Sermon

Paid in Full - Pastor Jared Herd

Scriptures: Matthew 18:21-35

<u>Context:</u> Pastor Jared taught us the need to live life from the heart. He shared that while we think we are intellectual creatures who have little capacity for emotion, we are actually emotional beings who, once in a while, have some capacity for the intellect. As a result, when we forgive, we need to forgive, not from the head, but from the heart.

Mixer

Share about a time when you made a head (intellectual) decision when you should have made a heart (emotional or spiritual) decision.

Questions

Observation: What does the passage say?

- 1. Read Matthew 18:21-22. When Peter asked how many times to forgive, what was the basis for his question and for the answer he offered? How did Jesus respond?
- 2. Read Matthew 18:23-24. In this parable (story), who do the king (v23), the king's servant (v24), and the fellow servant (v28) represent?

Interpretation: What does the passage mean?

- 1. When Jesus gives his response in verse 22, what does He mean?
- 2. In verse 27, what does the king's response represent relative to God's relationship with us?
- 3. In verses 28-30, how is the servant's actions toward his fellow servant representative of us?
- 4. In verses 32-34, what does the master's actions represent as it relates to us?

Application: How can we apply these passages to our lives?

1. What is the impact on us of turning the pain inward, and what is the impact of turning the pain outward?

- 2. What has or currently tends to be your approach (bitterness or revenge) to emotional pain you have experienced: Do you tend to drink the poison and pay yourself, or do you exhibit aggression (passive or otherwise) and make others pay?
- 3. What are the ramifications of forgiving from our head but not from our heart?
- 4. Pastor Jared shared that the cross becomes a conduit of the forgiveness we have received. Is there someone in your life you need to forgive as God forgave you? What steps will you take to forgive from your heart?
