Here are the details: finished size 63" x 77", Star Junction pattern by Ariga Mahmoudlou, Moda Bella White solid and Crown Royal bags for the top, Moda Grunge eggplant for the backing and binding, Quilter's Dream Poly Select white batting, Superior OMNI #3002 Natural White thread, and Citrine pantograph by Patricia Ritter.
