Crafting Communities

Grades: Kinder to 12th WORKSHOP TYPE: IN-MUSEUM

Explore what games like *Minecraft* can teach us about establishing communities and our roles in building relationships. From creating basic survival needs to sharing surpluses and asking for help, students will investigate how communities form, develop, and grow using simulated habitats in an interactive, real-life game environment.

This workshop highlights learning about community, civics, economics, sustainability, history, and social studies.

Hero's Journey to Collective Journey

Grades: 3rd to 5thWORKSHOP TYPE: IN-MUSEUM

Encourage youth to bloom into inspired storytellers, using imagination and creativity with pop culture favorites to explore, compare, and contrast the individual-centered Hero's Journey with the collaborative Collective Journey story structures! They'll also celebrate their own identities while creating fantasy characters and embarking on a journey together to problem-solve as a collective community.

This workshop highlights learning about story building and writing, Hero's Journey and Collective Journey story structure, character archetypes, and writing narratives.

Pop Culture and Activism

Grades: 9th to 12thWORKSHOP TYPE: IN-MUSEUM

Reflect on how pop culture plays a critical role in activism. Students will analyze pop culture and the "machines" that creatives have produced, which we can all use to make a difference. They will explore their skills and interests to process collective anger, raise awareness, and make their voices be heard through crafted personal social justice statements.

This workshop highlights learning about photography, activism, social justice, writing, and individual or collective impact.

Make and Take Printmaking Workshop

Grades: 3rd to 12thWORKSHOP TYPE: MAKE-AND-TAKE

Put the power of pop culture creation into your hands! Students will explore the art of chibi, a Japanese-originated caricature style commonly used in anime and manga — which uses exaggerated proportions and expressions to pack in big storytelling and emotion.

This workshop highlights learning about comics, proportion, symbolism, social-emotional learning, and storytelling.
