Scripture Reading

Acts 2:14-17, 2:22-23, 29-30, 36-37; Luke 22:60-62

Sermon Recap & Prayer

Peter, in his speech, did not bring an emotional appeal. He connected to their/our intellect. Knowing that the blood of Jesus paid the price for my sin should not bring me guilt, but the realization of God's grace offered to me unconditionally.

Discussion Questions

Observation: What does the passage say?

1. In **Acts 2:14-17 and 22-23**, what did Peter help the people understand regarding Pentecost?
2. In **Acts 2:29-30 and 36-37**, what did Peter help the people understand about prophecy and the fulfillment thereof? How did the people respond?
3. In **Luke 22:6-62**, what did Peter do and why is that important to what took place in Acts?

Interpretation: What does the passage mean?

1. In the passages from Acts we read earlier, why did Peter share about the words of the prophet Joel and the information regarding David?

2. What is the significance, to us, of Peter's statement, "God made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah?"

Application: How can we apply these passages to our lives?

1. Why is it important we understand God's grace, not just emotionally, but intellectually?
2. Pastor Jared said, "Christianity is not something you take up. Christianity is a power that takes you up." What does this mean and how does it apply to your own life?
3. Pastor Jared said, "When we sin, we don't just break the rules; we break the heart of Jesus." He also said, "The Holy Spirit does not just want to bend our will, but to melt our heart." Take some time to discuss these two statements together, then ask yourself, "Does Jesus fully have my heart?" What steps can and will you take this week to experience, not only conviction for when you break the heart of Jesus, but comfort and grace in knowing Jesus was beat up so you don't have to be.

Huddles

Break into small groups of 3-4 people of the same gender for deeper sharing, accountability, and prayer.

- Pray for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit on your group.
- Pray for specific areas where group members need God's power.
- Pray for revival in your church, your city, and your generation.
- Pray that wherever you go this week, the power of God would be evident through you.

Pray specifically: "God, help us not just to know about You, but to experience the full measure of Your grace. Take the guilt and shame we still hold on to, and help us to live by Your flame as Go First extensions of Your grace. Amen."
