*Thank you to those who have previously supported us by exhibiting in the Horticultural Section. We very much look forward to receiving entries from old friends and new exhibitors in 2026. **Judging will start promptly at 8:45am for ALL Horticultural sections on Show Day.***

General Information for Exhibitors

1. Closing date for entries is Saturday 4th July 2026 but entries received after Saturday 9th June will not be listed in the catalogue.
2. Late entries on show day are strictly restricted to 5 per exhibitor.
3. Entry fees are 25p per exhibit.
4. Confined classes apply to past and or present residents of Stithians Parish.
5. No exhibit is to be removed from the marquee before a secretary has given permission.
6. In an event of a tie for most points, an additional point will be awarded to the Exhibitor with the most first prizes.
7. Cups and Trophies will be presented in the Horticultural marquee at approx. 5pm on Show Day.
8. Prize money will be available for collection from the Horticultural Secretary after prize giving has concluded until 6pm on Show Day, or from the Secretary within 2 weeks.
9. Parking for Exhibitors in the Horticultural Section will be available in Exhibitor parking in a field near the marquee. Trolleys and help will be available to carry exhibits to the marquee. Cars can be unloaded next to the marquee on the Sunday but must be removed to the car park as soon as exhibits have been unloaded.
No exhibitors' cars to be parked beside the marquee on Show Day.
10. Please return cups and trophies to a secretary at least a week before the 2026 show in a clean and good condition.
11. Each 1st prize will be awarded 5 points, 2nd prize 3 points and 3rd prize 1 point.
12. The Association reserves the right to publish the name and town of exhibitors.
13. Confirmation of receipt of entries will be emailed but not posted to exhibitors.
14. Those requiring an exhibitor parking pass by post should enclose a stamped addressed envelope with their entries.
15. Exhibitors will only be exempt from payment of gate entry fee on Show Day if 20 or more bench quality exhibits are shown.
16. Any Exhibitor making a breach of the rules forfeits all prize money.
17. All exhibits in sections other than section 3 must be grown by the Exhibitor.
18. **All exhibits to be benched between 2 -10pm on Sunday 12th July 2026 and before 8.45am on Show Day.**

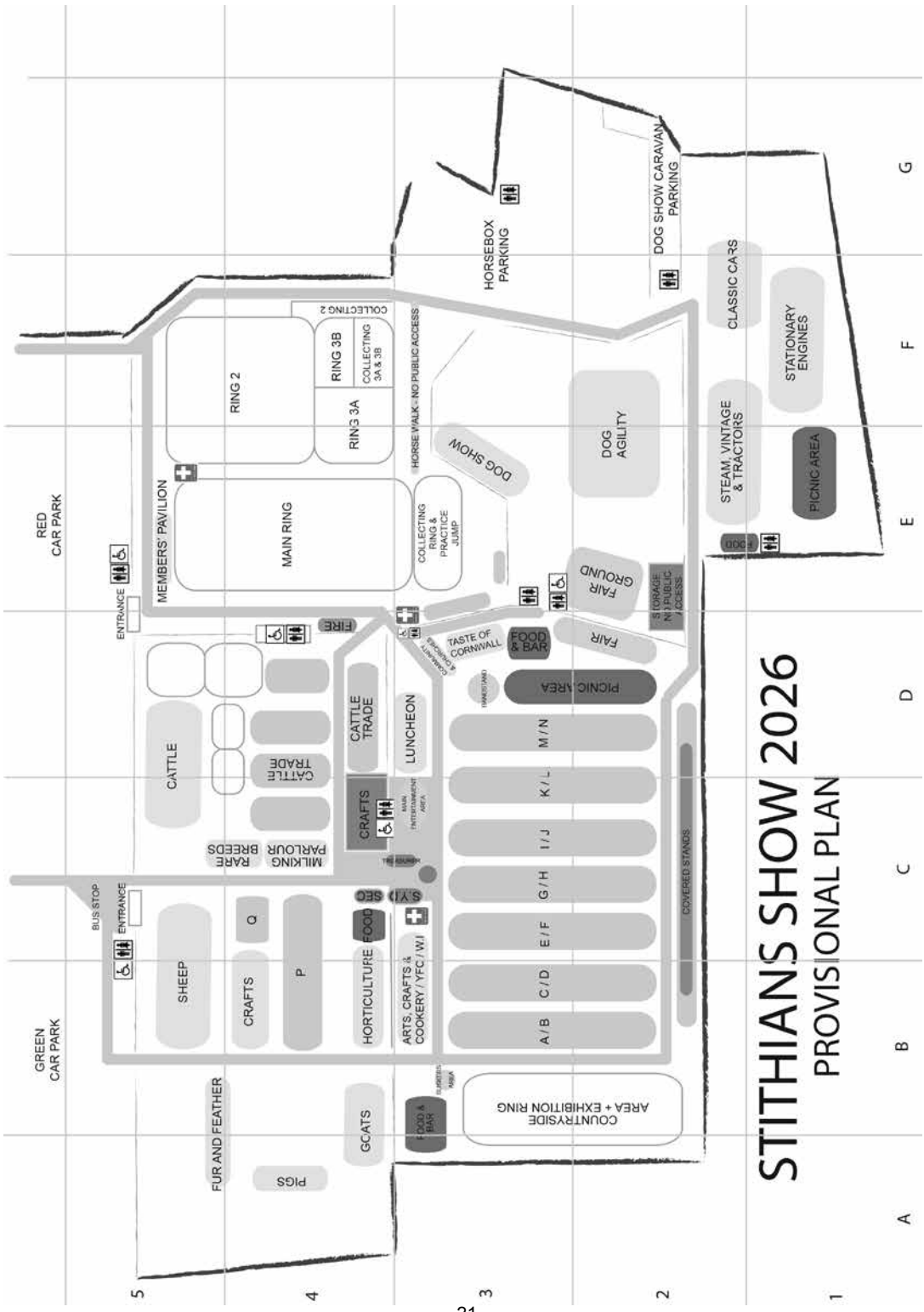

Health & Safety Policy

Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974

The Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999

GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

We commit to operating the Association in accordance with the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and all applicable legislation made under the Act 'so far as is reasonably practicable'. Our policy is to ensure that the Show is operated in a safe manner for all our employees, volunteers and the general public, and to provide such information, training and supervision as is needed for this purpose.

We also accept our responsibility for the health and safety of other people who may be affected by our activities. The Association acknowledges that the Show is likely to attract those who may be vulnerable and will consider them in their risk assessment of the event. The Association has an Event Safety Management Plan in place which covers all aspects of the operation of the Show and is available from the Show Office.

The Board of Trustees acknowledge that Health and Safety responsibilities within the Association are of equal importance as other priorities and will ensure resources are available to manage Health and Safety. Although the Board of Trustees accept responsibility for the implementation of the Plan, it relies on individual employees/volunteers to accept their own duty and responsibility to themselves, fellow workers and others who might be injured/affected by their acts or omissions. The Plan will be kept up to date, and appropriate to the Association's activities. To ensure this, the Plan will be monitored and reviewed every year or more frequently if required.

SAFETY INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE

All Exhibitors must comply with the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and all relevant legislation and guidance. Animal exhibitors must also comply with the Animal Welfare Act 2018 and any relevant codes of practice, guidance, etc. provided by the relevant governing body organisations. Further safety information is contained within the Stithians Show Health and Safety Manual which is made available to those exhibiting at the Show. All exhibitors will be expected to have read this document along with any relevant set-up and break down site rules.

SHOW SECURITY

The Association's appointed security contractor will provide 24-hour CCTV monitoring of the site from the Monday before the Show and guarded night cover between 19:00 and 07:00 from the Thursday before the Show and then 24/7 from 07:00 on the Saturday until 07:00 on the Tuesday after the Show. The Association's use of CCTV monitoring in some areas of the Showground is to enhance safety and reduce the risk of criminal activity. The location of the cameras may be moved in accordance with notified risks. The Association will not be responsible for the safe custody of any article brought for exhibition, nor will they be liable for any loss or damage that may occur to any article. It is the exhibitors' responsibility to ensure they have adequately insured their stock and equipment whilst on site and to report any suspicious behaviour to the Security Team.

FIRE SAFETY

All catering outlets and trade stands must assess the risk of fire. Where an ignition source is identified, or where hot works or cooking is carried out on the stand then suitable firefighting and prevention measures must be put in place. BBQs are not permitted on the Showground.

FIRST AID/MEDICAL COVER

If you are setting up prior to, or packing up after Show day, you are advised to ensure you have a first aid kit available. On Show day the Association's First Aid contractor will be on site. The nearest A & E Dept is at The Royal Cornwall Hospital, Triliske, Truro TR1 3LQ. Minor Injury Units are located at Camborne Redruth Community Hospital, Barncoose, Redruth, TR15 3ER and Falmouth Hospital, Trescobeeas Road, Falmouth, TR11 2JA; both of which require you to contact NHS 111 by phone or online prior to visiting. All accidents/incidents and near misses must be reported to the Show's Health and Safety Advisor who is contactable by radio or via the Show Office.

GAS SAFETY

Any fixed installation gas equipment (cookers, pipework, valves etc.) must comply with the provisions of the Gas Safety (Installation and Use) Regulations 1998. All catering vans / marquees with gas installation MUST have a Gas Safety Certificate issued by a competent Gas Safe Engineer and dated within the last 12 months. A copy of the

certificate MUST BE provided to the organisers prior to entry to the event. Crimped connection fittings must be used rather than jubilee clips. Further information can be found on the Nationwide Caterers Association website The Gas Safety Checklist - The Do's and Don'ts - NCASS"

ECOLI AND GENERAL INFECTION CONTROL

The Show provides the ideal opportunity for the public to interact with the animals. It is important that hand washing with soap and water is carried out by everyone following contact with animals and pens. There are hand washing facilities in the animal areas and in the toilet blocks on the Showground.

ELECTRICAL SUPPLY

Legislation requires electrical equipment to be maintained in good condition and for it to be suitable for the environment in which it is to be used. All portable electrical equipment brought onto the Showground must be maintained in good condition and where required, evidence of portable appliance testing be available to our Officers. The Show reserves the right to remove from use any equipment they deem to be unsafe. Further information is available from the HSE website <https://www.hse.gov.uk/pubns/books/hsg107.htm>

Diesel and LPG generators - the use of diesel and LPG generators is permitted provided modern, quiet equipment is used. Stand-alone petrol generators are not permitted. Petrol generators that are professionally built in as part of an operating unit may be used. The Association reserves the right to request any generator that is unsafe or causing a nuisance from fumes be switched off and removed.

SHOWGROUND TRAFFIC

All Showground traffic must give priority to pedestrians and riders and strictly observe speed restrictions at times when such movement is permitted. There is a one-way system in place during build up and break down - please adhere to this. The speed limit on site is **10mph**.

During the Show (08:00 to 18:00) all Showground roadways must be kept clear of any obstruction to allow unimpeded access by emergency vehicles. **There is no unauthorised vehicle movement permitted between the hours of 08:30 and 18:00.**

Livestock exhibitors: may leave the Showground prior to 18:00, subject to the approval of a Showyard Director and notification to the Section Secretary (movement is to enable compliance with Animal Welfare Regulations). The Livestock dispersal will be strictly controlled. Livestock exhibitors must park in the areas allocated to them and be respectful of others when parking.

WASTE

Traders and Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring that any waste is removed from site and their area is left in a clean and tidy state.

OPENING HOURS

Trade and Craft Stand Exhibitors are required to remain open until 18:00 and **MUST NOT** attempt to leave the Showground before that time. Those found to be packing up early and attempting to leave the Showground may find that their application is refused for future Shows.

VIOLENCE AND AGGRESSION

Physical or verbal violence or aggression towards our Show Team, Contractors or Officials will not be tolerated; you will be asked to leave the Showground without any recompense. If you have a complaint, we can usually deal with any issues if approached in a civil manner but cannot guarantee to always resolve issues on the day of the Show.

MAJOR INCIDENT PLANNING (SITE EVACUATION)

In the event of a major incident where it is necessary to evacuate the site or part of the site, please follow all signs and instructions from the organisers and Emergency Services. ALL people will be requested to evacuate the site, until it is deemed safe to return. The Association accepts no responsibility for any property or livestock or any person or persons who fail to comply with the request to evacuate the Showground.

Animal Escape - Animals are unpredictable and do occasionally break free. Please get yourself and others under your control to safety in a quiet and calm manner and allow those involved in the recapture to do this unimpeded.

WEATHER

It would be extremely unusual for us to cancel the event due to adverse weather. We have, however in the past had to delay set up due to high winds. Please ensure that your contact details are up to date when applying for a trade stand or exhibitors' space. In such circumstances we will communicate with you by email and social media.

It is your responsibility to ensure that you have appropriate structures for your stand. Garden-type gazebos are not suitable for use on the Showground and we encourage you to use a purpose-built shelter available from reputable suppliers. Please ensure that you have adequate anchorage and weights for your structure.

PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE

Whilst the Association has its own Public Liability cover in place it is only for its own protection. All exhibitors must have their own Public Liability insurance which covers them for attendance at the Stithians Show."
