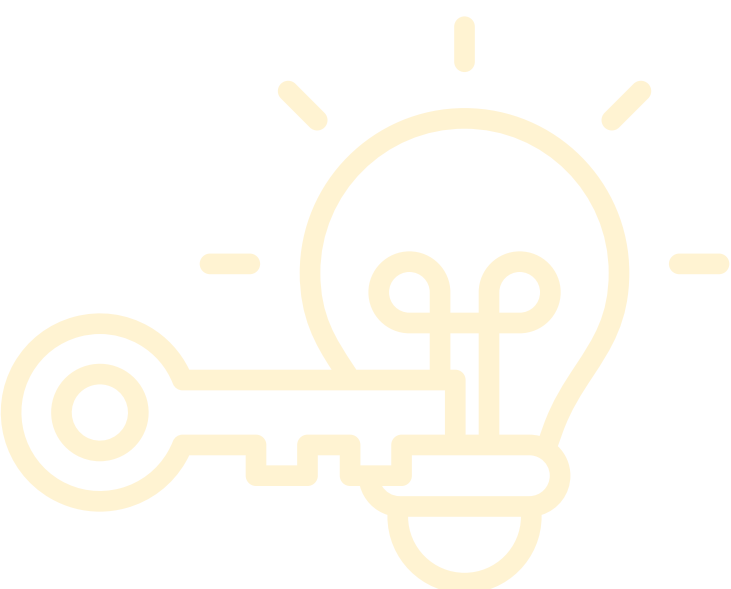
## IADVL Observerships and IADVL Training Program

### A. IADVL Observerships 2024-2025

IADVL Observerships for a duration of 4 weeks (with a stipend of 15,000 INR), for IADVL LMs aged less than 35 years and for a duration of 2 weeks (without a stipend), for IADVL LMs aged 35 years or above, are offered at approved centers. IADVL Observerships 2025 offered observership courses in different specializations under the able guidance of 27 course directors. Various courses offered are *LASERS, Aesthetic dermatology, Dermatosurgery, Phototherapy, Trichology, Hair transplant Surgery, Urticaria, HIV medicine, Leprosy, Pediatric dermatology, Dermatopathology and Dermoscopy*.

In **DERMACON 2025**, all the observership directors were felicitated, and observership results were announced in February 2025. A total of 244 candidates applied this year (230 below 35 years and 14 above 35 years), out of which 92 were selected (81 below 35 and 11 above 35 years). An email with the details of candidates to the course directors and of the course details, consent forms were sent to all the candidates. Till mid-December 2025, 65 candidates have successfully completed their observership, and 11 have withdrawn due to various reasons.

**Announcement for observership 2026** was made on 5<sup>th</sup> Nov 2025, and the entire submission process is now online. Applications have been submitted, 234 total, and we plan to evaluate and submit the results by January 2026.



# IADVL Observerships and IADVL Training Program

**B. IADVL Training courses 2025** are of 4 months with a stipend of 30,000 INR per month, as compared to a 3-month training period and a 10,000 INR per month stipend in 2024. Training course 2025 are offered at the following centers- Dr Bhumesh Kumar Katakam (Pediatric Dermatology, Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad, Telangana), Dr Sachin Verma (Procedural Dermatology, Skinvita Clinic, Kolkata), Dr Venkataram Mysore (Dermatopathology, The Venkat center for skin, ENT & plastic surgery (Venkat Charmalaya), Bengaluru), Dr Dasika Subba Rao (procedural dermatology, Vijaya Skin Hospital and Laser Center) and Dr Sumit Sharma (Hair restoration, Dermawave Skin, Laser and Hair Transplant Center)

Forty-five candidates applied for 2025 training, out of which 13 candidates were selected and allocated to the centers. Communication regarding the same was forwarded to the training course directors and candidates. Out of 13 candidates to date, 11 have given their consent. Till November, 3 candidates have completed their training

**Changes in Training Program 2025:** The training courses are for 4 months at a stretch or divided into 2 halves if the program director agrees, with a stipend of Rs 30,000/- per month.

Announcement for training 2026 was made on 5<sup>th</sup> Nov 2025, and the entire submission process is now online at Academy Central. Sixty-three applications have been submitted, and evaluation is underway. The results are planned to be announced by January 2026.



# IADVL Research Grant

This year, IADVL EC & Academy has allocated an impressive grant amount of 1 crore to support pioneering research projects. Applications were invited from members of IADVL for research grants for projects in Dermatology, Leprosy and STIs.
