Thank you for considering the trip to Portland to stand with the plaintiffs in Hadachek v. Oregon. This guide covers everything an out-of-town visitor needs to plan the trip — flights, hotels, parking, transit, courthouse logistics, and a few local recommendations for the day. Every person who fills a seat in that courtroom sends a message that this fight for equal protection belongs to a nationwide movement, not just one community.

Schedule update: Oral arguments now begin at **9:30 AM** (previously 1:30 PM). Please plan to arrive at the courthouse no later than **8:45 AM** to allow time for security screening.

GETTING HERE

Flying & Ground Transportation

Nearest airport: Portland International Airport (PDX) — roughly 12 miles from the courthouse.

MAX Red Line (light rail)	35–40 min	\$2.80 one-way	Boards directly at the airport; runs roughly every 15 min, day and night
Rideshare (Uber/Lyft)	20–30 min	\$30–60	Pickup areas are well-marked outside baggage claim
Taxi	20–30 min	\$35–55	Taxi stand located curbside at PDX
Rental car / driving	20–30 min	Varies	Downtown street parking is limited — plan on a garage (see next page)

BUDGET TIP The MAX Red Line is the cheapest and most predictable way into downtown — it drops you within a few blocks of every hotel listed below. Buy your fare on the TriMet Tickets app or at the airport station kiosk. Plan your exact route at trimet.org.

WHERE TO STAY

Hotels Within Walking Distance

All three hotels below sit in downtown Portland, within a 5–8 minute walk of the courthouse, and close to restaurants and MAX/streetcar stops. September is a popular travel month in Portland — we recommend booking as early as possible.

DAY-OF LOGISTICS

Getting to the Courthouse

Multnomah County Circuit Court — 1200 SW First Avenue, Portland, OR 97204. Courtroom 9C is subject to change; confirm the courtroom on the day of the hearing at the courthouse directory or with security staff.

Proceedings now begin promptly at **9:30 AM** — please arrive no later than **8:45 AM**.

Public Transit

- **MAX Light Rail** — Pioneer Courthouse Square or SW 1st & Jefferson stations, both a short walk away
- Portland Streetcar also serves the downtown courthouse area
- Adult fare: \$2.80, covers transfers for 2.5 hours

ACCESSIBILITY

The courthouse is fully ADA-accessible. Visitors with mobility impairments can use the accessible entrance on SW 5th Avenue at SW Salmon Street — press the wheelchair button beside the doors and Sheriff's Office staff will assist you inside. If you need a disability accommodation for the hearing itself, requests must be submitted at least 4 court days in advance through the Multnomah County ADA Coordinator (971-236-8671).

COURTHOUSE SECURITY

What to Expect When You Arrive

- Oral arguments begin promptly at **9:30 AM** — please arrive no later than **8:45 AM**.
- All visitors pass through airport-style security: bag check and a walk-through metal detector.
- Security lines can add 15–30 minutes — arriving early matters.
- A government-issued photo ID is recommended.
- Courtroom seating is first-come, first-served.

NOT ALLOWED INSIDE Firearms and weapons of any kind, pepper spray, stun devices, multi-tools, knives, scissors, and other sharp or pointed objects. Security staff do not hold prohibited items for pickup later and there is no lost-and-found — plan your bag accordingly before you arrive.

DRESS & DECORUM

INSIDE THE COURTROOM

- Dress in business-casual attire — collared shirts, blouses, slacks, skirts, or modest dresses. Avoid t-shirts with slogans, shorts, or beachwear.
- Remove hats and sunglasses before entering the courtroom.
- Silence phones completely; no photography, recording, or texting once proceedings begin.
- Remain seated and quiet during arguments — no audible reactions, gestures, or commentary directed at the judge, attorneys, or opposing parties.
- Follow all instructions from the bailiff or Sheriff's Office staff promptly.
- Campaign buttons, pins, or apparel bearing case-related slogans are not permitted inside the courtroom itself.

OUTSIDE THE COURTHOUSE

- Supporters are welcome to gather on courthouse grounds and public sidewalks before and after the hearing.
- Signs, banners, and Intact Global apparel are welcome outside — keep walkways and building entrances clear for other courthouse visitors and staff.
- Remain peaceful and respectful at all times; do not approach, film up close, or engage directly with opposing parties, witnesses, or press without their consent.
- Follow any instructions from courthouse security or Portland police regarding assembly areas.
- Coordinated messaging helps — please check with Justin before bringing signage so materials are consistent with Intact Global's approved messaging.

PLAN AHEAD

Weather & What to Pack

Portland in mid-September typically sees highs around 74–77°F and lows near 51–52°F, with occasional light rain (about 4 rainy days on average for the month). Layers are your friend — mornings and courthouse interiors run cooler than the afternoon.

- A light jacket or layer for cool mornings and air-conditioned interiors
- Comfortable walking shoes — downtown Portland is very walkable, and you may be standing in a security line
- A compact umbrella, just in case
- Business-casual attire is appropriate for the courtroom
