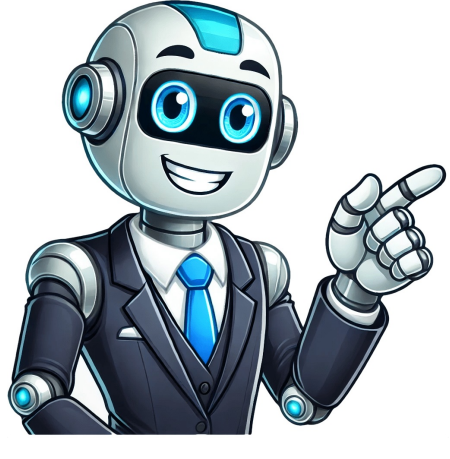

Google Drive lets you bring your files home by downloading them onto your computer or phone. You can grab one file, several at once, or all of them in one go. Before you start, check that your device has enough storage space for the files. To download a single file or folder, open Google Drive on your desktop, find what you want to download, right-click it, and choose "Download".
