OREGON Opportunity to RECYCLE

ORS 90.318, applies; in a city or the county within the urban growth boundary of a city that has implemented multifamily recycling service; A landlord who has five or more residential dwelling units on a single premises or five or more manufactured dwellings in a single facility shall at all times during tenancy provide to all tenants: [...the opportunity to recycle.]

MULTIFAMILY PROPERTIES

Recycling services must always be provided to tenants of multifamily properties during tenancy with the following criteria:

- 1. A separate location for containers or depot space for materials designated for recycling collection.**
 - Containers or depots must be adequate to hold the reasonable anticipated volume of each material. (Sanipac can help you determine the best size.)
- 2. Regular collection service of the source separated recyclable materials.**
- 3. Notice shall be given to existing tenants at least once per year and to new tenants at the time of entering into a rental agreement, including:**
 - Notice of the tenants' opportunity to recycle.
 - A description of the location(s) of the containers or depots on the premises.
 - Information about how to recycle.

CONTROLLED WASTE ITEMS

Oregon Law prohibits disposal of the following in garbage streams [ORS 459.247] Mandated recycling of some items require special collection.

- **Electronic Waste:** TVs/Monitors, Computers, Printers, Tablets, Etc.
- **Appliances:** Fridges, A/C Units, Stoves, Dryers, Etc. Any freon in units must be removed and removal status posted on each unit.
- **Used Oil - Tires - Lead-Acid Batteries**
- **Mattresses - Materials classified as Hazardous Waste:** Lithium Batteries, Paint, Chemicals, Etc.

COMMINGLE RECYCLE INSTRUCTIONS:

All recycling must be clean! Separating recyclables from your trash reduces the amount of waste that ends up in landfills, saves energy and reduces emissions!

INCLUDE ONLY THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:

PLASTIC

Bottles, round containers, buckets, and rigid plant pots
Caps OK if screwed on. All items must be 2 inches by 2 inches or larger.



METAL

Aluminum and steel cans, and scrap metal
Less than 10 pounds and 18 inches.




CARDBOARD AND CARTONS

Flattened cardboard, packaging boxes, and food and beverage cartons
Pizza boxes must be empty with no food residue.



PAPER

Newspaper, magazines, office paper, paper egg cartons, mail, paperback books, paper bags, and non-metallic gift wrap
