### Sermon

The Dove - Pastor Jared Herd

<u>Scriptures:</u> Genesis 1:1-2, 8:11-12; Joshua 3:14-16; Mark 1:4-5, 9-11; Matthew 28:19; Revelation 22:17

<u>Context:</u> Pastor Jared reminded us of the ongoing work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. When we choose to follow Jesus, the Holy Spirit enters into us and we become a new creation! He brings us affirmation by reminding us of who(se) we are and He will carry to completion the work He began in us through setting us apart, i.e. - sanctification.

#### Mixer

- 1. Share an experience you've had a feeling about something, i.e. calling a friend, taking a different route to work, etc. and didn't. Later you realized that feeling had been the Holy Spirit nudging you.
- 2. Share about your baptism experience.

### Questions

Observation: What does the passage say?

- 1. Read Genesis 1:1-2. What do we learn about the Holy Spirit from this passage? What significance does water have with creation?
- 2. Read Genesis 8:11-12 and Mark 1:9-11. What does the dove represent in these passages?
- 3. Read Exodus 2:3-5 and Joshua 3:14-16. How was water significant throughout history?

### Interpretation: What does the passage mean?

- 1. In Mark 1:4-5, we see John the Baptist baptizing Gentiles in the Jordan River. In Mark 1:9-11, Jesus is baptized and a dove descends. How does Jesus knit himself to creation? (See Genesis 1:1-2.)
- 2. Jesus tells His disciples in Matthew 28:19 to go and make disciples, and baptize them. What can we learn from this passage and what does it mean for us?

Application: How can we apply this passage to our lives?

- 1. Pastor Jared talked about the metaphors we use today around water, i.e. drowning in debt, in deep waters, etc. What steps can you take to turn over what you are drowning in to Him?
- 2. Read Revelation 22:17. This is the promise of our future when we will become complete. How does that give you hope today?
