writing thank-you notes after completing a task or receiving support from others. For instance, when we're done selling cookies, we'll ask our students who they think will get the job and why - usually because Candidate Two shows excellent etiquette! This practice ties in nicely with selling Girl Scout cookies. Young girls can be quite excited about this project, so as their leader, you'll need to help them calm down and work on sales pitches while still being polite even if someone doesn't buy a box. Our troop represents all the troops in our area, so it's essential that we make a good impression. That's why I love sharing these free printable Girl Scout thank-you notes with leaders. These resources are fantastic for girls to show their appreciation to customers. From Daisy Scouts to Seniors, it's always best practice to say thank you! At your next meeting, print out some samples and have the girls vote on which ones they'd like to use. Then, go to a copy store or assign a parent volunteer to print what you need, and make sure they save the receipt so you can reimburse them. If desired, your girls can also design their own tags that they can have printed for the boxes they sell door-to-door.
