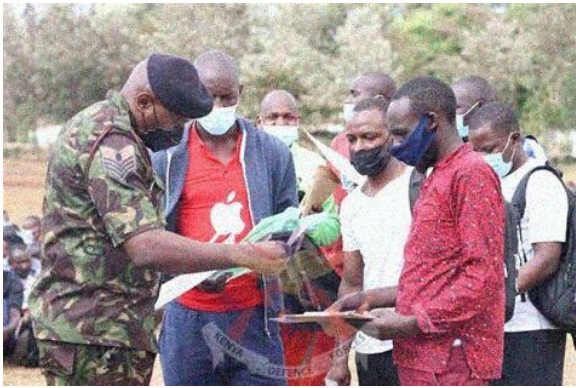

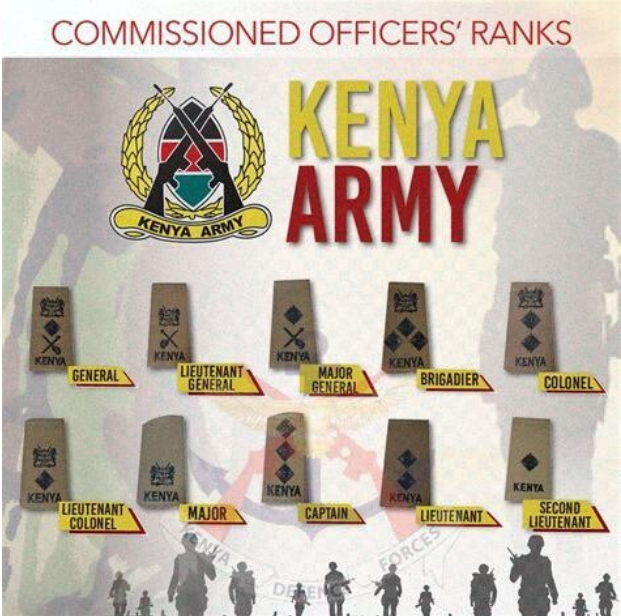

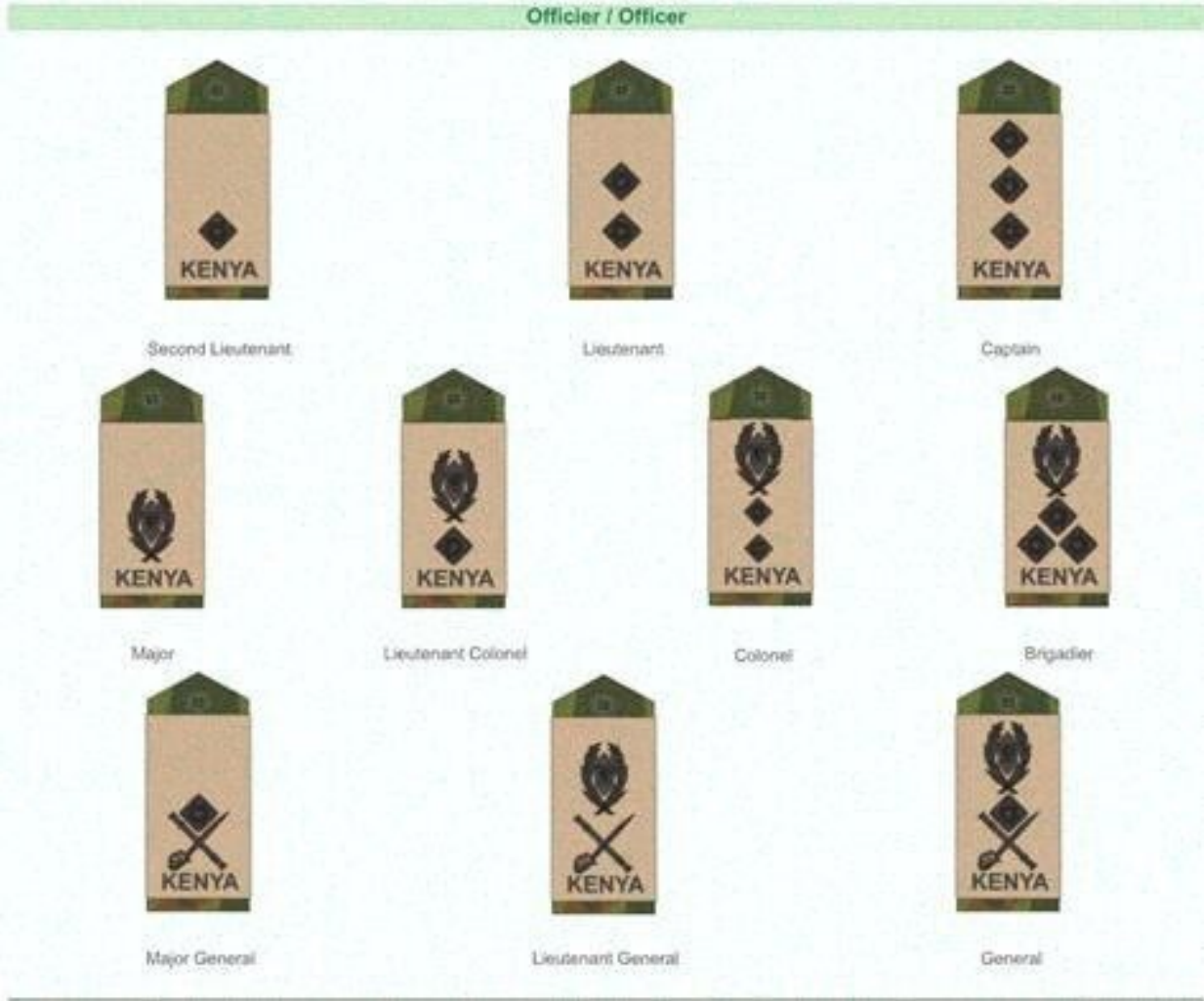

A Colonel serves as a staff officer, while a Brigadier is responsible for commanding a brigade or serving as a staff director. Major Generals oversee divisions and are in charge of promotions, earning them the title of "two-star generals." They can be promoted to service commanders. Lieutenant Generals hold senior positions within the KDF. The highest-ranking military position belongs to the General, who serves as the Chief of Defense Forces. The Kenyan Air Force (KAF) is a separate entity under the KDF's command, with its own ranks and salaries. The Air Vice Marshal is the second-highest rank in the KAF, followed by the Air Commodore. Wing Commanders are responsible for commanding a wing or serving as staff officers. Squadron Leaders are senior pilots, while Flight Lieutenants serve as training officers. Flying Officers are junior pilots. The Kenyan Navy (KN) is also under the KDF's command, with its own ranks and salaries. The highest-ranking naval officer is the Admiral, followed by the Vice-Admiral and Rear-Admiral. Commodores serve as senior naval officers, while Captains command ships. Lieutenants are junior officers, and Midshipmen are new recruits. KDF Salaries: How Much Does the Kenyan Defence Forces Earn? The Kenyan Defence Forces (KDF) has a salary scale that varies based on rank. The lowest ranking officer, a training cadet, earns around Ksh. 7,172 per month. In contrast, the Chief of Defense Forces receives approximately Ksh. 1,120,000 per month. They are only exempted from paying excise duty. The salaries of Kenyan military personnel vary based on their ranking, with the Chief of Defence Forces earning Ksh. 1,120,000 per month and the lowest-ranked Leading Aircraftman receiving Ksh. 19,941. Officers' salaries range from Ksh. 7,172 to Ksh. 1,200,000, with higher rankings corresponding to increased pay. Service length and merit also determine an officer's ranking. KDF drivers earn between Ksh. 14,610 and Ksh. 16,250, along with commuter and leave allowances of Ksh. 3,000 and Ksh. 4,000, respectively. Drivers and cooks receive the same salaries and allowances. The highest rank in the Kenyan military is held by the Chief of Defence Forces. The military's salary structure has sparked public debate, with some arguing that regular increments are necessary to protect the country.
