

REPORT OF IJDVL

(16th July to 15th December 2024)

Dr (Prof) Archana Singal, Editor-In-Chief, IJDVL

- 1. The Journal Citation Report (JCR 2024) for the year 2024 was published on 20th June 2025. IJDVL has scored an impressive increase in the Impact Factor from 3.2 to 3.4 and rise in Scopus CiteIndex from 1.9 to 2.6. With this increase, IJDVL now features in Quartile 1 for the first time within its subject category of Clinical Dermatology across the globe and the journal citation indicator category (JCI).
- 2. IJDVL was awarded The Blackbuck Award for Outstanding Medical Journal in India by the Union Minister of state for Road Transport and Highways, Mr Harsh Malhotra, and Chairman National Medical Commission Dr Abhijat Sheth, on 10th Aug 2025, which was received by the EIC, Prof Archana Singal.
- 3. Additionally, the editorial team including EIC Prof Archana Singal and Section Editors Prof Geeti Khullar and Prof Pooja Arora were interviewed by the Medical Dialogues regarding their insights about the Journal's excellent performance and workflow of IJDVL.

Report of IDOJ

(16th July to 15th December 2024)

Dr Dipankar DeEditor-In-Chief - Indian Dermatology Online Journal

Indian Dermatology Online Journal Report: April 1, 2025 to July 31, 2025

The Indian Dermatology Online Journal (IDOJ) published 2 issues (May- June and July- August) during this time. The issues were released on time and were well appreciated. While impact factor remains an important metric for journal performance, the journal is also receptive to the needs of Indian dermatologists, dermatology postgraduates and their clinical practice.

Impact factor 2024: Journal Impact factor (Clarivate analytics) and CiteScore (Scopus) for 2024 were released during this period. The journal impact factor is 2.0 and CiteScore is 2.2. These have seen a modest and encouraging increase compared to the previous year. The journal appreciates the authors for considering IDOJ for their preferred journal; the reviewers for their timely, extensive and insightful reviews despite their busy professional schedule; the members of the editorial board- present and the past- for their contribution in taking the journal to a higher pedestal and contributing to faster processing of articles and production of accepted articles; the publisher Wolters Kluwer Medknow for their support for the journal; and the Executive Committee of IADVL for their continued support to the journal without interfering in its activities.

IDOJ Editorial Board Meeting: The IDOJ Editorial Board Meeting was held at IADVL Headquarters in Ghaziabad on July 21, 2025. Members of the IADVL EC- Dr Rajeev Sharma (President), Dr Vinay Singh (President Elect), Dr Bhumesh Kumar Katakam (Hon. Secretary General) and Dr Kavitha S.B. joined the meeting and addressed the editorial board. The IADVL EC was highly appreciative of the journal performance and assured all support on administrative and financial fronts towards the functioning of the journal.

Dr Seetharam K.A, the Emeritus Editor, was felicitated for his great contribution as Editor-in-Chief of the Journal.

The Editorial Board discussed where the journal is and the way forward, how to increase the reviewer database and utilise the precious time and expertise of the reviewers without burdening them with too may review requests, how to improve journal efficiency including further reducing time taken for article processing and production, making the manuscript management portal more friendly for the authors, reviewers and editor; adding features on the article processing and production platforms for seamless progress in these phases, augmented social media engagement for better visibility of the journal, ways to use artificial intelligence to the advantage of research and publishing and tackling the menace of mindless Al use, etc.

Mr Vikas Chawla represented the publishing team. The technical aspects raised during the meeting of the editors were communicated to him for measures to be taken at the earliest.







Follow up to editorial board meeting and the most important action taken: From acceptance to appearance of articles in search engines like PUBMED were taking several months at the cost of visibility/ searchability of the articles on PUBMED. In the publication phase, the accepted articles are first published as 'ahead of print' before it is 'published in an issue' with a lag period of some months between these. The articles were appearing in PUBMED after approximately 5 weeks of getting 'published in an issue'. This shortcoming has been addressed and the articles published 'ahead of print' are appearing on PUBMED within one week, not several weeks/ months. This is in line with reputed journals globally.

The Indian Journal of Postgraduate Dermatology (IJPGD), an official publication of the Indian Association of Dermatologists, Venereologists and Leprologists (IADVL), is the first dermatology journal focussed on Dermatology residents worldwide.

IJPGD is a bi-annual, open access, online and print journal, which has so far released five issues so far. It is a peer reviewed journal devoted to publishing novel and high quality original research, case descriptions, snippets and review articles on various disciplines of dermatology including Sexually Transmitted Diseases and Leprosy. Another major focus of the journal is on medical education pertaining to undergraduate and post graduate dermatology teaching methodologies and innovations.

The submissions to the journal have been a sharp upwards curve since its inception. And encouragingly, most of the submissions have been from residents and faculty of teaching institutes. Being the first journal targeted towards Dermatology residents, this is gratifying for the IJPGD editorial board.

In addition, we strive to involve interested residents in the peer review process as well, giving them a chance at understanding the scientific publishing process.

The statistics for last year (2024) are as follows: Total articles published: 84; Total submissions – 262, Rejection rate: 43.26%; Acceptance rate – 14.6%; Submission to acceptance: 79 days

The journal gives awards for Best paper in Postgraduate Thesis section, Best Original article, Best Review article, Best case series and Best case report every year.

IJPGD has also been consistently receiving submissions from outside the country, highlighting the gradually increasing awareness about this focussed journal.

The articles published in the journal are considered at par with other indexed journals, for the purpose of applying for IADVL scholarships and grants. IJPGD is indexed with Google Scholar, CrossRef, ReadCube, Portico currently and we hope to apply for PubMed indexation after a few more issues which shall provide further incentive to Dermatology residents to contribute towards IJPGD.







- **How will it help IADVL?** Brief introduction.
- 1. The registration fee to attend Dermacon, Mid dermacons should be made affordable for all. As everything is sponsored, the registration fee should be @ 7000 for Dermacons & @5000 for Mid dermacons. How will it help IADVL? Brief introduction.

Background:

As per the IADVL Constitution 2024 (Page 34), the Hon. Secretary-Elect and Hon. Treasurer-Elect are elected by the life members of the association and serve as **observers** for one year prior to taking office. During this period, they may attend EC, Academy, and CCM meetings, assist the incumbent Hon. Secretary or Hon. Treasurer, and are entitled to travel and accommodation support. However, they currently:

- Do not possess voting rights
- Are not seated on the dais during ECM/CCM
- **Cannot perform independent functions**

Proposal:

In view of their democratically elected status by the IADVL membership, and to foster a culture of inclusion, respect, and preparation for leadership, it is proposed that:

1. Voting Rights:

- o The Hon. Secretary-Elect and Hon. Treasurer-Elect be granted voting rights during their observer period in Executive Council Meetings (ECM) and Central Council Meetings (CCM).
- Their voting rights shall be limited to issues **not involving financial or constitutional amendments**, preserving the sanctity of observer status while ensuring engagement in deliberations.

2. Seating on the Dais:

- o Both Hon. Secretary-Elect and Hon. Treasurer-Elect be provided seating on the dais during ECM and CCM, similar to other EC members.
- This shall symbolically and practically acknowledge their elected status, preparation for future leadership, and allow better visibility and interaction with the council.

Rationale:

1. Democratic Mandate:

Both positions are **elected by IADVL life members** through the same electoral process as other EC members. Denying dais seating or voting undermines this democratic endorsement.

- o Active participation in discussions and decisions ensures a more effective transition into their future roles, aligning with the spirit of apprenticeship.
- 3. Respect and Inclusion:

Legal Committee Opinion:

- 1. The posts President (Elect), Hon.Sec.General (Elect) and Hon. Treasurer (Elect) are posts not mentioned as office bearers in the Memorandum of IADVL (HQ), neither are these posts part of the Governing body of the Association, in the Memorandum.
- 2. These nomenclatures have been provided by the AGBM in its own wisdom for the Association.
- 3. Altough these posts are not a part of the Memorandum of the Constitution, but yet each of these are elected members of the Central Council.
- 4. Therefore the mentioned posts shall retain all powers and duties conferred by the Memorandum of the Constitution, as Central Council members .
- 5. The Said posts cannot excede the limits provided in duties and responsibilities other than those granted to Central Council members.
- 6. The Said posts are neither members of the Governing Council (Executive Council) as laid down in the Memorandum nor do they enjoy any other privilege accorded to Central Council Members except the nomenclature.
- 7. It would be both wise and prudent to desist from according any special status to any member of the Central Council except nomenclature.
- 8. The proposal to include these said posts for a special reference is primarily, illegal, arbitrary, malafide and a colourful exercise of power.
- 9. Any change on the original Memorandum of the Association has to be first have a prior permission from the registering authority under the Socities Registration Act and then proceeded .
- 10. The said changes will be a cause of greater litigation being not in concurrence of the societies registration act as it will foster disharmony, undue interference of extra Constitutional considerations (without due responsibilities and answerability to the the members at large) and undue influence on



policy matters as it will provide an undue support / rejection to matters of consideration, by the Association ,without any Constitutional liability .

- 11. The Memorandum of the Association does not mention any duties for the said posts and therefore they shall be a liability on the autonomy of the EC merely because of an illegal insertion into the decision making process of the Elected office bearers for the Association Year, as by law established.
- 12. The alleby quoted regarding other Medical Associations does not hold good too since the largest Association of Medical Men ,the IMA (HQ) altough includes Elect posts but does not allow the Elect office bearers to perform any duty of the Association or present themselves on the Dias .
- 13. What cannot be done directly, cannot be done indirectly": is a legal maxim
 This is the core principle of the doctrine, derived from the Latin maxim "quandò aliquid prohibetur ex directo, prohibetur et per obliquum".

This is an attempt indirectly for undue illegal interference merely by increasing the numbers of a future EC into being subdued / unconstitutionally interfered upon by pre elected CC members, in the the day to day running of the Association by changes brought about in nomenclatures.

Constitution Committee Opinion:

What our IADVL Constitution 2024 says:

As per IADVL Constitution 2025 (Section D, Page 34):

The Hon. Secretary-Elect and Hon. Treasurer-Elect are observers during their term prior to assuming office.

They may attend EC, Academy, and Central Council Meetings (CCM).

They have no voting rights and cannot independently perform official functions.

They are entitled to travel and accommodation for attending meetings but cannot influence decisions.

Their presence is for training and observation only, not for active decision-making or voting.

Proposal Nature:

The proposal seeks a **policy change**, not a constitutional amendment, because the current clause defines their role but does not explicitly bar dais seating.

However, **voting rights** in EC and CCM would indirectly alter the Constitution's intent regarding the observer status of these positions.

Impact on IADVL & Concerns:

Granting voting rights may **dilute the observer principle** meant for learning, not influencing decisions prematurely.



Could raise concerns about conflict of interest before they formally assume office.

Might require careful differentiation to avoid confusion in financial or constitutional matters.

Conclusion & Recommendation:

Dais Seating: Not Acceptable as per current Constitution.

Voting Rights: Not acceptable as per current constitution . Needs thorough deliberation. The Constitution treats these posts as observers only; voting rights-even partial-may need a constitutional review or clarification by the **Constitution Committee** before approval.

The proposal can be first discussed at EC/CC level for consensus, followed by a legal/constitutional vetting if voting rights are to be granted. Potentially conflict with observer role defined in the Constitution.

SOP committee Opinion

All committee members are in agreement and support the proposal. We believe it will help ensure a smoother transition, build confidence in future office bearers, and prepare them better for their roles.

We recommend that the proposal be placed before the Central Council for consideration.



It mandates that all committees must include members from IADVL and explicitly mentions *no non-member* shall be allowed. It specifies a two-year term for crucial committees like the Constitution Committee, Finance Committee, and Academy.

State Branches' Autonomy:

State branches are allowed to frame their own rules to maintain their autonomy, provided they do not conflict with the National Constitution (Section C, Page 23–24).

States can set up their own committees but align with the national rules.

No explicit mandate currently exists in the Constitution for every state branch to compulsorily have Ethics and Disciplinary Committees.

Administrative & Constitutional Nature:

This proposal qualifies as both administrative and constitutional. It proposes a new constitutional mandate requiring uniform committee formation at the state level.

Impact on IADVL:

This proposal strengthens ethical governance, ensures uniformity, and enhances accountability across all state branches.

It reduces risks of administrative lapses and legal/financial scrutiny by proactively managing complaints and ethics issues.

Aligning such mandatory committees with central IADVL policies will lead to smoother coordination.

Recommendation:

Yes, this proposal requires constitutional amendment as it seeks to *add* a new clause mandating state-level committees.

Referral to the Constitution Committee is necessary for clause drafting, placement, and legal vetting



Note:

The clause does not replace any existing clause but introduces a *new mandatory provision*.

Careful phrasing is needed to maintain state autonomy yet ensure uniform compliance.

Review:

The proposal seeks to make it *mandatory* for every IADVL state branch to have an **Ethics Committee** and a **Disciplinary** Committee with a minimum of five members (odd number preferred). If a state has an Anti Quackery Committee, either merge or rename Ethics & Anti quackery Committee if possible.

Currently, no such mandatory clause exists in the Constitution, though state branches can form committees on their own.

This proposal qualifies as both administrative and constitutional, as it aims to enforce uniform ethical structures across all states. It aligns with IADVL's mission of clean, transparent, and accountable governance.

Conclusion & Recomendation:

The proposal is justified, timely, and necessary for strengthening IADVL's governance framework across all state branches.

It requires a constitutional amendment and must be referred to the Constitution Committee for proper drafting, review, and inclusion.

This step will ensure consistency, safeguard ethical practices, and streamline coordination between the National and State IADVL bodies.

The proposal can be first discussed at EC/CC level for consensus.



What our IADVL Constitution 2024 says:

Relevant Sections:

Section H: Conferences (Pg 47–49)

Detailed clauses exist for conference finances, organization, and responsibilities.

SOP Section 8 (Pg 149):

Provides clear financial guidelines for DERMACON, including MOU with Organizing Committees.

Key Points in Current Constitution:

Current model allows **OC** to handle most aspects of the conference, with the National EC overseeing the finances and retaining supervisory authority.

The **financial responsibility** currently rests with both National EC and local OC, with strict reporting, auditing, and accountability rules.

Constitution discourages temporary structures and has strict guidelines for financial propriety.

However, there is no clause mandating a compulsory external event management firm for full conference management.

Proposal Nature:

This proposal is both administrative and constitutional.



It seeks to fundamentally shift the operational model by giving full conference management (except scientific program & basic local logistics) to a hired CMC under National EC control.

Impact on IADVL:

Merits:

Greater **financial transparency and control** at the National level.

Minimizes tax risks, legal scrutiny, and future disputes.

Reduces administrative burden on doctors and enables focus on scientific content.

Aligns with practices followed by many global medical associations.

Concerns:

Requires amendments in the Constitution (Section H: Conferences) and SOP (Dermacon Finances).

Could reduce local ownership and flexibility.

MOU terms with CMC must be carefully drafted to avoid future complications.

It can be too burdensome for National EC apart from regualr organizational responsibilites getting neglected.

Conclusion & Recommendation:

The proposal holds **strong merit** for better financial governance and risk mitigation.

However, it requires constitutional amendments (Section H: Conferences) and SOP revisions.

It must be referred to the **Constitution Committee** and **Finance Committee** for legal, financial, and constitutional vetting, with clear frameworks for accountability and operational roles.

EC may first discuss the feasibility and then send it for constitutional processing.

It needs constitutional changes and careful multi-committee review before adoption.

- (d) Each committee shall submit a report to the Central Council through the Hon. Secretary General, every 4 months and as requested by the EC.
- (e) Each committee shall have the option of co-opting a non-member when there is a need for an expert. Such a co-opted member shall attend the committee meetings like other members of the committee and shall not have voting rights. The reports of the committees shall be submitted to CCM and AGBM.
- (f) The President and Hon. Secretary General shall be ex-officio members of all such committees.
- (g) The term of office of the committees shall be as specified in the rules and regulations. The following committees shall have a two-year term: (vide AGBM minutes 2005-2006)
- i) Constitution committee
- ii) Finance committee
- iii) Academy
 - Since these committees are vital for the functioning of the association, they shall continue until they are specifically dissolved/replaced.
- (h) The President shall have the power, under exigent circumstances, to appoint any adhoc committee or task force for a specified purpose but should seek the ratification of the CC and GB for such action at the next available meeting.
- (i) EC Co-ordinator. The President may appoint co-ordinator from EC to different committees to ensure communication and efficiency. However, these co-ordinators are not members of the committees, cannot influence decision making and shall not have voting rights. Their sole purpose is administrative co-ordination.

SECTION E: FINANCES

1. FUNDS OF THE ASSOCIATION

- (a) The funds or the income of the Association shall be derived from the following sources:
- Donations or legacies from members or well-wishers of the Association.
- (ii) Donations will be accepted from members and others (non-members) for prizes, awards, etc., and will be reflected in the bank account.
- (iii) Sale proceeds and amounts derived from advertisements in souvenirs, etc., or the transactions or any publications of the Association, including the royalties of the sale of textbooks, except the official journal of the Association.
- (iv) Rents due to subletting the premises, if any, authorized by the Central Council.
- (v) Total savings accruing from all national conferences (DERMACON and MIDDERMACON)
- (vi) 20% of the savings of zonal conferences (DERMAZONE) (vide AGBM minutes 2020-2021)
- (vii) The savings from any International Conference, Including the regional one like an Asian or SAARC conference, if hosted by any branch, state or local. The host branch organizing the conference shall get 20% of the share of the surplus savings.
- (viii) Royalty from the textbooks and other academic materials published by IADVL should be credited to the central fund and will be the property of the IADVL, the management of which will be vested in the Central Council.



Constitution Committee Comment

What our IADVL Constitution 2024 says:

Committee Functioning (Section D, Page 33-34):

The Constitution allows formation of Standing Committees and empowers the President to appoint members in consultation with the Immediate Past President and President-Elect.

The President has authority to add or remove members of committees and sub-committees as needed during the term.

The EC and CC oversee committee functioning, but routine replacements don't necessarily require GBM approval.

Administrative Nature:

This is purely administrative, not constitutional, as it involves internal committee processes already within the President's prerogative.

Proposal Review:

The proposal aims to enhance efficiency and accountability by allowing committee chairpersons and conveners to suggest the removal of non-contributing members.

This is already *implicitly permissible* under current constitutional provisions, which allow the President to restructure committees as required, ensuring flexibility.

However, formalizing this as a routine practice with clear guidelines will further improve clarity and fairness.

Impact on IADVL:

Benefits:

Improves committee productivity and morale.

Encourages active contribution from all members.

Streamlines committee work without bureaucratic delays.

Recommendation:

No constitutional amendment is needed, but it is advisable for the EC to:

Frame a simple SOP or guideline stating that chairpersons/ conveners may recommend replacement of inactive members to the President, with final approval by the EC.



Ensure a fair process with prior notices/ information or warnings to non-contributing members befor replacement.

Enhancing Inclusivity and Opportunity within IADVL



The Indian Association of Dermatologists, Venereologists and Leprologists (IADVL) is a national body representing registered dermatologists from across India's diverse states. Just as the Union of India reflects a multicultural, multi-ethnic, and multilingual populace, the IADVL's membership mirrors this rich tapestry.

Currently, the existing voting mechanism for allocating DERMACON, our annual national conference, creates an uneven playing field. States with significantly larger membership numbers inherently hold a disproportionate advantage, making it nearly impossible for smaller state branches to successfully bid for hosting the conference. This situation particularly disadvantages regions like the North East and other zones across the Indian Union.

This imbalance not only limits opportunities for smaller branches but also concentrates conference-related financial benefits – crucial for community outreach, scholarships, and anti-quackery initiatives at the grassroots level – in a few select cities/states. Furthermore, repeatedly hosting DERMACON in the same centers gives the impression that only certain parts of India are dominant within the organization.

To address these disparities, we propose a rotational system for DERMACON allocation based on five distinct zones across India: East, West, North, South, and Central. Under this system, bidding for the conference would be restricted to branches within the designated zone each year. This approach would significantly reduce the current unfair discrepancy and ensure broader participation and resource distribution.

Equitable DERMACON Allocation Through Zonal Rotation

The Indian Association of Dermatologists, Venereologists and Leprologists (IADVL) serves as a national platform for dermatologists from all states of India, reflecting the country's diverse demographic.

However, the current DERMACON bidding process disproportionately favors states with larger memberships, hindering smaller state branches, particularly those in disadvantaged regions like the North East, from hosting the conference. This also concentrates vital funds for local initiatives (community outreach, scholarships, antiquackery efforts) in a few recurring locations, fostering a perception of regional imbalance within IADVL.

To foster a more just and equitable environment, we propose dividing India into five zones: East, West, North, South, and Central. DERMACON hosting opportunities would then rotate annually among these zones, with bidding open only to branches within the allocated zone. This will ensure fairer distribution of opportunities and resources across our national membership.

Reimagining DERMACON Allocation for Inclusive Growth

The IADVL, as a national body, brings together dermatologists from every corner of India, representing the nation's incredible diversity. Our aim is to ensure that all members have equitable opportunities and that resources are distributed fairly across the country.



The current method for allocating DERMACON, our premier national conference, inadvertently creates an uneven playing field. States with significantly higher membership numbers possess an inherent advantage, making it challenging for branches with smaller memberships to successfully bid for hosting. This particularly impacts regions like the North East and other less numerically strong zones within the Indian Union.

Beyond the issue of hosting opportunities, the repeated selection of certain cities for DERMACON limits the flow of essential funds – vital for grassroots initiatives such as community outreach, scholarships, and antiquackery campaigns – to other parts of the country. This concentration of events and resources also inadvertently conveys an impression that leadership and opportunities are confined to specific regions.

Therefore, we advocate for a revised approach to DERMACON allocation. We propose dividing India into five distinct zones: East, West, North and South. The conference venue would then rotate annually among these zones, with bidding restricted to branches within the designated zone. Furthermore, within each zone, different venues should be given a chance, and consensus-based allotment should be prioritized over voting wherever feasible. This systemic change will promote inclusivity, ensure a wider geographical spread of conferences, and facilitate more equitable distribution of crucial resources across our membership.

Existing Zones and their State Branches as per constitution) (common across all options):

Please note that we are open to rearranging these zones based on membership strength and other relevant factors.

- o States: Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh,

What our IADVL Constitution 2024 says:

Section H: Conferences, Clause (g)6, Page 42 currently governs DERMACON venue selection, which is primarily based on bidding and voting by members.

There is no constitutional provision mandating zonal rotation for conference venues. Presently, all branches, regardless of size, can bid and compete through voting.



The Constitution does allow the General Body to modify or restructure conference procedures if ratified through appropriate constitutional processes.

Nature of Proposal:

This is a **constitutional amendment proposal** as it aims to *modify Section H (Conferences)* to introduce a *zonal rotational system* for DERMACON allocation.

Impact on IADVL:

Merits:

Promotes **geographical inclusivity** and equitable representation of smaller branches.

Ensures **fairer resource distribution** and allows all regions to benefit from conference-generated funds and exposure.

Aligns with the principles of **national representation** and democratic fairness.

Concerns:



What our IADVL Constitution 2024 says:

Section H: Conferences, Page 40 outlines current DERMACON bidding rules, which are based on voting by Members, with no provision for zonal rotation.

The Constitution also outlines **election rules** for executive posts (President, Secretary, Treasurer), where any eligible member can contest, regardless of zone, based on democratic voting.

No rotational system exists currently for either DERMACON bidding or National Executive Posts.

Nature of Proposal:



This is a **constitutional amendment proposal** as it seeks structural changes in:

DERMACON Venue Selection (Section H, Conferences)

Election Process for Executive Posts (President, Secretary, Treasurer)

Impact on IADVL:

Merits:

What our IADVL Constitution 2024 says:

The Constitution (Section H: Conferences) and SOPs outline rules for conference organization, finances, and conduct, but there is no specific clause limiting the number of co-delegates or accompanying persons per member.

Conference-related provisions mainly focus on financials, venue selection, and scientific/administrative matters, leaving such operational aspects to the Organizing Committees and National EC.



Nature of Proposal:

This is a **policy matter**, not a constitutional one.

It falls under conference management guidelines, aimed at crowd control and safety.

Impact on IADVL:

Merits:

Addresses genuine logistical, safety, and crowd-management challenges, especially for large events like DERMACON.

Allows organizers to manage facilities like banquets, cultural programs, and other social gatherings more effectively.

Enhances delegate comfort and safety, ensuring smooth flow of conference activities.

Concerns:

Needs clear implementation guidelines, including exception handling (e.g., children below a certain age).

Could face resistance from members who are accustomed to attending with larger families.

Conclusion & Recommendation:

This proposal is practical and sensible from a **conference management** perspective.

It should be discussed and formalized as a **conference policy** under the supervision of the **Conference Reform Committee (CRC)** and EC.

No constitutional amendment is required.

The EC can approve it as a **standard conference regulation** after the Conference Reform Committee's review, ensuring fairness and clarity.

This proposal offers a reasonable solution for crowd control and conference safety by capping accompanying person registrations.

It is a policy issue and should be routed through the Conference Reform Committee for EC approval and implementation.

The Constitution and SOPs outline conference organization, scientific content, and financial rules, but they do not specify mechanisms for awarding CME credits.

CME credits are generally governed by **State Medical Councils**, but IADVL, as the organizer, can implement attendance-based monitoring to align with state guidelines.

The Constitution permits **conference SOP modifications** by the IADVL Academy and the EC.

Nature of Proposal:



This proposal pertains to policy and conference SOPs, not the Constitution.

It involves the implementation of attendance tracking for awarding CME credits.

Impact on IADVL:

Merits:

Promotes active participation in scientific sessions.

Ensures fair awarding of CME credits based on actual attendance.

What our IADVL Constitution 2024 says:

The Constitution and SOPs of IADVL do not explicitly regulate faculty participation limits in academic sessions at conferences.

Conference scientific programs are generally handled by scientific committees under the IADVL Academy and local Organizing Committees, with EC oversight.



No constitutional amendment is required for such operational policies; it can be included as a **conference or scientific program guideline**.

Nature of Proposal:

This is a **policy proposal** related to conference faculty allotment.

Impact on IADVL:

Merits:

Encourages **broader participation** by creating opportunities for more members, especially young and emerging dermatologists.

What our IADVL Constitution 2024 says:

Section H: Conferences and the **SOP on Dermacon Finances** (Pages 47–49 and SOP Section 8, P the financial rules for DERMACON.



There is **no mandatory clause for 50:50 profit sharing**; these ratios are typically determined by mutual agreement and formalized via MOU.

Nature of Proposal:

This is a **policy proposal** related to DERMACON financial management and does not require a constitutional amendment. However, it does affect the conference SOP and financial policies.

Impact on IADVL:

Merits:

Recognizes the **significant efforts and financial risks** taken by the organizing state branch.

Encourages more branches to bid for DERMACON by offering fairer incentives.

Potentially reduces regional monopolization of conferences.

The Constitution and SOPs for conferences do not contain explicit provisions regarding hotel room bookings.

Presently, such logistics are handled by Organizing Committees or Event Management Companies (EMCs) at their discretion.

The Constitution permits **Organizing Committees** to manage conference logistics, under EC supervision.



Nature of Proposal:



1. Uniform Tenure Alignment:

It is proposed that all State IADVL Councils follow a uniform tenure aligned with the National Council - preferably from CUTICON to CUTICON or April to April. This alignment will facilitate smoother coordination, standardized activity cycles, and better alignment in reporting, budgeting, and planning.

2. Orientation Meeting Post Elections:

Immediately following the elections, each State IADVL branch should conduct a mandatory orientation meeting—similar to a CC Meet—during the first week of the new term.

Participants: State Presidents and Secretaries.

Purpose: To outline the roadmap for the year's activities, set clear expectations, establish timelines for key events such as CUTICONs and MIDCUTICONs, and communicate financial protocols.

This practice should be uniformly implemented across all state branches to ensure consistency and effective governance.

3. Accounts and Signatory Transfer Protocol:

Operational Challenge:

One of the key challenges faced at the operational level is the delay in transferring financial authority and updating signatories following the election of new officebearers.

Proposal:

A strict protocol should be enforced to ensure the smooth transition of financial responsibilities. This should include a clearly defined timeline—within 15 days of the new term's commencement—for the transfer of:

- Bank account signatories
- Access to digital banking platforms
- · Custody of financial records and documents
- Handover of budgets, audit reports, and pending liabilities



Implementing this uniform protocol across all state branches will help maintain financial continuity, transparency, and accountability.

4. Conference Organization and Budget Management:

Clear SOPs to be drafted for organizing CUTICONs and MIDCUTICONs:

Transparent use of funds from sponsors

Avoid mere collection of funds without proper utilization and accountability

Clear budgeting with pre-defined expenditure heads

5. Proposal: Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for Organizing CUTICONs and MIDCUTICONs

To ensure transparency, accountability, and consistency in the organization of CUTICONs and MIDCUTICONs across all state branches, the following SOPs should be established:

Financial Guidelines for CUTICONs and MIDCUTICONs

- 1. Sponsor funds must be transparently documented and used.
- 2. Funds should be collected only with a clear spending plan.
- 3. Prepare a detailed budget with defined expense categories.
- 4. Submit post-event financial reports to State Council and National IADVL.

Proposal: Extension of Office-Bearers' Tenure to Two Years

What our IADVL Constitution 2024 says:

The Constitution grants state branches autonomy to manage their internal governance, provided it doesn't conflict with the National Constitution (Section C, Page 23-24). No uniform rule currently exists mandating synchronized tenures, orientation meetings, or standardized conference protocols across all state branches.

Nature of Proposal:

This is primarily an administrative and policy proposal.

Impact on IADVL, Concerns & Recommendation:

Extending office-bearers' tenure to two years or more may enhance continuity and leadership stability.

Some smaller or less active branches may find implementation challenging without capacity-building support.

State policy is governed by State EC/CC/AGBM and state constitution. If any change need to be done then we need to follow state constitution and must be driven by State AGBM mandate. We can only suggest here to amendment/s.

No constitutional amendment is immediately necessary.

This proposal is not needed at IADVL Constitution Committee as it's a state constitution matter of autonomy.

How will it help IADVL? Brief introduction

Proposal for Centralized Financial Oversight of DERMACON under IADVL Headquarters



Background & Rationale:

Over the years, DERMACON has evolved into one of the most prestigious and financially significant scientific gatherings in Indian dermatology. While the organizing committees have traditionally functioned independently and often diligently, there have been multiple instances where concerns regarding financial irregularities, lack of transparency, and even rumours of corruption and mismanagement have surfaced.

To safeguard the integrity of IADVL, maintain the public trust in its functioning, and uphold the highest standards of transparency and ethics, it is proposed that all future editions of DERMACON (National) must be conducted under direct financial oversight of the IADVL Headquarters.

Instances of Financial Misconduct or Suspicion:

Several episodes in the past underscore the urgent need for centralized financial control:

DERMACON 2013 – Ahmedabad: Serious concerns were raised regarding incomplete financial disclosures, mismatch in delegate collections versus reported expenses, and unexplained expenditure entries. Despite repeated requests, the final audited statement was delayed, with questions left unanswered.

DERMACON 2017 – Jaipur: Allegations of diversion of sponsorship funds to personal or parallel accounts and unapproved last-minute budget overruns created significant tension within the IADVL fraternity. This led to widespread discontent and damaged the credibility of the organizing branch.

DERMACON 2020 - Hyderabad: Rumors of high-level mismanagement, coupled with opaque vendor agreements and delayed financial reporting, gave rise to intense speculation about fund misappropriation. Although some explanations were later provided, the lack of proactive transparency further fuelled the perception of wrongdoing.

These incidents, though varying in severity and outcome, have collectively highlighted systemic loopholes in financial governance. Without a formal, centralized mechanism in place, such issues are bound to recur, eroding institutional trust.

Proposal Summary:

1. Centralized Financial Management:

Any state branch or body that bids for, wins, or is allotted the DERMACON National Conference must conduct the entire conference under the financial supervision and using the central IADVL Headquarters bank account.



2. Designated Conference Bank Account:

A dedicated conference account shall be opened under IADVL's National PAN and registration, with a clear event label (e.g., IADVL DERMACON 2026 Account).

The account shall be under joint supervision of the IADVL National President, National Secretary, and National Treasurer.

The Organising President, Secretary, and Treasurer of the host branch may be added as temporary authorized signatories for the duration of the conference and up to 6 months post-conference.

3. Operational Flexibility:

In today's digital banking era, this account can be seamlessly operated online from any part of the country. Authorizations, approvals, and oversight can be digitally administered through secure banking protocols and dual authentication.

4. Financial Reporting & Audits:

Quarterly financial reports must be submitted to the IADVL National Executive Committee (NEC).

A final audited statement of accounts must be submitted within 60 days of the conclusion of the event.

The audit must be conducted by a nationally registered Chartered Accountant and cross-verified by the IADVL's designated audit committee.

5. Budgeting & Expense Approval:

A provisional budget must be submitted to the IADVL Finance Committee within 3 months of being awarded the conference.

Major expenditures (above ₹5 lakhs) shall require prior written approval from the National IADVL Office Bearers

6. Transparency Measures:

All sponsorships, exhibitor contracts, and delegate fee structures must be declared to the National Office.

Constitution Committee comment

What our IADVL Constitution 2024 says:

Section H: Conferences (Page 42, Clause g-6) currently governs DERMACON financial protocols, where most financial management rests with the local Organizing Committee, with certain oversight from the National EC and Finance Committee.

Presently, while there is financial reporting, the **full centralized control under National Headquarters**

This proposal seeks to **modify existing constitutional clauses** by mandating centralized financial management for DERMACON through the National Headquarters.

Nature of Proposal:

This is a **constitutional amendment proposal** that would fundamentally shift financial responsibility for DERMACON from state branches to the National Headquarters.

Impact on IADVL:

Merits:

Establishes uniform financial control and reduces risks of fund misappropriation or irregularities.



Enhances accountability, transparency, and governance.

Ensures timely audits, structured reporting, and adherence to legal and tax regulations.

Builds public and professional trust in IADVL's financial operations.

Concerns:

Operational complexity may increase for the National Headquarters, requiring robust financial systems and staff support.

Host branches may feel reduced flexibility in managing local vendors and logistics.

Requires proper digital banking arrangements and delegation of authority to avoid delays.

This proposal need to be discussed first at CRC, then at CFC, then at Constitution committee then at CC Meet

Conclusion & Recommendation:

The proposal addresses critical concerns of transparency and financial integrity.

As it modifies constitutional provisions (Section H, Page 42), it requires referral to the Constitution Committee for:

Drafting detailed constitutional amendments.

Addressing operational feasibility, tax implications, and digital banking protocols.

Structuring roles for both National and State branches during the transition period.

This concern must be opined with Central Finance Committee & Conference Reform Committee.

Once vetted, the amendment can be placed for Central Council for discussion.

Background:
In recent years, the increasing frequency of webinars and online educational events organized under the Dermatology speciality has led to inadvertent and at times deliberate participation of non-dermatologists, unqualified persons, and even individuals misusing fake IADVL LM numbers. This not only compromises the academic sanctity of our association but also opens the door to misuse of scientific knowledge by unauthorized individuals for commercial or quackery-linked practices.
Proposal:
We propose that IADVL urgently formulates uniform guidelines applicable to all webinars and online academic activities — whether conducted at the national, state, zonal, or local level — to ensure that access is strictly limited to verified dermatologists.

Suggested Verification Protocols:
For IADVL Life Members:
Mandatory validation of credentials via a standard IADVL verification checklist, maintained centrally.
A one-time authentication fee of ₹50,000 to be paid by organizers to enable access to the credential verification mechanism for that event. This amount will support central processing and cross-verification efforts.
For Non-IADVL Members but Qualified Dermatologists (e.g., abroad or new applicants):
Submission of a notarised copy of their MD/DNB Dermatology or DVD degree, along with their Medical Council secondary registration indicating the specialty.
For pg students to be accompanied by a verified letter from their respective teaching institution or a State Medical Council attestation.
For Recently Joined or Not Yet Digitally Verified IADVL Members:
A notarised IADVL membership certificate along with a self-declaration under professional ethics and a copy of their PG degree.

Rationale:

- 1. Companies with limited budgets often skip credential checks, leading to unchecked access.
- 2. IADVL LM numbers are being faked or shared, compromising the integrity of our academic discussions.
- 3. Misuse of dermatology-specific knowledge by non-qualified persons leads to unethical practice, dilution of our science, and fuels quackery an issue we are already battling legally and socially.

Additional Suggestions:

All event registration portals must have mandatory document upload sections as per the above verification criteria.

A national credential-verification taskforce can be constituted within IADVL to support organizers.

Repeat defaulters or events that allow entry to non-dermatologists without verification should face disciplinary action including withdrawal of IADVL backing or listing.

Conclusion:

This proposal is aimed at safeguarding the sanctity of IADVL's educational efforts and ensuring our knowledge-sharing ecosystem remains secure, ethical, and exclusive to genuine dermatologists. We request urgent consideration and adoption of these guidelines.

- VI. PG Thesis Grants: IADVL DSB has initiated IADVL DSB Post Graduate Thesis Grant 2025, an initiative aimed at supporting dermatology post graduate students across Delhi carrying out their thesis research. A total of 3 grants of Rs 50000 each shall be awarded to the winners of the grant.
- VII. Derm-connect Newsletter of IADVL DSB (April- Jun 2025): IADVL DSB official Newsletter 'Derm-Connect, the second quarter edition (April to June) was published and released during the Private Practitioners conclave. The theme of the newsletter was in accordance to the theme of the conference: Private Practitioners: Skills Beyond Clinical Excellence. The newsletter contains interesting articles updating the busy practitioner and post graduates on science behind what is trending in private practice these days.





The International Aesthetic and Clinical Dermatology Conference, held from April 11 to 13, 2025, at PGIMER Chandigarh, centered around the theme "Biologicals & JAK Power: Transforming Dermatologic Therapeutics." 

C. Social activities

- 1. World Vitiligo Day, observed on June 25, serves as a global reminder of the need to raise awareness about vitiligo - a benign skin condition often associated with considerable social stigma. The role of Dermatologists extends beyond clinical management; they are entrusted with the responsibility of educating patients, providing empathetic counseling, and actively working to dispel societal misconceptions, thereby enhancing the overall quality of life for individuals affected by the condition. In alignment with this objective, Dermatologists across West Bengal, particularly in various medical colleges, commemorated World Vitiligo Day within their respective institutions. The observances focused on patient education, treatment awareness, and counseling initiatives, with the collective aim of fostering a more informed, compassionate, and inclusive society for those living with vitiligo.
- 2. On the occasion of World Skin Health Day, on 13th July, the IADVL launched a landmark initiative organizing nationwide free skin health camps simultaneously across the country. This pioneering effort aimed to: Raise awareness about skin, hair, and nail diseases among the general public Encourage individuals to seek consultation from qualified dermatologists Break myths and stigma associated with dermatological conditions. An additional goal was to attempt a record-breaking feat—registering the maximum number of skin health camps conducted in a single day in the International Book of Records. West Bengal IADVL, reaching every corner in alignment with this initiative, the West Bengal branch of IADVL organized statewide free dermatological camps at the grassroots level—ranging from private clinics to community halls, Vedic ashrams to correctional homes. 32 camps were conducted across the state, 59 dermatologists volunteered their time and expertise, 1,716 patients were examined and counseled in a single day This remarkable achievement was made possible by the dedication and tireless efforts of all participating dermatologists and volunteers, making the event a resounding success.

ADVL Observership & Training 2025-26

This program continues to attract young dermatologists nationwide.

Observership Programs 2025:

IADVL Observerships for duration of 4 weeks (with a stipend), for IADVL LMs or PLMs aged less than 35 years and for duration of 2 weeks (without a stipend), for IADVL LMs aged 35 years or above are offered at approved centers.

Courses Offered: Lasers, Aesthetic Dermatology, Dermatosurgery, Hair Transplant Surgery, Dermoscopy, Trichology, Pediatric Dermatology, Dermatopathology, HIV Medicine, Leprosy, Phototherapy, Urticaria.

Among a total of 244 applicants (230 <35 years, 14 >35 years), total of 92 (81 <35 years with stipend INR 15,000; 11 >35 years) were allocated. An email with the details of candidates, feedback form was sent to the course directors and of the course details, consent form, feedback form are sent to all the candidates. A WhatsApp group is created to ensure ease of communication and address queries from



course directors and observership candidates. Out of 92 candidates, till date 29 have completed the course (26 <35 years, 3 >35 years). Their details after receiving all the relevant documents have been forwarded for completion certificates.



Formation and First Steps:

The IADVL Constitution Committee was formally constituted this year under the guidance of the Honorable President and Hon. Secretary General and Executive Committee (EC) of IADVL. Immediately after its formation, an official WhatsApp group of all members was created to ensure smooth, transparent, and real-time communication.

On 16th February 2025, a joint meeting was held with the IADVL Executive Committee. During this meeting, Dr. Vikas Shankar (Convener) and Dr. V.K. Sharma (Chairperson) presented the roadmap of the Constitution Committee, reaffirming our collective commitment to serve the association by addressing constitutional matters within a defined timeframe. **Commitments and Work Delivered**

The Committee has pledged to deliver considered and consensus-based opinions on all matters referred to it by the IADVL President, General Secretary, or Executive Committee. Importantly, we resolved to respond without delay, with a standard turnaround of 48-72 hours. Since its inception, the Committee has:

Received the Central Council meeting proposals, on which the Honorable Secretary General sought the Committee's opinion on select constitutional matters. The IADVL Constitution Committee deliberated and delivered its opinions on all such proposals within the stipulated time frame.

Provided deliberated opinions on 5–7 important proposals referred by the Honorable General Secretary and the Honorable President.

Ensured all responses were finalized and submitted within 48 to 72 hours, maintaining both accuracy and efficiency.

Supported the Executive Committee by offering constitutional clarity wherever needed, ensuring smooth governance in line with the IADVL Constitution.



Future Plans

To strengthen constitutional awareness among members, the Committee has outlined several initiatives:

1. Constitution Quiz

A planned IADVL Constitution Quiz will be organized for both Life Members and Provisional Life Members.

The goal is to enhance understanding of how the Constitution functions and to create wider awareness of members' rights and responsibilities.

2. "Know Your Constitution" Campaign

After every Central Council (CC) meeting 2025, the Committee will release concise educational cum awareness posters highlighting key constitutional provisions.

This initiative aims to bring the Constitution closer to every member in a simple, accessible format. Guiding Principle The Constitution Committee reaffirms that it remains fully committed to:

Upholding the sanctity of the IADVL Constitution, Serving the members of IADVL with diligence, and Delivering timely, transparent, and accurate opinions whenever constitutional matters are referred.



IADVL'S ANTI-QUACKERY, LEGAL, AND ETHICS COMMITTEE

Anti-quackery committee:

Over 450 complaints were lodged by IADVLites using the google form that was uploaded on the IADVL website and circulated in numerous dermatology whatsapp groups. Over 100 complaints were processed and sent to respective medical councils and state clinical establishment regulatory authorities such as CMOs, CMHOs and DM&HOs based on the nomenclature in each state. Two clinics were closed down for good following our complaints. Other complaints could not be followed up due to the lack of pan-Indian district level anti-quackery cadre.

Dr Rajetha Damisetty, the chairperson, appeared in an hour long interview on 5th May, 2025 on Aadhan TV, a youtube channel. The video had over two lakh views and led to a social media furore with numerous dentists making verbal attacks on various social media channels on dermatologists in general and Dr Rajetha in particular. After tens of videos and thousands of comments, many highly objectionable and some obscene, a FIR was lodged against the main miscreants in the cybercrime department and representation submitted to the Telangana medical council (TGMC) and dental council (TGDC). On 12th May, 2025, a demonstration of solidarity and resolve was made by close to a hundred IADVLites who assembled in the Cyberabad police Commissionerate. This was followed by a well-attended press conference on 13th May 2025 that led to extensive press coverage in Telangana regarding the magnitude and public health implications of quackery.

The Telangana dental council issued a notice (Lr. No. 042/Ethics-Notice/1GDC2025) that stated that "dental surgeons shall name and style the establishment only as a Dental Clinic" and warning dentists that calling themselves cosmetologists would attract penal action. Telangana medical council also issued two long awaited notices in May and June 2025 including one that mentioned that MDS OMFS holders are not eligible to perform hair transplantation and facial aesthetic procedures. This notice is expected to have a positive impact in the two ongoing cases in Madras and Bombay high courts.

IADVL successfully submitted a complaint through a Bangalore advocate in Karnataka medical council against a high profile doctor who is self-proclaimed "celebrity dermatologist" in spite of her lack of a NMC recognised postgraduate degree in dermatology.



Legal aspects:

Letters were sent to various authorities including the NMC regarding the training institutes like ILAMED and COCTRASI which have played a major role in propagating quackery in India. IADVL has been named a respondent in the ongoing case regarding dentists performing hair transplantation in the Bombay High Court. A lawyer was hired through the good offices of Dr Amarendra Pandey, the convener as IADVL did not have a legal firm on a retainer agreement.

A legal notice was sent to HK clinics based in Hyderabad for unauthorised usage of IADVL logo and other unethical acts showcased in their instagram post.

Ethics related activities: Show cause notices were sent to IADVLites who were found to be flouting the medical code of ethics and creating a bad precedent to young dermatologists and promoting self treatment and promoting quackery. This is an unprecedented move for IADVL and followed the ratification of the social media etiquette guidelines by the IADVL GB in February 2025.

Personal attacks on AQCLEC members:

During this quarter, members of the committee were subjected to unfortunate attacks and malicious false propaganda as a direct consequence of their IADVL committee work. Dr Amarendra Pandey faced multiple RTIs and harassment in terms of legal notices for his anti-quackery work. Dr Rajetha Damisetty received personal legal notices from IADVLites who received show-cause notices from IADVL and was targeted by a senior member of IADVL. DR Avinash Pravin also faced cyber threats from dentists and an IADVLite who was accused of unethical practices and supporting quackery. All of them faced courageously handles the lamentable personal attacks in spite the lack of a IADVL lawyer or a formal communication to support them.



WELFARE SCHEMES OF IADVL - BENEVOLENT FUND, ACCIDENT FUND. DVL WELFARE TRUST

IADVL WELFARE SCHEMES

IADVL is glad to introduce two welfare schemes for the benefit of IADVL members. The schemes are intended to foster goodwillamong members and thereby make the association more popular and purposeful. The schemes are as below:

BENEVOLENT FUND

PERSONAL ACCIDENT RELIEF FUND

IADVL also has an on-going PROFESSIONAL INDEMNITY INSURANCE POLICY for financial protection against any medicolegal claims. Each of the above is to help and benefit IADVL member during any personal crisis or tragedy. Both these funds are through internal accrual while Professional Indemnity is in association with National Insurance Company limited.

JADVL BENEVOLENT FUND

IADVL Benevolent Fund is to extend solace and support to IADVL members who have undergone the misfortune of being afflicted by serious disability/prolonged illness. The disability or ailment should be due to diseases or mishaps that are not self-inflicted. The intent of the fund is to provide emotional and financial assistance and a helping hand at a critical time. The objectives of thisscheme will be to provide financial support to the deserving members in the case of invalidation or in the event of their suffering any injury or physical disability or unforeseen misfortunes like prolonged sickness leading to premature retirement. The supportwill be extended in the form of one-time payment to a maximum of Rupees 2 lakhs per member as per set guidelines.

Following is the list and definition of critical illness/disability eligible for grant of Benevolent Fund:

- 1. Stroke resulting in paralysis: Defined as a cerebrovascular accident or incident producing neurological sequelae of a permanentnature, having lasted not less than six months.
- 2. Chronic renal Failure: End stage kidney failure presenting as chronic irreversible failure of both kidneys to function, as a result of which regular renal dialysis is initiated or renal transplantation carried out.
- 3. Major Organ Transplant: The actual undergoing of a transplant as a recipient of one of the following human organs: (a) Kidney, (b) Lung(s), (c) Liver, (d) Heart, (e) Bone marrow
- 4. Blindness: The total, permanent and irrecoverable loss of the sight of both eyes.
- 5. Major Burns: Third degree burns covering more than fifty percent (50%) of the Life Assured's body surface area
- 6. Amputation of limb: Amputation of one or more limbs warranted due to conditions other than accidents.
- 7. Any other medical conditions deemed to result in a permanent or partial disability / COVID 19 infection requiring intensiveunit care.

JADVL PERSONAL ACCIDENT RELIEF FUND

The personal accident relief scheme is no longer there

MODE OF DISBURSEMENT OF BENEVOLENT FUND & PERSONAL ACCIDENT RELIEF FUND

Aggrieved member can send the duly filled application form, with bills, hospital summary etc through their branch /City unit to State President/Secretary who shall forward to IADVL President/Hon. General



Secretary. Upon receipt of the application an Expert Committee duly authorised by the IADVL Executive Committee headed by the President of IADVL shall evaluate and approve the same based on the merit of the case. The approved fund can be electronically transferred only in the name of the affected member whose PAN card is verified.

has been establishedfor the benefit of members of IADVL. The trust has been registered at Vadodara. DVL Welfare Trust is by IADVL, of IADVL and for IADVL ites".

Aims and objectives of the scheme:

- 1) To provide financial assistance to the family of a member of this scheme in the event of his/her death.
- 2) To inculcate a habit of savings among the members for their mutual benefit.
- 3) An option to provide comprehensive indemnity cover in the event of litigant situations arising out of alleged professional negligence by the members.
- 4) To educate the members, including clinic staff, to prevent any litigant situation and to guide them, how to deal with it in the event of such a situation.

Eligibility of the members: Any life member of IADVL, irrespective of age is eligible to become a Regular Member of the scheme. Family members of Life members of IADVL can also join the scheme as Beneficiary Members. Please note that separate forms need to be filled for each member of a family.

Total Amount Payable at the time of admission:

- 1. Admission Fees (as per age –given below).
- 2. Annual Membership Fees Rs. 750. (for the year 2020-2021) Icreament of Rs.50/- every year.
- 3. Advance Fraternity Contribution (AFC) Rs.2000 (Rs Two thousand only) a minimum amount kept with DVL trust towards members future fraternity contributions.

Optional amount to be payable at admission: Member can deposit additional amount of his choice as deposit for future annual contribution. The 4% interest will be credited on deposit amount.

Details of one time Admission fees: The Admission Fees payable shall be based on age in years of the proposed member or their family member who likes to join the scheme, as follows:

Optional Legal fees for professional indemnity For life members of IADVL who volunteer to have professional legal cover, this option is available. Annual legal fee is based as per type of Dermatology practice: a) The Consultant with only office practice will have to pay Rs. 1000/- per year; (B) The consultant with practice of cosmetic, laser & other Dermato surgical procedures will have to pay Rs. 3000/- per year; to cover these procedural events or litigations. The indemnity coverage will be Rs. 7,00,000 (Rupees seven lakhs) per case and Rs. 15,00,000 (Rupees Fifteen lakhs only) aggregate per year.


